**Mike Sanburn** of Bellflower CA. sends along the following from **Tim Tromp** of West Michigan dated 9/27/15 (re 1710 UnID):

With a little help from some underground radio friends, I've learned this was a test transmission originating somewhere around Timmins, Ontario (roughly 480 miles NNE). The transmitter was 35 watts into an inverted L antenna. The testing is for CHIM-FM's future 1710 transmitter that they reference on their website. The test broadcast I heard wasn't officially CHIM but rather the person tweaking their transmitter from what I gathered. It's unknown if CHIM plans on running the same output power when 1710 goes live. Here's a clip of what I heard: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=t6GEnjXjsfs>. It's on again right now at 2358 UTC as I type this and the op hinted he might boost it up to 50 watts tonight.

KMIK-1580 in Tempe was sold last month but are still Radio Disney. From what I heard they will change to religious and change call but I have not heard when the change will take place.

Salem Acquires Radio Disney's Final Five Lance Venta | September 15 2015 The final five stations left to be sold by Radio Disney will go to multiple holding companies of Salem Communications for a combined \$2.225 million. 1260 WSDZ Belleville IL will be Salem's only station in the St Louis market for \$275,000 under Caron Broadcasting. 1380 WMMI St Petersburg FL will become Salem's fifth AM in the Tampa market for \$750,000 as it goes to South Texas Broadcasting. 1440 KDIZ Golden Valley MN becomes Salem's fourth AM in the Minneapolis/St Paul market as it goes to Common Ground Broadcasting for \$375,000. 1640 KDZR Lake Oswego/Portland OR goes to Salem Media of Oregon for \$275,000. Salem already owns one AM and three FMs in the Portland market. 1690 KDDZ Arvada/Denver CO goes to Salem Media of Colorado for \$550,000. Salem currently owns two AMs and one FM in the Denver market. Salem has been the most prolific buyer of Disney's divestitures in this round as it previously purchased stations in Atlanta, Boston, Dallas, Orlando, and Pittsburgh. The big news in St Louis is that Radio Disney will be exiting the market shortly, after 17 years. Radio Disney LLC has sold WSDZ 1260 Belleville IL to Salem; my guess is that they will flip to a Business format. There are already too many Christian radio stations in the St Louis market; St Louis hasn't had a full-time Business station in many years. WSDZ was the station that drove WFUN-FM's "Fun Radio 95.5" Pre-Teen format off the air. The St Louis market could also lose 590 permanently; I won't be surprised that the license for KFNS 590 gets turned in to the FCC for cancellation. Next month will mark one year since the plug was pulled on the station, which had tried a "man talk" format. Grand Slam Sports, which owns KFNS and sister station KRFT (ex-KXFN) 1380, has been having a hard time finding a buyer for 590; 1380 is being leased to Inside STL, an Internet-based all-sports radio station. 1380 is still running 5,000 watts DA-D while they're trying to find a new nighttime transmitter site. KXEN 1010's 125-watt night signal has gotten weaker in recent weeks; I've been able to put a total null on them to pull in either WINS or CFRB. Their six-tower daytime array (which they haven't used since 2013) is still up on Chain of Rocks Road in Mitchell IL, although the three-tower nighttime array has been demolished. Their 375-watt day signal allows me to hear WCIL 1020 during the daytime with little trouble when I'm outside with the Superadio III. KQQZ 1190 De Soto MO has become the St Louis affiliate for University of Illinois football this season; the Fighting Illini have not had a local affiliate since KFNS pulled the plug. One of the duties I had when I was at WFUN-FM 95.5 was bringing the football and basketball games to the University of Illinois alumni in the St Louis area. Some DX of note: KSIR 1010 Brush CO noted through a nulled KXEN on August 28 with ESPN Sports Center All Night, local spots, promos and legal ID at 0350 ELT. WASG 540 Daphne AL noted through KMLB and KWMT with an ID in passing at 0358 on August 28. My first GY from CO was noted on August 30; it was a pleasant surprise to hear KSTC 1230 Sterling with an ID in passing at 0137 ELT. Another pleasant surprise was XEBJB 570 Monterrey NL; noted on September 22 at 0742 with mention of the station's dial position, local ads and pop music in Spanish. The 150-foot dipole I built in 2011 really does the job on the graveyard channels. In looking over my AM broadcast band logbook at my present location (I started this logbook July 4 1992), my ten most productive AM broadcast band DX states are: 1) Illinois (122 stations), 2) Missouri (115), 3) Texas (112), 4) Tennessee (108), 5) Alabama (77), 6) Wisconsin (66), 7) Georgia (65), 8) Kentucky (63), 9) Arkansas (56) and 10) Iowa (54). Call letter changes in my logbooks only count on AM; they don't count on FM, analog/digital TV and NOAA Weather Radio. As of September 22 2015, my AM logbook now stands at 1,615. 73.
