1998 IRCA Convention Summary

The 1998 IRCA convention was held in Missoula, Montana, the weekend of August 14-16. The headquarters was the 4B's Inn and Conference Center. Ten members attended: John Adams (OR), Phil Bytheway (WA), Fred Eatock (CA), Nigel Pimblett (AB), Mike Sanburn (CA), Craig Siegenthaler (WA), Pete Taylor (WA), Stan Weisbeck (WA), Reid Wheeler (WA), and host Larry Godwin.

Mike Sanburn from Bellflower, California, was the first member to arrive, and also the one attending from the farthest point. As it turned out, August 15 was Mike's birthday so we helped him celebrate at the banquet.

The convention events included a tour of the joint studios of locals KGRZ-1450 and KYLT-1340 on Friday. That evening Mike entertained the group with his gala radio station slide show.

On Saturday Craig Siegenthaler demonstrated his cottage-industry-produced Kiwa MW Loop and Pocket Loop Antennas, a Broadband Preamp, and a new product, a rotatable outdoor MW loop. The official IRCA Business Meeting, with President Phil Bytheway presiding, followed. During this session, Elections Committee Chairman Reid Wheeler reported the results of recent balloting: John Johnson won this year's TVA Award, and Nick Hall-Patch won the Heald Award.

At 6:00 we converged on the Sizzler Restaurant for our banquet. Our guest speaker was Joe Bowers, Director of Engineering, Sunbrook Communications, and Chief Engineer of KGRZ. Joe is a DXer himself and shared his perceptions of the status and future of the AM broadcast industry.

At 8:00 Phil and Mike conducted the annual IRCA auction. Bidding was pretty low-key this year, but the club netted about \$100, thanks mainly to the donation of a pocket loop by Craig Siegenthaler.

Our planned DXpedition at Maclay Flat didn't materialize due to member fatigue and the prospect of thunderstorms in the area. The last event was a lunch at Noon on Sunday at the Mustard Seed restaurant.

In summary, this was a sparsely-attended meeting compared to those of some years, but it accomplished the goal of providing a weekend of socializing with a few activities that only idiosyncratic hobbyists like ourselves would appreciate.

1998-1999 IRCA "Call Letter Scrabble" DX CONTEST RULES

The contest will be open to all IRCA members in good standing. Entrants will be disqualified if they cease to be members of the

- The contest will run from 0001 ELT September 1, 1998 through 2359 May 31, 1999. Stations may be submitted for scoring through June 5, 1999, but reception must be made during the above stated contest period.
- You must enter prior to January 1, 1999, except that new members
- may join within 30 days of membership.
 All loggings must be done within 25 miles of your main DX location. Normally, this is your home, for students this might be your college dorm. If a person moves during the contest, a decision on how to handle it will be made at that time on the individual factors.
- The contest manager will have the final word on all stations and interpretation of all rules, including disqualification of a station for scoring or a member from the contest.
- Your contest report of stations heard in any particular month must be postmarked by the 5th day of the following month. For example, a station heard on October 12th must be submitted by November 5th to be eligible. Failure to do this will disqualify the item in question for points.
- Contest entries must not be sent along with WDXR DX items as they easily become lost when filed away in the WDXR file.
- For the purposes of the contest, once a station is reported it remains for the entire year. You may not substitute stations after they have been reported.
- Standings will be updated on the 15th of each month and results published in the next available bulletin subject to normal deadline delays. The final standings will be tabulated on June 15, 1999 and will appear in the July bulletin, subject to space in that bulletin.
- 10. The contest manager will not be eligible to join the contest.
- 11. There is no entry fee for the contest.
- 12. Stations must be in the normal 530-1710 kHz band, licensed by the US or Canada. TIS and utility stations are not eligible for contest purposes. Loggings may be first time heard or relogs of stations heard before.
- To count a US station, you must hear the actual call letters. To 13. count a Canadian station, you must hear the actual call letters or hear a recognized slogan plus location.
- 14. Contest entries may be sent via e-mail to the address listed above. E-mail entries must not be "attached files" nor mixed with a WDXR report. Postal entries are to be sent to the street address in the masthead of WDXR column.
- Standings will be updated monthly after the cut off date and 15. results will appear in the next possible bulletin subject to space available.
- Entry in the contest implies consent to all rules, including those 16. which may appear later as necessity dictates.
- Prize: One only \$5.00 IRCA Bookstore Credit for the contest entrant with the most final points.
- The object of this contest, "Call Letter Scrabble," is to hear up 18. to 3 (three) stations in each of the fifty states and ten

provinces and two territories of Canada. D.C. will be considered a 51st state for this contest, but the three districts of the Northwest Territories will be considered one province.

Each letter of each call is worth a point value equal to the 19. Milton Bradley "Scrabble Brand Crossword Game" board game. These points are listed below. It is worthwhile to pick out target stations worth the most value for each state. Remember, you may not substitute stations after they have been reported!

Milton-Bradley "Scrabble Crossword Game" letter point values are as follows: A=1 B=3 C=3 D=2 E=1 F=4 G=2 H=4 I=1 J=8 K=5 L=1 M=3

N=1 O=1 P=3 Q=10 R=1 S=1 T=1 U=1 V=4 W=4 X=8 Y=4 Z=10. Example: For Wyoming you log KWYO, KZMQ, and KTWO. KWYO would be 21. 5+4+4+1=14 points. KZMQ would be 5+10+3+10=28, and KTWO would be 5+1+4+1=11 for a total Wyoming point total of 53. The better the call letter point value, the better the state total points.


