WAGL-1560, Lancaster, SC - tested Saturday, January 20, 2001 from 1:00-2:00 am EST:

Nick Hall-Patch in Victoria, BC, Patrick Martin in Seaside, OR, Frank Aden in Boise, ID, Tom Jasinski in Shorewood, IL, Gordon Bell near Troy, NY, Larry Russell in Flushing, MI, and Chris Knight in Fort Lupton, CO (near Denver) all report hearing the test, but John Wilkins on the other side of Denver in Wheat Ridge, CO, Pete Taylor in Tacoma, WA, and Eric Bueneman in Hazelwood, MO tried for the test but were unable to hear it.

WGSR results: (*** - NRC reflector, used by permission)

Michael P Battaglino, Chatham NJ ***: I'm very bummed that I missed "In the Midnight Hour!" In fact, I could only barely make out a few songs (and a quick TOH id at 0100) in the mess that is 1570 up this way. I primarily was having to deal with WISP, Dowlestown, PA and their EWTN programming the first hour, then WBUG, Amsterdam, NY showed up to complicate things in the second hour with CGW music from FM 101.1. What I did catch was in bits and pieces, for rather brief bursts. First time using the Quantum QX and the Quantum Phaser along with my 150' backyard fence wire, I think I'm gonna like this

combination with the R8B.

Frederick R. Vobbe, Lima OH ***: At one time I heard something that sounded like oldies, but could not tell the title, artist, or did I hear any ID.

David Hochfelder, Central NJ ***: Some of the program actually made it up here to central NJ, although it was a tough copy. The signal was moderately strong, but suffered from lots of fading and heavy co-channel interference from WISP, Doylestown, PA; WKLN, New Albany, IN; and a third station identifying as "Real Country." There was also adjacent channel interference from WQEW, right up the road in New York City. Both WKLN and your WGSR are new loggings for me, so it was a good night, all in all.

In any event, here's what I heard. I listened from midnight to 0120; unfortunately, I'm not sufficiently familiar with '70s music to identify many song titles and artists. That, combined with the persistent interference to the signal, meant that I couldn't follow much of the program. Sorry about that, because it sounded like Ron put a great deal of thought and fun into the programming.

However, at 0010 ET I heard what sounded like a theme song from a TV program (maybe SWAT?) and at 0018 "Band on the Run" by Wings. I heard voice ID's, either canned or live, at 0034, 0046, 0107, 0111, and 0119; for example, at 0034, I heard a live ID as "1570 WGSR." I also heard a siren (at least two blasts) at 0052 and a Morse ID repeated at least twice at 0058. The voice ID's, Morse ID, and siren all cut through the interference nicely, but much of the programming didn't.

I'm located in New Brunswick, NJ, about 30 miles southeast of New York City, and my receiver is a Sony ICF-2010 with a Kiwa Pocket Loop antenna.

Steve Francis, Alcoa TN ***: Heard here with 70's rock and code IDs. Hard to follow with WXLN New Albany, Indiana on same bearing and atop nearly all the time. I could tell Ron was taking an on-air call from a guy in Finland who was picking up the test, but WGSR was totally under WXLN by then, and I couldn't hear a word of the conversation.

Pat Martin, Seaside OR: I tried here on the Oregon coast, but cx up here were poor. I have heard WGSR twice now, but I haven't caught any of Ron's tests. Thanks for running the test. I am glad some others were able to log the station.

Kevin Redding, Mesa AZ: I am more than happy with seeing testing and am amazed that a guy in Finland could hear it. No way I could hear it with 1580 KMIK 50 kW and 2.5 miles away and XERF.

Lars Bygdén, Sävar Sweden ***: Yes, the WGSR-test did it all the way across the Atlantic Ocean. I picked it up here in Sweden (Northern Europe) at times between 0015 and 0230 ELT. Not so strong but clearly readible at times. Thanks Ron for your efforts! I'll send a report.

Phil Greenspan, Marshfield MA ***: Not heard here in Marshfield, MA. Too much WNSH local and WISP. Thanks for the test.

Bruce Conti, Nashua NH ***: WGSR FL Fernandina Beach - 2/3 0000-0200 - Not heard. WBUG 101.1 Real Country was dominant, along with WISP EWTN programs, all over likely WNST One-On-One Sports and unID Spanish (XERF?) in tiresome WQEW Radio Disney splash.

Nigel Pimblett, Medicine Hat AB: Managed to hear the WGSR test here, though it was tough with CRMW, XERF, and a station with ESPN. Heard nothing for nearly an hour, then a couple of voice IDs and also morse code IDs just prior to 0100 EST. New one for me, thanks Ron!

Robert Foxworth: I should check in now that I am back home after a weekend trip...I heard the WGSR test in Tampa, between about 0003 and 0015 when I had to call it quits. Moderately strong on short fade-ups, sometimes inaudible in the hash with plenty of background

signals. Hrd Ron's daughter give one ID at about 0015. I recognized one of the tracks but didn't know the name of any of the ones I heard! The best fade-ins were in the middle of the music of course but it sounded like a fun show to listen to and I thank and salute you Ron. Rx was a RS DX-398 unassisted (no ext. ant.) Bob F

Stephen S. Howe, St Albans VT: WGSR-1570 generally very weak with occasional fadeups to fair signal 2/3 0011-0043 with voice and MC IDs and one identifiable song, with very slight slop from WQEW-1560 and interference from two unidentified stations. CHLO, if there, was unusually weak.

WILM-1450 results:

Mike Brooker, Toronto ON ***: Heard one bit of code at 0059 EST, otherwise nada. No voice IDs heard, and any music would have been lost in the graveyard mush. I even get some CHKT-1430 slop.

Stephen S. Howe, St Albans VT: WILM-1450 very weak 2/4 0006-0018 with sirens and MC IDs. No "unusual programming" heard. Unlike last year's test, no sign of CHUC.

Steve Francis, Alcoa TN ***: Heard with a few code periods; not as strong as their 1998 test, but readable through the din. Always good to hear this little state!

Frederick R. Vobbe, Lima OH ***: Nothing heard here in Lima. Too much local 1450 stuff from different angles that I could not null out.

Michael F Battaglino, Chatham NJ ***: Unfortunately, nothing to report here in northern NJ (20 mi. west of NYC) either. Far too much WCTC-New Brunswick to copy anything, tried to null it, phase it-forget it. It's pretty much on the same bearing from me as Wilmington, hence the problem.

Lee Silvi, Mentor OH: I am pleased to report I heard the WILM DX-Test. I have to admit had it not been for the sirens and Morse code though it would have been much more difficult, if not impossible, to pick them out of the pileup on 1450.

Jazz will sign off

Sale of WNOP radio stops almost 50 years of jive

The Jazz Ark was abandoned years ago. Old Undies has passed away. And on New Year's Eve, all that jazz will end on tiny WNOP-AM (740).

For the first time in 40 years, this jive town won't have an alljazz station. What a shame.

In the 1970s and 1980s, WNOP-AM rocked and rolled unlike any station. It couldn't help it. The studios were inside three huge oil tanks floating on the Ohio River.

Radio Free Newport, they called it.

Free as in free spirits. Free as in few sponsors. Even then, the daytime jazz station wasn't making any money, which is why Al Vontz III has sold it to Sacred Heart Radio. A religious format starts Jan. 1, a week before America goes Jazz crazy over Ken Burns' new PBS miniseries.

For four decades, WNOF-AM marched to the beat of a different drummer - often Buddy Rich, Gene Krupa or Louie Bellson.

Jazz giants like Count Basie, Oscar Peterson, Wes Montgomery, John Coltrane, Stan Kenton and Woody Herman would stop by when playing gigs in town.

Erroll Garner, George Shearing and Rahsaan Roland Kirk and McCoy Tyner chatted with Oscar Treadwell from the old Monmouth Street storefront studio.

"Just about anybody who was anybody (in jazz) back in the '60s came on," recalls Walt Harrell, a 20-year off-and-on 'NOP veteran under the name of Bunky Tadwell, Sam Jessup and his real name.

Format began in '61

The jazz-and-comedy format was started in 1961, when Dick Pike returned to the station owned by former Campbell County Sheriff Jim Lang and his wife. They started the station in 1948.

"They said I could do anything I wanted," he says. And he did. He hired the hippest staff in town: Leo (Old Undies) Underhill, Ray Scott, Ty Williams, Jack Clements, Dee Felice and Mr. Treadwell.

"Count Basie said there was no jazz station in the country like WNOP-AN, and he was right," Mr. Harrell says.

Word of WNOP-AM spread to Variety, Billboard, Downbeat, Broadcasting and Cashbox magazines. If only the station had done as well in local listeners' ratings diaries.

"In '61 and '62, we probably had the highest ratings. We were in the one's, instead of a fraction," Mr. Pike says. "It never made money, to my knowledge."

But WNOP made people tap their toes, and laugh out loud.

The "bubble machine," a dilapidated tape player, was loaded with one-liners from comedy albums by Jonathan Winters, Shelly Berman, Hudson & Landry, Lenny Bruce and others.

Andy Griffith's "Buddy, have a drink!" could slip onto the airwaves any time - after songs, during newscasts, or in the middle of commercials for the Cabooze liquor store. Mr. Berman was so grateful to WNOP-AM for promoting his comedy records that he recorded about a dozen station identification announcements explaining what the call letters stood for:

- * Where Nonsense Occasionally Prevails.
- * We Never Offend Porcupines.
- * Who Needs Our Problems?

Budget "cruise'

In 1972, jazz lover Al Vontz II of Heidelberg Distributing bought the 1,000-watt daytime station. When his Newport landlord tripled the rent, he moved the station into a trio of oil drums next to the Central Bridge.

"At that time you had to broadcast in the city of license, so my father said, "I'll get as far away from the city as I can,' " says

Al Vontz III, his son and CEO of Heidelberg.

WNOP-AM was a Tristate watermark for 16 years, until they gave up the ship in 1989.

Max Warner, Bob Nave, Chris Wagner and Val Coleman played records inside the Ark on spring-mounted turntables with weighted (4 grams) arms. The bounding waves weren't a problem, but "you could wear the grooves out pretty quick in a record if you played it a lot," says Mr. Nave, who hosts The Bop Connection 5-6 p.m. Sundays on WVXU-FM (91.7).

When runaway barges careened down the Ohio River, Mr. Nave and Ray Scott did play-by-play. When the river froze in 1977, Mr. Harrell described the hundreds of people (and several motorists) crossing the river.

You never knew who would wander in. Local filmmaker Bob Gerding once walked in with his client, WKRP in Cincinnati creator Hugh Wilson. Mr. Harrell recalls the TV producer saying, "If I had seen this place first, this is where we would have put WKRP!"

Few, but loyal, listeners

In the past two decades, WNOP-AM bounced through several locations before moving into the "Jazz Mansion" at 2516 Spring Grove Ave., Camp Washington. Loyal listeners endured a variety of changes as Mr. Vontz searched for profitable programming. Geoff Nimmo introduced fusion music in 1984. After the Gulf War, the station switched to CNN Headline News.

"We were trying to cut our losses," Mr. Vontz says. "Frankly, I couldn't listen to five minutes of that (CNN) myself."

He brought back the jazz, but it could never attract a big audience. WNOP-AM seldom had enough listeners to make the quarterly Arbitron ratings.

"We knew, because of WNOP-AM, that some artists sold more jazz music in Cincinnati than what they did in other cities," Mr. Vontz laments. "It was very frustrating. We put it (selling) off for as long as we could."

FM no quarantee

Mr. Pike says he urged the Langs in the 1960s to get an PM signal, which has better quality for music. Since 1954, the Langs had owned the license for a Newport TV station to be called WNOP-TV (Channel 74). Long after they sold the license, it was finally built as WXIX-TV (Channel 19) in 1968.

But being on FM would be no guarantee of success. Xavier's WVXU-FM canceled its jazz shows in 1998 due to lack of financial support. Owners of WVAE-FM ("The Wave") dropped "smooth jazz" in 1999 for "jammin' oldies."

"I don't understand it. There are nice jazz stations in Cleveland and Columbus. Why can't we have one here?" asks jazz fan Pat Scharf of Western Hills.

"WNOP-AM is truly a treasure that we're losing," says Dr. Joseph Hamad, a Kenwood physician who plays the station in his office.

Stopping the music

In recent years, WNOP-AM returned to its roots as "Real Jazz 740" under General Manager Mark Stevens, a Green Township kid who liked to hang out at old 'NOP in the early 1960s.

Mr. Stevens expanded WNOP-AM to 24-hours in 1998, though the 37-watt night signal barely reaches I-275. Be tried to buy the station this fall when he heard Mr. Vontz was selling. More than 2,000 people signed petitions to keep the jazz station.

"For a station that nobody ever listened to, or ever heard of, we did OK," says Mr. Stevens, who is organizing a Dec. 27 wake for jazz fans at the 20th Century in Oakley.

Mr. Stevens is exploring resurrecting WNOP-AM on the Internet or on another station. "A broker is actively looking for a frequency for us," he says.

For now, they stop the music on New Year's Eve. ("Buddy, have a drink!")

"I understand that Mr. Vontz is doing this, not because he wants to, but for economic and business reasons he had to do it," Mr. Nave says. "But I feel like I did when we lost the Albee Theatre. We're losing an institution, a landmark."

And all that jazz.

Pat Martin of Seaside, OR. sends along the following:

A bit of sad news, the old KGW -620 towers in Portland OR were knocked down today (12/26/00-ye ed.) to make room for wet lands. The 600 foot towers had been there in North Portland near the Columbia River since the 30s. Recently the station KEWS (Was KGW) co-located with KEX their sister station in SE Portland.

Sheldon Harvey *** of Greenfield Park, Quebec sends along the following:

Just DXing at sunset and heard on 1600 kHz at 4:35 PM Eastern (2135 UTC) (12/26/00-ye ed.) a somewhat slurred ID tape for "The New WKKX-Wheeling, West Virginia. Came up clear out of the pile-up, then either buried, or went off. (This is ex-silent, ex-WOHZ per latest M Street-ye ed.)

Blake Lawrence *** of Washington, DC. passes along the following: From the Radio & Records website (www.rronline.com):
WAFN/Miami, New Year, New Format: The station is slated to drop its affiliation with the Fox Sports Radio Network on Monday (1/1/01-ye ed.) and flip to a Spanish Religious format. WAFN is on the expanded band at 1700 AM.

Brock Whaley *** of Decatur, GA. adds the following:

The trade magazine Radio & Records reports that WAFN 1700 Miami,
will drop the English sports format on Monday, and flip to a Spanish
Religious format.

Russ Edmunds *** of Blue Bell, PA. passes along the following: From DCRTV.com:

"1480 AM, WPWC in Dumfries VA came back to life on 12/28 after almost a year off the air. The station has been heard airing a rather undermodulated relay of the Korean programming carried on Multicultural's 1460, WKDV in Manassas. WPWC used to program traditional country and we'd heard it was purchased by JMK Communications which also has reportedly purchased 1520 AM, WTRI in Brunswick MD. Korean programming was forecast for both 1480 and 1520, but the latter aired Spanish religious programming last summer and is now mainly dark, returning to the airwaves every few days with videogame-ish music...."

Dennis Gibson of Santa Barbara, CA. passes along the following: KVEN-1450 Ventura, CA has made the rumored switch from news/talk to oldies. Their slogan is "The Boomer"; one of the worst I have heard in some time. The whole thing is really hokey; the bumpers and the sound quality are dreadful. The latter was expected. I imagine the champagne was flowing last night at KVTA-1520, which now has news/talk in Ventura County all to themselves. Most of the KVTA staff worked at KVEN until about a year ago; there was a mass resignation that caught management totally off guard. KVEN never recovered.

Tony King *** of Wairarapa, New Zealand passes along the following: 1640 WSYD Mt Airy NC is on. Heard it Saturday night (12/31/00-ye ed.) on the Superadio III + twin 100m radials.

Dennis Gibson of Santa Barbara, CA. passes along the following:
On Saturday (12/31/00-ye ed.) we went to Novato. Instead of going through SF, we went up through the East Bay. I haven't been up that way in at least 25 years, and I wasn't interested in antenna sites then. I saw the following (I wasn't sure which ones were who at the time):

Truly the end of an era, 19 years after WABC's great Musicradio era came to an end.

An ID came up and it was KCLB 970 // to KCMJ 1140. Looks like they may have changed from NOS to talk and if anyone nearer can verify, I would greatly appreciate it.

Now that's a long column! Super Bowl weekend just around the corner! Darn, the Raiders aren't in there. Oh, well. Everyone have a happy upcoming Groundhog Day, too! 73's.

I did go by KAVL towers but saw no lit ones of 1380. Unable to see in darkness if the 2 are still up. Could 610's be used for diplexing? Will try calling to ask. Hope all is well with everyone. 73 [1/26] On 1/26 early about 11:30pm I went back to Antelope Valley and got phone directory plus went out to see if 1380 towers were really lit per CE of FM 105.9 KPWR - no lights noticed. Drove out dirt & rutty road to the area. 610 also nearby, no cars in lot so its remotely controlled from Av K-4 and 1380 is, from Q-9 in Palmdale. The KPWR CE also said 1470 lost 2 towers to poor maint. so I went out to 70th St E near what would be Av K-8 or 10 if it was on map. On way to site I could only see 1 lit tower and once I got to it, saw 1 unlit one also so I assume only 2 are used. Just called Hi Desert Br. about 1120 AM here and confirmed engrs are at 1470 working to get it back to normal service plus woman Lisa says 1380 lites go out at sunset (maybe a timer, but I bet FAA requires them on 24 hrs since Fox Field is nearby). Also 1470 is affiliate of R. Unica, 1380 has a net it uses for standards. I recall 1380 in 60s as KBVM, a daytimer. Wish LA has a Music of Your Life affiliate. Oh, the groupings of AV stations are: Hi Desert Br. KHJJ

Greetings. Happy New Year to all. I had a good Christmas! First some background. A few years ago I asked my wife Cindy if she had ever seen or heard of "Radio Call Letter Stamps"... At that time she said no. She is an antique collector and frequents shops and the Internet looking for items that she collects. So for Christmas I got a surprise. She had managed to obtain 142 stamps! There are a few duplicates so there are about 138 different call letters. For you new guys these call letter stamps were sent back with QSL's to DX'ers as verifications back in the 1920's! And many early radio stations used them. My wife said she has access to more stamps so there will be another surprise in the future! Once I get a chance to sort them all out I will make the list available to whoever may be interested. They will not be for sale! And if there is anyone else out there who collects these let me know. During my 38 years of DX'ing and collecting QSL's I managed to get only one, and that was from KFI back in 1964! Another Christmas gift came from my younger daughter, Erin. She gave me a framed copy of a 1919 Atwater Kent Radio sales ad in a wood frame with glass cover! The ad says that the early Atwater Kent battery operated radios were sold without tubes, you had to buy them separately! And supply your own battery power too! Have tried for all the DX Tests this season. Heard all but the KNUS 710 test. KRKS, KBJD, WAGL and WJNT tests were all easily heard. Also managed to get my name mentioned on WAGL after calling in during test. WAGL was also heard well during previous test about 10 years ago or so. There was one other test that I missed and heard about it after the fact. I heard 710Khz from Denver back in 1973 as KBTR and still needed this frequency for a verie. This was a good chance but their test signal did not make it this. My local WAUR 930 is putting out spurs on 870, 960 and 990. The ones on 870 and 990 are 60khz on either side of their main signal and are clearly heard here at home during the day 13 miles away. The 870 spur was heard on the car radio up to 20 miles away during the day. I wrote to the station and told them about this. The station's reply was "Thanks - enjoy your hobby". Six months later the spurs are still there. I drove by the station during Christmas holiday and clearly heard the 960 spur from several miles away. And the 870 and 990 signals are so strong and solid that you have a choice of either the main 930 signal or 870 or 990 to listen to! Total coverage for the community of Yorkville and surrounding I received notice from Reid Wheeler that someone has nominated me for the IRCA Board of Directors. I appreciate the nomination. I'll have to give it some thought before deciding on accepting. I frequently put in a typical 9 to 10 hours a day at work most of the time. So when I get home it is late in the evening - supper and then to bed most days. There has been little time for sunset and evening DX and there would be even less time for other activities! And the computer and Internet eat away at valuable time too! The Christmas partial solar eclipse was a fizzle! Did not hear any signal enhancement during the peak period which was near 11 AM here. 73's and good DX!
