 640 KFI **CA**, Los Angeles – 9/4 0703 noted with mention of "L.A.P.D. body cameras", spot cluster including a PSA for Kars-4-Kids. "KFI, clouds this morning" mentioned at 0706. A poor signal was noted, mixing with KWPN. (JJR-MI)
 650 KGAB **WY**, Orchard Valley – 9/7 0718 noted with a promo for Rush Limbaugh, "Cheyenne's Number One Talk Radio, KGAB" ID. A fair signal was noted; atop and alone on the channel. (JJR-MI)
 660 CFFR **AB**, Calgary – 9/3 0701 noted with traffic report, ad for Jack Carter Chevrolet mentioning "Jack-Carter-Chev-dot-CA", announcer mentioning "7 C in Calgary" and "660 News time". A poor signal was noted; alone on the channel. (JJR-MI)

9/12 **Guy Atkins**. I'm on a family vacation to Yachats, Oregon, but I was able to sneak a few minutes of pre-dawn DXing from the top of 800+ ft. Cape Perpetua. This scenic overlook has an astounding view when the sky is clear, but this morning it was foggy and overcast.

The setup was an Elad FDM-S2 and a Wellbrook ALA1530S+ Imperium 1-meter active loop antenna.

This morning's DX was hampered by some significant unidentified noises throughout the band; I haven't figured out yet if this QRM was self-inflicted from my own electronics (minimal gear brought along) or if it's something on-site. Tomorrow I'm trying a different location along the highway at 140 foot elevation (a highway 101 turnout that Gary DeBock and I have used the past few years).

Besides what's listed below, I had a lot of channels with threshold audio... unfortunately the noise covered up any chance of DXing these frequencies.

- 531 **UniD.** Some weak EG talk with ads string for cafe and other businesses at 1348, but no clue as to who this was. On the recording I think I hear mentions of "in Auckland" a couple times, but if this was 531 PI the language wouldn't be English(?)
- 612 **AUSTRALIA**, 4QD, Emerald. Poor to fair with bluegrass music and talk 1344, parallel to the following: 702 2BL Sydney at 1340 (better), 657 8RN Darwin (good), 684 8RN Tennant Creek at 1350, 738 2NR Grafton (presumed) but very weak, 774 3LO Melbourne at 1344 (good).
- 675 **NEW ZEALAND**, Radio National. Kiwi accented English talk about upcoming program on how Buddhists and Hindus are coping with the aftermath of the April 2015 major earthquake in Nepal. Fair-good briefly around 1351. Rock music selection, followed by commenter "that was one of New Zealand's most popular artists..." and a mention of Christchurch.
- 684 **UniD.** Weak talk and music here, 1344-1350.
- 693 **JAPAN**, JOAB, Tokyo. Surprisingly good at 1349-1351 compared to the DU signals. Continuous Japanese talk by a man, and completely dropped into the noise at 1352.
- 792 **UniD.** Very good signal of jazz instrumental music peaking at 1346, disappearing before any talk could surface.
- 936 **UniD.** Man and woman talking in Aussie accent English; no parallels noted. 4PB Brisbane?
- 1035 **NEW ZEALAND**, Wellington, Newstalk ZB. Newstalk ZB ID at 1345 with talk show host and guest in Kiwi sounding English. Poor-fair.

- 1521p **SAUDI ARABIA** BSKSA, Duba, AUG 19 0240 – carrier hetting KOKC OKC, which has got to be the 2-megawatt BSKSA Duba transmitter in the NW corner, the #1 beacon for trans-Atlantic MW DX conditions; WRTN shows sked is 15-03 UT, which seems strange, except they obviously find it worth running only during night hours. From mid-August, the "season" is supposedly back for us. Can't pull any audio on 1521 or detect anything on 1566 or 1512. [Hauser-OK]

*** PAN-AMERICAN DX ***

- 570 **MÉXICO** XEBJB, Monterrey, NL. AUG 26 1128 – “XEBJB, Nueva Vida”, Monterrey ID with 5 mil watts, Grupo Radio Alegría. New slogan, ex-Notiradio 570, as of last year’s IRCA Log. Cantú as of Feb, and WRTH 2015. Implies Christian format now. [Hauser-OK]
- 580p **MÉXICO** XEMU, Piedras Negras, Coah. AUG 17 0541 – ranchera music is holding its own against WIBW Topeka, presumed XEMU Piedras Negras, and as the two are not exactly opposite, by carefully positioning the DX-398 I can null or minimize the WIBW signal without totally nulling the other one. Live DJ with timecheck, but no ID, before WIBW regains. [Hauser-OK]
- 650 **MÉXICO** XETNT, Los Mochis, Sin. AUG 26 1130 – song in ode to glorious Sinaloa, mentioning its main cities, but nothing about its main industry; 1134 Radio K jingle, and plug for Grupo Chávez, 1135 live opening(?) for ‘Buenos Días, Yardero’ show, ie XETNT, a regular here around sunrise, usually too early for me in summer. [Hauser-OK]
- 740 **MÉXICO** XEQN, Torreón, Coah. SEP 3 0659 – with auroral boost, horrible low rumbling het against KRMG Tulsa, and somewhat separable with LSB tuning on the DX-398 and nulling: PSA about Puebla; Radio Fórmula, Chihuahua also mentioned but call ID for flagship in the DF, XERFR 970. Really must be XEQN, 10/1 kW, the only other Fórmula on 740 being in Q.Roo. [Hauser-OK]
- 770 **MÉXICO** XEACH, Monterrey, NL. SEP 7 0612 – Spanish music dominant, Fórmula ID, ie XEACH, 25/1 kW; nulling it, something weak in English, probably KKOB or KKO. [Hauser-OK]
- 780 **MÉXICO** XESFT, San Fernando, Tam. AUG 26 1139 – “La Poderosa, 103.5 y 780” ID, 6:39 TC; ie XESFT, 5/1 kW; with KSPI OK nulled, otherwise, makes annoying low audible het with it; also afflicting WBBM in the evenings. [Hauser-OK]
- 820 **CUBA** Radio Ciudad de la Habana. AUG 10 0135 – harmonious duet in Spanish, as good as WBAP which must be in a fade, on the NRD-545 and fixed N-S wire antenna, but better than on PL-880 which I can rotate to null WBAP. Then “that Cuban sound” man and woman announcers in scripted text, mentioning Cuba. Meanwhile, not //4765 Progreso or 5025 Rebelde, which is to be expected since uplooked later the closest 820 Cuban is Radio Ciudad de la Habana, 10 kW CMBU in Arroyo Arenas; however, there are two Radios Progreso also listed further on 820 in Ciego de Ávila, and way off in Moa, Holguín. Actually, WRTH 2015 lists “two” Radios Progreso on 820 both in Ciego de Ávila, CMIB and CMBC; all 10 kW except Moa 1 kW. [Hauser-OK]
- 870 **MÉXICO** XETAR, Guachochi, Chih. AUG 31 1205 – non-Spanish language mentions Guachochi, pronounces call XETAR as in Spanish, Secretaría de Salud PSA in Spanish. So this indigenous Chihuahuan is again audible around sunrise here, but soon fades. [Hauser-OK]
- 880 **MÉXICO** XEPNK, Los Mochis, Sin. AUG 28 0556 – Mexican NA with KRVN nulled, and thanks to dead air from KHAC-USB. 0557 ID for XEPNK and a similar FM call, plug Radio México network. This is 10/2 kW, surpassing 24h NSP XEV Chihuahua if it’s really on, 5/0.25 kW per IRCA Mexican Log. [Hauser-OK]
- 900 **MÉXICO** XEOK, Monterrey, NL. SEP 5 0149 – checking whether 890 Spanish song is // here, which would mean Radio Progresos, Cubans, but it’s not; instead, “Manténgase informado en 900-AM Noticias”, loops N/S, then song in English. So it’s XEOK, 10/2.5 kW, which has no problem blocking “250/250” kW XEW, DF, close to the same direction from here, with 100X the power at only sesqui the distance; yeah, right. [Hauser-OK]
- 1060v **MÉXICO** XERDO, Reynosa, Tam. SEP 7 0621 – “La Raza AM 1060 y 93.9” ID with usual LAH, from off-frequency XERDO Reynosa etc, the FM being XHRAW. [Hauser-OK]
- 1300 **MÉXICO** XEP, Ciudad Juárez, Chih. AUG 28 0546 – timecheck in Spanish for 11:45; loops WSW, music. Only two XEs are in the summer UT -6 zone, XEJL in Sinaloa, 1000/250 watts; and XEP Ciudad Juárez, Chihuahua, 38000/200 watts, but the latter often heard here with suspected day power at night. However, it soon lost out to the CCI. No US Spanish stations in the UT -6 zone according to the 2015 NRC AM Log, but some Texans in UT -5. Assuming the TC is only a sesquiminate off instead of an hour off. No, the Mexican NA can be heard at 0602, so local midnight in MDT zone. Spanish music still audible at 0613 by monitoring LSB only, conveniently suppressed by KHAC which had resumed modulating on USB. [Hauser-OK]
- +AUG 29 0548 – I am rechecking 24 hours later the Spanish circumstantially identified as XEP, Ciudad Juárez, Chihuahua. Again a dominant signal from WSW (or ENE), apropos for 38,000 rather than legal 200 watts, but plenty of CCI. Is playing romantic song, “Aquellos Ojos Verdes”; 0551 “En Radio México Noticias, también música bonita”, then “16 Tons” in English! but not by Tennessee Ernie Ford, no bass this one. 0557, Radio México Noticias promo, federal promo for La Hora Nacional, promo some RMN morning shows; more music; 0602 “Escuchas Radio México Noticias”, no further ID and into choral NA. 0604, NA is over already, and finally an ID for Radio México Noticias, including XEP call. This station is obviously determined to maintain its “news” identity even when playing music. [Hauser-OK]
- 1610 **ANGUILLA** The Caribbean Beacon, The Valley. AUG 23 0059 – MW bandscan finds PMS quite audible, and synchro with 5935 WWCR, 6090 Anguilla, all taking exactly same satellite feed. ~7.5 SAH with something else on 1610, TIS or CHHA? Pre-sunset here, which will be 0113, now earlying at the rate of 9 minutes per week, soon to be 10 as we close in on Equinox. Recheck at 0137: not heard. [Hauser-OK]
- 1620 **CUBA** Radio Rebelde, AUG 29 0138 – Radio Rebelde with excited commentary, but NOT //5025, which is to be expected as 1620 then mentions “sorteo de béisbol – de la FM Radio Rebelde”. [Hauser-OK]
