

It seems that the only DXers east of the Mississippi River who had a problem hearing the test were those like me here in Memphis who live in WBIX's protective null. Likewise, J.D. Stephens and Les Rayburn in Alabama reported no success in hearing this most desirable test. A trend that appears to be developing is a greater international interest in trying for DX tests. This is indeed exciting, and a potentially strong selling point to station engineers and management for future

tests. Evidence supporting some unrealized potential for future successes in this area is provided by comments from DXer Mark Connelly in Massachusetts:

"At 0016 EST/0516 UTC on 24 FEB I had no problem hearing the WBIX-1060 Natick, MA test on the DXTuner receiver located in Ilfracombe, England," he wrote. "Code ID's, sweep tones, and voice announcements came through fine. Clearly dominating the channel. (Other DXTuners) that had some signal: Edinburgh, Scotland (poor, much weaker than at Ilfracombe, bits of voice and tones) Italy and Germany (carrier evident but nil / nearly nil audio) Caracas, Venezuela (bits of Morse code ID in huge "jumble")."

Thanks for sharing this fascinating info Mark. Perhaps we need to try and reach out to DXers in Latin America and encourage them to begin listening for tests. I have not received any reports from DXers in those regions on any tests this season.

As the prime BCB listening time begins to transition into nights with higher QRN levels and more hours of daylight, I am still trying to nail down just a couple more DX tests. More to follow on these as details become available.

Once again, our sincere thanks to WBIX Chief Engineer Grady Moates for agreeing to conduct this test, and to BTC member Paul B. Walker Jr. for his persistent efforts to arrange it. Now to the task of processing the many requests for QSLs.

Remember to keep checking the **DXTESTS.INFO** Web site frequently and listen to the BTC Podcasts for news and late-breaking developments.

Via **Martin Foltz**, we have this update from Steven Mena at KQMs:

CBC Radio One switch to FM dial delayed, The Cape Breton Post

SYDNEY — The CBC says it's highly unlikely CBC Radio One in Sydney will switch over to the FM dial this fiscal year or next. The radio station hoped to make the move by sometime next fiscal year but radio regional director Susan Milton said that isn't likely to happen. "What they are going to do for the next year is prioritize areas of the country that have no service, so we aren't obviously there," she said. "It's our Maritime priority but there are other parts of the country that have no CBC Radio One service. They are ahead of us." Milton said the move to FM is still on the wish list for next fiscal year. "We're lower on the list though so it's highly unlikely unless something happens, say a project in another part of the country doesn't happen, well, that would obviously free up those and we could get back on the priority list." When the CBC received permission from the Canadian Radio-Television and Telecommunications Commission in July to switch over to the FM dial it was given two to three years to make the move, she noted. The CBC has the AM transmitter and antenna system off Keltic Drive will have to be replaced, along with other related broadcasting equipment, for the move from 1140 AM to 97.1 FM. The switch to FM will improve the signal, and the sound, for Radio One listeners, and will extend the broadcast into some pockets that currently aren't able to receive the AM signal.

North Korea Intensifies Press Oppression', By Yoon Won-sup, Staff Reporter

North Korea executed the director of one of its state-owned companies last year for having made phone calls abroad without permission, according to an international association of journalists. "North Korea is the world's most isolated country and the security forces are responsible for keeping it that way at all costs," Reporters Without Borders based in Paris said last week in its annual report covering 98 countries. It shows a marked increase in executions for the offense of communicating with people outside the country, the reporter added. The group said the North has intensified its oppression of the press, particularly foreign press, which target North Koreans as an audience. Several foreign-based radio stations have increased their airtime while newspapers available online, in particular the Daily NK, have stepped up their coverage. But Pyongyang responded to the challenges by resuming jamming and dissident radio from broadcasting to its people. They are Free North Korea Radio, Voice of America, Open Radio for North Korea, Radio Free Asia and Radio Free Chosun. The Korean Workers' Party fiercely condemned foreign news aimed at destabilizing the regime and the security forces were ordered to act to prevent foreign videos, publications, telephones connected to the Internet. However, many exiled North Korean journalists contribute to the blogs. Most of the Web sites are hosted in Japan or South Korea because the ".nk" domain name has yet to be launched. Meanwhile, the reporters group revealed that North Korean journalists secretly launched a magazine "Rinjijang" in November last year with a Japanese news agency in order to cover unprecedented news about North Korea. Around a dozen journalists received secret training in China before returning to their country and published the first edition including interviews with North Koreans and an analysis of the economic situation. North Korean reporters are looking for subjects that reflect the lives of the people, their attitudes and aspirations. One of the project's founders was quoted as saying, adding that the magazine will be distributed secretly inside North Korea. Reporters Without Borders campaigns for freedom of speech all over the world. "The spinelessness of some Western countries and major international bodies is harming press freedom," Robert Menard, secretary-general of the organization, said in the report. "The lack of determination by democratic countries in defending the values they supposedly stand for is alarming."

According to my 100000watts.com change report tonight, KOPT 1600 in Eugene has flipped from progressive talk to public radio, with Oregon Public Broadcasting buying the station from Churchill. This extends OPR's reach to the south - it's currently heard in Portland, Corvallis (KOAC 550) and most of Oregon, but public radio in southwestern Oregon comes from Eugene's KLCC 89.7 and KWAX 91.1, and from the Jefferson Public Radio chain based in Medford that includes KRVN 1280 in Eugene... which means Eugene will now be the only city (that I know of, anyway) with two public radio stations on the AM dial (PM-OR)

 Happy anniversary IRCA! I hope a recent DX Forum of mine didn't chase any would be reporters out of the pages of the bulletin. The last month has seen a dearth of anyone sending any comments into the club (including me, hil). I'm still curious about what challenges other members are encountering now that HD-AM digital has become an unfortunate night time occurrence on the dial. I'm of the mind now that we as a club, as hobbyists and most of all as listeners to the AM dial have to

take our concern about this broadcaster induced obliteration caused by HD technology to the FCC and to our members of Congress and the Senate. We, the public, have a right to be able to hear free radio transmissions as clearly as possible since the airwaves belong to us. While some QRM is to be expected (although now it is out of control) with so many lower power stations on at night all over the AM spectrum), what is not acceptable is large 50kW spewing hash all over onto their adjacent channels over hundreds of miles. Actually it's not even okay for local and regional channel operators to do it either. This is not about just us being able to enjoy our hobby and logging stations, this is about the right of the American people to be able to dial across the radio freely and hear what is on without it being masked over by a relatively few broadcasters who think this is the next great way to make more money. A failed technology has no place on the nation's airwaves. We need to be heard on this. I would recommend that you read what one radio owner thinks about this on WYSL.com. Bob Savage of WYSL Avon, NY is vehemently opposed to HD-AM as is the CE of WSM-650. They even have a website that denounces IBOC and says that it is wrong because -It Bothers Other Channels! (The actual meaning of IBOCI) If we aren't heard on this all parties will assume this destruction of AM is OK and nothing will be done about it. Come on IRCA members what do you think about this and how is it affecting your ability to DX in your area? For me I've really been hurt in the 780-1280 area of the dial, with sections from 810-850, 900 -920, 1020-1140, 1170-1280 the worst, as well as 1360-1380. At least WJR shuts off the IBOC at night and WWJ-950 has turned it off entirely. Hopefully more will follow their lead and realize that the so-called benefits of HD are not there. Bring back AM-stereo, at least that boosted signals and improved the fidelity of the stations that used it. Fortunately, in spite of the tougher sounding AM dial; I have been able to receive 3 new stations so far this year, all in February. On 2/10 at 1900 had some classic C&W pounding over WRVA on 1140, turned out to be KCLE Cleburne, TX, caught a full ID along with mentions of sister stations on 1120 and 1460 plus one FM. That was pretty cool! On 2/12/2 hours I had some oldies and standards on 1440 and as the station went into an ad block they mentioned a business in Johnstown, NY, that gave me WFNY from nearby Gloversville. Then on 2/16 at 1915 after hearing much Asian sounding music and language, believe it was Korean, caught a s/c off for KJON-850 from Carrollton, Texas, nice. So yes there is some DX still possible. In fact a very good unneeded was heard about 0245 on 2/26 while station was KOMO in Seattle. Hearing it made me wonder as to the chances of hearing a WC Pacific NWer like them again given what the dial is like these days. It does go to show that given the right conditions and perhaps the right station off at the right time and no IBOC good DX can still happen. Hope it is happening for all of you. (Of course perhaps WMP was off for IBOC installation, ugh.) 73s.
