DX Tests

PLEASE NOTE: Even if you don't hear a test, be sure to contact the station, and thank them for going to the trouble to run a test! Please remember, what's listed as being on, say, Monday morning "may" be what you think of as Sunday night! (Test times are in the station's LOCAL time.)

Saturday, November 2, 2002 - WDFB-1170, Danville, KY tested from 12:00-12:30 am Eastern Standard Time:

Many DXers tried for this test, and the results were very clear - either a location heard the test, or they didn't - there wasn't much of a question of whether or not what was heard was the test!

The Morse code seemed to get out the best - several people reported that there was a lot of QRM from other stations on the same frequency or nearby, but the code was able to get thru. For instance, Nigel Pimblett in Medicine Hat, AB, reported that he was only able to hear the Morse, thru a strong KFAQ and a weaker SS station. Park Barton in Tuscaloosa, AL reported moderately strong KFAQ (Tulsa, OK) signals at his QTH, and that he also heard the code well. Pete Dernbach in Manchester, MO (near St. Louis)

and Saul Chernos in Burnt River, ON reported hearing the Morse clearly, but KJOC (and sometimes WWVA) were often interfering. Jeff Falconer in Clinton, ON and Steve Howe in St. Albans, VT also mentioned that while they heard WDFB (mainly the code), most of their interference came from WWVA. Les Rayburn in Helena, AL (near Birmingham) says the signal was very clear at his location; the same was true for Gerry Bishop in Niceville, FL and Tom Jasinski of Shorewood, IL. Bill Dvorak in Madison, WI also heard the Morse code IDs, as well as a choral version of the National Anthem that was played. Barry McLarnon in Ottawa, ON also heard the test and mentioned that everything except the code was badly mutilated by interference from WWVA. Shawn Axelrod in Winnipeg, MB also heard the test, as did Greg Myers in Clearwater, FL - he mentioned that he had to use LSB to listen due to Cuba-1180 splash at his QTH. Steve Francis in Alcoa, TN heard the entire test and described what was heard; RC Watts in Louisville, KY as well as Bob Pote in Greenwood, IN (near Indianapolis) also picked up the test.

But the test wasn't heard by some of those who tried for it: Mike Brooker in Toronto, ON heard nothing but a low growl under WWVA, Patrick Griffith in Westminster, CO heard mainly KFAQ with some splatter from KSL, and Paul LaFreniere in Grand Marais, MN had too much interference from KJOC and WWVA to hear more than a burst of code. Rick Kenneally in Wilton, CT and Matt in Buffalo, NY both mentioned that they heard WWVA

(and some slop from WHAM-1180) instead of the test. Tim Noonan in Madison, WI said while he heard a trace of code, KJOC was too strong and he could not null it well enough to hear enough to send a report. Frank Aden in Boise, ID, tried for the test, but says he heard nothing that sounded like a test. Powell Way in Columbia, SC reports that the test was not heard at his QTH, due to a local on 1170 kHz leaving their transmitter on at full power (10 kW)!

- 950 KJR WA, Seattle 11/2 1145 sports talk show in & out of the static. Fair to weak but all by itself. A very noisy evening! (GH-OR)
- 960 KABL <u>CA</u>, Oakland 10/31 0130 NOS type music, choppy signal mixing with unIDs but mostly on top, heard on Hammarlund with loop. (GH-OR)
 - KOVO UT, Provo 10/30 2037 traffic report for SLC area, weather for Wasatch Front, promo for Sportstalk 12-80 Salt Lake area ads, atop frequency, then gradually lost under KALE. (bp-WA)
- 980 KUSA WA, Selah 10/30 2250 local quality in Ellensburg with "Talk 980 KUSA" ID and CNN news. (bp-WA)
- 1050 KORE OR, Springfield 11/3 0100 suddenly up out of the slop and way over unID ESPN station I was trying to ID. 0103 gone like the wind! (GH-OR)
- 1120 KZSJ <u>CA</u>, San Martin 10/27 2013 ID and Asian language program briefly over KPNW. (bp-WA)
 - ?KANN? <u>UT</u>, Ogden 10/30 2010-2030 tentative with Christian rock/pop music and religious messages in weird 3-way battle with KPNW and KZSJ. (bp-WA)

- 1430 ?KVVN? CA, Santa Clara 10/30 1924 possibly the one with SE Asian language program, dominant. (bp-WA)
- 1450 KMMS MT, Bozeman 10/26 0800 promo for "The Savage Nation," then ID as "Newsradio 1450 KMMS Bozeman," and into ABC news. (NP-AB)
- 1460 KRRS <u>CA</u>, Santa Rosa 10/30 1950-2230 various times, tentative, Mexican music and hyperactive Spanish DJ, many mentions of Santa Rosa. Slogans, if any, given too quickly for me to decipher while driving at 70 mph. Quite loud at

- times and mostly alone until KUTI took over after I crossed the Columbia River. (bp-WA)
- 1590 KLIV <u>CA</u>, San Jose 10/30 2055 dominant with local news, call ID's "Silicon Valley's News Station" slogan. (bp-WA)
- 1600 KGST <u>CA</u>, Fresno 10/30 2049 monster signal with Mexican music, Spanish DJ, "Cah Heh Esseh Teh, Su estacion favorite" ID. (bp-WA)
- 1610 TIS MT, Hardin 11/1 1920 message promoting Custer's Last Stand re-enactment. Mentioned parade on Saturday June 22nd, so obviously an old message. (NP-AB)
 - TIS WA, George 10/30 1945 TIS good for several miles along I-90 with features about farming and agriculture. Spotted the antenna on a large billboard next to town. Forgot to note the slogan/call. (bp-WA)
 - HAR WY, Cheyenne 11/1 1918 tape loop with woman giving road report for 1 November, as of 4:10pm, mentioning I-80 and Highway 221. (NP-AB)
 - HAR WY Rawlins 11/1 1910 short tape loop by man with ID mentioning Carbon County Visitors Council and WY Dept. of Transportation and giving frequency and call that sounded like WTO681. (NP-AB)

DX TEST

- 1170 WDFB KY, Danville 11/2 0007 couldn't copy anything else, but the code ID's made it through a strong KFAQ and a weaker Spanish language station. Thank goodness Red Deer moved to FM! (NP-AB)
 - (WDFB)+11/2 0000-0100 nothing heard that sounded like a test. (FA-ID) +11/2 not heard 0000-0100, just a weak Spanish station. No sign of WDFB at all. (GJ-CA)

UNIDS

- 1000 10/30 2328 Spanish music briefly killing KOMO between Ellensburg and Cle Elum, fade out completely before end of song. (bp-WA)
- 1030 10/30 2245 slow Spanish vocal and Spanish talk fair-poor in KYXE-1020 splatter, while driving between Vantage and Ellensburg. No sign of KTWO, KMAS or KLLU. KJDI? (bp-WA)
- 1170 11/2 0839 oldies music, then strangely an ID between songs as "This is Newstalk AM 1170." (NP-AB)

A great report from John Bryant this week!!

November 5-10, 2002 DXpedition to Grayland, WA

John Bryant

Receiver: Ten Tec HF-340

Antennas: 3 Beverages, SW, W, NW

Conditions on this DXpedition were generally poor and the log "reads much better than it listened." With the exception of a single night/morning, most Trans-Pacific signals were at best fair at peaks. Very few IDs were heard due to low signal levels, though peaks often allowed positive ID of languages. That plus knowledge of parallels on either MW or SW allowed most signals to be IDed rather positively. Strangely, two signals were persistent by their presence

with at least moderate signal levels, no matter what the propagation conditions: 1116, 4BC in Brisbane was present and almost always the strongest Aussie whether the conditions favored DownUnder or East Asia. This is remarkable for an Aussie commercial station of only 5 kw. So too, the situation with 1134, JOQR, Tokyo. JOQR is a private station of 100 kw that is often heard here. However, it was considerably more reliable than usual and was almost always the loudest Japanese station, far outstripping the 300 to 500 kw. NHK big guns. Perhaps it is not a coincidence that these stations were on almost adjacent channels.

The only "good" morning was an opening to the central Pacific and Australia on November 7. Then signals were much more robust and somewhat more numerous.

This is my final DXpedition until late next May. By that time, perhaps the solar weather and geomagnetic conditions will be more favorable. The loggings:

AUSTRALIA

The Australian MW scene is a mixture of private and government-operated stations. Unlike New Zealand, almost all private commercial stations are independent, though they may use a networked news cast, etc. Australian Broadcasting Corp. is the governmental broadcaster and offers four networks to the medium wave listener.

ABC Radio National: A specialist network broadcasting programs on the arts, religion, politics, the law, news and current affairs, science and technology, history, including features, documentaries, magazine programs, specialist analysis, music, drama and comedy. Most transmitters of the 200 transmitters are on the FM band, however, at least one major AM outlet exists (with an RN call) in most major cities.

ABC Metropolitan Radio: A network of nine stations, one in each state capital, Darwin, Canberra and Newcastle. News, current affairs, talk, information, sport, entertainment programs and other networked programs of interest to urban audiences. 612//702//774

ABC Regional Radio: The most extensive radio network in Australia - 49 studios and outposts and a national network of around 70 AM and 180 FM transmitters as well as State and national satellite services. A mix of local, regional, state and national programming for audiences outside the capital cities. Usually parallel in the evenings and overnight.

NEW ZEALAND

Over two-thirds of New Zealand AM radio now consists of simulcast programming carried over seven networks. Happily, there are very few instances of a network having two outlets on the same frequency. This makes identifying stations quite easy, as long as one can hear a known network outlet.

National Radio: Government-owned news and features network of about 20 transmitters. There is a single 50 kW station (2YA-567) and five 10 kW stations. The remainder are primarily 2 kW outlets. 567//756

News-Talk ZB: Now privately owned simulcast news and phone-in + interview talk programming. The network consists of about 20 stations, with one 20 kW station (2ZB-1035), five 10 kW stations and the remainder being primarily 2kW stations.

Radio Sport: Sporting events, features and talk carried on over a dozen outlets. 792//1332

Classic Hits: Top pop hits of the 60s, 70s, 80s from a network of 9 stations. Some of the automated stations run local commercials, IDs, etc within network programming until 1200 UTC. After that time all are simulcast. Difficult to hear in NAm. Strongest is only 2kW. Note: some Classic Hits stations carry Radio Sport programming during important national sports events. 1026//1215

AM Network & Southern Star: These two networks primarily share the same transmitters. There is one 50 kW transmitter (2YC-657), three 10 kW stations (882, 900, 963) and a single 5 kW outlet. The AM Network simulcasts NZ Parliament when it is in session (there are regular afternoon and EVENING sessions. A schedule may be found on the web at http://www.radionz.co.nz/am/f-am.htm.) When Parliament is not in session, these transmitters simulcast the Southern Star Network of contemporary Christian music.

Radio Rhema: This simulcast network of a dozen transmitters is relatively difficult to hear from North America. About half of the network is 5kW transmitters and most of the rest are 2kW. Radio Rhema programming is Christian talk and features.

Radio Pacific: This small all-talk network consists of a single 10 kW transmitter (702) and two 5kW outlets. Difficult to hear in NAm. 702//711
