In the flash tips Department: Pete Taylor reports that KKHI-1550 will go 24 hours in January (bay area DXers take note!). Pete also says that Al "jazzbo"/Wedge Plans Collins is leaving KGO in favor of WNEW, New York... from Broadcasting Magazine, via Greg Monti, comes more news on Radio Marti. The station will most likely operate on 1040 kHz, a frequency used by the Voice of America for Cuban/Latin American broadcasts about 15-20 years ago. However, this has not yet been finalized. Operation is still scheduled to begin in January, which sounds a bit optimistic, but.... Watch these pages for more details.

Jack Swearngen has sent in some information on a nifty-looking DXing aid. It lasted an hour. Hundreds of callers to WCAO and sister station V-103 (which went off the air half an hour later) were told only that "technical difficulties" were to blame. The power stayed off until 11:30.

A 15-year-old girl had climbed one of WCAO's antenna towers, apparently despondent. The stations then cut the power to prevent the girl's hands from being burned by the RF current coursing through certain parts of the 300-foot tower. She managed to scale nearly 150 feet be-

could engage her in a conversation.

The conversation ended when Watts persuaded the girl to descend a fire-truck ladder to the several dozen police cars, rescue squads, TV crews and several hundred spectators who'd gathered below. She was uninjured when she surrendered to the authorities.

Other Pacific news: NZEC has been testing near Taihape on 59h KHZ, also on 1386 KHZ near Levin. 4XD-1431-Dunedin has a new schedule, Mon-Sat 0600-1100 GMT, Sun. 2100-0000 GMT. 2YP-1530-New Plymouth is on the air NSP, relay of the National Programme. 3CR-Melbourne has applied for a power increase. 3WM-Horsham schedule now Mon-Sat 1900-1500, Sun 2000-1400, 8DN-Darwin now 24 hours NSP (1242-2 KW) 2XX-Canberra plans power increase and extended schedule. Filed are applications for new commercial stations in Esperance and Carnarvon, West Australia. Tuvalu-580-now 5 KW with hours 1830-1930 and 0430-0630, plans to extend schedule when staff available. Alan Roycroft advises that FCC granted CP for new Honolulu station, 1310 KHZ, but only 500 watts. Applicant has appealed for higher power, but FCC claims that interference to their monitoring operations at Waipahu has reached a level where further field intensities from Honolulu will be disasterous. KAIM-870 has their new 50KW transmitter in place, and tower is up on new site. Neighboring subdivision is not proceeding so Billy Graham Crusade/KAIM will have to pay 250,000 dollars to bring in 12KV power line. When new transmitter is on the air, it is expected that KNUI-900 will suffer severe interference along the western coast of Molokai, forcing yet another frequency change for KNUI, KHLO-650 is expected to go 5 KW in October, but as at September the construction of the transmitter building had not commenced. KTVM-1350 is likely to be sold soon and new owner plans to move to a longer wavelength as soon as possible to improve coverage. KISA-1540-Honolulu may have to leave the air for non-payment of bills, and since extension of night time hours, they have been receiving more DX reports. Those forums went into 57 colums, an average of 0.58 forums per column. The largest columns were the anniversary issues in March with 13. I kept track of who sent each week to get this list of statistics. The top 20 in reporters shows a big advantage in typing a column like this - you get a forum in without having to remember to send in to the editor each week, and I was the leader in my own column with 49 forums. The next 20: 2. Bill Townshend 29 3. Ernic Cooper 29, 4. Bill Murtzel 25, 5. Niel Wolfish 19 6. Mark Connelly and Gerry Thomas 17, 8. Thill Boersma 15, 2. Greg Monti 14, 10. C.M. Stanbury 13, then Mike Brooker 11, Saul Chernos and Steve Miller 8, Mike Jeziorski and Cary Siegel 7, Fob Gerardi and Mark Strickert 6, John Clemmer, Karl Torth, Charles Taylor, and Dave Yocis with 5. 28 people had one. By last name, 79 M, 67 C, 53 T, 46 W, and 41 S. These totals include 2-forums in one, and forums as a result of phone calls with present and former members. \_ I T will always be around in DXing somewhere, and will never forget IRCA as the club that introduced me to many DXers that have become good friends and made the DX/radio hobby an important part of my life. I wish you all the best of DX and enjoyment from the radio hobby. As forum 375 comes to a close, it's goodbye from the man they call P-R-M, saying 73.

#### Pirate radio makes a comback in England

Radio Caroline, 50 kw AM operated on ship in International waters, will beam pop music to Britain and Europe; Wolfman Jack heads staff of DJ's; Major Market Radio handling sales.

Radio Caroline, the pirate AM radio station that broadcast rock music to Europe during the 1960's and 70's, will resume operation this month from a ship anchored off the Essex Coast of England. The nondirectional 50 kw station will have an adult contemporary format directed primarily toward Great Britain, but will include continental Europe as well.

Radio Caroline is now scheduled to sign on the air Nov. 28, after a two-month delay. The ship housing the station was hard hit by a storm as it moved into position off the Essex coast and the decision was made to add 150 tons of ballast in order to offset the imbalance of the craft's 300-foot transmission tower.

Announcement of the station's return was made in the New York offices of Major Market Radio, a broadcast sales firm that will handle all time sales for Radio

Caroline.

Major Market's vice president for marketing, Ray Lindau, said that the station is seeking advertising from multina-tional corporations. "especially those doing business already in the United States. We think they can translate their success here into success in Europe. where a multinational medium has not been available.

According to Lindau, the venture is acked by "a group of private European backed by "a group of private European investors who would prefer to remain anonymous." He said that there is no involvement of American individuals or corporations in the operation and dismissed a published report that Gene Autry, whose Golden West Broadcasting is the parent company of Major Market Radio, has a fi-nancial interest in the station. "We are international sales representatives for Radio Caroline," explained Lindau, "that's as far as it goes."

Lindau declined to estimate the amount of annual billing he expects Radio Caroline to draw, but predicted it will eventually outdistance London's Capital Radio, said to generate \$34 million a year. "It has the potential of becoming the biggest radio station in the world, in terms of billing," said Lindau. He also would not release names of any advertisers the station has already signed, but said they in-clude accounts in the hotel, fast food, magazine, apparel and cosmetics indus-

The new Radio Caroline will be permanently anchored in international waters, at approximately the same site as that occupied by the original station. The vessel housing the station is "Imagine," a 300foot, 1,100-ton craft of Liberian registry. It replaces "Mi Amigo," the original Radio Caroline facility, which sank in March 1980

According to Lindau, the new Radio Caroline will emanate from a 200-foot tower and will be somewhere between 600 and 700 khz. A second transmitter will operate on an undisclosed shortwave frequency. An estimate of the potential audience for the station is about 8 million, with the actual audience probably exceeding the 3.9 million said to have tuned in to the original Radio Caroline.

Heading the roster of personalities. many of whom are said to have been associated with the first station, is Wolfman Jack. He will host a 90-minute program during afternoon drive time.

The first week of the Wolfman's show will be produced live from the ship, with subsequent programs custom-produced for the station, sent by tape from Los Angeles. Wolfman Jack, born Bob Smith, produces syndicated radio programing through his own company. Audio Stimulation, and until recently hosted "The Midnight Special" rock concert series on NBC-TV. He has performed frequently on television and in motion pictures, and produces occasional specials through his own television production company.

Except for Wolfman Jack's program, all programing on Radio Caroline will be produced live with personalities living aboard the ship. Lindau said the names of other personalities are being withheld until broadcasting begins, although he indicated they include "a well-known female air per-sonality from California." He said the names are not being disclosed in part to protect those involved from possible prosecution under Britain's Marine Offenses Act, which prohibits British citizens from supplying a pirate ship. Lindau said that some of the air personalities who have signed hold British passports.
All on-air personnel, except Wolfman
Jack, will live on the ship for three weeks at a time, followed by one to two weeks of shore leave.

All advertising sales will be handled by Major Market Radio through corporate and agency representatives in New York
