


### DX GETTOGETHERS



### Radio's 'Rooster' still crowing after 30 years

The Morning Rooster (not his real species) really had something to crow about Tuesday morning:

30 straight years of roostering.
"Gracias," he would say to the numerous well-wishers who called carly to congratulate him on his extraordinary achievement. "Gracias. Muchas gracias.

Then the tape-recorded barn-yard fowl would crow in the background of his home base-ment studio and Jose Chapa, the Hispanic community's Morning Rooster since the late 1950s, would turn back to his micro-phone and begin reading the

radio program, broadcast live on a small station at 6 a.m. from his rooster-decorated house in Elmwood Park, is now only a quaint boutique in what has become the big business of Spanishlanguage broadcasting.

His wire-service machine bur-bles away in the laundry room, disgorging an endless ribbon of news from Latin America. The wood-paneled studio down the hall past the pool and Ping-Pong tables is a cozy, electronic nest filled with microphones, tape machines, control knobs, records and, nearly everywhere you look. rooster icons.

Roosterabilia are on the wall, perched atop the "On Air" light, upstairs by the TV, on top of the bookcase, bracketing a letter-sorter and, in ceramic, under a table by the window.

"Using the rooster was on my mind from the very beginning," said Chapa. "Because of the hour

and because our listeners are working-class people. They like the reminder of the country."

Chapa once tried having a live rooster in the studio with him, but the bird did not get along with the recorded rooster that heralds Chapa several times each show, crowing in response and causing Chapa to laugh through his newscasts.

Also in the rooster-tale file is Chapa's account of a predawn police raid in the early 1960s in which officers allegedly came around to the door of a house inhabited by Chapa fans, persuad-ed by neighbors that the family was keeping a live rooster on the premises.

It's cute stuff. But behind the bird trademark is a serious journalist who has been a serious pioneering force in Spanish-language communications in Chicago since he offered the first news-based radio show for Spanish speakers here in September, 1953.

"Everyone told me I was going to fail," he said. "But instead I found a great hunger out there."

Chapa's specialty, then as now, was news from home. He used short-wave radio, foreign newspapers and Spanish newswire services to put together reports from the countries many of his listeners had recently left. He bought time from radio stations by the hour and earned his living by selling commercials within his

His success in attracting advertisers over the years eventually caught the eye of other entrepreneurs, and the Chicago area now has three full-time commercial Spanish stations and two Spanish-language television

"I set the table and they came to eat," said Chapa matter-of-

"We owe a lot to Jose Chapa, agreed Maura Donohue, sales manager for WOJO-FM, the most prominent local Spanish radio station. "His reputation and his loyal following have meant a

than 30,000 listeners, but Chapa thinks the service undermeasures Hispanics and that his audience is seven, or eight times that.

Tuesday's landmark show, like some 7,000 others before it, began with a rooster call and then a song. This time the song was "Parece Que Fue Ayer" ("It Seems Like It Was Yesterday").

But Chapa acknowledged offmike that, actually, it does seem like a long time since Dec. 1. 1957, when he took over the 6 a.m. hour on WSBC (AM 1240). He has owned the shift ever since, always buying his time and selling his own commercials just like numerous other ethnic broadcasters on a handful of Chicago's timebrokered radio stations. But no one in Chicago radio and, Chapa says, no one in U.S. Spanishlanguage broadcasting, can claim similar longevity.



### EASTERN DX FORUM

Reports from members living east of the Mississippi River

J.D. Stephens, 3605-8 Chasewood, Huntsville, Alabama Not that much activity lately, although 35805 I did manage to pull a partial all-nighter a few weeks back. That was the Sunday morning I caught WLW-700 on a rare SP. In its place was JBC, Jamaica with some great reggae. I haven't yet decided if the poor conditions of late are because skip has been lousy of if it has been just great (making for lots more interference from distant stations). The

clears and regionals sound like GYs and the GYs are a more horrendous mess than usual, with numerous stations coing in at equal strength and none ever seeming to break away from the pack on any given frequency. (I notice that at night here on the GYs--rce) Although it seems rather early (late Nov, early Dec.) for it, I wonder if we are beginning the seasonal anomaly. My veries have been just as much a problem. About 4 months ago, I began sending my reports on special stationery along with NRCs "Broadcast Band DXing" info sheet and a photocopy of a verie from another station. I had hoped that my low response rate was due to there being some confusion as to what it was that I was wanting, and thought that the inclusion of these items would result in an increase of QSLs. For some reason, I still have only a little better than 45% return rate (you might be figuring your response ratio wrong, too. See my Forum--rce although I have seen a decrease in the no-data "Thank you for your letter" See my Forum--rce) replies, and the handwritten scrawled messages on a half-sheet of torn notebook paper. There must be some improvement, however, as I have gotten several veries recently that mentioned how complete and easy to understand my reports were and one CE who even said that he was sure that I get a high response ratio due to my inclusion of these items. If he only knew! In regards to Gary Heisey's WYOS-670 AL station reported in Vol. 25 #10, I have been unable to locate information on any station here in AL operating on 670, nor have I been able to think of any possibilities for similarsounding callsigns. The mystery continues... Until next time, 73s de JD.

Bill Harms, Box 961, Bad Aibling Station, APO New York, New York 09098 or Fanny-Niggl Strabe 20, D-8202 Bad Aibling, Federal Rep. of Germany I have two developements to report on the DX scene here in Europe. First of all, it looks like Radio Caroline changed frequency from 963 to 819. During the first part of November I heard a station with English language religious programming on 819 during the evening. the same time I did not hear any trace of Radio Caroline on 963. Please see DXWW-E for the details. The second thing is the expanded use of frequencies by Berliner Rundfunk. In the past week or so I have heard them on several new frequencies: 1089, 1188, and 1458. They are all NSP and fairly strong. The station on 1089 effectively blocks out a chance of fairly strong. getting a good reception of British Forces Broadcasting Service from Cyprus. Fortunately, I did hear them earlier in November, however, so I did get a chance to log them. Unfortunately, it wasn't enough for a good report. The station on 1188 blocks out Radio Dublin. I have heard Radio Dublin several times, but again never enough for a good report. Oh well. On 1458, the BBC London holds down the fort, so the new Berliner Rundfunk outlet won't make that much of a difference. Tim Kridel, I am sending you photocopies of an ADAM computer catalog. The company's name is M.W. Ruth. I also found an ad for a company that sells ribbons for the ADAM at a reasonable price. I am enclosing that ad as well. Several mail-order

retailers sell a good variety of software and hardware for the ADAM. I hope you find these to be useful. A few people at work tried to persuade me not to buy the ADAM, because Coleco was discontinuing it. However, it still fits my need for word-processing and my kids use it for their games. I use it to type up my reception reports and for filing my DX lists, so I use it for DX related purposes. I also use it for most of my correspondence. I have to go now. Here's hoping the DX season will be better. And I agree with J.D. Stephens that the members in IRCA are friendly and helpful! Let's make IRCA the best club around. Gute DX de Bill von Bayern. I never thought I would hear Tom Snyder on WLS, but that's where his network talk program is, starting at 2300 CST. Cap Cities apparently didn't like Phyllis Levy's "Sex Talk" program. In other local radio news, WCZE-820 lost one of its towers in strong winds that followed a major snowstorm here on December 15. The chief engineer, interviewed on television, said that they would be operating with reduced power through their remaining three towers, and that he was happy that a "domino effect" had not occurred, knocking down all the towers at the suburban Elmhurst transmitting site. A trend that seems to be reversing itself: several local stations that have been NSP for years are going off the air once s week. WIND-560 now has a regular Monday morning SP (I stumbled across it on 12/21 and logged CFOS-560 as a result--rce), and WFNA-1490 goes off on Sunday mornings. The WFNA SP is especially interesting, since they never had a regular silent period and there are a lot of nearby stations on that frequency that I need. Other than 560 and 1490, DX has been slow through the fall and early winter. Sunset has sounded pretty flat most of the time, with only a couple ofnew stations. My big radio-related project this winter will be to go through all my DX bulletins and get rid of a lot of them. I have IRCA bulletins going back continuously to the summer of 1967. about four-and-a-half years before I joined. That was when Don Erickson published the stenciled DX Monitors on blue, yellow and red paper. I have NRC bulletins from as early as 1968, just before the Boston Publishing Committee went offset. I also have plenty of NASWA, WTFDA, CADX, and even old Midwest DX Club bulletins from as far back as 1971. Don't worry! I wouldn't think of actually throwing these in the garbage. They'll be donated to the next convention I attend. Happy New Year and best of DX in '88: (Karl, I don't remember the Midwest DX Club!--rce)

Rick Evans, 1431-E 29th Avenue South, Wisconsin Rapids, Wisconsin This column is being typed a couple days early, due to the Christmas holidays. I leave about 0800 CST for Michigan and won't be back until late Sunday, or more likely, during the day Monday, with a normal work schedule Monday evening. It'll be the first time in almost 12 years that us three kids will be there at the same time. My Dad, I'm told, is really looking forward to it. In J. D. Stephens Forum above, I mentioned that he might be figuring his verie to report ratio. I would suspect that the normal way of figuring the ratio is to divide the number of reports sent into the number of veries received. That may be right for past years but I don't think it would be for a short-term comparision. If a person is sending out 5 reports a week, the numbers can be skewed fast if you count all the reports sent—even those which couldn't even get to the station at the time you count the numbers. Let's use my numbers for convenience in examples: I've sent out a total of 58 reports since I moved to Rapids, with the first one being dated 9/10/87 and the latest being two on 12/21. I've received 36 veries, which would make it a 62.1%. One of the 58 rpts was returned by the Postal Service as undeliverable. At 57 reports, I now have a 63.2%. Subtract the two reports dated 12/21, the ratio jumps to 65.5%. If you go back 31 days (a month), the ratio for 51/34 goes to Another way would be to figure out what the average length of days it took to get a verie is, then subtract that from today (also subtracting any veries you received for reports during that time). For me, the average weight is 16 days. That puts me back to 12/7, and with only two reports out since then (because of my bad cold, I didn't even turn on the radio), and I'm back to a 65.5%. Some of the reports went out to stations which, because I had verified them from other locations, I had assumed would be easy veries, such as WBBM-780, WCZE-820, WJMS-590, KLZ-560. Surprise, hil I've been putting off verifying the clear-channel giants until spring or summer, prefering the smaller stations, but that also keeps my state count down, which I find depressing! I've just done a review of my Gary veries for a project I'm involved in, and discovered that many of the big stations weren't verified there for years after I moved to Gary--mostly because I had verified them in Mich. One verie this week: v/l KJLA--1900. When I get requests for tapes, I end up going to Walnut Creek. Even there, at night power/pattern switch, they totally go away. I get some KPLA 770 by day, almost none at night. Very strong days/decent nights out in Pleasanton where I work. KKSA sounds decent in stereo, at least until Casper sunset time.

Actually, all the little AM-band DX has been away from the apartment building, especially since the place got wired for CATV, buzzzzz. I take a portable receiver/recorder, usually the Sony CFS-6000 to make airchecks for collectors who've been requesting Sacramento, Santa Rosa, San Jose, Monterey and of course, San Francisco/Oakland. On this machine, even mono AMs have good audio, though alas, fine programming is harder to find on AM now (not that FM has picked up the slack). (What else is new?-hi-RtH.)

Greetings from Kodiak, where the earth shakes and our radio stations don't need to do EBS tests. We've had two EBS alerts-for-real within the past month, as Alaska shakes and tsunami evacuations are put into effect. Any unID EBS tone on 560 is probably local KVOK. In addition, DX hasn't been too bad lately either.

Morning sunrise skip at this time of the year yields practically all AM'ers in Alaska. My only hold-outs now are tiny 50-watter KIAL Unalaska-Dutch Harbor, a relayer of KDLG 670. Even the low power stations in Sitka, Cordova and Valdez come in very loud just prior to sunrise. Through Decem-ber and January with sunrise between 0900 and 1000 (local) it's the most convenient time to DX. I have lots of trouble staying up past midnight, although that's when most of tests are on, none of which I've been able to catch so far this season.

Excellent conditions this morning with CKRW 610 coming in well even with local KGTL 620 aplattering next door. Numerous Russians and Japanese

Same noted with KABL AM and FM, both very good, although FM slightly better, obviously. If there is one last resort to save AM, I'm afraid it's going to have to be in stereo.

Greetings. First off, I've been intrigued by several items in the past few DXMs. Ric, I've been observing KPLA 770 at this QTH at night. KPLA is dominant for the most part, usually over KKOB. Some times KKOB approaches equal strength as KPLA, producing a big SAH/dogright between the two. (Steve, what's SAH?-RtH.) Daytime, KPLA is semi-local in strength, better than any Sacramento station. The situation at Sonoma State is a little different.

Nick Hall-Patch, thanks for mentioning in your latest Technical column the "Snake" antenna (07 December DXM), which 160 meter buffs are discovering as a good low-noise receive antenna. It appears to work on the same principles as shielded loops, which are E-field devices. H-field antennas pick the electrical (voltage) field of RF, which includes NOISE (i.e. powerlines, ignition hash, but not TVI). I really like the 160-meter ham band because it's so close to the high end of BCB. I'm trying to see what DX I can accomplish with 25 watts output on CW, but my current HF receive antenna has near receive sesmitivity on 160 meters (1800 to 2000 kHz), even thought my poor receive sesnitivity on 160 meters (1800 to 2000 kHz), even thought my transmit antenna works fine. I use separate transmitter and receive for that

band: My R-1000 receiver and an old WWII Model TCS-13 transmitter.

I don't want to wander into ham stuff here, but I would like to propose a BCB DX'ers net or roundtable meeting on, say, 40 or 75 meters. We have two such nets in the LWCA where we talk about NDB and LOWFER stuff. We could discuss tips, propagation, DX techniques, etc. and non-ham members could listen in. . .sort of a BCB DX program. Please drop me a line if anyone is interested. My call is N6NKS. (Steve, there was a ham-net, mostly on

the EC about 10 years ago for the very purpose you proposed-RtH.)

Allrighty, I have a suggestion for any Oahu DX'ers in IRCA. No doubt you on that island are plagued with Honolulu's extreme RF levels on the BCB. I was amazed at the amount of spurs and external mixing products due to anterna tower duplexing by several stations. (And 3 and 4 on a tower, hi-RtH.) But I found DX out past Mokuleia Beach a few miles east of Kaena Point, north shore, to be nice. Most of the Honolulu stations had selective fading on them and were greatly attenuated due to terrain blockage. I believe the Honolulu stations were weaker at Kaena Point than in Hilo on the Big Island. Hilo gets huge skywave signals from Honolulu, especially if it's a "short-Skip" night. KFI was STRONGER than KORL at times, both from Hilo and at Kaena Point. 73 de SMM
