Due to time constraints, a detailed rundown of each test from this past DX season is not possible. All of the tests are confirmed as having aired as scheduled, except as noted below. Also, below are listed the results of rescheduled tests.

MONDAY, OCTOBER 5, 1996 - WYTI-1570, ROCKY MOUNT, VA. Despite a telephone confirmation the previous Friday afternoon, this test did not run. It was resceeduled for November 9th.

MONDAY, OCTOBER 7, 1996 - WAPF-980, MCCOMB, MS. Another no-show despite a telephone confirmation. the CE said that it did run, however (even though no one heard it). It was rescheduled for January 13, 1997.

MONDAY, OCTOBER 14, 1996 - WAKK-1140, MCCOMB, MS. This test from the sister station to WAPF (above) was another no-show despite a telephone confirmation. Rescheduled for January 13th of '97.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 9, 1996 - WYTI-1570, ROCKY MOUNT, VA. A no-show for a second time - again desorte a telephone confirmation the previous Friday afternoon. It was rescheduled yet again for February 1st of '97.

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 18, 1996 - KALM-1290, THAYER, MO. No confirmed loggings were noted in DX bulleting. but KALM's Program Manager said the test did run and that one report was received from a DXer near St. Louis. Reports from other DXers in that part of the country, however, reported hearing nothing. A "repeat" of this test was offered and n was arranged for February 24th.

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 14, 1996 - KSTL-690, ST. LOUIS, MO. This test was confirmed with the CE by phone the day before the test, yet nothing was heard but regular programming. Your CPC chairman called the following week to inquire, and the CE said that the block of time which had been alotted for the test was sold to a religious group, which is why the test didn't run. It was rescheduled for March 24th.

MONDAY, DECEMBER 30, 1996 - KISL-630, ST. LOUIS, MO. The test from this sister station to KSTL-690 (above) was also confirmed with the CE by phone, yet nothing was heard but regular programming. Rescheduled for March 24th.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 4, 1997 - KXNO-1140, LAS VEGAS, NV. Despite a phone confirmation, made the day before the test, with their CE that this test would run, nothing was noted by DXers except regular programming. Numerous phone calls made by your CPC chairman in hopes of rescheduling this test were not returned.

SATURDAY, JANUARY 11, 1997 - KPQ-560, WENATCHEE, WA. No reports of this test were seen in the DX bulletins, and inquiries to their CE were not answered.

MONDAY, JANUARY 13, 1997 - WAKK-1140, MCCOMB, MS. This rescheduled test did run, and was widely heard. For convenience, the rescheduled test for sister station WAPF-980 aired immediately after this, as both operate out of the same studios.

MONDAY, JANUARY 13, 1997 - WAPF-980, MCCOMB, MS. Unlike the previous test which your CPC chairman was informed did run, this one was actually heard by DXers, and aired immediately after the test from sister station WAKK-1140 (see above).

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 1, 1997 - WYTI-1570, ROCKY MOUNT, VA. The third time's the charm, as this one finally ran as scheduled, and was widely heard.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 24, 1997 - KALM-1290. THAYER, MO. Again, no loggings were noted for the KALM test. Inquaring messages left by your CPC chairman for the test personnel were not answered.

SUNDAY, MARCH 23, 1997 - KKFJ-570, ALTURAS, CA. A phone confirmation revealed that their CE had gone on vacation for 2 weeks. Thus, a no show. It was rescheduled for April 27th.

MONDAY, MARCH 24, 1997 - KJSL-690, ST. LOUIS, MO. This rescheduled test was widely heard. For convenience, the rescheduled test for sister station KJSL aired right after this, as both operate from the same studios.

MONDAY, MARCH 24, 1997 - KJSL-630, ST. LOUIS, MO. This rescheduled test aired immediately after the test from sister station KJSL-690 (see above).

SUNDAY, APRIL 6, 1997 - WHK-1420, CLEVELAND, OH. This station moved to new studios near the date of the test, and the cassette tape with Morse code IDs was misplaced. CE Dave Johnson (who also ran the test from WHLUM AARON) has promised a test from WHK this coming Fall.

MONDAY, APRIL 7, 1997 - WKWF-1600, KEY WEST, FL. This was confirmed by phone with their CE the Friday before the test, but no loggings were reported - even by Florida DXers.

SUNDAY, APRIL 27, 1997 - KKFJ-570, ALTURAS, CA. No loggings of this rescheduled test were reported by DXers, and inquiries to their CE by your CPC chairman have not been answered.




