First off it's quite distressing to me to see on going battles in the club. The idea of scrapping CDXR to me is shall we say not a good move. I joined IRCA so I could report to a column that represented what I hear. Now I admit some of the reporters do live a fair distance from 7

me and the DX they hear is going to be tough if not impossible to hear up here but at least it gives me a fighting chance at them. The DX in the other two report sections is marginal at best for me. There's no way I'll be hearing a lot of what is heard on either coast but I still go through these two columns every issue to help (hopefully) ID some of my unIDs. Being in the middle of the continent does have the advantage of being able to hear both coasts most of the time. As for the editor of CDXR, John Johnson is doing a fantastic job of putting together a column. Geov Parrish, 1201 South Court House Road, #240, Arlington, VA 22204 I try not to chew up too much valuable space elsewhere, since BI takes more than enough of DXM's lines already, but some of the issues raised in recent DXMs beg comment. 1) I agree with Steve Mittman et al on the penny-wise, pound-foolish nature of DXM's editing and page layouts. I fall to see how we can attract and retain new members when they miss valuable information, either because it wasn't printed or because it was there and they couldn't find it or make sense of it. DXM seems utterly impenetrable to someone unfamiliar with it. When weire left with only the handful of regular contributors who can understand the codes and abbreviations and make the column deadlines, we lose more than we save. 2) There's been lots of discussion on how to save printing costs, but I've seen very little on alternative ways to generate more income. Outside publications have traditionally covered some of the gap, and aside from the tardy Almanac nothing seems to be in the hopper. Same for auctions, contests or other fund-raising ideas. I'm also not aware that IRCA markets ITSELF in any meaningful way to attract new members. Why rely on just one strategy (12 page DXMs)? 3) I'm absolutely opposed to adding spectrum space to IRCA's mandate, with the possible exception of FM.
