



If you have not made up your holiday wish list, now might be a good time to take care of making sure someone in your family remembers to get that important radio-related gismo for you this season. Of course, best wishes for the holiday season from your favorite shortwave club to our favorite shortwave club members.

Our first DXpedition of the season is over. I am happy to report that Fred Kohlbrenner, Bob Montgomery, Ed Mauger, Kris Field and I managed to survive yet another outing to French Creek State Park. See the Musings column for more about this adventure.

**Adrian Peterson** announced the winners of AWR "New Millennium" DX Contest: "This year's two winners are located in India and in Germany. They are Jose Jacob VU2JOS at the National Institute of Amateur Radio in Hyderabad India, and Thomas Drescher at Rosrath in Germany. The major requirement in this year's "New Millennium" contest was to indicate the number of different AWR QSL stamps in the listener's collection; each supported by a valid AWR QSL card. Jose Jacob numbers his total collection of AWR QSL stamps at 384, with more than 200 different notations, each supported by a valid AWR QSL card. His collection contains many copies of the first series of AWR QSL stamps as well as the current series. In view of the fact that Jose Jacob is also on the air in "Wavescan" with his Asian DX Report, it was decided to add another First Place Winner. Thomas Drescher of Rosrath in Germany numbers his

total collection of AWR QSL stamps at 120 with all different at 64 each supported by a valid AWR QSL card. Both contestants will receive the 2000 Bronze Medallion, as well as an autographed copy of Jerry Berg's highly acclaimed book, *On the Short Waves*. Another major segment in this year's contest was to make suggestions regarding future AWR DX contests. Many excellent suggestions were given, and we choose one of these for next year's contest, in the year 2001. Jose Jacob suggested that we search for the world's most beautiful QSL cards and next September we will invite contestants to list what they consider are the five most beautiful QSL cards in their collection, in any mode of radio transmission. Watch for the details around midyear 2001."

Basically, RL2000 lets listeners and DXers: Log the stations they have heard; Record and playback audio clips of the stations they have logged; Create customized paper and electronic reception reports; Scan, import, store, and view paper and electronic QSLs; Track the performance of their monitoring stations; Electronically report loggings and QSL reports to radio clubs and publications. Another useful hobby resource guide is about to be issued. *The 2001 Shortwave Frequency Guide, Fifth Edition*, published by Klingenfuss Publications (Hagenloher Str. 14, D-72070 Tuebingen, Germany or e-mail [klingenfuss@compuserve.com](mailto:klingenfuss@compuserve.com)) is scheduled for release on December 10, 2000. Billed as "simply the most up-to-date worldwide shortwave radio handbook available today," the 500+ page guide is a useful addition to any listening shack. The direct price of 35 Euros, about US\$30.00 depending upon exchange rates, includes worldwide shipping. The use of computer-to-plate technology limits production time to just 10 days. Since Joerg Klingenfuss does not accept paid advertisements from the industry, his guide often contains some sharp opinions. I engaged him in conversation and soon afterward I purchased my DX-440. In the summer of '91 I purchased the Drake R8.

It must have been that winter that I was talking to another avid shortwave buff that he mentioned that I might enjoy talking with a dedicated DXer and shortwave listener in Lubbock, Texas, Gigi Lytle. ## Giving Thanks for Electronic Media

I know, the Thanksgiving holiday in the US was in November, but, hey, that's what's on my mind as I finalize the column over Thanksgiving weekend.

It has been argued that the development of electronic media have caused a decline in shortwave listening activity, as potential newcomers to the hobby get their kicks in other ways, and as broadcasters use the excuse of electronic media development to cut back on shortwave resources and programs. While member counts for those clubs who publish statistics support this argument, other recently published statistics point out that sales of mid-priced portable radios are growing here in the US. In addition, I heard an ad for the Grundig Yacht Boy 400 on the hourly CBS Radio News the other evening.

Why the "will of the voter" may not yet be clear in Florida, the "will of the 'Fester" at last year's Winter SWL Festival was clear: people did not want to see paper-based publications disappear. However, the near-instant dissemination, turnaround, and feedback possible with the Internet make the Internet a valuable tool in augmenting the listening experience.

Prices of entry-level computers continue to drop, and the availability of used computers with very adequate functionality for Internet connectivity for price tags below \$500 continue to make it easier to add this functionality to your listening shack. If you live in a metropolitan area of 50,000 population or more, you likely now have access to one or more free Internet service providers. Yes, you must endure advertising on your computer screen, and, yes, these providers of free Internet access can track your Internet usage habits, but in my own opinion the benefits outweigh the costs. If you are in an area where free access is not available, Monthly fee-based

Internet access is now less than \$15 for most providers. When you put your gift list together for Santa this year, consider adding a computer to that request for a new radio.

I mention all this because the US election, with its twists and turns, brought about ad-hoc programming and transmitter extensions at broadcasters including the VOA. There is no way a printed publication could have passed along this information. Canada's coming election will bring special programming on **Radio Canada International** that will have come and gone by the time you read this.

Despite this enthusiasm for electronic media, hopefully this column will continue to play a role in your enjoyment of shortwave programming. We'll review upcoming programming when we can, and we'll also review what we've been listening to.

## Christmas and New Year's Programming

As a result of last year's premature celebration of the millennium, it appears most broadcasters are ignoring the real millennium moment in their upcoming programming. However, the upcoming holidays will yield an assortment of special programming. Here is a quick look at some of what's planned for the holidays:

The **Voice of Russia** hasn't yet finalized details, but look for holiday-themed programming on programs including **Music and Musicians**, **Kaleidoscope**, **Folk Box**, and **Jazz Show**, among others. Keep in mind that the Eastern Orthodox faith celebrates Christmas on January 6<sup>th</sup>, so their Christmas specials won't air until January. Check the "What's New" section of the Voice of Russia webpage for updates.

Meanwhile, **Deutsche Welle** will be airing "looking back" editions on *Marks and Markets* and *Cool*.

**Radio Canada International** promises special programming on December 24<sup>th</sup>, December 25<sup>th</sup>, and January 1<sup>st</sup>, but won't have details until mid-December.

The **BBC World Service** will offer these special features:

Thursdays throughout December, 0230, repeated Fridays, 1530: *Pick of the World* features World Service highlights from the past year. Program editions the last two weeks of December will focus on listener input, so send in your nominations, including approximate dates of original airing, to the program at pick@bbc.co.uk or via fax to +44-20-7557-2531. If faxing, remember to include your international access code (011 in North America) before the number.

Sunday, December 24<sup>th</sup>, 1502: *A Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols* airs live from King's College in Cambridge. The College's famous choir leads the congregation in Christmas carols, and the 90-minute service includes the first performance of a carol by the British composer, Jonathan Dove, written for this broadcast. The program airs live to all regions at this time.

Christmas Day, 1430, repeated Tuesday, 0130: *Music Mix* airs a special *Best Albums of 2000* feature with Kevin Greening looking back at the best popular music albums of the past year.

Tuesday, December 26<sup>th</sup>, 0205: Queen Elizabeth's annual *Christmas Message to the Commonwealth* airs to the Americas. The European streams carry this Christmas Day at 2005; African streams at 1805 on Christmas day, if you can't wait.

Tuesday, December 26<sup>th</sup>, through Saturday, December 30<sup>th</sup>, 0445: *Off The Shelf* presents highlights from five classics during Christmas week: *Dolce Domum* from Wind

*in the Willows* on Tuesday; *The Flame Trees of Thika* on Wednesday; *A Tree Grows in Brooklyn* on Thursday; *Natasha's First Ball* from *War and Peace* on Friday, and *The Christmas Truce* on Saturday.

Wednesday, December 27<sup>th</sup>, 0230, repeated Thursday 1505: *Seeing Stars*, in *Science View*, muses on the possibility that Venus, visible as an evening star in December, was the "Star of Bethlehem" chronicled in the Bible 2000 years ago.

Secrets hidden in Nativity paintings will be explored, as will the hopes of Coptic Christians living in the Egyptian town where the Holy Family sought sanctuary from Herod's wrath. Repeated Thursday to the Americas at 1530.

Thursday, December 28<sup>th</sup>, 0205, repeated Friday 1505: *Sports International* airs a special *Year In Focus* program looking back on the year that was, with special emphasis on the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney. Mike Costello hosts.

Sunday, December 31<sup>st</sup>, 1330: *In Praise of God* offers a special half-hour service from St. Mary's Church, Warwick, in the English midlands. The highlight is a specially-commissioned drama of the Christmas story seen through the eyes of Mary, presented by Playbox Theatre, the national theater company for young people.

## Radio Netherlands Documentaries

Here are some of the upcoming highlights for **Radio Netherlands' Documentary** program, airing to North America Thursdays 0000 and 0500 UTC, and also Saturdays 0030 UTC.

7th & 9th December: *The Rural Renaissance*—One of the charms of small-town America is supposed to be the sleepy

quality of life... but some small-town residents are waking up to a struggle for survival. Their traditional industries are fading away, while the benefits of a technology-driven society are passing them by. Ann-Marie Michel visits one such town, Tifton, Georgia, that's trying to break the mold. It's a rural pocket of activism where the local government is taking a scientific approach to shaping the town's future.

**14th & 16th December: *Lifting the Bamboo Curtain***—Last June, North Korea's Supreme leader Kim Jong-il amazed the world by emerging from the shadows. When he embraced South Korean President Kim Dae-Jung at Pyongyang airport in the first ever North-South summit, the reclusive "Dear Leader" stepped into the limelight to reveal a genial statesman bent on reconciliation with the South. Is reunification a real possibility at last? Jane Murphy looks at the legacy of fear and suspicion and what reunification would mean for the long-suffering Korean people.

**21<sup>st</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup> December: *The History of Toys***—From the earliest stone games to the enormous variety in toy warehouses today, children's playthings have always been a barometer of the times. religious authority in the world for more than two thousand years. The Delphic Oracle has been silent for 1500 years. David Swatling investigates why her ruined home on Mt. Parnassus still holds a magical attraction for thousands of pilgrims each year, who come in search of spiritual guidance.

## **Radio Canada International – Oops!**

Last month, I mentioned that **Radio Canada International** was reducing its daily hours to North America; that appears not to be the case, after all, as a new three-hour morning broadcast now airs weekdays from 1300 to 1600 UT. Here's what you can expect:

**Weekdays, 1300–1600:** The domestically produced CBC series ***This Morning***, a current affairs magazine and interview program, airs Mondays through Fridays all three hours. The first hour has long been part of the morning North American shortwave broadcast.

**Saturdays, 1300–1400:** ***The House*** looks at the week past in Canadian political affairs, behind the scenes from Parliament Hill in Ottawa, with Jason Moscovitz.

**Saturdays, 1400–1600: *Basic Black***: The CBC offers the following description of ***Basic Black***: Journalist, author, and humorist Arthur Black drives this two hour adventure, featuring people with unusual occupations, bizarre passions, and arcane obsessions. To cap it all off, Arthur takes a quirky squint at the week's events in a monologue that finishes every show.

**Sundays, 1300–1600: *This Morning–Sunday Edition*** has historically aired one hour later UT, but is now on at this time.

## **Summertime in Australia— Cricket, anyone?**

John Figliozzi, our resident Aussie expert, mentions that Radio Australia often offers parallel sports programming this time of the year. Australia-West Indies Test cricket is the fare in December, with the following matches offered:

December 1-5: Second Test-Perth,  
0230-0930 UT

December 15-19: Third Test-Adelaide,  
0030-0730 UT

December 26-30: Fourth Test-Melbourne,  
0000-0700 UT

A different set of frequencies will be used for this service than are used for Radio Australia's normal broadcasts. We in North America will most likely achieve success listening to the Pacific-beamed frequencies of 17580 kHz from 0000 to 0758 UT, with a switch to 11630 kHz from 0800 to 1358 UT.

## **BBC World Service—Other High- lights**

In addition to the offerings mentioned above, here are a couple other items of interest.

Sundays, 0000: *Play of the Week* highlights include:

December 10<sup>th</sup>, *Ghosts* by Henrik Ibsen—One of the seminal plays of world literature, *Ghosts* by Norwegian writer Henrik Ibsen deeply shocked even the liberal theatre-goers of Europe when it first appeared in 1881. Ibsen said he had to write it after his previous play, *The Doll's House*, to show what might have happened when a women like Nora doesn't walk out of her life of 'duty'. The play is not just about hereditary illness and the sins of the fathers being visited on their helpless children (in this case hereditary syphilis being passed on to young Osvald), but it is also a condemnation

of the rigid and conventional moral code that society forces people to live by.

December 17<sup>th</sup>, *Joyful and Triumphant* by Robert Lord—Robert Lord—a man who died tragically young—was one of New Zealand's most popular playwrights and *Joyful and Triumphant* was his most frequently performed play. It spans thirty years—each scene set on a different Christmas day in a close-knit New Zealand family. We share their triumphs and their tragedies; we watch teenagers grow into adults, and a new generation come along, destined to cause their own fair share of mayhem and heartbreak.

December 24<sup>th</sup>: *The Lady Vanishes* dramatized by Neville Teller—One of Alfred Hitchcock's most famous early film successes was the 1938 comedy adventure thriller, *The Lady Vanishes*, based on the classic novel of suspense by Ethel Lina White, *The Wheel Spins*. It is the late 1930's and the forthcoming world war casts its shadow across Europe. Iris Carr (Jenny Funnell) is travelling alone on the continent, having visited a remote mid-European country, Zabrovia, and is returning to England on an express train where she meets a pleasant, garrulous, middle-aged Englishwoman in the railway carriage, Miss Froy. (Renee Asherson).

## Roll Your Own QSL Cards

### A Step-by-step Guide on How to Create Customized QSL Cards

One time proven technique for extracting an elusive verification from a broadcaster is the use of the prepared QSL card. More than ever, due to budget cutbacks, changes in station personnel, and overworked station staff, radio stations have fewer resources available for verifying the reception reports of DXers.

Not being content with using the commercially available plain text prepared cards, I set out to try to design my own graphic QSL cards. I felt these more personalized prepared cards might pique the interest of the station, and thus improve my chances of a reply. At the very least, a prepared card with just a few simple images would certainly look more pleasing in my QSL album.

#### Software

As I have almost no artistic ability, I decided to let my computer do all the work for me. I've found that to design something with text and graphics, most software is strong in one area, but weak in the other. As I wasn't planning on any elaborate designs, I decided to compromise and use the graphics capabilities of the Microsoft Word 97 word processing software.


Essentially, text boxes are used to define various areas of the card. Text boxes act as containers for text or graphics that can be positioned on a page and sized. I use one

text box for the card heading, another for the verification text and reception details, and a couple of boxes are used for "holding" the graphics.

#### Getting Started

The first step will be to draw the outline of your card. I try to size my cards around 4" high by 6" wide. To get started, open a new document, select "View" from the menu bar, and click on "Page Layout". Then, select "Insert" from the menu bar, and click on "Text Box". Your mouse pointer will now look like a crosshair. To draw the text box, left-mouse click the starting point of the box, and while holding down the left mouse button, "drag" the box to a size that you find suitable. (Don't worry too much about the size of the box at this point, as you can very accurately resize the box to within a hundredth of an inch later.)

Next, I add two more text boxes within the first text box to define the text area for the card heading, and reception details. Your card should now look something like this:



## Adding Text

Now, you can continue nesting even more text boxes to hold your graphical images, or type in the text of your card. To insert text in the text box, position your cursor inside the box and click. Your cursor will be at the starting point for the text. At this point, you would type as you normally would using a word processor. All of Word 97's formatting tools, such as font size, color and margin justification are available to you. Your card now might look something like this:



## Adding Graphics

Now we're ready to insert some graphics. In order to make the prepared card look as official as possible, I try to find a station logo on the Internet. I first consult Thorsten Koch's "Internet Guide to International Broadcasters" website: <http://www.hardcore-dx.com/iguide/index.html>. If the station's website doesn't turn up there, I use various search engines to search on the station's name. Although the station may not have a website, sometimes images related to the station can still be found.

In the event I can't locate a station logo, I use an outline map of the country or the country's flag. In politically sensitive situations I use generic radio related graphics like an antenna tower. One of my favorite sites is Flags of the World at: <http://www.skalman.nu/fotw/flags/index.html>. Although I don't know any websites that specialize in outline maps of countries, I can


find most maps at <http://www.britannica.com>. The maps found there require some more manipulation, but more about that later.

As an example, visit AFRTS' website at: <http://www.afrts.osd.mil/>. To grab their logo at the top of the page, simply right mouse click on the image to activate a list of options. Depending on the web browser you are using, click on "Save Picture As" or "Save Image As". Now you will have the option to rename the image and store it on your hard drive in the directory or folder of your choice.

To place the AFRTS logo on the card, create another text box in the upper left hand corner. Click inside the new text box, then select "Insert" from the pull-down menu. Click on "Picture", then "From File", to insert the image stored on your hard drive. Locate the directory

where the AFRTS logo was stored, select the file, and click on "Insert" to insert the logo on the card.

To re-size the logo, click on the image to activate the borders and sizing handles of the image. You can now either re-size the image by pulling on one of the corner handles, or by right clicking on the border to activate the picture formatting options. If you elect to use the sizing handles, be aware that in order to maintain the original aspect ratio of the image, you must drag one of the corner handles.





As Microsoft Word's image editing capabilities are limited, I find it necessary at times to use a specialized graphics program, such as Paint Shop Pro by Jasc, Inc. (<http://www.jasc.com>). With Paint Shop Pro, you can change the size of an image by using their "resample" function. I use their "magic wand" function to delineate the outline of a country from a larger map. This powerful tool looks at differences in RGB value, hue, or brightness, to distinguish the outline of an image. Once the country's outline is extracted from the larger map, I use the "flood fill" function to paint the country a solid color.

## Aesthetics

By default, text boxes are created with internal margins. I like to eliminate the margins as it permits more space for text. To do this, active the "Format Text Box" pop-up as before by right clicking on the text box border. Click on the "Text Box" tab where you will have control over the four margins inside the text box. Set all four margins to 0 inches to eliminate the margins.

All that's now left is some "fine tuning" of the card. For example, your card will look more aesthetically pleasing if you make the

borders of your text boxes invisible. To do this, right click on the text box border to activate the pop-up menu, and select "Format Text Box". Click on the "Colors and Lines" tab, and you will have control over the line thickness and color of your text box. To make a box invisible, select "No Line" under the "Color" portion of the menu. Another thing that I like to do is to add some interest to the card's outside edge. Here, I choose a colored double line from the "Style" portion of the "Format Text Box" options.

If you've followed all these steps, your card could look something like this:



Although this may not be the most eye-catching QSL in your collection, it certainly beats any of the commercially available text only prepared cards.

They say that imitation is the highest form of flattery. Several stations now verify reports with photocopies of my prepared cards. However, most valued by me is a letter from the Bhutan Broadcasting Service in March, 2000, stating that they designed their new QSL card based on my prepared card. After many years of not verifying reception reports, the BBS was finally issuing QSL cards again.

## Hardware Bits

**MFJ-616 Speech Intelligibility Enhancer**—MFJ Enterprises has recently announced this new product to help hams with high frequency hearing loss, although it looks like it might be useful for SWLs (even with normal hearing) as well. It is essentially a stereo audio equalizer with turnover points at 300, 600, 1200 and 2400 Hertz, allowing for a 20 dB boost or cut at these frequencies. This permits boosting the audio frequencies where most of the speech intelligibility is contained and reducing the frequencies that are mostly noise. The two channel capability allows the use of a balance control to equalize the loudness of each channel to further improve speech intelligibility. The '616 has switches to choose between two inputs, turn the external speakers on or off and bypass the unit to permit comparison of filtered vs. unfiltered audio. It requires an external power supply of 12 volts DC. The suggested list price is \$169.95 and MFJ recommends the use of their MFJ-281 speakers (\$12.95 each) which are optimized for speech frequencies or their MFJ-392 headphones (\$19.95) with the '616. At the time of writing, there was no information on the MFJ-616 on MFJ's website: [www.mfjenterprises.com](http://www.mfjenterprises.com). MFJ may be contacted at: MFJ Enterprises, Inc., P.O. Box 494, Mississippi State, MS 39762; (662) 323-5869. Hopefully, I will obtain one of these units for review in the near future.

**Alpha Delta Delta-4c Antenna Switch Console**—This is a new antenna switch from Alpha Delta that is configured to sit on a table top next to the radio. It is a heavy cast metal enclosure that is designed not to slide around with use. It measures approximately 6 x 6 x 6 inches. It has sockets for 4 antennas and the cables run straight out of the back

of the unit. It includes a replacable Arc-Plug cartridge for lightning protection. The 4c has SO-239 connectors with a list price of \$139.95 and the 4CN has N connectors for ten dollars more. Although it is expensive, it's nice since it will sit on a shelf or desktop and doesn't slide. See it at: [www.alphadeltacom.com/delta4c.html](http://www.alphadeltacom.com/delta4c.html). ### Industrial Communication Engineers (ICE) Beverage/Long Wire Matching Units

I recently bought one of these units for use with the 220 feet of wire that I have strung along the top of a fence. There are several models in the 180 series available, either with coverage of 50 kHz to 30 MHz or 1.5 to 30 MHz, with either isolation between the antenna and feedline or with DC continuity to permit control voltages on the antenna for switching. The matching units have taps for antenna impedances of 300, 450, 600 and 800 ohms. I.C.E. also offers terminating loads for beverages and mounting fittings for attaching the units directly to ground rods. I purchased the 180A matching unit and 400MA mounting adapter for \$61.00 from Cable X-perts, Inc. I used a MFJ-259 antenna analyzer and found that the antenna (with a 470 ohm terminating resistor) had a relatively flat SWR around 1.5:1 from 1.5 MHz to 10 MHz. I.C.E. has a website at [www.inducomm.net](http://www.inducomm.net), but Ralph Brandi reports having had problems ordering through that site; I.C.E. told him it's actually owned by a contractor. antenna is only about 7 meters off the ground. They had a big stack of QSL replies ready to send out and invite reports and inquiries.

**4830 Radio Grigota**, Santa Cruz: The station owner, Daniel Artega, says the station is active running half power (500 watts) due to several bad 4-400c tubes. He says new tubes were ordered from California, but never received. The studio is currently undergoing remodeling and is a real mess, although the MW transmission was on the air when I visited. The transmitter location is about 7 km from the center of Santa Cruz. Unfortunately, my monitoring was unable to pick up the station on SW during my stay there and I question whether it is really currently active. I'll try to get another read on the situation in about 2 weeks.

**4855 Radio Centenario**, Santa Cruz: This station is located in a nice, well equipped building on the edge of town just off the highway toward Cochabamba. The station director reports that it is running 4 kw. (WRTH says 5 kw, Passport says 1 kw) It was audible during my stay in Santa Cruz.

**5500 Radio Luz del Oriente**, Santa Cruz: This station (listed in WRTH) does not appear to exist. The address reported in WRTH is a house and the owner said there was a radio transmitter in the back when he moved in a few years ago, which he would be willing to sell fairly cheap. He had never heard of the station, nor had anyone in the vicinity. Interestingly, the current resident has worked in radio and would appear to be knowledgeable.

**5974.2 Radio Nacional**, Cochabamba: This station (listed in WRTH) has apparently gone bankrupt and will not return to the air.

**6015 Radio El Mundo**, Santa Cruz: This station is owned by the El Mundo newspaper and was not on the air during my stay. A visit to the station yielded the information that the station was temporarily off the air due to equipment problems, and that all of the station personnel were on vacation. The representative said he expected the station to be back on the air in a few weeks. We'll see!

**6030/9660 Radio ABC**, Santa Cruz: This station was recently sold and merged into the Radio Antena 1 group. At the moment it is only transmitting on FM, but there are efforts currently underway to re-initiate SW transmissions, hopefully in December 2000 (next month). The local director was not sure of the frequency(s) to be used, but said that it would be "the same as before". No information on power, etc. was available, but I will check back with them in a few weeks to see if more information can be gleaned. (I also mentioned that if they let us know ahead of time by email, it might be possible to get some reception reports from various areas of the world to check their transmission.)

**6095 Radio Cosmos**, Cochabamba: This station has

been off SW for 4-5 years, according to the MW station manager. The primary business was promotion of music recordings and the SW market does not support the business. There are no plans to return to SW, although the station is active on MW.

**6135 Radio Santa Cruz**, Santa Cruz: This station is on the air and often reported, so nothing new here. (Fair-BOL, Cumbre DX Nov 8 via DXLD/Hauser-OK)

*Voice of Sudan*, which broadcast on behalf of the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) against Sudan from its base in Asmara, Eritrea, has been closed down.

The closure comes on the heels of Eritrean President Issayas Afewerki recent trip to Khartoum in seek of economic trade, and just one month short of planned legislative and presidential elections in Sudan. The elections are being boycotted by nearly the entire democratic opposition.

The Sudanese Minister of Culture and Information, Dr. Ghazi Salah al-Din, told the Sudanese News Agency earlier today that the Voice of Sudan is now officially off the air in a "positive development" that is the result "of the recent contacts between the two countries..."

Without mentioning the closure of the NDA's radio station, Eritrean ambassador to Sudan Eissa Ahmed Eissa told Agence France Press on yesterday (Oct 30) that "No deal was concluded with the Sudanese government during the last visit by... Afewerki to Khartoum for getting rid of the NDA in exchange for certain economic privileges."

Sudanese Minister of External Relations, Dr. Mustafa Osman Ismail, reported to the Sudan News Agency on Monday, however, that he is "following up the meetings currently being held in Asmara between the Eritrean government and elements of the opposition. (T)he outcome of these meetings would be more obvious during the coming days," he said, "and in the light of which the next step would be defined."

The outcome is clearly the silencing of The Voice of

Sudan.

Since April 2000, the NDA has been increasingly isolated by other opposition groups and was expelled from the Umma Party coalition for its resistance to negotiate with the regime in Khartoum. Reports also indicate that the United States government, which has provided the group with at least US\$20 million in non-military aid, has recently become reluctant to provide the group with additional funding.

The Voice of Sudan, which hit the airwaves in 1995 and was relatively easy to listen to around the world on short wave, maintained warm relations with its overseas listeners and had a good "QSL" verification policy. Recent efforts since August to reach sources within the NDA, who for years had been friendly to CRW, have been unsuccessful. **SIERRA LEONE** Interesting info in from our friend David Smith at UN HQ: *UN Radio* has started on 6140 SW from here. David advises that he has heard from Duncan Robinson, UN chief of communications in Freetown, that they have commenced SW testing from "the Mammy Yoko compound" on this freq. A Barrett Model 950-HF transceiver is being driven by 600 ohm audio direct from the studio mixer with excellent SW voice quality. They are on the air 24 hrs. a day, with mainly mx at night, programs alternating between English and KrioL. David is putting out a call for reception reports, and will try to convince his counterparts in Sierra Leone that it's a good idea to start printing QSL cards. I will try to get more contact information on this; I am not certain what the mail situation is with Sierra Leone these days. I assume that reports can be sent to David for the time being. a distant site, probably in the South of the country.

v7156.88 **Ha Giang BS** (t), 1046, Het here (for at least the last half hour), no audio and too much 7145 splatter QRM. This was hrd daily but could never get any audio because of the QRM. Probably unmodulated too.

v6381.34 **Lai Chau BS**, signs on at 1200.

v9930.80 **Voice of Vietnam**, 1400-1420, found this here while KWHR off the air either intentionally or unintentionally (according to stn engineer Sheldon Remington in a recent visit, they do take the transmitters off air during thunderstorms) due to the flooding rains, thunderstorms and power outages at the time. VTN identified by Hans Johnson. (Dave Valko-Hawaii DXpedition, Cumbre Oct 29/Nov 2) [That's a VTN JAMMING station outlet against RFA Vietnamese - Bueschel/BC-DX/Bueschel-GER)

This week I paid a visit to Lao Cai, about 350 km NW of Hanoi. It lies on the Red River and faces the Chinese town of Hekou in Yunnan Province which is reached by a short railway bridge. Lao Cai is not the most charming of places, perhaps because it was largely demolished during the Chinese invasion of Vietnam in 1979. Most of the new buildings were obviously thrown together in a hurry. Now that relations have improved, quite a few day-trippers cross the border from China in search of cheap shopping (mostly vegetables, actually) and the experience of a foreign country. There are even a couple of duty free shops, but they didn't exactly seem to be doing a roaring trade when I poked my nose through the door.

The local Voice of Vietnam station operates 0300-0430, 0945-1100 and 1145-1400 on 1098, 4497v and 6698v kHz. There's probably also an early morning transmission at around 2200-2300, but I'm afraid I wasn't awake in time to hear it. The mediumwave transmitter site is on the western edge of town inside a walled compound marked 'Restricted area - no trespassing' in both Vietnamese and English -- maybe they are aware of the risk of being encroached upon by visiting shortwave listeners?! The shortwave signals may also be coming from the same site, there appear to be two 'birdcage'-type antennas slung end-to-end between three low masts, but this array is hard to see as it is largely overgrown by trees. All three frequencies are rather intermittent, and it's not uncommon for one or

two to be off air at any time. In particular, 6698v often seems to 'die' a couple of minutes after coming on air.

I'm not sure whether the studios are located at this site, it didn't look much like my idea of a studio centre with a few rather primitive-looking brick huts scattered around the compound. Also there is no sign on the compound mentioning Voice of Vietnam.

The audio from Lao Cai is very variable, some periods are reasonably good but at other times it is very clipped and distorted. This seems to be a studio problem, as the audio is basically the same at any given time on all three frequencies and also on the FM frequency 95.2 MHz which carries a short segment of local programming from 1000 (at other times FM relays the first program of Voice of Vietnam from Hanoi). The audio problems seem to be worst on some sections of prerecorded programming, including the sign-on music and ID, so maybe there is a problem with a tape deck.

Both shortwave frequencies are variable. 5597v varies around 5595-5598. On 10 Nov, the other transmitter jumped from previous 6684v to 6698v, where it has consistently been heard since. The carriers of both SW transmitters are a little unstable, especially as the transmitters warm up just after sign on. With the BFO on your receiver turned on, you can hear the whistle changing frequency as the transmitters drift around slightly.

On the way back to Hanoi, I broke the train journey with a day in Yen Bai, also a regional station formerly heard on shortwave. However, Yen Bai is now on FM only, with two frequencies (92.1 and 98.0 MHz) which carry separate local programming at times. Also there is no trace of the MW transmitter at Yen Bai listed on 580 kHz. I think it is over a year now since I heard Yen Bai on shortwave, so I'm not too optimistic that they will ever return...






