# 153 transmission

Due to late arrival of some important parts for establishing the programme feed to Ingoy, the planned special broadcast will be postponded slightly. It's now been scheduled to take place on FRIDAY 6TH OF OCTOBER between 1900 and 2300 UTC.

The transmitter was put on the air yesterday at half power (50 kW) and should now be operating at full power 100 kW. Until the studiofeed is ready during next week, the transmitter will relay NRK P1 (including regional programmes from NRK Finnmark). As soon as the studio feed is OK, programme will be switched to NRK Europakanalen (// Kvitsøy 1314 kHz) but with regional programmes from NRK Finnmark as well.

This will give you an opportunity to listen to 153 kHz from now on, and be fully prepared for the special show to be broadcast in English and Norwegian on friday the 6th. A special QSL-card will be available for correct reception reports to that broadcast, and we plan to mail them from Ingoy with the postmarks of the local Ingoy postoffice. A goodie for you stampcollectors as well!

Until the coming friday, feel free to give us a status-report on how you receive the signal!

I HEARD IT, I HEARD IT (NRC items used by permission):

- 1180 WJNT MS, Jackson, several fairly clear Morse Code IDs from 0100-0107 EDT 9/30, just before Coast to Coast AM. Was surprised to hear this with the Cuban blatting away with KOFI and KLAY in there. (PM-OR)
  - +Sporadic code noted under WHAM and the Cubans, sure doesn't sound like 50 kw ND. (Steve Francis/NRC)
  - +Got up at 0125, hrd Coast to Coast AM about equal to Rebelde at best, sometimes much weaker, 3 cw IDs at 0130 break, could not understand the local cutaway, only IDed via CW. Not an especially good signal, for 50kw. RX a Radio Shack DX399 portable, no ext ant. In Tampa FL Bob Foxworth/NRC.
  - +Being so close to WHAM, I had my doubts about hearing WJNT... also, they are in almost exactly the same direction from me, so nulling WHAM wouldn't help much. However, I tried tilting my loop way up to try and get a high-angle null on WHAM while letting WJNT slip through underneath... maybe it helped. I had a hint they were there shortly after TOH when I noticed a pronounced echo on the CBS newscast from WHAM. Sure enough, there were several CW IDs from WJNT that came through clear as a bell after the news, along with ads and other talk that was hard to decipher. MS is never an easy catch from here (1183 miles from WJNT), so I was happy to log this one (but I'm still bummed that I never heard WGSR-1570!). (Barry McLarnon/NRC)
  - +9/30 0200 Tuned in toward the end of the test period and heard a very clear, fast morse code "WJNT" right before the top of the hour. Way under the Cubans in KERI null. There's no way this was 50kW non-directional. New MS #2(Tim Hall-CA)
  - +For location and equipment shortcomings I figured logging the test on air wouldn't be possible so I went to the WJNT website. Very nice, an interesting program crystal-clear. I'll contact Mr. Stan Carter with many thanks. Good DXing from Bill in Cave Junction, OR. (William Flynn-OR)
  - +9/30, 0100-0200, DX TEST, after reviewing my tape, got a strong code ID right after 0100 under/over KOFI. Going to send taped report. (Frank Aden-ID)
  - +Surprised to hear this in southern Alberta too, with Cuban pounding in as Pat noted, and also the pest from Montana, KOFI. Only definite items I noted were the code IDs prior to 0107 and again after 0130, but I'm still happy, as that's a new state for me. (Nigel Pimblett-AB)

New issue of DXN says WQRS are the new calls for 1660-Marco Island, FL, but I heard them here in DC last night o/u WWRU with nostalgia music still IDing as WMIB.

Pat sends along the following from Kevin Redding of Mesa, AZ.:

In the Phoenix market KGME 550 and KFYI 910 are to switch frequencies this evening (9/25/00-ye ed.) at midnight. Both stations are owned by the megacorp Clear Channel. The 550 frequency one year ago belonged to KOY which had that frequency since the 1920s, is also owned by Clear Channel. For Clear Channel to move the 910 KFYI signal to 550 is tantamount to the Clear Channel elecs admitting moving the highly listened to KOY to a peanut whistle frequency of 1230 as a major mistake. The 550 frequency is the most valuable in Arizona and covers more of the state than any other. This will help KFYI to gather more listeners. The move of KGME to 550 from 1350 by Clear Channel was a dismal failure because KGME never achieved more than about a 2 share where KOY had always gathered between a 4.2 and 5 share consistently with its Oldies and AC format. My opinion which

is worth less than two cents is that Clear Channel had made a mistake moving KOY off to 1230 and they are losing advertising dollars over it. They will never move KOY back to 550 because they don't want to lose face and the best they can do is move KFYI which has outperformed KGME consistently to the 550 spot. I find this particularly amusing and get a bit of satisfaction out of it since the sports shock jocks at KGME were so disgusting in the treatment of the KOY listeners in the first hour of their programming. I think that the failure of KGME to reach the desires of the Clear Channel gurus is kind of a fitting justice for that treatment. As for KFYI in all of this, some of the KFYI new programming leaves me puzzled, especially in the night slots. We will all have to see how this will shake out.

Tigers, Red Wings to move broadcasts to WXYT

Detroit's sports-radio landscape shifted dramatically Thursday when the Detroit Tigers and Red Wings informed WJR-AM (760) that the teams will be moving to WXYT (1270) in a six-year deal worth up to \$50 million.

The announcement was to be made formally at a news conference today. But Steve Stewart, operations chief for WJR, said Thursday that the station had been told it had lost the two teams' play-by-play rights. Announcers for the two teams are expected to shift to WXYT.

WJR had been the flagship station for the Tigers since 1961, and for Red Wings games since the early '70s, but it could not match the money or promotional promise WXYT's owner, CBS/Infinity Broadcasting, offered in its package.

WXYT will begin airing Wings games as early as next week and will assume Tigers broadcasts next season. The station already is the originating station for Detroit Lions broadcasts.

In opting for WXYT as a flagship station, the Tigers and Red Wings must at least temporarily live with WXYT's weak (5,000-watt) signal, which requires a string of affiliate stations to reach a statewide audience. WXYT is expected to petition the Federal Communications Commission for a boost to 50,000 watts, matching WJR's signal.

WXYT also is expected to turn to an all-sports format that would pit it against all-sports WDFN-AM (1130).

Mike sends along more on the subject:

It's official: Detroit Red Wing games will switch from WJR-AM (760) to WXYT-AM (1270) in a few weeks, and the Detroit Tigers will move to WXYT starting next season.

After that, though, it gets a little hazy.

At a Friday news conference at Comerica Park, WXYT general manager Rich Homberg and Chris and Denise Ilitch (whose family owns the two teams) toasted the six-year, \$50-million deal.

It puts together all six Detroit-area radio stations and two TV stations that are owned by CBS/Infinity Broadcasting to better market the two teams, they said.

But there were still unanswered questions, such as:

\* WXYT, now a talk station, will go all sports -- so does syndicated conservative entertainer Rush Limbaugh have a future at the station? "I'm not talking about it," Homberg said Friday. He did say that Glenn Haege's weekend home-improvement show will remain on WXYT. Haege is said to bring in a large portion of the station's revenues.

- \* When will WXYT go all sports? Soon, Homberg said. But no date was given.
- \* What will WXYT do about its 5,000-watt signal, which covers a far smaller area than WJR's 50,000-watt signal? Homberg said the station planned to petition the federal government to increase the station's power, and in the interim, he had handshake agreements with five radio stations outside Detroit to air Wings and Tiger games.
- \* When will the first Wings game air on WXYT? Homberg said the station will certainly carry the first game, but said nothing about the remainder of the exhibition season, which ends Oct. 1.
- \* What happens if an on-air personality on one of the six CBS/ Infinity radio stations criticizes the Tigers or Wings, since Homberg and the Ilitches described the deal as a "partnership"? Homberg said there would be no muzzling of comment but added, "We have a journalistic arrangement." He didn't elaborate.

Pat sends along the following from Tim Hall of Chula Vista, CA.: MEXICO: Per the Mexican SCT's web site

(http://www.sct.gob.mx/satelital/am/am\_sin.html), XECU-1470 Los Mochis has indeed moved to 1450 kHz and increased their day power to 10kW (still 1kW nights). Sydney radio ratings, found today (tomorrow actually, it's the Sept. 27 edition!) in the Sydney Morning Herald, while looking for Olympic news:

Alan Jones helps 2UE steal the Sydney show By DAVID DALE

2UE is close to stealing 2DAY's crown as Sydney's most-heard radio station, according to ratings figures released yesterday by ACNielsen.

With an increase of 1.4 percentage points since July, 2UE now attracts 13.8 per cent of mainstream stations' listeners - equal to the share attracted by 2DAY (which declined by 0.7 points).

Much of 2UE's success can be attributed to gains of 2.1 points in the ratings of Alan Jones at breakfast and John Stanley on the afternoon shift, while 2DAY's biggest loss was 1.7 points in the afternoon shift hosted by Cathy Dinn.

The audience figures were measured between August 13 and September 16, so the effect of Olympic coverage is minimal.

After 2UE, the biggest gainer was 2WS FM, which rose 1.3 points to 7.4 per cent of the mainstream audience. The biggest loser was MIX 106.5, which dropped 1.2 points to 8.3 per cent, with the main decline in the mornings with Bogart Torelli. This will come as good news to those who like the rock music of the 1960s, which dominates the 2WS format but is excluded from the MIX music format.

The biggest gains for 2UE were in the 25- to 39-year age group, which is much loved by advertisers, the age group where MIX suffered its biggest loss.

## COMMENTS:

Sept 22 was what I'm told is unusual for this time of the year on the Pacific coast, with reception conditions favoring Australia, almost exclusively. Nothing was heard from New Zealand, the Pacific Islands or, especially, Japan. September 23s dawn was what I'd been led to expect for this time of year: Japan and Korea, with little else available. September 24 was also unusual with BOTH Japan and Australia pounding in simultaneously. Previously, even when I've heard both countries on the same morning, the reception windows have been at different times, with conditions "switching" from Australia to Japan, etc. On September 24, Japan was available on the northwesterly beverage and Australia was available to the southwest at the same time and often on the same frequencies. September 25 was rather disappointing, with reception conditions having deteriorated markedly. Tho' stations were received from Japan, Korea and - late - Australia, the only really high quality reception was from the Korean peninsula.

Looking at all four days, the reception was probably considerably better on MW than we had any right to expect here at the peak of the sunspot cycle. The fact that most trans-Pacific DX was confined to the dawn enhancement period was not very limiting thanks to the relatively shallow angle of the sun in this northerly location. Dawn enhancement lasted at least two hours each morning. Wonderful!


