

Hello one and all. I hope that everyone had a fine holiday season. I've not had much time for DX'ing in the past few months as it seems that I've either been working or sick. The few times I've turned on the receiver, not much of interest has been heard, except a few Central Americans on 60 meters. Which leads me to observe that perhaps it's time to rethink the purpose of IRCA. If we continue to be "devoted exclusively to broadcast band DX'ing" then the present interference levels on MW may just be discouraging more people from participating in BCB DX in general and from IRCA in particular. I $\mathrm{don}^{\mathsf{T}}\mathsf{t}$ think that having VHF FM coverage is necessarily the answer, as the techniques and hardware require ments are considerably different than what most of us have. Perhaps defining the coverage as 300 to 3000 kHz (the total MF spectrum), and restricting coverage to broadcast stations only (no utes, chirpers, beacons, etc.) would be beneficial. Sometimes when there's not much to be heard on MW, the 120-meter Aussies are in and that is better than turning the receiver off. When MW DX is really the pits, I can go up to 60 meters and usually hear something interesting. Covering broadcast stations 150 to 5050 kHz would enable IRCA to cover most SW parallels and also have something to write about when the MW cx are bummed out. Anyone remember slide rules? Is IRCA becoming obsolete, too? Anybody (especially foreign DX'ers) wanting info on Australia can get bewdy brochure from the Australian Tourist Commission, P.O. Box 5522, Norwood, MN 55383-5522. F.C.C. APPROVES "MEGASTATIONS"

- Steve Mittman

A new Federal Communications Commission ruling now permits ownership of two or more AM or FM stations on the same band, by the same party, in the same marketplace. The intention of the rule was to help floundering AM stations, though it applies to FM stations as well. By allowing stations to buy out nearby stations on the same or adjacent frequencies (which presumably cause interference to their coverage area), and for them to then either turn the offending station off the air or have it become a simulcast relay, the station is able to thus "extend" its coverage area.

The following report aired on the Cable News Network and CNN Headline News on Monday, January 1, 1990:

Anchor: "The Federal Communications Commission recently changed the rules governing ownership of multiple radio stations in the same market. The development is leading to a new broadcast entity called a 'megastation.' Jack Poorman explains:"

Poorman: "At one time or another you've probably flipped from one station to another and heard the same song at the same time, on two different stations. But thanks to a recent ruling, you might actually be hearing not just the same song, but the same radio station -- broadcasting on two different frequencies. That was made possible when the F.C.C. relaxed what it calls its 'duopoly rules.' The change allows station owners to buy properties on the same band that are geographically closer together than under previous rules. According to the F.C.C., it started as an idea to bolster the floundering AM band."

Bill Johnson, Deputy Chief, Mass Media Bureau, Federal Communications Commission: "One of the problems that AM is facing is that there is too much noise and interference on the AM dial. And there have been proposals by AM stations to buy out the stations that are causing the interference, combine the facilities of the two stations, and result in one surviving, larger entity, that suffers less interference and can provide better service."

Poorman: "But despite the best intentions of the F.C.C. to help AM radio, the first station owners to capitalize on the ruling set their sights on the more lucrative FM band. Among the first stations in the country to simulcast the same program on two FM frequencies: Y-106 and Y-104 in Atlanta [WYAY-106.7 Gainesville and 104.1 La Grange]. The radio station took to the television airwaves to promote its unique situation:

T.V. Commercial: [Shows a man standing in front of a large map of Atlanta. Concentric circles emanate from the upper righthand corner, labeled "106.7."] "This is Atlanta... If you live down here (points to lower left), you've had a problem -- until now. Now Y-106 has another transmitter at 104.1 FM."

Poorman: "But so far the combined marketshare for Y-106 and Y-104 was $\underline{\text{down}}$ from the previous ratings period when they had only one transmitter."

Y-106 General Manager: "I was disappointed because, you know, when you come on with something this big, you hope that it's going to be gang-busters, and take over. But you have to realize, too, that it is so new, that it's going to take some time. As far as long-term goals, we would like to put our competition out of business."

Poorman: "Their competition, Kicks 101.5 FM, is currently the ratings leader in the battle to be the #1 country station. Their general manager says he's not too concerned about the megastation:"

Kicks-FM General Manager: "You must deal in the limited area that's called the 'metro area.' There's eighteen counties, I believe, in this metro area. If I cover it, and they need two stations to cover it, we'll compete on the programming. Currently it seems like we have the best programming because the votes are in from the Arbitron."
