Interim KDXR Editor



- MOROCCO, Oujda 0236 10/17: Assumed w/gd carrier and weak audio. Much better 594 0340 w/m&f in AA, AA mx @xlnt level.
- t FRANCE, Marseille 0233 10/17: XInt w/lt. mx but did not stay for positive lang. 675 ID. At 0308, not as good and was not able to ID f speaker but did not appear to be AA (precluding Bengazi). (Likely France as suspected - anyone ever heard Libya?ed)
- SPAIN / unID, Sevilla 0228 10/17: An unID stn, not in SS, was noted at a good 684 level but the Spaniard took over by 0232 definately //774. (Beograd, possibly? ed)
- 693 ENGLAND / unID, Droitwich 0232 10/17: XInt w/big band mx w/someone underneath. Noted //909 earlier in the evening.
- 738
- SPAIN, Barcelona 0246 10/17: Fr/gd w/SS talk //774. unlD, 0239 10/17: Fr/gd w/mx, m in unlD lang. 0329 but does not appear to be FF 765 (which Sottens would run). The mx was western precluding some of the more exotic stn's on this freq. (e.g. Damman).
- 774 SPAIN, Caceres 0137-0400+ 10/17: Excellent, ear-splitting volume w/SS talk, mx //855/738/684. Perfectly readable on Sony ICF-7600D w/shotgun loop at 0330. Best signal I've ever noted from them.
- 837 uniD's, 0205 10/17: Xint w/SS mx and fast SAH noted. A guess would be Sevilla and/or Las Palmas.
- 846 ITALY, Roma 0142-0331+ 10/17: Gd-xlnt w/lt. mx. EE nx at 0203; FF nx at 0331 fol/by GG nx at 0333 agreeing perfectly w/WRTH schedule.
- 855 SPAIN / uniD, Murcia 0202 10/17: Excellent w/m-f alternating w/nx. Something
- mixing underneath at 0229. (Possibly Romania? ed)
 unlD, 0143-0240+ 10/17: A real puzzle. Gd-excellent w/AA chanting (not mx) at 864 various times thru period. Seems unlikely that Paris would run continuous AA pam though they do run AA in late evening (i.e., around 2300UT) which I've heard in England. The most likely possibility seems to be Santah, Egypt, although a weak Moroccan and a Saudi are also listed. Anyone else catch them? (Wish so, but I've been putting in much OT lately and missed most of this. ed)
- 909 ENGLAND, Moorside Edge 0144 10/17: Gd w/lt. mx //693.
- 954 uniD, 0145 10/17: Good w/m in unID language. A number of possibilities incl. Madrid.
- 1053 ENGLAND, Droitwich 0009 10/17: V gd w/mx //1089 (also at v gd level).
- 1107 EGYPT / unID's, Batra 0009 10/1/: V. powerful signal at tune-in w/AA mx. However, at 0135 a Blood, Sw at & Tears song was noted. Later at 0212, two distinct audios vying for dominance: one w/pop mx, the other w/AA chants at 0221. Possibly a third stn w/audio as well. A very complicated situation! Non-AA mx also noted at gd level 2312 10/14.
- uniD, 0220 10/17: A gd carrier but no audio discernable. (I've noted same here 1116 several times - often a strong carrier but audio very difficult. ed)
- WEST GERMANY, Wolfsheim 0222 10/17: V gd w/m in GG, It. mx. 1017
- 1062 DENMARK, Kalundborg 0401 10/15: Excellent w/m in Scandinavian lang. during xint N. European opening. (A fine logging, Rich. ed)
- 1134 YUGOSLAVIA, Zadar 0140 10/15: V gd w/mx. Also xlnt at 0104 10/15. Only fr evening of 10/16 (10/17 UTC) when lower latitudes dominated.
- USSR, Kaliningrad 2259 10/14: Gd w/IS (presumed R. Moscow WS IS). Excellent 1143 by 2313 //4765 (Cuban Mayak relay) w/opera. Also, outstanding 2323 10/15 //4765. Mayak IS noted at 2359/.
- 1179 SWEDEN, Soelvesborg 2257 10/14: Good w/piano mx noted at 2326; f in EE at 2327. Fr/gd 2312 10/15, IS and s/on theme noted at 2330. A fr carrier also noted at 0007 10/17, still in at 0152. This latter reception may not have been Sweden as cx were not that good to N. Europe and they are not scheduled on at the time.
 - 1197 unID, 2331 10/14: Excellent carrier but audio was very weak.
 - 1215 ALBANIA / uniD, Lushnje 0426 10/15 : Fr w/f in uniD lang. IS noted at 0429 but under another audio.
 - NORWAY, Kvitsøy 0114-0400+ 10/15: V gd/xlnt w/light mx and brief periods of 1314 talk. Man in NN noted at 0354, no pips on hour and back to vocal mx. Also very nice w/mx 0131 10/16.
 - 1377 unID, 0112 10/15: Fr carrier only. Kaliningrad on 1386 was very good at this time. Seems too late for Lille, perhaps something furtyher east. (I've never seen Iraq reported on the freq. but they run 1000kW. ed)

- 1386 USSR, Kaliningrad 2255 10/14: Gd w/man in lang. IS at 2300 - same as the unfamiliar one hrd at 0459 10/14 in previous report (see recent Special. ed). V gd w/m&f in RR //4765 at 0405 10/15. Gd //4765 at 2313 10/15, Mayak IS noted at 0030 10/16. Also fr-gd w/m in RR at 0214 10/17.

 ALBANIA, Lushnje 2256 10/14: Fr-gd w/Internationale. IS noted at 2258.

The Reference is an indispensable guide to what was reported the last three years, and where to find specific information about the receptions.



KSCO 1080 was still on with day power which I reported to Nancy as KLRS (ow that flipper hurts). Noted KEEN 1370 back on at 1921. On TV, 2 and 11 were off, half of the FM stations were off. KLIV 1590 was taking calls and using "Kara" slogans as well as KLIV calls (// with KARA 105.7). KFAX 1100 noted on at 2023, KDIA noted back at 2027. KFRC, which was on in the evening, noted off at 0330. Next morning, 1220, 1260, 1450 and 1550 still off. 1260 came on in the afternoon. KKHI came back Thursday morning, KDFC 1220 noted on at 1300 and KEST back at 1800. KGO reports 2 of their 3 towers are down and temporarily running with 22 kw. I was lucky.
