If you've never contributed before...

Here are some guidelines to sending tips and articles to the DX Monitor. The 85 degree longitude line through Canada down to the Ohio River, then south along the Ohio and the Mississippi Rivers, is the dividing line between EDXR and CDXR reports. The 110 degree longitude line divides CDXR and WDXR reports. For the Forum columns, the dividing line is the Manitoba-Ontario provincial boundary, and the Mississippi River. Reports on your DX

catches should contain the following information: Date and Time in Eastern Time, if a domestic (US or Canada) catch, or in UTC or GMT if your tip appears in the DX Worldwide columns, Alaska and Hawaii included. Call letters, location, slogan or other form of ID heard, such as FM calls relayed by the AM, signal strength, any interference you encounter, whether the catch is rare, new, or fairly regular; other information is also helpful, such as local ads, weather or traffic checks, syndicated programs, network affiliations, formats, and local sports teams being carried. News of a format or call letter change at your local station is welcome too. We look forward to seeing YOUR TIPS in the DX Monitor...

The last couple of days I notice that Pine Hills-540 has now become WFLA, ex-WQTM ex-WFLF, while 970 is still Tampa's WFLA. Although both are now news-talk, they do not even simulcast each other! While one has Dr. Laura the other has Paul Harvey & a string of commercials. This is a strange phenomenon I never encountered before. I recall the days 540 was WGTO Cypress Gardens which I heard in St. Louis, then saw its lushly landscaped studio at Cypress Gardens on my first trip to Florida in 1970. Present location of Pine Hills is just outside of Orlando, although 50,000 watts its surprisingly weak to my DX den 50 air miles south in the daytime as well as at night.

Eric Bueneman of St. Louis, MO passes along the following:

Before you hit the convention floor, you might be apprised of these changes:

- 1) Haven't monitored this channel yet, but 1510 Highland, IL and 1560 Shelbyville, IL are expected to swap calls (if not already). 1510 will become WDID, while 1560 will take the WINU calls. Both are owned by the New Life Evangelistic Center. 1510 is a semi-local at this location; 1560 is blocked by KTUI and ACI from WBGZ-1570.
- 2) KXEN-1010 Festus, MO is now 24 hours with Christian teaching 0600-1700 CDT, with Contemporary Christian music filling out the schedule. Thei 500-watt night pattern is in AM Stereo.
- 3) KIRL-1460 St. Charles, MO is back to 5 kW DA-D, ex-5 kW day/500 watts night DA-2. The four-tower nighttime site in Hazelwood is not very well-maintained; some of the antenna bases are now overgrown with weeds. Urban Gospel format.
- 4) KJSL-630 St. Louis, MO seems to have dropped most of the anti-Catholic talkers; they're now more a general Christian talk format, with Contemporary Christian in morning drive.

To those of you on the West Coast and vicinity, is anyone noticing powerhouse KNX-1070 a little weaker than usual? I'm about 100 miles away, and they're usually kersmash 24/7/365, but their signal seems down just a little and the almost non-existent nulls a little deeper. They've just installed a new solid state 50 KW transmitter. Check out the installation and a fascinating summary of the history of KNX at: http://www.steveblodgett.com/KNXDX50install.html The site shows a photo of the power output meter of the new transmitter reading 50 KW, so maybe it's just my imagination.

Still not a peep out of this one (KLFF-890 Arroyo Grande, CA-ye ed.) which M Street says will come on some time this month. I checked while I was in Santa Maria today. They will be diplexing off KKOM-1280. KKOM sure isn't very strong in Santa Maria, which surprises me. But I'm not sure what their pattern looks like. They have applied to increase their day power from 5 KW to 10 KW, and they showed up in the last San Luis Obispo Arbitron for the first time in recent memory.

They hope to have a new local morning show in place by October 1. Call letters will remain the same (it says in the Seattle P-I). That's the very latest from the Puget Sound area's most splattery station. And oh yes, as tempting as it was, I didn't get up at 5 to hear the change.

For a good desk loop, check with Radio Plus, ???? Chastain Way, Pensacola, FL. I don't have the exact address handy at the moment and, of course, can't think of Garry's last name, either. Comes with age, I guess, although they say memory is the second thing to go. (I can't remember what the first thing is, but it's probably not that important...) I was surprised to hear local WMYS-1430 carrying CBS news on the hour now. I was used to hearing CNN news on the hour. WNTS-1590 is still USA Radio news.
