Remeber that there will be no EDXR in next issue as I'll be relaxing and resting (although not from doing this column.) In response to several questions about reporting to this column, the "ideal" reports would be typed, in the same format as the column and in frequency order. However, I'm not very picky, especially since contributions haven't been too heavy lately. All that I really ask is that each item include all of the following: frequency, calls, state, city, date, time, program details, reception quality and your initials. It is easier for me if these items are in the same order in your report as they usually appear in the column, otherwise I tend to get lost trying to reorder things. The really important thing, though, is that you report. I usually am able to figure out any one's handwriting and will publish all reports I receive. The only real restriction is not reporting stations that are easy catches in your area. This includes the 50kw clears that you can hear almost any night plus your local and semi-local stations. ### GM Opts For Motorola System To Receive AM Stereo Broadcasts

KOKOMO, IN — General Motors, after more than a year of testing five competing—and largely incompatible—systems for receiving AM stereo broadcasts, has selected a system designed by Motorola.

The announcement from GM's Delco Electronics Division is expected to have great influence on the emergence of a standard system for AM stereo broad-

A year ago, the Federal Communications Commission formally declined to define a standard scheme for transmitting—and therefore receiving—AM stereo. Instead, the FCC said it would let the marketplace decide on a standard out of at least five different schemes proposed by various communications companies. That prompted many AM radio stations to install and test some of the competing transmitter systems.

Industry analysts said GM's choice of the Motorola-type receivers for use in its cars was a significant step toward making the Motorola transmit/receive scheme a de facto standard for AM stereo.

For Motorola, the announcement could mean that Motorola decoder integrated circuits would be in Delco radios for the 1984 model year, although no specific production quantities or contract plans have yet been announced. National Semiconductor has demonstrated a chip family that could be used for receivers in the Motorola encoding scheme—the LM1981 series.

The Motorola scheme uses a method called compatible quadrature amplitude modulation (C-QUAM) for subcarrier channel separation. A 25-Hz pilot tone is used for reconstruction of each channel. The transmitted signal is a recombination of two RF carriers that are separated by 90 degrees—(L+R) modulates one, (L-R) the other.

The announcement comes shortly after the conclusion of a series of broadcast tests conducted by Delco at radio station WIRE in Indianapolis. Transmitters for the Motorola, Harris and Magnavox, systems were used and tested.

Long Island-based Kahn Communi-

Long Island-based Kahn Communications, a proponent of a fourth system, declined to participate in the Delcosponsored tests, asserting that broadcasters—not users—should dictate the evolution of a new system.

Receiver manufacturers had been hoping for a receiver-based resolution of the AM stereo issue at the upcoming Consumer Electronics Show. Electronic Engineering Times, 12/20/82

Permit me to engage in some rambling about the early days of radio. Hearing KFI Los Angeles was the first big thrill for the beginning DX'er back east in the late '20s. In looking through my logbooks from that period, I find an occasional reference that KFI was already coming in as early as 1930 or so in Dallas on winter nights. By that time in my DX'ing career, I was merely noting the early arrival for hearing KFI was a matter of routine. KFI, in those days, was owned by Earl C. Anthony, the Packard dealer in Los Angels and San Francisco. The station power was 3500 watts and it operated on 467 meters, which is one-and-a-half meters lower than its present frequency. That isn't enough difference to notice.

In the summer of '28, I spent about six weeks in California and toured the L.A. area taking pictures of radio stations. I still have most of them in print or negative form. My picture of KFI's antenna towers shows them located atop the three-story Packard dealership building. If memory serves correctly, the location was on Spring Street in downtown Los Angeles.

My California trip also included a three or four day excursion to San Francisco, foing and returning on a Pacific steamer named "The Harvard." More station pictures collected in the Bay Area. KPO, the present KNBR, atop Hale's Department store; KGO over in Oakland, its towers in a field east of the city. Other station pictures too.

The most unusual photograph taken in the Bay Area were the towers of a "dummy" KFI located atop Anthony's Packard building in downtown San Francisco. Anthony never had a San Francisco station and never had any plans to establish one. Nevertheless, he had erected two antenna towers atop his San Francisco building, huge letters on them saying, "KFI - Packard."

Anthony, later on did establish a second station, KECA in Los Angeles on 1430. When the FCC outlawed dual ownership, KECA would have become something else, but I don't know what present L.A. outlet descended from KECA.

Enough for now. 73. (More, Gene, more. By the way those towers remained on the San Francisco building on Van Ness into the '60s. The building became a Cadillac dealership-RtH.)

Hi IRCAns. I had a siper time out at Pt. Reyes, North Beach on 07 November, making it the sixth all-night DX'pedition at that location this year, each one very different from the last, DX'wise. I didn't feel up to driving all the way to Ano Nuevo, especially after fetting off work at 1800 PLT, so Sheldon Remington and I decided to go out to DX Beach; it only takes 45 minutes from Fairfax (about an hour from here). The funny thing was I wasn't too sure whether Asians or DU's would be sominant, so I set up a 1,000-foot wire at 270 degrees, which was a compromise between the two. Because a Beverage tends to receive the lowest angle DX slightly off to the sides of the wire, (about 5-25 degrees, depending on length vs. frequency), it was perfect for both DU and the higher lattitude Asians. However, the Asians were not only dominant, but were big and loud, with quite many of them swamping West Coast domestics. I also noticed how well the Hawaiians were coming in, but didn't chase them, unfortunately. At times, I wakked around the beach with just the Superadio, listening to loud Asians and Hawaiians.

Longwave was hot, with stations heard as far east as the Gulf Coast beacons, and the Russian BC stations from Siberia and the Far East which were amazingly strong. I noticed, just like Art Peterson, how the stations on Longwave would fade like waves sweeping through the band, but in reverse order from what he noticed- first starting at the high frequencies and moving to the lower ones and back and forth.

JOIB 747 was the first Asian, in as early as 2245 PLT with huge signals. In the usual Pt. Reyes tradition, we stayed well past sunrise to enjoy the beautiful sunrise skip conditions. As the 10 kHz domestics to the east faded, only the 9 kHz splits were in, virtually alone and het free. Those longwave Russians were still in well nearly two hours after local sunrise as well as 657, 891, etc., and we gave up waiting for them to fade to go home. Every time we thought they were faded for good, they would come back up to good levels. That's what I call persistence. I also heard some Asian type audio on 720 and 1350. Congrats on the IRCA Año Nuevo group for some great DX too. (The McGreevy Mirror continues next week-RtH.)

Provinces not covered: Sengkulu, Jawa Tengah, D.I.Yogyakarta, Musa Tenggara Barat, Musa Tenggara Timur, Irian Jaya, Timor Timur and Sulawesi Tengah. It is possible there are no commercial stations in Bengkulu, Timor Timur and Sulawesi Tengah. According to Dave Tucker in Irian Jaya, he knows of no commercial stations operating in Irian Jaya now. There used to be a couple, but they folded for one reason or another. (The two would have been Suara Annida and Suara Kasih, formerly on SW from Jayapura). Unfortunately, there is little or no information available for the moment on stations in the other provinces.

Each province within a Nusantara has a different digit, e.g. Sumatra: Aceh = 2, Sumatera Utara = 3, Riau = 4, etc. The last 3 letters are unique to each station, and from the way they are allocated, it is often possible to deduce even the town location, or whether the station has undergone a significant frequency shift.

### How Reliable is the Information in the List?

As far as frequencies are concerned, from the various actual loggings, it seems that an estimated  $2/3 - \frac{3}{4}$  are accurate. Some 4 ID titles are substantially different. Addresses are generally accurate, with relatively few changed. Frequency coordination seems rather well organised, with only 3 possible clashes that I can spot: 346 Radio Fortune in Bandung would not be here if RRI Bandung were too (but I think they are fixed on 540 now); 1332 R. Oz and R. Antares, both in West Java, are unlikely still to be on this channel when high power RRI Jakarta uses it also. In summary, the list seems a faithful representation of the commercial scene of just 3 or so years ago.
