

NEW AM DAYTIMERS TO BE BANNED: The FCC has put a freeze on accepting applications specifying daytime-only operation on the AM band. A "freeze" usually means a temporary stoppage of acceptance of applications for some service, but this time it's different. The freeze is being put on to allow the FCC to begin and complete a formal rulemaking which will put a permament ban on new AM daytimers. Existing daytimers can continue to exist (providing they don't go out of business) but no new ones will be allowed. (BC and Monti)

SECOND FM BAND PROPOSED: Radio New Jersey, the owner of WRNJ 1000 Hackettstown NJ, has petitioned the FCC to create a second FM band, to be known as FM2, to be a place to which financially troubled AM broadcasters can move. RNJ proposes that the 225 to 230 MHz band (or perhaps a different 5 MHz wide band) be made available for broadcasting and that daytimers be given first refusal rights to apply for frequencies in the new band. They could still own and operate their existing AM stations while constructing and operating their new FM2 stations. After daytimers, other AM stations could apply for FM2 frequencies. Technical specifications for transmission, including stereo and subcarriers, would be identical to those used on the existing FM band. Assuming the FCC required radios to include the new band and assuming the service became viable, the AM station owners would turn in their AM licenses, becoming FM-only (actuelly FM2-only) broadcasters. RNJ thinks that the current relief being given to AM daytimers, such as very low night power and/or presunrise and postsunset authority aren't enough to assure that large numbers of AM stations won't

fail financially. (BC and Monti)

AM STEREO UPDATE: Press Broadcasting, the owner of WJLK 1310 Asbury Park NJ, has petitioned the FCC to require that all AM stereo radios be required to pick up both the Kahn and Motorola systems. The petition did not ask the FCC to require that all radios having FM stereo also have both AM stereo systems.

EARLY START POSSIBLE FOR DAYTIMERS WHEN ADVANCED TIME LAW CHANGES: The FCC is considering allowing daytimers to begin broadcasting with their full, daytime powers beginning at 0600 local time, twelve months a year, regardless of how far before surrise that might be. This change is being considered in light of the new national advanced time (some people call it daylight savings time, which it isn't becasuue it doesn't) law, which has us turning our clocks shead one hour on the first weekend in April instead of the last weekend. (BC)

(BC) The host of CBS RadioRadio's weekend, three-hour rock nostalgia show "Crusin' America" will be Bruce "Cousin Brucie" Morrow. (BC) Westwood One's Mutual is starting up a new sub-network in January called Mutual P.M. It will include evening newscasts originating on the west coast, plues Mutual's nighttime talk programming such as Dr. Toni Grant, Larry King and Jim Bohannon. (MSJ) Transtar has announced its next, 24-hour, satellite-delivered radio format, "AM Only," designed for AM stations. It has a target audience of 35 to 54 year olds, plays mostly adult standards music, shunning both adult

Many of you probably do not remember the days when broadcast stations gave out small, postage-sized verification stickers. Many of them were very handsome, including this one, which was very difficult to reproduce because it is gold on black. This was one of my very first QSLs, dated December 2, 1954. Of course the sticker dates from a period even further back in time, as you can see, the sticker depicts a flat-top antenna, outlawed in the mid-1930s. KFYR is on 550 kHz now. I doubt if you can still get one of these stickers from them, but it's worth a try.

I didn't get a chance to say it last week, because I ran out of space, but last week's report was one of the best I've seen in recent years. In fact, it rather resembled Western DX Roundup in content, hi. Congratulations to Karl Jeter and David Reitz for very fine work.

I received many responses to my invitation to reporters to comment on what they think is reportable and what isn't. Oddly enough, the majority of the responses were from outside the jurisdiction of EDXR, and I even received letters from two ex-members. Nearly all of the Board of Directors also wrote me.

I've been waiting to comment myself in order to allow everyone to have their say, both privately, and in the pages of the DX Forums. The responses to this issue have run the full spectrum but the center of gravity is toward allowing reporters pretty much to say what they want. On a scale of 1 to 10, with 1 representing Robert Kramer's restrictive views, as expressed in his last column, and 10 representing Karl Zuk's unrestrictive views, also as expressed in his last column, 1'd say opinion gravitates around 7-8.

Quite frankly, after a full review of all sides of the issue, and after doing 10 columns, I don't see any changes at all. With only one exception, all of the EDXR reporters are exceptionally fine DXers and don't need to be lectured by me or anyone else. I'm very proud to serve DXers such as these, and I am indeed glad they live in

EDXR territory, not CDXR or WDXR.

In fact, I had planned to scrap the plans for a commentary, but several Board members have written to urge

me to go about it anyway, so my commentary will appear next issue.

In other business, Robert Ritchey wrote to say "Is it my imagination, or is it getting harder to hear stations sign off at sunset? I used to hear more sign-offs in one evening than I hear in a week now." I've noticed that too. With the new "Mexican rules" daytimers on those old clears are either not signing off, or are going to PSSA authorizations for two hours and then signing off, or are staying on all night now, so there are fewer sign offs than there used to be, at least at full or critical hours power.

Thank you for your letter of August 18. It is most heartening to find listeners with WGN's welfare at heart.

With respect to the 840kc radiation that you refer to, this has existed since the World War II days when WBBM moved their transmitter from Glenview to their present site, which is about one mile from WGN. WGN moved to their site on Route 53 in 1938.

The radiation that you refer to emanates from the WBBM transmitter and not the WGN transmitter. We have been fully aware of this, so has CBS and the FCC. There is nothing that WGN can do about it. We are also happy to report that we were able to buy a modern transmitter which was installed and put into operation in 1957.

I hope that the foregoing information is sufficiently complete so that you can exonerate WGN from this problem of spurious radiation. Again we thank you for your communication.





(See attached cover letter for a 3 volume report entitled "Future Directions for Commercial Radio" Interim Report: AM to FM Conversion by the Australian Department of Communications.

If we had wanted to run a laboratory test, we couldn't have found better conditions than in Australia. Australia is a sparsely populated country, where AM's superior coverage should have meant that AM would always dominate FM.

Furthermore, unlike the United States and Canada, where FM has a long history and generations have grown up with FM and now have a strong bias against AM, FM only started commercial operation in Australia in 1980. Therefore, there is no bias against AM by the young people, except a bias based upon actual recent performance.

In the last two years, ever since Motorola was given a monopoly in Australia, the supposed "salvation" of AM radio, the decline of AM radio has become so severe that a detailed Government study has been performed on converting AM stations to FM and, as a side benefit, the availability of the medium wave band for uses other than broadcasting. As the Australian government itself has stated "AM stereo, while launched with great fanfare, has not yet realized hopes initially invested in it." Press release dated April 4, 1986 by the Minister for Communications.

Obviously, <u>AM Stereo, WHEN THE SYSTEM IS WRONG, is not a salvation for AM radio.</u> The basic advantage of AM radio is its superior coverage over Therefore, when you introduce a system that sacrifices both mono . and stereo coverage, can you expect anything but a disaster.

They had no choice. No confusion on the part of the public there. No competition, just a good old monopoly where the Government tells you what to do none of that masty freedom business - and just look at what happened.

AM Stereo was dubbed the "Big Flop of the Decade" by an advertising executive during a recent Australian government sponsored seminar.

Fortunately it cannot happen here in the U.S.A. because of our checks and balances system, our Constitution, etc., etc. For those who spout the anti-free competition nonsense about "if we only had a single system" well, THEY DID.

Freedom works and any organization that attempts to violate the laws of free enterprise economics as well as the laws of nature is doomed to failure. No matter how big, powerful, and well connected a firm may be, it cannot control the real marketplace, the public.

Nobody is ever going to force the public to accept inferior technology when they can hear superior products, such as, FM and CD's.

Giving Motorola, or any other firm, a monopoly on the basis of poor technology has about as much of a chance of being successful as water running up hill.

We should all feel sorry for Australia but thankful that we now have the results of their "noble" experiment proving once again, the efficiency and superiority of free competition.

At this rate, I might make writing a Forum almost a habit, hi! (Good-rce) Sine my last check-in, I have been trying out my two beverages (one west, one south) in some daytime DXing...this was helped with a day off midweek and a weekend. This is an interesting experience, and I can routinely hear daytime DX 200-300 miles away, and even one 600 miles away, as I will get to shortly. Back on 11/28, I noted WZRX-1590 Jackson, MS or "Z-Rock" in well and dominating on the west wire at 1432--well over 300 miles away. miles away. This afternoon, 12/7, I was using the sourth wire and had WTNT-1270 Tallahassee all alone at 1100 with "Talk Radio Weekend" and an FSU Football promo; just before that, 1280 was dominated by WGTX Defuniak Springs, FL with dual "FM-103 and AM-128" IDs. Both of those are over 200 miles from here. Later the same afternoon, WAYD-1200 (ex-1190) was heard here with "Christian Radio" slogan and gospel music. Around 1500, I was somewhat astonished to hear KYOO-1200 Bolivar, MO begin to come in under WAYD at about 1515 with country music--that's well over 600 miles away from here! However, by 1515 during this time of year, I suppose nighttime conditions are already starting to form, so maybe this reception of KYOO in broad daylight is not so unusual after all, hi. Speaking of the WAYD reception, I have also logged two other frequency-changes lately: WRFA-820 (ex-800) and WFNC-640 (ex-940). The former was only just recently verified while still on 800, and in fact they asked me to listen out for their switch! There have been a couple of auroral-like conditions lately, noticed on 11/29 and 12/4. I didn't check the indices on the first date, and on 12/4, the A index was only 8. On both nights, there was a definte weakening of northern signals here, and I was able to hear "Sonido-1120" which is actually on 1127 kHz. That's about all from here. Best wishes for the holidays for all! 73's!

Winnipeg has its share of great and horrendous frequencies. On the bad side: 590, 620, 640 and 1300 seem to suffer the most from being adjacent to locals. If one is fortunate enough to hear anything on these frequencies, it's always the same station. In other words, 1300 KGLO is the only thing I can pull out from the 1290 CFRW mess. One has to watch out for local mixing products on 1210, 1350, 1390, 1440 and 1490 as well. On the plus side, 15 heard on 1340, 14 on 1400, 12 on 1450 and 14 on 1490. The most intriguirng frequencies here are 770 and 1210.

770 is invariably a five-way dogfight between WABC, KKOB, KATL, CHQR and the Colombian. HJKX seems to appear most evenings regardless of how many Mexicans and Cubans are audible. Yet when HJKX is really strong, it's almost impossible to find any other audible Colombians. 1210 has been giving me fits ever since I moved here. WCAU, CKWA, KLDI and KGYN all make nightly appearances, but at poor levels. I've definitely heard Cuba and Venezuela here, but wonder if I may also be getting traces of Colombia and/or Mexico at times. Nothing ever seems to dominate this frequency for more than three minutes at a time. Add to 1210 the noise (apparently created by KRSV being off frequency) (Even in Winnipeg, that's heard? Hello FCC-RtH), and the CKY-CKRC (580 + 630) mixing product and you get one huge headache. I wonder what the current formats of KQTL (Sahuarita, Arizona), KUBE (San Juan, Texas) and KCLG (Washington, Utah) are? (KCLG is C&W, KUBE is SS-RtH.) I think there is a definite possibility that EQTL may be the source of some of the Spanish I hear fading in and cut on 1210 all the time. Anyone who may be able to shed some light on 1210 would be doing me a big favor.

I said previously that Shawn Axlerod has been a big help for DX tips. He just called to ask for some help on the Spanish audible underneath 1110 KFAB. Luckily I recognized the Venezuelan national anthem at 0359 UTC, so Shawn added YVQT (R. Carupano) to his logs. Finally, I should mention that Gardner and John are doing a fine job as the new EXDR and

CDXR editors respectively. 73.

Well, the second half of November didn't produce much DX. KSVA and KLPZ tests were apparently both no-shows. I remember asking my boss at KRED what would happen if I was an hour late with power down night after night, and his answer was, ". . . probably nothing."

If KOFY 1050 is running 500 watts nighttime, they re still not getting into Sacramento. XED still dominates the frequency. Still haven't

heard KDFC on their night power.

Look for another edition of a CAMP GTG in early 87. Will try it one more time. . . possibly finding a good location for a Beverage party (Camp Coors is starting to look good, hi).

That's it this time around. Best of DX and 73 de RtH. .
