- 800 KBRV **ID**, Soda Springs heard 1/7 at 0850 with "KBRV The Bear" then weather report. (BB-AZ)

 KKAN **KS**, Phillipsburg 12/30 1900 end of oldies song, then ID "This is your regional information center, KKAN, Phillipsburg." (NP-AB)
 1570 KDIZ **MN**, Golden Valley 1/1 2058 repeating ID "KDIZ Golden Valley" and announcement about "Business 1570" (KYCR) has moved down the dial to 1440. (NP-AB)
 1590 WGBW **WI**, Denmark 1/1 2000 "WGBW, Denmark-Green Bay, True Oldies 1590" ID at the hour. (NP-AB)

 940 KIXZ **TX**, Amarillo. 12/30 Strong signal. 0758 all alone when most of band was quiet. Heard with health care and Gold's Gym spots, ID and CBS News at 08:00. Not common here. [KDF-IL]
 1380 KCII **IA**, Washington. 1/2 fair to poor signal, mixing with WLRM, WBEL. 0123 noted with "KCII" jingle into Adult Contemporary format. FM simulcast partner on 106.1 MHz was logged in August 2013. [EB-MO]
 1390 KRFO **MN**, Owatonna. 1/4 fair to poor signal mixing with KCLN, WGRB. 2152 with Oldies format, "The only station for your favorite Oldies, AM 13-90 KCLN" ID. [EB-MO]
 1450 KMRY **IA**, Cedar Rapids. 1/2 fair to poor signal, dominating over other stations. 2359 noted with Classic Hits format, "93.1 FM, 14-50 AM, KMRY AM and FM Cedar Rapids" semi-legal ID into CBS News. The translator is actually in Iowa City. [EB-MO]

- 770 KATL **MT**, Miles City – 1/8 1826 noted with "Clark Howard on 770 KATL" ID. A poor signal was noted with WABC and two other stations nulled. (JJR-MI)
 830 KUYO **WY**, Evanston – 1/8 0929 noted with very soft Christian music; no IDs so I would assume this would be KUYO. A poor and very faint signal was noted; not new in the logbook. (JJR-MI)
 900 CHML **ON**, Hamilton – 12/31 between 1625 and 1805 noted with The Best of Roy Green. The signal was noted mixing with WCPA and unidentified stations with a Talk format and vocal music in Spanish. (KK-VA) (Your vocal music in Spanish may be WKDA Lebanon TN; your talker may be WLSI Pikeville KY – eb)
 910 WRKL **NY**, New City – 12/31 1717 noted with talk in Polish by a male announcer, possible mentions of Central Park Avenue and New Jersey. At 1741, this legal ID was done in English by a male announcer: "AM 1030 WNVR Vernon Hills/Chicago; AM 1300 WRDZ LaGrange/Chicago". The signal was noted mixing with WRNL, WBZU, WSBA, two unidentified vocal music stations and unidentified stations with Spanish language programming and Fox Sports Radio. (KK-VA) (Radio Disney is no longer on 910, so you may have heard an Adult Contemporary format. That would fit either WAKO Lawrenceville IL or WDOR Sturgeon Bay WI. The closest Fox Sports Radio affiliate to your location is KINA Salina KS – eb)
 WBZU **PA**, Scranton – 12/31 1630 noted with an ad for Morgan Creek Golf Course in Hunlock Creek, PA by a female announcer; a phone number of (570) 256-3444 was mentioned. "WILK" jingle, as WBZU is part of the WILK Network. The signal was noted mixing with WRNL, WRKL, WSBA, two unidentified vocal music stations and unidentified stations with Spanish language programming and Fox Sports Radio. (KK-VA) (Your unidentified Spanish station could either be WLAT New Britain CT or WMRB Columbia TN – eb)
 920 WHJJ **RI**, Providence – 12/31 1745 noted with the Sean Hannity program; not WUVA or CHNX. At 1750, one male announcer was noted saying: "The final hour of the Sean Hannity Show", followed by another male announcer with a "News Radio 920" ID. Checking the WHJJ Web site, I see their slogan is "News Radio 920". The signal was noted mixing with WUVA, CHNX and unidentified stations with talk and vocal music. (KK-VA)
 930 WPAT **NJ**, Paterson – 12/31 1700 noted with "WPAT Paterson" legal ID by a male announcer in English. At 1717, a "WPAT" jingle was noted. The signal was noted mixing with WHLM, WFMD, WBEN and an unidentified vocal music station. (KK-VA) (One possibility for your unidentified music station is WGAD Rainbow City AL – eb)
 WBEN **NY**, Buffalo – 12/31 between 1625 and 1805 noted with a political call-in show. The signal was noted mixing with WHLM, WFMD, WPAT and an unidentified vocal music station. (KK-VA) (Another possibility for your unidentified vocal music station could be WLLL Lynchburg VA – eb)
 WHLM **PA**, Bloomsburg – 12/31 1627 noted with a "WHLM" jingle. The signal was noted mixing with WBEN, WFMD, WPAT and an unidentified vocal music station. (KK-VA) (Another possibility for your unidentified vocal music station could be WYFQ Charlotte NC – eb)
 940 WINZ **FL**, Miami – 12/31 1717 noted with mention of "breaking news, traffic and severe weather on News Radio 610 WIOD" by a male announcer. At this point, WINZ is simulcasting WIOD. At 1721, a "940 Wins" ID was noted by a male announcer. A power cut and pattern change was noted at 1730. The signal was noted mixing with WADV, WMAC, WGRP, WKYK and unidentified stations with talk and Christian programming. (KK-VA) (Your Christian station could either be WCPC Houston MS or WKGSM Smithfield VA; your unidentified talk station may be WFAW Fort Atkinson WI – eb)
 WKYK **NC**, Burnsville – 12/31 1653 noted with "Real Country; that would be the home of Legendary Classic Country" mention by a male announcer. The signal was noted mixing with WADV, WMAC, WGRP, WINZ and unidentified stations with talk and Christian programming. (KK-VA)
 WGRP **PA**, Greenville – 12/31 1649 noted with "This is the forecast from 940 WGRP and 940 WGRP-dot-com" mention by a female announcer. The signal was noted mixing with WADV, WMAC, WKYK, WINZ and unidentified stations with talk and Christian programming. (KK-VA)

- 980 KDSJ **SD**, Deadwood – 1/8 0924 noted with mention of “coverage Saturday at one on 980 KDSJ and KDSJ 980-dot-com” mention. A poor signal was noted. (JJR-MI)
- 1020 WRIX **SC**, Homeland Park – 1/3 1712 noted with Christian talk and vocal music, before this mention by a female announcer: “Hi, this is Dena Hopper, and this is The Life” The signal was noted mixing with KDKA, Radio Reloj (Cuba) and unidentified stations with talk and Spanish language programming. WRIX is only the second U.S. station to be heard or identified on this frequency. (KK-VA) (Kraig, your unidentified talker could be WCIL Carbondale IL; your other Spanish could be WURN Kendall FL – eb)
- 1040 WPBS **GA**, Conyers – 1/3 1725 noted with Korean language programming with brief English mentions. A male announcer was noted with this mention in English: “Don’t even think about changing the station; you’re listening to Musicland 905”. I visited the station’s Web site with help from a Korean co-worker to see if the station carries “Musicland 905” around 1700 ELT; WPBS carries the program. The signal was noted mixing with WSGH, WYSL, WHO and unidentified stations with Christian Talk and Oldies. (KK-VA) (Your Christian talker could be either WCHR Flemington NJ or if the talk is of a Catholic nature, WLCR Mount Washington KY. Your Oldies station could really be Urban AC station WJBE Powell TN – eb)
- WYSL **NY**, Avon – 1/3 1628 noted with “The Voice of Liberty” mention by a male announcer, followed by a “WYSL” jingle ID. Later, this legal ID was noted by a male announcer: “You’re listening to WYSL 1040-dot-com, 92.1 FM and 1040 AM, WYSL Avon/Rochester”. (92.1 refers to W221CL Avon NY – eb) The signal was noted mixing with WPBS, WSGH, WHO and unidentified stations with Christian talk and Oldies. (KK-VA)
- WSGH **NC**, Lewisville – 1/3 1702 noted with continuous Christian music in Spanish, followed by this legal ID by a male announcer in heavily accented English: “This is WNOW Mint Hill, WWWC Wilkesboro, WWBG Winston-Salem, WSGH Lewisville, North Carolina”. The signal was noted mixing with WPBS, WYSL, WHO and unidentified stations with Christian talk and Oldies. (KK-VA) (Kraig, these stations are part of the Radio Adoración network. You must have heard “Lewisville” pronounced as “Lawrenceville”; many Spanish stations ID in English with a heavy Spanish accent. This is also a format change for WWWC; the latest NRC log lists this as Southern Gospel – eb)
- 1070 KFTI **KS**, Wichita – 1/8 0922 noted with ad for Burger King and a “Classic Country 1070” ID. A fair signal was noted in a nice fade-up; alone on channel. (JJR-MI)
- 1090 KTGO **ND**, Tioga – 1/7 0805 noted with mentions of North Dakota Web sites, agricultural report with mentions of grain prices, oil prices, farm co-op addresses and other information, followed by mentions of Best-of-ND-dot-com and North Dakota’s Best-dot-com. A poor signal was noted with no sign of WBAL or WAQE. (JJR-MI)
- 1190 WLIB **NY**, New York – 1/6 1851 noted with Urban Gospel format, mentions of “Like WLIB (on Facebook) and “WLIB-dot-com”. A poor signal was noted in a WOWO null. (JJR-MI) (I have a semi-local parked here – eb)
- 1230 KDIX **ND**, Dickinson – 1/8 0825 noted with mentions of “North Dakota markets... in Dickinson” and “steers in Dickinson”, followed by a weather report mentioning “Cloudy in Dickinson, 25 degrees.” This was still in an hour later on a recheck. A poor signal was noted. (JJR-MI)
- 1240 KDLR **ND**, Devils Lake – 1/7 0552 noted with promo for a basketball game streaming on Radio Works-dot-com, Classic Country format, “Weatherology” feature, calls, U.S. national anthem noted at 0559. KDLR plays “The Star Spangled Banner” at 0559 weekdays. This is nice to know, just in case! I know this from my travels in the area. A poor signal was noted. (JJR-MI)
- 1250 KIKC **MT**, Forsyth – 1/8 1000 noted with a clear Mountain Time check, “KIKC” ID and “Classic Country” mention after music selection. A poor signal was noted; alone on the channel, a new log at L’Anse. (JJR-MI)
- 1260 WCCR **OH**, Cleveland – 1/8 1700 noted with legal ID, “AM 1260, the Rock” ID into Ave Maria Radio Catholic talk. A poor signal was noted; alone on the channel. (JJR-MI)
- 1290 KOWB **WY**, Laramie – 1/8 0949 noted with mentions of “Winter weather in Wyoming” and “WY-DOT” (Wyoming Department of Transportation). A poor signal was noted; alone on the channel. (JJR-MI)
- 1340 KTOQ **SD**, Rapid City – 1/8 0828 noted with PSA for Feeding America, mention of SD Highway 44 East, ad for Shop Black Hills-dot-com, “ESPN Rapid City” ID and weather forecast mentioning a high temperature of 10 above and a low of six degrees below zero. A poor signal was noted above other stations. (JJR-MI)
- 1380 KAGE **MN**, Winona – 1/8 1738 noted with “K-Gee Country” upon tuning in. A poor signal was noted before fading out. (JJR-MI)
- KOTA **SD**, Rapid City – 1/8 0810 noted with “KOTA Radio news time 6:12” time check into local news. A poor signal was noted at first, rising to fair strength. (JJR-MI)
- 1410 CJWI **QC**, Montreal – 1/7 0534 noted with 11 minutes of talk in French; I assume this is CJWI. A poor signal was noted in a tight null of WIZM and WING. (JJR-MI) (The NRC Log shows CJWI as a French and Creole station; I heard this one when they were on 1610 – eb)
- KLFD **MN**, Litchfield – 1/8 1937 noted with mentions of “Cenex” and “Highway 12”, gave estate information and two phone numbers, “AM 1410, the Original” ID into Classic Country format. A fair to strong signal was noted. (JJR-MI)
- KDKT **ND**, Beulah – 1/8 0900 noted with mentions of Western North Dakota, KDKT Sports Radio 1410” ID. A poor signal was noted; alone on the channel. (JJR-MI)
- 1420 WCED **PA**, Du Bois – 1/7 1727 noted with mentions of “Sandy Plaza” and “...Diner”, gave phone number in Area Code 814; “Connect Radio 96.7 and 107 (point nine)”. A poor signal was noted; a new station in the logbook. (JJR-MI)
- 1450 KYNT **SD**, Yankton – 1/8 0805 noted with “KYNT news time 7:05” time check, weather report mentioning “another one inch of snow”. A poor signal was noted over other stations. (JJR-MI)
- 1490 KOMJ **NE**, Omaha – 1/7 1713 noted with “Boomer 1490, celebrating one year on the air, six o’clock tonight!” mention. A fair signal was noted. (JJR-MI)
- KNDC **ND**, Hettinger – 1/8 0831 noted with mention of “Weather Eye”, weather forecast mentioning “18 at 1490 KNDC”, into a Classic Country format. A fair and loud signal was noted at armchair levels. (JJR-MI)
- KORN **SD**, Mitchell – 1/8 1000 noted with mention of “on News Radio KORN 1490”, “KORN” ID into local news. A poor signal was noted. (JJR-MI) (I haven’t noted this station at my location, but did pull in sister station KQRN 107.3 in July 2003 – eb)
- 1550 WITK **PA**, Pittston – 1/3 (no time) noted with “You’re listening to WITK” ID at the top of the hour, followed by a station promo and Christian talk. A poor to very poor signal was noted, mostly under two other stations. (PS-ON) (You mentioned WACK and WHK in your report; they’re both on 1420 – eb)
- 1580 KNIM **MO**, Maryville – 1/8 1008 noted with ad for Case-International Harvester dealers in Missouri and Southern Iowa, “KNIM Weather Central” mention. A poor signal was noted. (JJR-MI)

The era of Pre-Teen radio in St Louis ended in mid-December when Radio Disney signed off for the last time in the Gateway City. Just before Christmas, St Louis got its third Conservative Talk station when WSDZ returned to the air as "1260 the Answer". It carries Salem's conservative talk shows, including Michael Medved. The other two conservative talkers in St Louis are KMOX 1120 (anchored by Rush Limbaugh) and KFTK 97.1 (whose biggest name is Sean Hannity). KXFN 1380 is silent once again, as their programming has now moved to KFNS 590. Inside STL is leasing the station. The three remaining towers near Madison IL, used for daytime broadcasting, are owned by Emmis Communications; a couple of years ago, KXFN had to give up its nighttime tower site in Monroe County IL because of financial problems. Emmis originally acquired the station in 1998 when Zimmer Radio Group pulled out of St Louis. WGNU 920's sports programming is now simulcast on the HD2 channel of KPNT 105.7 Collinsville IL. I often question the use of "HD" channels to relay AM stations, as "HD" sub-channels have only a clear signal for 10 miles. KMOX 1120 uses KEZK 102.5's HD3 channel; that and the AM "HD" signal does not get out as far as the analog AM signal. KQQZ 1190 and KZQZ 1430 now simulcast for one hour a day (1700-1800 ELT) on weekdays; it's a talk show hosted by Bob Romanik, known as "The Grim Reaper of Radio". He often talks about politics in St Clair County IL; his views are a bit off the wall. "The Grim Reaper" is a former strip club owner who served as Chief of Police in Washington Park IL. His sons and attorney actually own the station (since Mr Romanik is a convicted felon). Speaking of KZQZ, their nighttime service returned a week before Christmas; it was down due to technical issues. The flooding in the St Louis area between Christmas and New Year's did a lot of damage around southern St Louis and northern Jefferson Counties in Missouri; I monitored the Red Cross communications nets on 146.850 and 147.360 MHz, as well as the marine and railroad frequencies on VHF. I didn't listen too much of the coverage on the local broadcast stations, although I watched the coverage on local television stations. 73.

Technical details are at the end of the report. Let's get straight into the loggings...

- 530 TIS **CO**, Fort Collins. 9/26 0305 – NOAA weather for northern Colorado. New.
 DoT **WY**. 9/26 1159 – Presumed WY DoT station, very weak, just mainly heard three sets of 3 ascending tones. FCC search shows a station in Cheyenne, plus mobile units.
 CM?? **CUBA**, La Habana. 9/25 0329 – Radio Enciclopedia usual piano music with female announcer. Rebelde outlet came in a bit later. Caught a nice ID 9/27 1101: "Radio Enciclopedia desde La Habana, Cuba."
 CM?? **CUBA**, unknown. 9/25 0559 – Radio Rebelde ID and familiar 9-note theme. This station was often noted //670, 710, 1180, 1620 and often fighting with the Enciclopedia station which was the one received here in past years. New.
- 540 XESURF **BCN**, Tijuana. 9/25 0459 – Spanish religion, ID "XESURF Tijuana, México, Radio Zion 540 AM." Most shows feature the same female preacher. Same programming airs on KXOR-660 in Oregon. New.
 XETX **CHIH**, Nuevo Casas Grandes. 9/25 0329 – "Su mayor compañía todo el día, la ranchera de Paquime, 540 AM y 90.5 FM." Also "B-M Radio." For the following 2 or 3 evenings, this station and many other stations in Chihuahua were running some sort of a baseball playoff between the Chihuahua Dorados and the Guasave Algodoneros (the Golden Boys vs the Cottonpickers?!). At the same time, 3 Sinaloa stations (including XEHS-540) were running a fútbol (soccer) match for the Dorados de Sinaloa, so I had two teams named Dorados playing two different sports and both mentioning Guasave and Sinaloa. Kind of confusing at first!
 XEHS **SIN**, Los Mochis. 9/26 0350 – "La major 90.9." Later in the weekend, this station was running Dorados de Sinaloa fútbol (soccer) simulcasting XEHW-600 and XEORO-680, with the announcer giving IDs for all 3 stations during the game. New.
- 550 KFYI **AZ**, Phoenix. 9/25 1229 – Local ads, ID. New.
 KLLV **CO**, Breen. 9/26 0414 – "Inspirational voice of the Four Corners, KLLV in Breen, Colorado. This daytimer is still staying on at night after 10 years, mostly playing hymns. Mixing with KFYI and XEPL on ESE wire.
 KBOW **MT**, Butte. 9/28 1304 – "6 minutes after 7:00 on KBOW." New.
 KFYR **ND**, Bismarck. 9/26 0143 – High School football: Mandan Braves vs Minot/Dakota Memorial "MDM" Magicians. Slogan "K-Fire 5-50 and 99.7 FM."
 KOAC **OR**, Corvallis. 9/28 1304 – NPR news, Oregon Public Broadcasting. New.
 KCRS **TX**, Midland. 9/28 0159 – "News talk KCRS Odessa-Midland, an ICA Broadcasting station" into Fox news. New.
 XEPL **CHIH**, Ciudad Cuauhtémoc. 9/28 1200 – XE anthem, "XEPL 91.3 FM 550AM 24 horas, Cuauhtémoc, Chihuahua, México, la superestacion." Relog.
 ??? **UnID**. 9/27 0404 – Weather from meteorologist Judy (Dunweather or something similar?), into a health program produced by the Arthritis Foundation. I initially suspected KTRS-MO, which appears to do some work with the arthritis foundation, but I don't see a specific program of this nature listed in their (partial) program schedule on their web page. KFYI would be another likely choice, as their format has traditionally contained a lot of "health talk" but this seems less likely as it was coming in on the ENE wire.
- 560 KBLU **AZ**, Yuma. 9/26 0245 – Promo for "Chamber Chatter" Wednesdays at 8am, "where Yuma comes to talk." AP news noted later. ID includes the phrase "part of the El Dorado Broadcasting Network." New.
 KWTO **MO**, Springfield. 9/26 0259 – "Friday afternoon at 2, right here on 5-60 KWTO, the talk of the Ozarks" into CBS news. New.
 KMON **MT**, Great Falls. 9/28 0059 – Country music, "Big Sky Country KMON." New.
 KLVN **TX**, Beaumont. 9/27 0359 – "KLVI Beaumont-Port Arthur-Orange." Logged again with a similar ID (and mentioning **klvi.com**) at 1100 UT. This station (I think they were KFDM then) was my dad's favorite station growing up in SE Texas in the early 1940s. New.
 KPQ **WA**, Wenatchee. 9/28 1259 – Promo for financial show weekdays at 2pm "on 5-60 KPQ." New.
 XESRD **DUR**, Santiago Papasquiari. 9/25 0359 – ID by male announcer. Relog.
 XEYO **SON**, Huatabampo. 9/28 0205 – "Radio lobo." New.
- 570 KCFJ **CA**, Alturas. 9/27 0159 – End of CRI "Beijing Hour." Repeated announcements about the programs being produced by G&E Studios. "This is KCFJ AM 5-70 Alturas." Surprised to hear all of this CRI stuff mixed in with their usual NOS format. New.
 KLAC **CA**, Los Angeles. 9/25 0559 – Local ads, ID, Fox Sports. Legal IDs mention KYSR-FM HD. New.
 KWML **NM**, Las Cruces. 9/26 0113 – High School football: Centennial Hawks vs Las Cruces Bulldogs. New.
 WNAX **SD**, Yankton. 9/25 1159 – Ad for Northland Ford, ID into CBS news. Relog.
 KLIF **TX**, Dallas. 9/27 0229 – Job posting for general sales manager and promo for upcoming radio branding seminar. Relog.
 KNRS **UT**, Salt Lake City. 9/25 0604 – Usually the dominant station on this channel with "talk radio 105.7" slogans, Fox News and talk shows. Station was running announcements saying that the talk format was moving to FM 105.9, which I later found out merely meant that their FM was changing frequencies on October 8th.
 KVI **WA**, Seattle. 9/25 0405 – "Talk radio 5-70 KVI." Most of the Seattle radio dial was audible this year off the back-end of the ESE and SE wires.
 XEBJB **NL**, Monterrey. 9/25 0400 – "XEBJB 570 AM" ID by male announcer. "Nueva vida" slogan also noted. Later IDs also mentioned 5kw and Grupo ACIR. New.
- CM?? **CUBA**, unknown. 9/27 0404 and 0429 – Reloj station briefly noted with pips way off (around 25 seconds after each minute). At first I thought I might have a 2nd Reloj outlet on this channel but I never actually heard 2 stations simultaneously.
- 580 KIDO **ID**, Nampa. 9/25 0159 "Idaho's place to talk, KIDO AM 5-80" into Fox News. New.
 WIBW **KS**, Topeka. 9/26 0215 – Royals baseball, IDs. New.

 KONA **WA**, Kennewick-Richland-Pasco. 9/26 0236 – High School football: Richland Bombers vs Hanford Falcons. “News radio 6-10,” ABC news. New.
 XEBX **COAH**, Sabinas. 9/25 0332 – “La primera, la voz de la region, XEBX, Sabinas, Coahuila.” New.
 XEGS **SIN**, Guasave. 9/25 0359 – “La G-S, 106.1, la _____ de Guasave.” New.

 KMNS **IA**, Sioux City. 9/26 1159 – “Sioux City Fox Sports 6-20.” New.
 KPOJ **OR**, Portland. 9/25 1258 – Weekly EAS test, KPOJ Trailblazers Fan Fest promotion. Still uses slogan “Rip City Radio,” whatever that means. (NOTE: In my recent Montana trip, I was confusing some of KPOJ’s sports programming with KIGS’s Asian programming which was coming in at the same time, just as they were during this logging). New.
 KMKI **TX**, Plano. 9/26 0223 – High School football: Plano West Wolves vs McKinney Boyd Broncos – this game was also broadcast on KVCE-1160 according to Dallas newspaper listings. (NOTE: At this time the station was still IDing as KMKI, despite the call change to KEXB being listed around this time. At other times this weekend they were IDing as “KVCE AM 11-60” during the hour. ID at 9/27 0159: “Money radio 6-20 KMKI Plano, a service of Salem Media Group.”)

KHAS **NE**, Hastings. 9/26 0217 – High School football: Game was just ending "on Hastings radio, 12-30 AM KHAS radio" – must have been the Hastings Tigers vs the Alliance Bulldogs (same game as KCOW-1400).

KOTS **NM**, Deming. 9/26 0119 – High School football: Deming Wildcats vs Santa Fe Demons.

KFUN **NM**, Las Vegas. 9/26 0222 – High School football: Capital Jaguars (Santa Fe) at Robertson Cardinals (Las Vegas) for homecoming (Robertson was leading 28-22 at halftime).

KBCQ **NM**, Roswell. 9/26 1230 – "92.5 cool FM." New.

KYVA **NM**, Gallup. 9/26 0100 – Dodgers baseball, local ads, ID. "Rockin' oldies" slogan noted the next day. New.

KSNB **WA**, Spokane. 9/26 0200 – Local ad for Precision Garage Door Repair in Spokane. New.

???? **UnID**. 9/25 0600 – Spanish format, "estamos la zeta AM." Can't find any station on 1230 currently using this slogan.

???? **UnID**. 9/27 1130 – Star Spangled Banner very weak on NNE wire.

1240 KJCR **MT**, Billings. 9/25 0159 – ID "KJCR, Global Catholic Radio's listener-supported radio station." Also uses slogan "Billings' Catholic radio." New.

KODY **NE**, North Platte. 9/26 1059 – PSA, then promo for "Nebraska football on Husker Radio 12-40." Relog.

KCLV **NM**, Clovis. 9/26 0232 – High School football: Rio Rancho Rams vs Clovis Wildcats. Also 9/27 0159 with promo for Ag show 5-6am, "talk 12-40 KCLV Clovis" into SRN news. New.

KRJW **OR**, Altamont. 9/26 1259 – "AM 12-40 KRJW Altamont-Klamath Falls, CBS Sports Radio 12-40 the winner." New.

KCCR **SD**, Pierre. 9/26 0152 – High School football: Riggs Governors (Pierre) vs Yankton; opposing team's coverage was on KYNT-1450 but I didn't hear that station. Also logged 9/25 1131 with add for Wegner Auto in Pierre. New.

KFBC **WY**, Cheyenne. 9/26 0215 – High School football: Laramie Plainsmen vs Cheyenne Central Indians (same game carried by KOWB-1290). Halftime report with KFBC's Keith Kelley.

KASL **WY**, Newcastle. 9/25 0500 – "Your home for today's country hits, 12-40 KASL." Relog.

XEWG **CHIH**, Ciudad Juárez. 9/26 1204 – "12-40 AM, la unica de Ciudad Juárez." Relog.

???? **UnID**. 9/26 0159 – High School football: One team sounded like "Golden" with a team name like "Yankees," "Jankies" or "Jinkies"; the other team name was 3 syllables ending in "mint" or "ment" and was called the Gophers. The team in Golden CO did not play on this night. KZER **CA**, Santa Barbara. 9/25 1230 – Spanish format, usual "radio laser 12-50" slogans. New.

KBRF **MN**, Fergus Falls. 9/26 0135 – High School football: Fergus Falls Otters vs Thief River Falls Prowlers, sponsored by local auto service shop. The previous night they ran promos for this game ("Friday Night Lights on Lakes Radio") and mentioned that "10-20 the game" (KJJK) would be running the Hillcrest – Park Christian game. Also logged 9/27 1159 under KNEU with job opening at the station, inviting people to send resumes to an e-mail address lakesbroadcasting.com. Relog.

KIKC **MT**, Forsyth. 9/25 0059 ID hard to copy under KNEU-UT: "... classics... KEIR **ID**, Idaho Falls. 9/26 0135 – High School football: Madison Bobcats vs Blackfoot Broncos (also aired on KEII-690); sponsored by Kettle Embroidery in Rexburg and Vital Sign and Graphics in Rexburg. ID noted at 1105 the next morning: "KEIR, FM 101.1, the new home of Idaho State football." Relog.

KWEI **ID**, Weiser. 9/26 0229 – ID "KWEI Weiser" and Spanish music format "Juan, tocando lo que le gusta." New.

KWYR **SD**, Winner. 9/25 1105 – "Country 12-60" slogan faded up during KEIR's ID. For a moment I thought KEIR was changing formats. Relog.

1270 KPOW **WY**, Powell. 9/26 0136 – High School football: Powell Panthers vs Green River Wolves (other team's coverage was on KUGR-1490).

KSCB **KS**, Liberal. 9/27 1230 – Local ads, promo for Knights of Columbus benefit, KSCB calls mentioned in next promo announcement. Relog.

KINN **NM**, Alamogordo. 9/26 0404 – Local ad string, jingle for Alamogordo weather. Listed 80w nights. New.

KAJO **OR**, Grants Pass. 9/27 0204 – Oregon Ducks college football network. New.

KNWC **SD**, Sioux Falls. 9/26 1200 – "Voice of the Northwestern Eagles." Relog.

KFLC **TX**, Benbrook. 9/27 1101 – "Univision America, una estacion de Uforia." New.

KBAM **WA**, Longview. 9/26 1259 – Faded up for a nice clear ID "KBAM Longview." Mixing with KDJI. Listed 83w nights (no PSRA as far as I know). New.

 KOUU **ID**, Pocatello. 9/26 0101 – High School football: Preston vs Pocatello, sponsored by Teton VW in Idaho Falls. Mentioned simulcast on 102.9 FM. This station also ran a game on Thursday night, the Century Diamondbacks @Skyline (Idaho Falls) Grizzlies.
 KMMM **KS**, Pratt. 9/27 1230 – “The mighty 12-90 KMMM” into AC music. Alone on a usually-crowded channel. New.
 KGVO **MT**, Missoula. 9/25 0559 – Promo for “Montana Mornings” program on AM 12-90 and FM 101.5. ID and Fox news. New.
 KOWB **WY**, Laramie. 9/26 0136 – High School football: Laramie Plainsmen vs Cheyenne Central Indians (same game carried by KFBC-1240).
 CFRW **MB**, Winnipeg. 9/25 1145 – “Good morning show” with traffic advisory for Winnipeg due to heavy fog. Relog.
 XEAP **SON**, Ciudad Obregon 9/25 0400 – “12-90 AM, Ciudad Obregon... Romantica.” New.
 1300 KROP **CA**, Brawley. 9/26 0150 – High School football: Brawley Wildcats vs Gila Ridge (AZ) Hawks. Station runs SRN TownHall.com news. Slogans include “talk radio for all Imperial Valley” and “Your source for local sports.”

 KNOX **ND**, Grand Forks. 9/26 0146 – High School football: Lake Park-Audubon Raiders vs “Polk County West Thunder” which is seemingly a new name for the listed opponent, the Climax-Fisher Knights (Climax is in western Polk County MN; Lake Park-Audubon HS is also in MN). Noted other nights with “Red Valley news and talk on the radio” slogan. Simulcasts FM 107.9. Relog.
 KTCK **TX**, Dallas. 9/27 0135 – Local ads, SMU football. New.
 KAHL **TX**, San Antonio. 9/27 0204 – NOS format, local ad for Medicare supplemental coverage from WellMed Medical Group 871-7277/wellmedmedicalgroup.com, found in the list of advertisers on KAHL’s web site. Listed 280w nights. New.
 CIWW **ON**, Ottawa. 9/27 0359 – “Wherever you go, 13-10 news, CIWW” into Canadian Press news (which started around 0359:23). New.
 XEC **BCN**, Tijuana. 9/25 0605 – “Radio Enciso, XEC.” New.
 XETIA **JAL**, Guadalajara. 9/27 1100 – Nice clear slogan: “Bienvenidos... Radio vital, Guadalajara, Jalisco.” New.
 1320 KWHN **AR**, Fort Smith. 9/27 0359 – Ad for Proflowers.com, ID, Fox news. New.
 KAWC **AZ**, Yuma. 9/25 0459 – Community calendar, to be followed by “more great jazz” on “Colorado River Public Media, a service of Arizona Western College.” Listed 106w nights. New.
 KHRT **ND**, Minot. 9/25 0600 – ID “KHRT Minot, North Dakota’s solid Gospel station” into SRN news. Relog. Minot stations on 910 and 1320 were in very well this year, but the 1390 station, which had been logged on previous trips, was not noted this year. Listed 310w nights.
 KRDD **NM**, Roswell. 9/26 0408 – Spanish format, new slogan “la que arde.” 0506 ID in Spanish “KRDD, la doble D.” Listed 188w nights. New.

 KGAK **NM**, Gallup. 9/26 0058 – High School football: Espanola Valley Sundevils vs Gallup Bengals (homecoming), sponsored by Red Rock insurance. Opposing team’s coverage was on KDCE-950. KGAK’s coverage was in Navajo. Station signs off at 0359 with national anthem. Owned by KRJG Inc. which can sound a bit confusing during the sign-off.
 KCKM **TX**, Monahans. 9/26 0120 – “Your classic country station, KCKM.” I expected they would be an easy High School football catch, but I didn’t notice them running a game. New.
 KOVE **WY**, Lander. 9/26 0135 – High School football: Lander Tigers vs Douglas Bearcats. Normally runs Fox news at the top of the hour.
 1340 KIKO **AZ**, Apache Junction. 9/27 1100 – “Great hits from the 60s and 70s, KIKO-FM 97.3 Claypool, KIKO AM 13-40 Apache Junction. New (ex-Miami, including a transmitter move of about 30 miles or more).
 KPVV **CA**, Oroville. 9/26 1059 – Radio Catolica Mundial. New.
 KTMM **CO**, Grand Junction. 9/26 0141 – High School football: Fruita Monument Wildcats vs Doherty Spartans. Note that KTMM was not running the same game as KNAM-1490, whom they normally simulcast.
 KACH **ID**, Preston. 9/26 0054 – High School football: Pre-game and into Soda Springs Cardinals vs West Side Pirates (same game that was being broadcast on KBRV-800), sponsored by Napa Auto Parts in Preston; also had updates from the Pocatello-Preston game.

 KSRO **CA**, Santa Rosa. 9/26 0229 – High School football: Casa Grande Gauchos vs Rancho Cotate Cougars – kickoff shortly after 7:30pm PDT.
 KCCY **CO**, Pueblo. 9/26 0101 – High School football: Canon City Tigers vs Pueblo Central Wildcats.
 KDIO **MN**, Ortonville. 9/26 0254 – “Real country you’ve (grown?) to love, 13-50 KDIO.” Listed 38w nights. New.
 WCMP **MN**, Pine City. 9/25 1105 – Presumed with “Red zone 13-50” slogan. Lots of Minnesota stations in at this hour. Listed 500w PSRA. New.
 KBRX **NE**, O’Neill. 9/26 1139 – “13-50 AM the rock, KBRX.” Listed 500w PSRA. New.

1360 KLSB **CA**, San Diego. 9/25 0459 – Local ads and IDs. Station now uses both NBC Sports Radio (plus NBC features like Tom Brokaw commentaries) and Fox Sports networks. Still uses “extra sports 13-60” slogan at times. New.

KHNC **CO**, Johnstown. 9/25 0159 – ID, “The Lion” slogans and “American Freedom Network” mentions. USA Headline News at ToH some hours. Programming is mostly Bible readings and quotations from the Constitution. These guys were switching back to day rig a few hours after sunset each night.

KSCJ **IA**, Sioux City. 9/26 0040 – High School football: Council Bluffs Thomas Jefferson Yellowjackets vs Sioux City North Stars.

KBUY **NM**, Ruidoso. 9/26 0359 – Oldies, ID. 0405 “KBUY AM 13-60 and 105.9 FM, classic hits 13-60 AM and 105.9 FM, where great hits play back-to-back.” Heard often with KACT on the SE wire. Listed 199 (or 182?)w nights. New.

KDJW **TX**, Amarillo. 9/26 0059 – Faded up suddenly for ID, mentioning translators in Nazareth and Hart(?). New.

KACT **TX**, Andrews. 9/26 0102 – High School football: Andrews Mustangs vs Sweetwater Mustangs sponsored by Western Grill Steakhouse in Andrews. This station also runs the West Texas HS football wrap-up show (fridaynightscores.com). Mentioned FM 105.5. New.

1370 KWTL **ND**, Grand Forks. 9/25 1208 – EWTN/Real Presence programming as found on KVXR-1280. Relog.

XEHF **SON**, Nogales. 9/28 1300 – Usual Radio Formula programming. Probably these guys are the ones running the Mexican national anthem around 0200 UT. New.

1380 KSRV **OR**, Ontario. 9/26 0220 – High School football: Ontario Tigers vs Nyssa Bulldogs sponsored by Farmers Mutual Telephone Co. Still using slogans “great oldies” and “oldies 13-80.” New.

KOTA **SD**, Rapid City. 9/26 0040 – High School football: Sioux Falls Washington Warriors vs Rapid City Central Cobblers (apparently also aired on KWSN-1230; announcer apologized to KWSN listeners for mis-pronouncing a Sioux Falls player’s name).

1390 KRRZ **ND**, Minot. 9/25 1053 – “Classic hits 13-90 KRRZ.” Relog.

KENN **NM**, Farmington. 9/26 0040 – High School football: Los Alamos Hilltoppers vs Farmington Scorpions sponsored by High Country Auto Group and others. ID mentioned the game was simulcast on FM 92.1. Some ads were in Navajo. Other team’s coverage was on KRSN-1490.

KCRC **OK**, Enid. 9/26 0222 – High School football: Enid Plainsmen vs Choctaw Yellowjackets sponsored by Stevens Ford-Lincoln in Enid.

KLGN **UT**, Logan. 9/26 0035 – High School football: Northridge Knights (Layton UT) vs Skyview Bobcats. Very confusing broadcast. Pre-game show announced that it was taking place in Layton, but talked mostly about the Weber Warriors who were not playing. To make matters worse, the pre-game show began with an announcement for “Aggies Football on KLG, sponsored by Larry’s Pharmacy and Les Olson Office Equipment, which was a reference to the Utah State Aggies game that would air the following night.

XEKT **BCN**, Tecate. 9/25 0259 – “XEKT AM 13-90, la super K-T.” IDs usually mention FM 88.5 which they added a few years ago. Anthem around 1300 UT has female choir and orchestra.

1400 KESQ **CA**, Indio. 9/25 0604 – “La poderosa 96.7.” New.

KFTM **CO**, Fort Morgan. 9/26 0309 – High School football: Fort Morgan Mustangs vs Skyview Wolverines. Mixing with one or two other games.

KWUF **CO**, Pagosa Springs. 9/26 0234 – High School football: Pagosa Springs Pirates at Monte Vista Pirates.

KXGN **MT**, Glendive. 9/26 0151 – High School football: Dawson Red Devils vs Laurel Locomotives. Announcer called his team “Dawson County.” QB and running back names matched maxpreps.com. New.

KCOW **NE**, Alliance. 9/26 0142 – High School football: Alliance Bulldogs vs Hastings Tigers (same game as KHAS-1230) sponsored by Martin’s Restaurant in Alliance and others.

KVSF **NM**, Santa Fe. 9/26 0100 – “Right here on ESPN 14 hundred, KVSF, Santa Fe.” New.

1410 KIIX **CO**, Fort Collins. 9/26 0259 – “Kicks country AM 14-10, kiixcountry.com.” Mixing with KOOQ-NE. New.

1420 KJCK **KS**, Junction City. 9/26 0144 – High School football: Junction City-St Xavier Blue Jays vs Seaman Topeka Vikings, promo for post-game show “here on the talk of JC.” Announcers were frustrated because the referee kept picking up the football and putting it back down in a slightly different place each time the linesmen were walking on to the field to measure for a first down. New.

KULY **KS**, Ulysses. 9/26 0058 – High School football: Colby Eagles vs Ulysses Tigers sponsored by Golden Plains Credit Union (opposing team’s coverage was on KXXX-790).

KTOE **MN**, Mankato. 9/25 1204 – Jingle “information radio 14-20, KTOE Mankato.” Noted again later with promo for Minnesota State-Mankato Mavericks college football. Relog.

KJDL **TX**, Lubbock. 9/26 0410 – “Another hour of classic country on Raider classic country 98.7 FM and 14-20 AM.” Listed 140w nights. New.

KUJ **WA**, Walla Walla. 9/28 1059 – Poking through KSTN and KULY with FM 102.3 simulcast mention. Listed 900 (or 650?)w nights. New.

XEXX **BCN**, Tijuana. 9/25 1130 – “Vida 1420 Tijuana” slogan. Anthem around 1300 UT has female choir and orchestra. Also occasionally mentions sister station FM 107 XHRST “Los 40 Principales.” New.

XEWJ **PUEB**, Tehuacán. 9/28 1155 – “Exa 14-20.” Faded up as all the Mexico City stations were coming in. New.

- WPIS369 **CA**, South Lake Tahoe. 9/28 1304 – “You're listening to CalTrans Highway Advisory Radio for Tahoe.” New.
 ???? **ID**, unknown. 9/25 1131 – “You're listening to the Idaho Department of Transportation.” Each of these stations gives a district and station number which can be found in their license listings on the FCC TIS Search page. Unfortunately I lost the signal before they gave it. Since this was coming in on the NNE wire, my best guess from my drives up US 93 and down I-15 this summer would be Pocatello, but there is no way to know. Whatever this was, it was new!
 ???? **ID**, unknown. 9/26 1306 – Another (or same) Idaho DoT station was coming in on the unterminated ESE wire, fading in fairly suddenly at 1306:50. My recording ran out before any station number was recited.
- KPB732 **NM**, Pecos. 9/26 0409 – Male announcer for National Park Service at Pecos National Monument NM. “This is a test... visitor center hours 8:30am – 4pm. 505-757-7241.... Visit our web site at www.nps.gov/peco.... Along Interstate 25.... Park exit 299... the village of Pecos has a number of gas stations....” New.
- HAR **NV**, Elko? 9/26 1307 – 9/28 0059 – Female voice, “you're listening to the Nevada Department of Transportation highway advisory radio...” Having just driven through this series of stations in northern Nevada, Elko would be the most likely location, although there is a slight chance it could be the station farther west near Emigrant Pass which runs the same message. Unlike ID and WY HAR stations, NV DoT stations do a very poor job in terms of IDing or providing any unique content in the messages heard on each station.
- WQCT745/746/748 **TX**, El Paso. 9/26 1201. For most of the weekend I was picking up at least one of the series of Texas DoT HAR stations around the El Paso area, with information on lane closures for all the major roads – US 54, US 62, I-10, I-110, TX-375, etc. At times I thought I was hearing more than one of them, but I'm not sure. There are at least a dozen stations blanketing these freeways, and many were active when we drove through the area in 2006 and 2012. New.
- WQKF534 **UT**, Brigham City. 9/25 0304 – Loop of NOAA weather for Northern Utah. This is part of a network of 6 “homeland security” stations for Northern Utah counties on 530, 1350, 1610 and 1700. Of the 2 stations licensed for 1610, this was the one that was on when we drove through northern Utah a few months earlier. New.
- WQHS744 **WY**, Dubois-Brooks Lake. 9/26 0142 – WY DoT station, female voice, advising motorists of conditions in the Brooks Lake area. Most WY DoT stations begin with one or more sets of 2 ascending tones (a full step apart on the musical scale) at two points in the message: first before an automated voice (usually female) reads the time, and second before a recorded voice (male or female) gives call sign (usually), location (usually) and road conditions for a designated area. Often logged simultaneously with the similar station with the male voice, which has to be the Riverton transmitter. New.
- WQBJ389 **WY**, Evanston. 9/25 1208 – WY DoT station. One or both of the stations with the same calls in Rock Springs gets out better than the single Evanston station does. Thankfully these stations include their locations in their tape loop. This one says it is “for the Evanston area.” Female voice for automated time announcement, male voice for recorded road conditions message. New.

- 1610 WPJZ253 **WY**, Laramie. I-80 MM 314. The station I heard on 9/25 with the same message format as WQHS744, giving conditions for the Mortenson area, apparently must have been this station (Mortenson is SW of Laramie). 9/26 0249 I managed to catch the call-letter ID. This station had a series of 3 ascending pips at the start of the message, whereas most other WY DoT stations have one or more sets of 2 ascending pips. New.
- WPTC509 **WY**, Rawlins. 9/25 1105 – Carbon County Visitors Center. Noted several times throughout the weekend. Station seemed to have a number of different messages, mentioning I-80 and other award-winning roadways (scenic byways?), golf courses, and other travel destinations in the area. New.
- WQHS744 **WY**, Riverton. 9/25 0304 – WY DoT station, male voice, advising motorists of road conditions through Togwotee Pass. New.
- WQBJ389 **WY**, Rock Springs. 9/25 0604 – WY DoT for Rock Springs. Calls the same as the Evanston station and message is very similar, but thankfully each station announces its location. There are actually 2 stations in Rock Springs. I don't think they are synchronized but I don't think I've noticed an echo on this signal yet. Relog.
- CHHA **ON**, Toronto. 9/27 0359 – "O Canada" and back into Spanish programming. I've had several tentative logs of this station from as far west as western Colorado but this was the most definitive logging. Hearing the Canadian national anthem on a TIS channel is a real attention-getter! New.
- ???? **UnID**. 9/25 0059 – Male announcer gave a call sign that sounded like WQX?604. Fighting with at least 2 WY DoT stations and the voice sounded quite similar to the voice on one of those stations. ESE wire.
- ???? **UnID**. 9/25 1209 – Male voice sounded like "You're listening to the City of Roosevelt Creek." The word "Roosevelt" is presumably incorrect, but the word definitely seemed to have 3 syllables. NNE wire. At least 2 WY DoT stations were also in at this time.
- ???? **UnID**. 9/26 0245 – Male voice, "You're listening to transportation station..." and maybe a mention that it was a test broadcast. Did not sound like the WY DoT stations which were also coming in faintly at this time. Sounded a bit more like an Idaho DoT station. Several stations, maybe as many as 4 or 5, appeared to be fading in and out over the course of a few minutes. NNE wire.
- 1620 KOZN **NE**, Bellevue. 9/26 1159 – "The mighty 12-90 KOIL, Omaha's most Husker football talk is on 16-20 the zone, KOZN Bellevue-Omaha" into NBC Sports Radio. Relog.
- WTAW **TX**, College Station. 9/27 0229 – Texas A&M Aggies football postgame show. 9/27 1100 – promo for next week's Aggies game on "news talk 16-20 WTAW." New.
- KYIZ **WA**, Renton. 9/28 0300 – "KYIZ Renton-Seattle." New.
- CM?? **CUBA** unknown. 9/25 0304 – Radio Rebelde outlet frequent noted here, //530, 670, 710, 1180. These stations occasionally run a distinctive 9-note musical theme that is easy to identify.
- 1630 KCJJ **IA**, Iowa City. 9/25 1130 – Local ads including Deery Chrysler-Jeep-Dodge-Ram. New.
- KKGM **TX**, Fort Worth. 9/27 1101 – "Dallas-Fort Worth's home for America's leading Bible teachers, KKGM." New.
- XEUT **BCN**, Tijuana. 9/25 0605 – Occasionally audible under KRND, "UABC Radio" which stands for Universidad Autonoma de Baja California. New.
- 1640 KZLS **OK**, Enid. 9/26 0059 – High School football: Norman Tigers vs Westmoore Jaguars ("Jags"). Carries Red Eye Radio late at night. Also noted 9/25 1159 with ID "KZLS Enid-Oklahoma City, the eagle." Seemed to be running SRN Townhall.com news.
- 1650 KYHN **AR**, Fort Smith. 9/26 0238 – High School football: Northside Grizzlies vs Fayetteville Bulldogs, into post-game show sponsored by AutoZone. (NOTE: At the time of this logging, the station was still IDing as KYHN and still covering the team from Fort Smith AR; although they were authorized to move to Sallisaw OK at this time, it was obvious that they had not made that move yet, and should therefore be counted as AR and not OK). New.
- KFOX **CA**, Torrance. 9/25 0459 – "Southern California's #1 Korean language station." New.
- KCNZ **IA**, Cedar Falls. 9/26 1059 – promos, weather, "the Cedar Valley's sports station, KCNZ." New.
- 1660 KQWB **ND**, West Fargo. 9/26 0135 – High School football: Willmar Cardinals vs Moorhead Spuds (both teams in MN). Also noted 9/25 1159 with ad for Moscatel Subaru on highway 10 and ID "Fox Sports 16-60, KQWB, West Fargo." Relog.
- KRZI **TX**, Waco. 9/27 1059 – Local ads, "KRZI, (ESPN radio for?) Central Texas" in to ESPN Sports Center. New.
- 1680 KRJO **LA**, Monroe. 9/26 0232 – High School football: Wossman Wildcats vs Rayville Hornets (Wossman lost 38-29). New.
- KNTS **WA**, Seattle. 9/25 1159 – ID "KNTS Seattle, a Salem Español station." New.
- 1700 KBGG **IA**, Des Moines. 9/26 1159 – "17 hundred the champ, KBGG Des Moines, a Cumulus station" into CBS Sports Radio. New.

Receiver: Perseus SDR-IQ v4.1/Lenovo W540 laptop with eSSD drive (a very small drive, but also very fast and quiet).

Antennas: Beverages on ground, as follows:

1. **NNE** 3500 ft terminated (1st 3 nights only; this one broke at 865 ft the first night, and at 400 and 750 ft the second night; thankfully the breaks on the second night were not until after the High School football games were done)
2. **ENE** 2300 ft terminated (2nd and 3rd nights only; this one broke at 500 ft both nights it was up, but thankfully the break on the 2nd night must not have occurred until sunrise because the antenna performed great all night and morning)
3. **ESE** 1000 ft unterminated (2nd and 3rd nights only; no breaks)
4. **SE** 2250 ft terminated (all 4 nights; no breaks)
5. **N** 1150 ft unterminated (4th night only; no breaks. This was actually 150 ft NE followed by 1000 ft N)

This was my fifth visit to this location. Each time is better than the time before. This time I had at least 497 new catches (plus a few tentatives I'm still trying to resolve), raising my totals from 553 stations heard to 1050. Hard to believe you can get to 1000 stations in just 11 nights of DXing, but that's how good this location can be. Bear in mind, all my previous sessions here were in June (2002, 2003, 2013, 2014) when conditions are not exactly ideal. My visit this year was timed to combine the end-of-September sunset/sunrise conditions with the so-called "high school football STA." That worked nicely! But pre-sunset and post-sunrise conditions here are still not the best. You don't get many good catches here unless it's totally dark out.

This was the first time I had a fellow DXer join me. Veteran GY DXer Ron Schiller enjoyed the good reception and brought some wonderful classic veries for show-and-tell.

The shorter (1000-1150 ft) "experimental" wire was unterminated, by design. I was intending to run this wire to the N for the whole session, but realized at the last minute that my parking location would cause a N wire to be in danger of getting run over as people cut corners pulling out of the gravel parking lot. Since I also perceived that my SE wire was a bit too close to the direction of my 2013 wire, I came up with the idea of running the short wire to the ESE, hoping it would pick up TX off the front-end and OR off the back-end (which it did, very nicely). The last night, I made a 150 ft. NE lead-in followed by a 1000 ft. N wire, to avoid the parking lot issue. It wasn't very directional but it did add several northern stations to my total. Next year I'll see if I can put up a better N wire. I still may experiment with an unterminated N wire in hopes of picking up Baja to the S, unless I can get a good SSE or S antenna up next year (a S wire would come a little close to the eastern side of the motel rooms). I can get slightly W of N, but it looks like a good portion of the land on the NV side north of the highway is fenced off. I think if I park in a slightly different place next year I can get a better N or NNW wire up, and/or maybe something to the SSE. I have yet to put up a wire that really pulled the Mexican stations in well.

Some of the directions I chose this year (especially the NNE wire) were a bit difficult in terms of termination. In other words, the terminating resistor on the antenna was often not enough to keep California pests from coming in off the "back end" of the wire. But this occasionally worked to my advantage as well, adding CA stations to my totals. When we started listening just after sunset of the first night, there were so many CA stations coming in that I was concerned the NNE wire might already be broken. It wasn't until I reviewed the recordings that I realized conditions were mildly auroral that night. (The northern stations started to come in as the aurora broke up after 0500 UT or so).

The ENE wire was incredible before it broke. Thankfully the first of the two nights this wire was up it must not have broken until sunrise, because it brought in great catches from the ENE all night long. The second night it was up, the break occurred much earlier in the evening, and the results were pretty wild. On some channels it still behaved like a beverage, pulling in great catches from the ENE. On other channels it behaved more like a traditional longwire, pulling in signals from the SE and SSE. When I heard KLV1-560 in Beaumont TX on this wire, I knew something was up.

I was able to pull in a lot more stations from the northwest this time, so I'm really glad I spent those 4 nights DXing near Glacier National Park in June to re-familiarize myself with the northwestern radio dial.
