But there was a reason why the BCB clubs published weekly during the DX season...things happen fast. Even next day is not always fast enough but next month is usually history. Please let your Forum editors have your ideas and suggestions.

IRCA's Financial Condition

As covered in the IRCA Financial Status report written by Phil Bytheway and published last issue, 11/11/89, IRCA has, during the past 4 years, spent itself into the hole. There is currently only about enough money in the club's checking account to cover the Almanac orders received, the postage money not yet reimbursed for previous issues, and the printing and mailing of two or three more issues. There was no money this spring to pay the printer's bill though the club continued to publish full-size issues including a triple-weight Anniversary Issue. And we still owe for the money that has been loaned to pay the previous printer's overdue bills. However, it should be emphasized that IRCA is in no danger of financial collapse. Renewals, though we continue to lose membership, now cover the full cost of publishing the bulletin. This has been made possible by doing all of the mechanical work and using inexpensive philatelic postage; we no longer pay the Postal Service an annual fee for the privilege of not using stamps. Ralph Sanserino, your Publisher, will have more to say in a future issues. Your support of the IRCA by renewing promptly and keeping the club posted on your changes of address as well as purchasing club publications & reprints will assure the club continues for another 25 years. A more complete current financial statement, including an Income and Expenses statement, will appear early next year. -Donald Krickson, Secretary-Treasurer.

First of all, I want to offer my prayers and sympathies to an IRCA members who lost any family members in the recent Bay Area tragedy. Secondly, I sincerely hope that any IRCAns whose homes or property were destroyed by the quake will be able to recover their loses quickly. I've never been in an earthquake myself, but I can imagine what many of you might be going through. (Think of the ground rolling like a wave under your feet, surroundings rocking, your balance off, and unable to move - that's close, hi-RtH.) Naturally my first thought upon hearing the news was - radio coverage. On went the R-1000. I was surprised to find many CBS // to KCBS (KMOX and KKAR 1180 were two examples), so I decided to go down to 740 to look for the real thing, and there it was. KCBS was topping CBL at this QTH, so it must have stayed on day power to provide quake coverage to most of the western states. (Normally, Rick, KCBS is 50 kw day/night, but on lower power due to a tower loss-RtH). I then flipped up to 810 to look for much-wanted KGO. I nulled our KCMO (a feat in itself) and instantly heard news reports and phone calls on the jolt. Then came the ToH ID - WGY. (ToH: Top of the Hour?-RtH.) KNBR came in under KFEQ, which wasn't easy because KrEQ is nearly unnullable here. To finish up on my earlier days of DX'ing: in September '87 I entered my final year of school at the University of Iowa. I hadn't done any serious DX in upon hearing the news was - radio coverage. On went the R-1000. I was suryear of school at the University of Iowa. I hadn't done any serious DX in over 3 years because college was taking up so much of my time. A lot has happened in the past 2 months or so. Was in SoCal 21 to 24 September, seeing family in Anaheim and going to Disneyland. On the way down, heard KPUP 540 on the Superadio in Pismo Beach with a fair signal. Also heard a weak KTOM 1380, about 1730 PIT. Maybe KPUP's signal is mostly to the south? In Anaheim, noticed the city's TIS on 530 back on, but with no calls mentioned. The I-5/SR 55 TIS also heard in Santa Ana, but no LAX TIS heard 'til I got down that way. Locally, the KNRY/KRML CE runs a very low-powered TIS-type service on 1200 at an RV campground off Hwy. 1 in the town of Marina. There's also a low-powered station on 590 at Pacific Grove High School. Local radio changes: KNRY 1240 has dropped the Sun talk network for all CNN radio, except for Larry King and Mutual news weeknights 2300 to 0300 ELT. "MTC" was GWDXA's version of the forums (or musings). No one ever knew just what "MTC" stood for, though rumor had it that it stood for "milk the cow" as one of the GWDXA founding members had a bovine fetish. Karl J. Zuk, 154 Old Post Road North, Croton-on-Hudson, New York 10520 Hi, everybody! I'm reporting from Grass Valley, California, where I'm staying for two weeks. I'm learning how to repair and operate one of Grass Valley Group's video mixers. First, congratulations to Bill and Nancy Hardy! Another baby DXer has arrived! I recently attended a pirate radio operators convention hosted by the RNI folks. I saw an interesting technique of aiming a telescope at the sun and projecting the results from the eyepiece to a piece of white cardboard to observe sun-spots. They were very obvious, and I'm told that this is an excellent way to predict their activity. You can see how they change every 28 days. Don't ever look at the sun directly through a telescope! You'll damage your eyes permanently! The major conclusion of the fest was that Mororola heavily promoted their C-Quam AM stereo system to make the AM band decay, knowing that the system was poor. The band would die and then they could clean up by selling all sorts of transmitters and receivers to make use of the band for data or whatever. The NAB antenna project, transmitting from Maryland, is finally on the air. Using a 40 watt LPB transmitter, they have done preliminary tests on 1550 kHz using their anti-skywave antenna. In a nutshell, the antenna has two components. One is a standard vertical stick. The second is a horizontal dipole-like element mounted 3/4 of the way up the stick and supported by the vertical element's guy wires. By phasing the two elements, you can create a deep skywave null in one direction. They are also testing its properties as a receiving antenna, using stations like WTIC, WQXR, and WCBS as reference signals. If you would like details on the project, send me a SASE and I'll send you a copy of the NAB technical paper on the project. Speaking of WCBS, I could hear them near the New Hampshire/Canada border in broad daylight driving in my car, recently. Similar conditions exist here in Grass Valley: 24 hour a day reception of KSL and KOA for exam-The Sacramento airport TIS also can be heard with a radius of at least 40 miles, on 530 kHz, while travelling on I-80. KGO continues to get out fairly well considering the massive damage to their towers during the earthquake. Only one tower is now active. Finally, I visited Jay Lemmons, and his four lovely daughters, at KRAK in Sacramento. What a beautiful station, and what great people! Merry Christmas to everyone!
