TRIVIA QUESTION OF THE MONTH

From January: pending the return to the air of silent and about-to-be-sold WVAB-1550, the largest city in the U.S. in terms of population with no functional AM stn is Virginia Beach, VA - now the most populous city in Virginia, with nearly 300,000 people and no AM of its own! Of course if you count North York, Ont. separately from Toronto (and who wouldn't, hi...) it has nearly double that population, and no radio of its own.

For February: the move of CJMR-1190 Mississauga to 1320 KHz last month leaves Canada, for the time being, with no full-power (250 w or more) daytime-only stations. Name four other former Canadian daytimers who've shed that status in the last ten years - and how they've done it.

In March: beware of a mondo mundo anniversary ?, now being researched!

- 810 BAHAMAS, Freeport-ZNS3 1/15 0500-0900 Very good signal again to-night w/usual rel. programming interspersed w/mx interludes. This station has become a semi-regular catch here. (TRH-CA)
- t COLOMBIA, Bogota-HJCY-Radio Sutatenza-weak u/o KGO nulled with Colombian mx and YL anc. Woman said "....Sutatenza..."(I think) at one point at 0630 on 1/29. This used to be regular back in the early 80s when KGO was off. Haven't heard it in several years. At 250 KW, I would think it would be reported more often. Possible 24 hour operation, even though it is listed as a 0500 s/off. Tentative report sent. (PM-OR)
- 920 MEXICO, Ensenada-XESDA? 1/14 2129 Noted w/Rock 92 and La Estacion de los Exitos slogans. Station only seems to ID once a day, usually around 0630, shortly before s/off. Still trying to confirm call letters. (TRH-CA)
- 950 MEXICO, Hermosillo-XEPB-MM 1/15 0342 Booming in w/SS Adcon mx, lots of IDs and same slogans as previously reported. Local XEKAM-890-950-1010 was off this evening. First time I've caught XEPB at home. (TRH-CA)
- 1520 MEXICO, Ciudad Juarez-XEJBC? 1/17 at 1159. New station, noted with anthem and s/on anmts. Several call letter IDs (I'm sure about everything except the B...could be a D or P. Third letter is definitely J, not H as have been reported). Radio Paso del Norte slogan. New XE #166. (TRH-CA)

- 1098 MARSHALL ISLANDS, Majuro-WSZO from 0902,Inst. MOR mx followed by announcer (male),in EE. Clear mentions of Marshall Islands. Faded to het by 0909,retune at 1002 until 1010 fade again and mention of Marshall Islands. Audio weak at all times.1/22. (JB-NHP-BC)
- 1475 t MALAYSIA, Sabah-Vy low audio at 1115, Language either Malay or Indonesian 1/22. (JB-NHP-BC)



I wanted to follow up my lengthy forum on KPPC 1240 with some detailed technical information on their single center fed "t" longwire antenna. This came from their engineer at the time in 1982: "In 1936 when power was increased to 100 watts, the present antenna configuration, a top-loaded "T," consisting of #8 gauge cold drawn copper wire, strung between two 90-foot self-supporting towers was installed on the roof of the Pasadena Star-News. The principal difference between this system and other types using a longwire (such as the four-wire flat-top of KGFJ 1230), is that the actual radiating element is the vertical lead (121 feet) with the horizontal wire element actually acting as a capacitive load. The system was last completely replaced in the early '50s in conjunction with a ground system of copper mesh grids installed under the tar paper of the roof, and a fan of #8 and S gauge copper wire running into a series of strategically placed grounds (earth) on the lot next door. Actually, many of these grounds are silver-soldered to buried, large, copper "stills" used by bootleggers during Prohibition. These were donated to the church for KPPC's use at reduced price by the government in the '30s." Anyone know how many other stations are or were licensed with this type of antenna system in the last 10 years? The CE after hearing my tape of KPPC recorded on a Sunday midday with 1240 in San Bernardino at 250 watts, said, "With only the longwire and 100 watts, KPCC does surprisingly well." With their sked now sunset to sunrise and 250 watts 6 days and 24 hours on Sunday, it'll be interesting to see what KPCC decides to do when their current antenna and towers come down. As far as I know, a target date for the current antenna to come down hasn't been decided. 73 'til next time de Jim.

Thanks to RtH for his support of my rantings and ravings in my last forum. DX has been mostly of the short-skip variety lately - such as it is. I've reported it to the various columns. Got a nice letter from fellow IRCAn Tim Kridel up at the U of MO, Columbia - let's hear more MO members. KGBX 1400 is now // 100% with their FM 105.9 with all live jocks. IDs as "KGBX Springfield, KGBX-FM Bolivar/Springfield." Their AM is C-Quam stereo and sounds very good on my mono-only radios; the FM is processed to hell and back and sounds awful. I need to augment/replace my little TRF with a real radio, so I combed my DXM and DXN back issues to see what rx/ant combinations are being used (or at least, listed in the various loggings columns 'tho not real scientific, hi.) Topping the list seems to be the Superadio I and II, followed by (closely) the Sony ICF-2010 - regardless of the horror stories about the front end IC blowing up from static, etc. Next in line: the old Icom R-70, FRG-7, newer Icom R-71, Realistic TRF, Kenwood R-1000 and Collins R390. Next come Sangean ATS-803, Panasonic RF-2200, Hammarulunds (HQ150/160), Racals (6790/RA-17), Kenwoods (R-5000/R-600), as well as Kenwood and Icom ham transceivers; the Drake R-7 and SPR-4; Realistic DX-160/302/400; McKay Dymek AM7; and various portables and AM-FM stereo receivers. It's interesting to compare this with the listings in the 1977/8 IRCA Foreign Log (Vol. 7). A dozen years ago the most popular rx by far was the FRG-7, with the HQ-180, DX-160, R-390 and Realistic TRF (!) in a dead heat for 2nd place - SPR-4 and SP-600 only slightly behind them. Other nostalgia - inducing rigs used at the time were Lafayette HE-30?HE

600; DX-150A; National HRO and NC-183; Hallicrafters SK-99; HQ-129X/140X. This suggests a few trends: 1) The GE has filled the "cheap but good portable" niche once dominated by the TRF; 2) the Sony 2010 seems to be filling the niche left by the demise of the DX-160, FRG-7 and other low-to-mid-priced tabletop rigs (we need more of the latter, don't you think?); 3) the old tube "boat-anchors," excellent though they were for MW, are getting mighty scarce; 4) the newer solid-state communications rx seem to be popular, despite their often reduced sensitivity on the BCB. If anyone has any thoughts on "appropriate" rx for BCB DX, I'd like to hear from you. Maybe next time I'll report on antenna useage. 73 from the Buckle of the Bible Belt.

Howdy folks. Well, I'm happy to announce that I've just finished sending in what should be my last batch of Almanac material, after about 8 weeks of staying up past midnight 3 or 4 nights a week working on the stuff. This last batch (I didn't count the pages, but they weighed over a pound!) contained updated network lists for 19 or 20 networks, 3 talk shows, a couple music programs and satellite feeds and all major and minor league sports. DX has been slow lately, although conditions have seemed quite good at times. Like most of us, I had absolutely no luck with the recent CPC Tests. In fact, almost all of my recent new catches have been new XE stations or frequency changes. Speaking of XE stations, I plan on writing to the Mexican Embassy and a few Mexican government agencies to see if I can scare up some fresh info for a new Mexican list. Neil Kazaross, John Wilkins, Chris Knight and I have spent a lot of time monitoring the Mexican AM band. But who knows how many changes we haven't stumbled on to yet? I used to get station lists from the Mexican Embassy when I was a teen. Wonder if they're still friendly now? Local news: KPOP 1360 has finally livened up its format a bit, replacing big BLAND with some good big BAND! They had been trying to capitalize on the uproar caused when former ratings leader KJQY 103.7 switched from BFL to an awkward EZL mix. KFMB 760 seems to have changed night pattern and/or increased power. The station has been announcing that they wanted to put more signal to the north to serve listeners in Orange County. Recently, they've seemed stronger to the north while here to the south I recently heard WJR poking right through them one night. They're killing us at the Beverage site, overloading my 2010 with false images. Here's hoping the DX improves all-around. 73 de TRH.

Looking through some of my old logbooks from the 1926-29 period, I felt a pang of sympathy for today's DX'ers on the trail of elusive stations. Sympathy because while many of them use much better receivers than I had, there is just no way under the sun they could find the kind of DX'ing accomplishments that came so easily for me more than 50 years ago. This was DX'ing from Dallas, using a 6-tubes Thermiodyne receiver, powered by a couple of 45-volt B batteries and one 6-volt A battery. The latter was identical to the battery used in your car in those days, and when it got low, you could tell because your tubes didn't light up so brightly anymore. All of those 6 tubes were 01As, Cunningham tubes, a tube maker eventually swallowed up by RCA. I kept track of stations heard in a variety of ways, one by one as I got 'em of course, but then I would go through the logbooks, probably in the summer, to summarize my DX'ing accomplishments. I would list them by state, city and I kept another record of stations heard more than 1,000 miles from Dallas. The city record is the most interesting to me now. It shows I logged 37 stations in Chicago, 22 in the Los Angeles area, 18 in the New York City area, 11 in Toronto, 11 in San Francisco, 7 in Mexico City, 6 in Kansas City, 4 in Philadelphia, 4 in Detroit, 7 in Denver, 6 in Milwaukee, 6 in San Antonio, 4 in Nashville, 4 in Seattle, 3 in Portland, OR, 4 in Tampa-St. Petersburg, 3 in Pittsburgh, 2 in Boston, 2 in Spokane, 3 in Miami, 3 in Cincinnati, 4 in Washington, DC, 4 in Vancouver and 4 in Calgary. Maybe that's enough to make my point. No DX'er in Dallas area nowadays will be able to log 22 in L.A. or 18 in NYC. Nor is it any discredit to them, for the FCC, and today's stations have both devoted themselves to destroying the DX conditions that I knew in those days. In that era, the only all night station I had to contend with was KGfJ, a hundred watter in L.A. I didn't like it being there one bit, but never realized it represented the wave of the future. So I wish everyone good DX, but I don't believe you're likely to find it.
