It is not often that a DXer experiences two milestones in the space of one week. I managed to make two milestones in the period of one week. On November 4 at 1659 ELT, I logged WINI 1420 Murphysboro, IL with a legal ID mentioning Southern Illinois and the Bob and Tom morning show, going into CBS news at 1700. WINI is the 1,100th AM radio station logged at my present QTH since I moved there in 1992. On this reception, I had minimal ACI from KZQZ 1430. I had not heard this station since 1983, when I heard them on night pattern two blocks from my present QTH. Five days later, I hit another milestone with my 100th digital television station, in the form of WRGT-DT on RF channel 30, out of Dayton, OH. Since reaching the 1,100-station milestone on AM, I've heard several more. WGIV 1370 Pineville, NC was noted with calls and Urban Gospel music at 1744 11/5. This station is in a Charlotte suburb, having moved from Gastonia. I finally identified the station that was playing music on 590 through KXSP with local KFNS null'd; it turned out to be Radio Musical from Santa Clara, Cuba. It was running Classical music and identified in Spanish at 0255 11/6. WHKY 1290 Hickory, NC was noted at 2253 11/6 with local ads, weather forecast and jingle. Another station heard was WRCO 1450 Richland Center, WI with soft Oldies, calls and local ads at 2351 11/6. WEBY 1330 Milton, FL noted with local ads, calls, "Northwest Florida's Talk Station" slogan and talk at 1734 11/12; the signal was strong enough to take out WVH's Christian teaching programs. Also logged KEBC 1340 Oklahoma City, OK with legal ID and a sports report from Fox Sports Radio at 0300 11/13. A pair of unidentified stations were also noted: a station on 1460 was running Middle Eastern music at 0342 11/6. A fair to poor signal was noted through KHOJ. I checked the online schedule for WPCN Wallied Lake, MI; Oldies was scheduled at this particular time. Another one was on 1230 at 2232 on 11/6; this one carried Contemporary Christian music and the slogan "AM 1230 The Light". My first guess would be KLWT Lebanon, MO, they've recently switched to CCM. Locally, KATZ-FM 100.3 Alton, IL has flipped from Urban Contemporary to Christmas music; a format change is coming in January. The station holds a CP to move to Bridgeton, MO and downgrade from a Class B to a Class C3. That leaves WHHL 104.1 Hazelwood, MO as the only Urban Contemporary (hip-hop/R&B/rap mix) in St. Louis. WHHL changed its city of license without having to relocate its transmitter site; it's still six miles north of my QTH. KFUD-FM 99.1 Clayton, MO has been sold to a Christian group; this group owns CCM stations KPVR 94.1 Bowling Green, MO and KHZR 97.7 Potosi, MO. They plan to move the two stations, known as "Joy FM", to 99.1, and leave St. Louis without a full-time Classical music station. There's a drive on to petition the FCC to deny the sale, though. The deal is 100% financed by the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod; the buyer hasn't finished paying for KPVR and KHZR. Philadelphia, Miami, Atlanta and Los Angeles have lost full-time Classical music stations in recent years (short range "HD Radio" stations don't count). Kansas City's Classical music station is on 1660 kHz, and has become one of two dominant stations on that frequency at night. It's too bad KXTR couldn't be on 610. My former employer, WSJE 88.7 Edwardsville, IL, will be sticking with its mainstream Jazz format, although the focus will be more on the Jazz Studies program at Southern Illinois University Edwardsville than national releases and professional DJs. It will also become the flagship for all SIUE sports except men's basketball; that status will be shared with KFNS 590 and KRFT 1190. Speaking of KFNS, the former FM station on 100.7 in Troy, MO has become a Classic Hits station as "Westplex 100.7" under the ownership of Kaspar Broadcasting Company; the studios are in nearby Moscow Mills. Kaspar also owns KWRE 730/KFAV 99.9 in Warrenton. The "Westplex" refers to the far western suburbs of St. Louis in St. Charles, Warren, Lincoln and Franklin counties in Missouri. As of 1200 ELT 11/13, my AM log stands at 1,106 stations heard. 73.
