### December DX

December is well under way, and it brings with us the shortest days of the year. You can put the short days to good use in this hobby. For example, the winter months will often provide freak daytime DX openings, where normally inaudible stations will come in from up to a few hundred miles away. This is especially common at the higher latitudes. Here in Seattle, Alberta stations are quite common during the winter daytime, and once I even heard KLBM-1450 LaGrande, OR at 12:30 in the afternoon, not bad considering they're 300 miles away.

You can also take advantage of the earth's tilt at this time of the year. During December and January, stations to the northeast of you fade in first during the sunset DX period, and stations to the southwest stay on their day facilities the longest. So if you live in the Great Lakes area, you may bag stations from New England or the Maritime Provinces that would get buried in the interference during other months of the year. And if you live in the western US, you may be able to hear some otherwise elusive California stations after your local sunset.

Meanwhile, sunrise is just the opposite. For the next few weeks, stations to the northwest of you will fade out last. Here in the Pacific Northwest, for example, California pests will fade out before Alaska and BC stations; I've heard KSKA-580, KTKN-930, and CHTK-560 that way in recent years, minus a lot of otherwise annoying QRM.

### WHO BROADCASTING COMPANY

### HISTORY

The history and expansion of WHO Broadcasting Company from its beginnings on April 10, 1924 as a 5,000-watt radio station is a fascinating story. It is a story that reflects a growth in staff size, facilities and the very best in broadcasting service to the public...one striving for continued quality and responsibility in its programming.

WHO was originally owned by the Bankers Life of Des Moines when radio was still considered novel, with stations broadcasting without individual identification. Eventually, the station was asked to choose call letters. "WHO" was chosen by the company's manager in response to inquiries of "Who is this?" and "Who are we listening to?" In 1930, Colonel B. J. Palmer, noted for his progressive thinking, purchased WHO Radio and plans were made for expansion. In 1933, WHO was granted an increase in its operating power to 50,000 watts, making it one of the few stations in the country with such a vast coverage area. The extension in power enabled WHO to reach the entire Middle West and far beyond. Mail was received from Maine and Louisiana, remarking how clearly the signal was received.


To better reach the needs of its far-reaching audience, the WHO Radio News Bureau was created, bringing a professionally-staffed, fully-equipped news department to the public in 1935. Because 25% of all Grade A farmland was served by WHO's extended signal, the station then established the country's first farm news department. Although it started as an experiment in 1936, the Farm Service Department quickly became a model for others in the radio broadcast industry.

Early listeners to WHO Radio were tapping their feet to the Iowa Barn Dance Frolic, a local program of music and comedy on Saturday nights. WHO's first Sports Director, President Ronald Reagan, did play-by-play broadcasts of University of Iowa football games from 1932 to 1937, as well as "re-creations" of baseball games from within the studios. On the scene reports from newsmen Jack Shelley and Herb Plambeck during World War II, brought first-hand accounts to the homes of thousands. And the origination of "National Soil Conservation Days" provided listeners with agricultural updates and know-how.

After 63 years of service, WHO Radio continues to maintain its high standards, with comprehensive, award-winning news coverage and programming. 21 updated farm reports are heard daily, and listeners are able to hear discussions with guests and experts. Increased sports coverage, ranging from high school and college athletics to professional, brings the best in sports to our listeners.

WHO has always prided itself on its involvement with the lives of Iowans. Although much has been written here of the past, the future holds even greater responsibility.

In 1948, WHO was joined by its "sister" station, WHO-FM. Broadcasting on the FM frequency, the station offered high school sporting events, updated newscasts and music. As times changed, so did the role of FM stations. In 1973, new all-stereo equipment replaced the old and the station changed its call letters to KLYF. Adult Contemporary music can be heard on KLYF 100 FM 24 hours a day in homes, cars, office buildings and stores.

On April 26, 1954, WHO-TV was authorized to telecast on Channel 13 with maximum power. Since its beginning, the station has been affiliated with the NBC network. With an eye to the future, property at 1801 Grand was purchased and groundbreaking ceremonies held on April 10, 1981. Now, our beautiful three-story structure, containing more than 65,000 square feet of office and studio space on 2.5 acreas of land, houses WHO Broadcasting Company and the corporate offices for its parent company, Palmer Communications, Incorporated. The occupancy of the new building is yet another milestone in the fascinating history of the company, and opens more doors for future growth and added service to the community.

Good going on those New Jersey stations. The last two I never heard while I was living near Philadelphia, although I did hear WFPG-1450 on a f/c 20 years ago while I lived in Gary. Time for the soapbox, I guess. I was somewhat irritated while reading Karl Zuk's President's Report in the 11/26/88 DXM on Radio New York International. I think it should be somewhat obvious as to the reason why radio stations are licensed by the FCC -- it's to bring some semblence of order to the radio band as to what stations are broadcasting where. The FCC doesn't have that much power on program content other than obscenity. It won't even do anything about the half-hour commercials which masquerade as children's programs. I don't know how true it is but several years ago there were remarks that the pirates on 1605-1615 in the NYC area were interferring with the radio signals at the airports there. The fact that the RNI is broadcasting from a ship registered to another company outside the three mile limit doesn't hold water with me. The intent is to broadcast solely to this country. The BBC is a red herring. Britain and the US are parties to an agreement which decides how the frequency allocations will be handled. Newspapers aren't licensed for the reason that they don't interfere with each other in the same way two stations on the same channel will. I realize that if one goes back into newspaper history there are many unsavory chapters, dirty tricks and outright lies in the news columns. but the only way they would interfere with each other physically is if two newsboys hawking their papers tried to occupy the same two square feet on a street corner. If Milwaukee has two daily papers or fifty, it doesn't matter (except for my newspaper collection), it doesn't matter, but if two or more people decide they want to broadcast on 920, it does matter. The FCC seems to be doing a great job in allowing a lot of AM/FM stations on the air, judging by the Forums I read. With freedom comes responsibilities and one of them is to follow the rules which were designed to bring order out of chaos, and those who choose to flaunt the rules should be prepared to accept the penalties. The regulatory agencies (FCC, ICC, SEC, FDC, etc.) weren't designed in a vacuum for no reason. Enough.

### OTH Radar Planned for Middle of North America

Keith Seaver (P.O. Box 241, Portland ND 58274) reports that the US Air Force is getting ready to start on construction of the central sector of its Over-the-Horizon Backscatter Radar System. The Air Force announced officially on September 16, 1988 that the cite will located at the Grand Forks Air Force Base in North Dakota. The receiver is to be located near Thief River Falls in Minnesota. The announcement was from Joan Boatwright, deputy assistant secretary of the Air Force.

The central OTH system is of particular concern to all shortwave listeners and DX'ers because it inundates a populated area. About 80% of the Continental US and much of Southern Canada will be effected. See the map below for the coverage area. Petitions against the radar has already amassed hundreds of Signatures. Public meetings against the OTH radar also drew large, mostly hostile crowds. If you are also opposed (this editor sure hopes you are) you can write to the US Air Force and complain. I would also suggest sending copies of your letter to the Department of Defense and the President of the United States, Ronald Reagan as well as the President Elect of the United States George Bush.
