S-R BROADCASTING Sports KRKO-A (NORTHSOUND 1380)/EVERETT WA has won its appeal of an OCTOBER decision by a hearing examiner that stopped its construction of two additional towers for the station and a new AM. The SNOHOMISH COUNTY COUNCIL voted 3-2 this week to overturn the examiner's decision, ruling that there is not enough evidence to support the examiner's argument that the towers could cause health problems. KRKO built new towers for its 50,000-watts days/34,000-watts nights signal last summer. Local environmental groups and residents have waged a battle to stop the towers from being built, but failed to stop the initial phase of the project. (PM-OR/MS-CA)

Dale Park sends along the following from Inforum dated 1/19/09:

Ed Schultz takes 'Live and Local' radio show to nation's capital, hints at possible television deal, Dave Olson

Beginning next week, Ed Schultz and his local "News and Views" show will come at listeners from a new vantage point - the nation's capital. Schultz said Friday that his show is leasing studio space in a facility operated by the Center for American Progress in Washington. CAP, founded in 2003 and headed by John Podesta, former chief of staff for President Bill Clinton, describes itself as a progressive think tank. "News and Views' - the show - is not going to change, just the location of it is going to change," said Schultz, adding that the show will be broadcast from Washington at least 50 percent of the time. He stressed that the content and focus of the morning radio talk show will remain the same. "It will still be 'News and Views' as it's always been: live and local and regionally focused, with some national content to it," he said. Schultz said the evolution of his national radio program, "The Ed Schultz Show," dictates he spend more time in Washington. "I need to be more accessible to the networks," he said, adding that a couple of business deals now in the works could come to fruition in the next few months. "There is a real possibility of a television opportunity on the horizon, but that's really all I can say about it right now," said Schultz. Schultz said certain stories and situations, like major flooding, will require him to be in Fargo. "I'm still going to be doing a good number of shows from the KFGO studios," he said. Schultz, who lives in Detroit Lakes, Minn, said he has an apartment in Washington, where he has developed many contacts and friendships in recent years. "This is just a real exciting time for the country, and I want to be there," he said. "I want to see it. I want to be around it. That's another reason for this change." (DP-HI)

Dale Park passed along the following from Mlive.com (Flint, MI Journal) dated 1/30/09:

A sad day for Flint: Local sports talk radio officially dead, WTRX no longer broadcasts local talk, Posted by lared Field

I received some sad news yesterday from a coworker at the Journal whose husband is a part-time board operator at WTRX in Flint Township. The station, Flint's lone sports talker, will no longer broadcast ANY local talk. It's a sad day for Flint, but it's emblematic of a much larger trend in radio that started even before the downturn of the economy – syndicated content. Doug Fisher, the station's program manager and host of its only local sports talk show, "The Male Room," received the news on Thursday after the show. As many of you know, I've been a weekly guest on the show for two years (during hoops season) and rather enjoyed doing it. Everyone involved in the production was very professional to me and, from what I could tell, never alienated listeners with condescending talk like you hear so often from big-city stations. Even if you didn't care for the show, it's sad to think that there will no longer be any local sports talk in Flint. Fisher did a great job covering high school sports, talking to coaches and athletic directors from all over Genesee County. I'm going to miss hearing local fans whine and complain about the Lions, Tigers and Pistons (no one ever has anything bad to say about the Red Wings). More than that, though, I'm just going to miss local radio in general. It's leaving us, slowly but surely. The "Male Room" will be replaced by a national show that, in my humble opinion, totally sucks: ESPN's "The Herd" with Colin Cowherd. WTRX will continue to carry "The Huge Show", a statewide sports talk show broadcast out of Grand Rapids. That will be the closest thing Flintstones will have to local sports talk. (DP-HI)

Dale Park sends along the following form **SignonSanDiego.com** dated 1/20/09: Clear Channel announces sweeping round of job cuts, UNION-TRIBUNE.

A sweeping round of cuts announced Tuesday by Clear Channel Communications will affect at least five San Diego radio stations and 40 employees. Chief Executive Officer Mark Mays said the company will eliminate about 1,850 positions nationwide from its radio, corporate and outdoor-advertising divisions, accounting for about 9 percent of its work force. The local cuts were the deepest at XTRA Sports-1360 AM, which lost four of its five on-air hosts and all three producers. The XTRA on-air hosts fired were Craig Elsten, Mike Costa, Chris Ello and Jeff Dotseth. Josh Rosenberg and program director Brian Wilson were retained and will host a 3-7 pm weekday show beginning Wednesday. The station is currently airing Fox Sports radio programming instead of its local shows. Local Clear Channel executives would not comment on the

dismissals, but the All Access and SD Radio Web sites reported that Star 94.1, Channel 93.3, KGB 101.5 FM and Rock 105.3 lost members of their sales and promotions staffs. On-air losses reportedly include Ditch and Ruth 66 of KGB, Zethian Oats at Rock 105.3, and Sean "Sonic" Leckie of Channel 93.3. Clear Channel's roster of San Diego stations also includes talk station KOGO-AM 600 and country outlet KUSS-95.7 FM. Jay Posner: (619) 293-1834; jay.posner@uniontrib.com. (DP-HI)

Dale Park sends along the following from the Detroit, MI News dated 1/21/09:

Local sports shows cut at WDFN, Joanne C Gerstner/The Detroit News.

The parent company of WDFN 1130 made sweeping cuts and a major programming change to the Detroit sports talk radio station Tuesday, eliminating local shows such as "Stoney and Wojo" and Sean Baligian's midday program. Clear Channel now will air nationally-syndicated Fox Sports Radio programs. Detroit News columnist Bob Wojnowski and Mike Stone were co-hosts of the afternoon drive-time show "Stoney and Wojo," which was the AM station's marquee program. Morning host Matt Shepard's show also was eliminated. Other on-air staffers such as Matt Dery and Rob Otto will remain to handle quarter-hour local updates and the Pistons pre- and post-game shows. WDFN launched in 1994 and the "Stoney and Wojo" show debuted in April 1995. "It's a really sad day because I loved working at that station," Wojnowski said. "And I know a lot of Detroiters have loved listening to the station for the past 14-15 years. It's just another sign of the times, a very sad sign." Said Stone: "I will miss it terribly. People tell me the show meant something to (them). That's amazing. Hopefully, somebody will want to pick up 'Stoney and Wojo." WDFN's Web site was taken down at 3 pm Tuesday, save for a home page that indicated it was being remodeled. Baligian ended up being the last local show on WDFN, finishing as the station switched to the noon inaugural address of President Barack Obama. In place of the "Stoney and Wojo" show Tuesday was a program hosted by Chris Myers of Fox Sports. "Pretty odd that my last words on 'DFN were, 'And now President Barack Obama," said Baligian, who was at WDFN for nearly 10 years. "Not the way I thought things would end. But we've all been hearing rumors for a while that something big was going to happen. I didn't think it would be like this, but I'm not surprised. Radio is a tough business, and we know things can end quickly. "All I can say is we tried our best. We really did." The change from local to national format signals an end to the heated battle between WDFN and rival 97.1 FM The Ticket for sports talk supremacy in Detroit. The Ticket also is heard on 1270 AM. Clear Channel said it eliminated 1,850 jobs nationwide Tuesday, or 9 percent of its workforce. (DP-HI)

Mike Hardester (also passed on by Pat Martin) passes along the following dated 1/21/09:

On 7 January 2009, the owners of (North Carolina AM stations) 910-WSRP (Jacksonville), 1230-WLNR (Kinston), and 1370-WLNR (Lillington) filed with the FCC a Notification of Suspension of Operations and Request for Silent STA due to financing. Each station's format is in Spanish. WSRP is confirmed off, however, neither WLNR or WLLN are normally audible here, so I cannot comment if they're off. In their reason for requesting the STA, the owners stated: "It is not financially feasible to continue operating the station at this time. This STA is requested to allow the licensee an opportunity to seek additional revenue sources or a purchaser." During the First Gulf War (then WLAS) on 910 went silent for an extended period of time. This was due to the mass deployment of military personnel, from Camp Lejeune, to the Gulf and resulting very weak economy. I'm a bit surprised at this situation occurring now, owing to the strong Hispanic population in this area. However, local WLDG-98.7 FM (x-WKOO which had an "Oldies" format) has been full time in the Spanish language for about 2 years. Perhaps their ratings are higher than the AM side. (MH-NC)

Mike Sanburn sends along the following from Pat Griffith of Westminster, CO dated 1/22/09:

I noticed KVLE/610 in Vail CO on the FCC silent stations list. I did some followup and found that they actually have an STA for being off the air. From the STA request:

ON OR ABOUT SEPTEMBER 1, 2008, A CONCRETE TRUCK BACKED UP INTO ONE OF THE GUYED WIRES SUPPORTING THE TOWER BROADCASTING THE OPERATIONS OF LICENSEE'S STATION KVLE (AM), VAIL, COLORADO (FCC FACILITY ID NO 16272). AS A RESULT, THE BROADCAST TOWER COLLAPSED TO THE GROUND AND THE STATION WENT SILENT. LICENSEE ORDERED A REPLACEMENT TOWER AND POURED NEW CONCRETE FOOTERS FOR THE TOWER BASE. HOWEVER, THE REPLACEMENT TOWER HAS NOT YET ARRIVED. ALSO, WITH THE ONSET OF INCLEMENT WEATHER DUE TO THE WINTER SEASON, LICENSEE WILL NOT BE ABLE TO ERECT THE REPLACEMENT TOWER UNTIL WARMER WEATHER IN THE SPRING. THEREFORE, LICENSEE RESPECTFULLY REQUESTS THE COMMISSION GRANT TEMPORARY SILENT AUTHORITY FOR ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY DAYS (180) FROM THE SUBMISSION OF THIS REQUEST.

It makes me wonder why the operator would not come up with a temporary solution to get the station back on the air even if it meant with limited coverage. There are a number of temporary solutions that are readily available such as a temporary long wire antenna or rental of a skirt fed tower on a trailer which is available from several sources. And especially in a place like Vail where they are off the air during all of the winter ski season which must be their most lucrative months. And being off the air for so long will surely result in a loss of listenership that will never be regained. (MS-CA)
