ANARC REPORT

NASWA is one of several clubs in North America comprising the Association of North American Radio Clubs (ANARC). This organization is not a club in itself, but rather a body of those member clubs, and associate member clubs, enjoined for the betterment of the hobby of DXing, whether on short wave, broadcast band, utilities, TV or FM. Each affiliate club within the membership of ANARC is represented by a certain number of persons of that club who have been appointed by respective club headquarters. Individual persons cannot become members of ANARC. NASWA has three representatives to ANARC and these men represent your club in cooperative matters of mutual benefit to all clubs. In the past, ANARC has endeavored to promote goodwill and constructive rapport between the DXing hobbyists and the world's broadcasters. Two of the projects of ANARC with particular appeal to hobbyists have been the frequency recommendation committee and the QSL policy committee. These two projects have chairmen and other volunteer committee members to established a working relationship with stations who have problems finding room on the crowded bands or instituting a QSL policy satisfactory to the many hundreds of persons writing them each year. If any NASWA member has a suggestion that seems to have hobby-wide interest and appeal, they are welcomed to write their club ANARC representative living nearest them. IMPORTANT SCIENTIFIC CONTRIBUTION MADE BY DX'ER - By Jimmy C. Jones

My former employment in pipeline construction required that I move about to various parts of the country. Therefore, my outside antenna for shortwave listening was a wire whose length was dependent upon whatever supports were available at each new location. The fact that this random length of wire was not resonant did not cause any serious reception problems until last winter when I moved to Bemidji, Minnesota.

I got up at my favorite DXing time.. around daybreak.. the next morning after getting the receiver and antenna set up. I noticed that the temperature on the outside thermometer was 49 degrees below zero and said to myself, "Brr, now that's cold!" I turned on the receiver, but even the VOA only barely moved the needle of the S-meter. Upon going outside to check my newly strung antenna, the problem immediately became obvious. Standing Waves!! The frequency waves were freezing solid right there on the antenna!

However, the signals reached their normal strength after the sun had been up for a little while. By alert observation of the thermometer at this time, I made the important scientific discovery, later verified in numerous controlled experiments, that the freezing point of standing waves is -41° Fahrenheit!

While helping me to judge the Tall Tales, Al Sizer commented that 'while he agreed Jimmy Jones' tale was the winner', he could attest to the veracity of Jones' story having had similar experiences himself after reading Jones' report. It seems that after the thaw came in Bemidji, Sizer turned on his receiver just as the last ice crystals were dropping from the antenna. He caught the spectacular voice booming in: "We now bring you the Sunday morning church service from the Episcopal Church in Port Moresby." But, in case you don't think hearing Port Moresby is so much of a big deal, Sizer reminds us that the day he heard it was Thursday. The frozen waves had thawed and filled his receiver with signals from the previous Sunday that had been frozen on his antenna! Congratulations to Jones! This remarkable discovery will henceforth be known as Jones' Bemidji Effect.

EQUIPMENT Q-BOX AUDIO FILTER Neal Perdue telephoned HDQ with word that the Q-BOX he purchased had arrived, and that initial tests indicated it was certainly worth the \$17.95 + \$1 shipping. Actually he used words like "fantastic", "amazing", etc. The device is powered by a 9 volt battery, and is plugged into the headphone jack of your receiver. You then plug your headphones(at least 1000 ohms) into the Q-BOX. It is described as an "inductorless active filter". Specs claim a continuously variable bandwidth from 30 Hz to 2000 Hz. Center frequency is 800 cycles.

We will have a complete report on this device next month. It is available from AUTEK RESEARCH, Box 1494, Canoga Park, CA 91304.

This list is comprised of countries which have stations which broadcast English transmissions to North America or which can be heard with English broadcasts not beamed to North America. Arranged alphabetically by country name, the list utilizes the standard Log Report abbreviations except for the numbers 1, 2, 3 and 4 which appear next to the station name, in parentheses. These numbers refer to the relative occurrence of reception of the given station, with 1 being "heard regularly with English to North America", 2 being "heard often with English to North America", 3 is "heard regularly with English broadcasts not beamed to North America"; 4 is "heard often with English broadcasts not beamed to North America". 5 means "not broadcasting in English, but identifies in English at the beginning of programmes". These numerical grades are arbitrary and refer mostly to my QTH. Information for this listing came from my loggings, NASWA's FRENEX, and DSWCI's SWN. Frequencies underlined as "5955" have been recently logged by me.

QUESTION Are the FBIS lists better than the WRTH?

ANSWER They are quite different. The FBIS lists are simply tabulations giving freq, power, location, call, etc. The WRTH gives schedule information, addresses, much other data. One finds, after using the WRTH for a while, that it is a MUST, whether for casual listening, or for serious DXing. On the other hand, the FBIS lists, being not as up-to-date as the WRTH, and being merely the tabulations that they are are of less use to the serious DXer (though still very useful) and of almost no use to a person just interested in casual listening. QUESTION You've been stalling for quite some time on the awards program. Almost a year, now. Is there really an awards program? If so, how about some details?



REVIEW OF THE AUTEK Q*BOX

by NEAL PERDUE

(HQ note - this review, expected for next month, arrived in time for inclusion this time.)

To spend one hour with the Q-box active audio filter is to know that you have found the greatest DXing aid to ever hit the market, and at a truly reasonable price. Do you want to give your receiver selectivity equal to rigs costing \$600 and more at a cost of \$18.95?? Well, here is the answer from AUTEK RESEARCH of California--- address appears later in this review.

**Where to start, how to say enough about this fantastic device? It is a box standing 3" high, 4" wide, 1 1/2" deep, with phono plug input & output, and one VARIABLE selectivity knob as it's only control. Widest selectivity is 2kHz and it goes down to 30 Hz: (At 3 db, per manufacturers specs - HQ) The Q-box is battery operated, rated at more than 500 hours per 9 volt battery.

** The results with my SW#A have been unbelievable. (Other owners please note.)

** This device has so many advantages over other selectivity devices that I don't know where to start to tell about it. The specs and "73" Magazine test report are available from Autek upon request. I will decline further comment on this item beyond what I say in this review as the response to my invitation for info on the Unique Wire Tuner far exceeded my expectations and I simply don't have the time to answer all of this correspondence.

** The operation of the unit is so simple that you just plug the Q-box into the phone jack of the receiver and plug 1000 to 2000 ohm (optimum) earphones into the Q-box.

** Exalted carrier reception has previously been advocated by some members (it doesn't apply to the SW#A) but on rigs with which I can utilize this method I've found the hets, whistling, whining, etc., to be aggravating. The ideal answer to the problem is to be able to use the AM mode and narrow the passband. The Q-box lets you do exactly this, with amazing selectivity.

** I decided to give it the acid-test on 60 meters. I couldn't believe my ears: As the Q-box is tuned from minimum to maximum selectivity on a QRM-ridden signal, the noise and interference simply disappear and the desired signal jumps right out of the QRM. Believe it or not, you can go to almost the MAXIMUM of 30 Hz, cut down the surrounding noise, and pick out a signal that is barely audible in the 60 meter mess, and hear it intelligibly where it was just a garble on the band before switching in the Q-box. It's like switching in an expensive filter, and it's VARIABLE. The maximum setting of 2kHz is ideal for scanning the band, and when adjacent-channel interference occurs, start narrowing the passband to eliminate the interference, while the signal to noise ration increases dramatically. The desired result is intelligibility, and the Q-box will get it for you.... This unit should be of interest to anyone who has a receiver which must switch to BFO for sharper selectivity than available in the AM mode. One hitch, you can't drive a speaker with this unit without an amplifier, but the serious DXer uses headphones anyway (*) so I don't consider this a serious disadvantage. Cost is \$17.95, plus \$1 shipping in NA from AUTEK RESEARCH, Box 1494, Canoga Park, CA 91304. NAP

* I know several top NA DXers who almost never use headphones. The subject would be a good one for an "AS I SEE IT" feature... "AS I SEE IT" is designed to provide the opportunity for intelligent, well-thought-out discussion of subjects of DXer interest without getting into the month after month repetitious arguments that result in the usual "open-mike" column. "AS I SEE IT" is handled through HDQ. Dan Ferguson

The World DX Friendship Year '73 is nearing its end, and we who are in some way involved - DXers, DX Federation and Club officials, and producers/presenters of DX radio programmes - can look back on activities which, as I am sure you will agree, have brought us closer together and at least made us more aware of the potentialities for international friendship that are contained in the DX hobby.

One of the positive elements that WDXFY'73 has produced is a widespread desire to protract world friendship through DXing into the future. I, personally, have received many letters calling for further initiatives to ensure that "every year shall be a World DX Friendship Year", and I know that I am not alone in this.

Also, the very successful Sweden Calling DXers Contest, in which 17 SW Stations collaborated, resulted in the desire, expressed by many of the contestants, to make this an annual event. Our good friend Arne Skoog of SCDX has suggested that this annual contest be called "DX Rally", and on behalf of Radio Nederland, and as producer of DX Juke Box, I have agreed to organize the event in 1974. It is hoped that the DX Rally will be sponsored and organized by a different SW Station in each consecutive year.

Naturally, I have given much thought to the 1974 project, and I am submitting herewith 10 points with the request to give careful consideration to the ideas put forward, and I shall be extremely grateful if you will kindly let me have your reactions at your earliest convenience.

But first let me draw your attention to what I consider to be the most inspiring issue of World DX Friendship Year '73. I refer to initiatives that have been

developed to make the DX hobby known to handicapped people - the sightless, the disabled, the bedridden.

A positive, organized step in this direction was started in 1972 by the American SPEEDX organization, which initiated a Handicapped Aid Program (HAP). It came to full flower in the WDXFY'73, and is bringing a new interest and colour into the lives of handicapped people.

A highlight of HAP activities has been the placing of a complete listening post (including a communications receiver) at the disposal of the Rancho Los Amigos Rehabilitation hospital - one of the largest such hospitals in the United States.

Arthur Cushen, M.B.E. of New Zealand has compiled a DX Course for the blind, and it is available via SPEEDX to blind persons everywhere.

It is also known that the Newark News Radio Club in New Jersey, U.S.A. issues cassettes and runs a programme to provide information to blind DXers.

The Tellus DX Club of Mjndal in Sweden has, in 1973, delivered handicapped people from their isolation by providing them with international contacts via the DX hobby. Supported by the city authorities, the club room has been adapted and equipped to suit the special requirements of the handicapped, and an equipment-lease programme is contemplated.

The International Short Wave Club of London has also been actively engaged in this direction, and it was suggested in a recent ISWC bulletin that, in memory of the Club's late Secretary of long standing, an Arthur Bear Fund be organized to provide means for aid to the handicapped.

The European DX Council plans to start a Handicapped Aid Programme, and it is hoped to get this off the ground in 1974.

In view of all this activity, and of the evident desire in DX circles to turn the available facilities and know-how to the benefit of the less fortunate, it seems to me that there is every reason for designating 1974 as the World DX Handicapped Aid Year, and to coordinate and streamline our ideas in order that the greatest possible effect is achieved in the widest possible area.

The ten points submitted herewith will, I hope, give rise to further constructive ideas. Here, I feel, is something we can all do together.

DX RALLY 1974

TEN POINTS FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION

1. The year 1974 to be designated WORLD DX HANDICAPPED AID YEAR.
2. The 1974 DX Rally to be in the nature of a year-round campaign by DXers for DXers.
3. DX organizations to establish contact with institutes for the Blind, Rehabilitation Centres and other specialized institutions for the handicapped, with people isolated in their homes, and also with municipal authorities in order to gain access to such centres for the purpose of introducing inmates to the DX hobby, and of giving guidance and support thereafter.
4. Radio stations with DX programmes to stimulate, support and publicize the DXers' initiatives on a regular basis throughout 1974.
5. The participating stations to air some special programme(s) centred around some form of DX activity for the handicapped, in collaboration with the national DX organizations. These programmes to be spread over 1974. (In practice this will probably mean the second half of 1974).
6. The DX Rally contest proper to be twofold in character.
 - a) a Club contest for the best results in the interest of the handicapped,
 - b) an individual DX contest for picking up and reporting on as many handicapped aid (station) programmes as possible in 1974.
7. The contest jury sub 6a to be nominated by ANARC, DX-Alliansen and EDXC, jointly.
8. Prizes (to be donated) as far as possible in the form of equipment, instructive literature, etc, to go to the handicapped, not to the contestants. Certificates to be issued to the latter.
9. A further aim to be the setting up of permanent national or local DX Handicapped Aid Programmes.

10. DX Rally '74, incorporating World DX Handicapped Aid Year, to be publicized and discussed (besides by the stations) in DX-bulletins, and to be an agenda item at Club meetings, at the RDXA Parliament and at the ANARC and EDXC Conventions.

It is realized that a year is a long time for interest to be sustained, but any campaign takes time to get underway. The project will have to "get talked about".

The 10 points set forth above are suggestions. You may have other and better ones. Please let me have them. And please let me know as soon as possible if you intend to be actively involved. Thank you.

As the Radio Free America operation is now in a stage of painstaking litigation, we can catch up on some of the other information that has languished in recent issues. The only point of interest *vis à vis* RFA is that, as CB predicted, a high Government official -- H.R. Haldeman -- has been asked to testify at RFA legal proceedings. Whether he will be required to appear is another matter, but other present and former White House officials (e.g., Colson, Mitchell) could be sought out instead.

If you have written here in recent weeks and had no answer, please bear with me, as a number of personal matters -- among them a new wife, new work, and a new home -- have made it impossible to get even essential daily matters taken care of. I expect things will be less hectic by January.

One small non-clandestine item too late for LN or FS is contained in a cable from the IBA indicating major changes will take place in its overseas broadcasts around early December. Additionally, the 1130-1230 broadcast is now on 15100 & 17710 kHz (ex-17720 and, presumably, 15130); and the 2000-2045 broadcast has replaced 15100 by 15400 kHz, dropped 11725 and 17720 kHz, and increased power on the clear channel of 11700 kHz.

This month CB provides the first complete writeup on the African station, Radio Liberation ("Radio Libertação"), plus a full rundown on Lactian and Persian Gulf stations.

WEST AFRICA

CB is proud to present details of the long-mysterious PAIGC operations on shortwave. Thanks to Ms. Amélia Sanches of PAIGC we now have a reasonably-complete picture of the Radio Liberation setup.

RADIO LIBERATION ("Radio Libertação"): Radio Liberation is the official station of the Partido Africano da Independência da Guiné e Cabo Verde (PAIGC), which is now a member of the OAU and which is recognized by over 55 nations as the official government of the "Etat en République de Guinée-Bissau", i.e. what is often referred to as Portuguese Guinea.

The station has broadcast daily since mid-January, 1973, from its own transmitters near Conakry, Republic of Guinea. Of these three transmitters, one has an output power of 2.4 kw, while the other two have a power of one kilowatt each. Additionally, Radio Liberation is carried as a regular program by three other African broadcasters -- Radio Conakry, Radio Senegal, and Radio Mauritania.

At one time transmissions were jammed by a two-tone beeper, but this seems to have ceased. However, Radio Conakry is currently jammed heavily on 9648v and 7125v by an unknown source (it is worth noting that although the Soviet Union has cut back on its jamming of foreign radio broadcasts, Chile, Israel and Rhodesia have apparently resorted to this odious practice in recent weeks).

Radio Liberation transmits solely in Portuguese and West African vernaculars to Guinea-Bissau and the Cape Verde Islands. Its official schedule appears to be accurate, although in practice sign-on times tend to vary somewhat from day-to-day. The transmitter on 6240 kHz is of 2.4 kw, while the others are of 1 kw each. Other frequencies used earlier in 1973 include 6120, 7300 and 15265 kHz.

For the record, the black clandestine station, "Radio of the National Liberation Front of the Republic of Guinea", which operated from 0620-0725 and 2100-2205 on 4970 kHz, ceased broadcasting in March, 1973. This station was operated as an anti-Touré device by the Portuguese and pretended to represent an indigenous force within the Republic of Guinea opposing President Sekou Touré.

Reception on 6240 kHz is usually good on the Eastern seaboard at 0700 and around 2200. The IDs include, "Esta é A Voz da Libertação, ou é Radio Libertação -- estação emissora do PAIGC. A voz do povo da Guiné e Cabo Verde em luta", "Esta é Radio Libertação", "Aqui Radio Libertação", and "Transcreve é Radio Libertação". The interval signal consists of African drumbeats (4/4/3/5). It signs on with an ID, then into a Majak-like theme on a guitar and it signs off with an anthem. Ms. Sanches indicates reception reports would be of "great use", but says nothing about verification. However, friendly reports in French or Portuguese might succeed in extracting a verification and can be directed to Amélia Sanchez, Services d'Information du PAIGC, Secrétariat Général, B.P. 298, Conakry, Republic of Guinea, enclosing 3 IRCs for return airmail postage.

Our thanks to Glenn Hauser, Ernie Behr and the others who provided the several details to compliment Ms. Sanches' information.



Pro-Communist forces in Laos operate pretty much under the direction of the Lao Patriotic Front ("Neo Lao Hak Sat"). According to Western sources, the Lao Patriotic Front claims to consist solely of the People's Party of Laos ("Phak Pasason Lao"), with the Patriotic Neutralist Forces being an autonomous ally. These same sources suggest the PNF are actually controlled by the People's Party of Laos, which, it is further alleged, is controlled by the North Vietnamese government. On the other hand, Asian sources indicate the Lao Patriotic Front consists of at least the Khaosan Pathet Lao and the Khana Pathet Lao, and is merely allied with the PNF.

Regardless, it appears the three groups mentioned by Asian sources are engaged in broadcasting, although there have been suggestions that the Khana Pathet Lao station is run by pro-U.S. forces as a black clandestine operation.

This much is beyond dispute: the Pathet Lao and their allies control most of Laos and are sympathetic towards and, to a large degree, dependent on Hanoi. All their transmitters operate from near Hanoi, apparently from the Voice of Vietnam complex also used by the Voice of the National United Front of Kampuchea and Liberation Radio (all these stations were crippled simultaneously by the December 19, 1972, B-52 bombing of the Voice of Vietnam).

Although the Pathet Lao are reluctant to discuss their radio operation -- perhaps because it tends to reveal their dependence on Hanoi -- Western sources are not so bashful and indicate clandestine radio operations are the prime propaganda medium for the pro-Communist, anti-U.S. forces. For that reason, Vientiane irregularly jams these broadcasts. RADIO PATHET LAO ("Witayu Kachai Sieng fai Pathet Lao"): This is believed to be the radio operation of the Khaosan Pathet Lao, the main pro-Communist political force in Laos and the controlling body behind the Lao People's Liberation Army. It has broadcast since 1960 from a site apparently within the Voice of Vietnam complex near Hanoi, although RPL claims to broadcast from its Laotian capital of Sam Neua. However, there have been suggestions that one transmitter, 15 kw, seized from pro-U.S. forces in battle years ago, serves to relay RPL broadcasts from a site at or near Khangkai, Laos. The First Network transmitters at Hanoi are reportedly of Chinese manufacture and are of less than 15 kw output each. The same Asian source indicates the RPL staff consists of roughly 300 persons.

In addition to broadcasting operations, the LPF operates from Hanoi a radioteletype (RTTY) operation whose schedule is not available.

The Radio Pathet Lao schedule, nominally via BBC MS, but actually compiled by the U.S. FBIS (see Don Jensen's revealing exposé of FBIS in the February & March issues of SWC), is as follows:

The station IDs in Laotian as, "Thi ni Witayu Krachai Sieng fai Pathet Lao"; in French as, "Ici la Voix de Pathet Lao"; and in Vietnamese as, "Day la dai Pathet Lao". The interval signal consists of an Asian xylophone and strings. It signs on and off with an Asian anthem, but not the Laotian National Anthem. It rarely verifies from the Information Office of the Lao Patriotic Front in Hanoi, 40 Quang Trung Street, Hanoi, Democratic Republic of Viet Nam. Publications include "Laos News", a weekly English-language newsletter from the Hanoi Information Office; Lao Hak Sat, published at Sam Neua in Laotian; and Kongthap Fotpoi Pasason, Laotian-language organ of the Lao People's Liberation Army.

RADIO OF THE PATRIOTIC NEUTRALIST FORCES ("Sathani Withayu Krachai Sieng Heang Pathet Lao"): This station first appeared in December, 1961, under the rubric "Radio of the Laotian Kingdom". Although it claims to operate from Khang Khai in Laos, it actually operates from Hanoi as indicated earlier. It is scheduled in Laotian from 2315-0015, 0500-0600, 1100-1200 and 1300-1400 on 4250v, 6273v and 8600v kHz. It IDs as, "Thi ni Sathani Withayu Krachai Sieng Heang Pathet Lao" and signs off with a slow version of the Laotian National Anthem. It is not known to verify.

RADIO KHANA PATHET LAO ("Sathani Withayu Krachai Sieng Khana Pathet Lao"): This station, first traced July, 1973, in Sri Lanka, is believed to be nominally the official broadcast operation of the Khana Pathet Lao. Aside from that, nothing concrete is known about the station, but Western radio monitoring agencies have yet to issue any data on it, leading to speculation that the station may, in fact, be a black clandestine operation of the CIA or the Laotian Government in Vientiane.

Additionally, Victor Gometilleke, who unearthed the station in the first place, has recently -- and independently -- arrived at the same thought.

Laos is not new to black clandestine radio activity, having been the site of the fake "Voice of the National United Front of Kampuchea" (Pakse, Laos -- see March CB-1). Too, Vientiane is a veritable nest of CIA operatives both in known CIA activities and in mufti, usually as Agency for International Development (AID) advisors.

One such AID advisor, Tom Hargrove, is intimately familiar with black clandestine radio activities. Mr. Hargrove, whose activities have included clandestine military operations with U.S. Special Forces in Indochina, was deactivated from the military long enough to learn an AID skill (animal husbandry) and -- in the guise of an author -- nearly all there was to be known about past and present black clandestine radio operations throughout the world. After this period of training he made a trip to an undisclosed site in Texas and shortly thereafter surfaced as an AID advisor in Vientiane.

All we know of the station's schedule is that provided by Victor. He finds them in Laotian from 1100-1130 daily on 5012v kHz with the ID, "Thi ni Sathani Withayu Krachai Sieng Pathet Lao". Note, however, that Singapore and Nanning both operate on roughly 5010 kHz and that the clandestine Voice of the Burmese People operates on 5111v kHz from 1200-1300 and 0015-0130.

Thanks to the several who helped with this Laotian section, including the BBC MS, Vic-

tor Goonetilleke, Lars Rydén, Bob Bundy, and cartoonist Diane Lévesque.

MIDDLE EAST
Part III

PERSIAN GULF: The BBC MS reports a new clandestine station operating since November 3, 1973, under the title "Voice of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Oman and Arab Gulf" ("Saut al-Jabhah ash-Sha'biyah Li Tahrir 'Uman Wa al-Khalij al-'Arabi"). It is heard in Arabic from 1445-1615 daily on 6478 kHz.

The two other clandestine stations active in this region are:

Voice of Free Yemeni South ("Saut al-Janub al-Yamani al-Hurr"), a/k/a Radio Free Southern Yemen ("Idha'at al-Janub al-Yamani al-Hurr"): This station beams politically-leftist programming to Southern Yemen (Aden). Although the site is not known, a likely possibility is Yemen (San'a). One transmitter has been intermittently jammed with white sound since January, 1972. The programming, all in Arabic, is scheduled as follows:

1130-1500 5345, 8404 kHz

1630-2000* 5345, 8404 kHz

*up to 2103 sign-off during Ramadan

It IDs as above and signs off with an Arabic martial anthem played by a band. It is not known to verify.

Voice of the People from the Heart of the Arabian Peninsula ("Saut ash-Sha'b min Qalb al-Jazirah al-Arabiyyah"): This station is beamed to "our masses in the Arabian Peninsula" and criticizes the Saudi Arabian government. It was first noted by the BBC MS broadcasting from Iraq on May 8, 1973, as "Voice of Truth, Voice of the Arabian Peninsula". Its schedule, all in Arabic, is:

1200-1300 9573v kHz

1800-1900 9560*, 9573v kHz

*Beamed to the Gulf and the Hijaz & Asir Provinces of Saudi Arabia

IRAN: The BBC MS reports an unidentified clandestine station operating since October 23, 1973, with a signature tune identical to that used by the now-inactive clandestine station "Voice of the United Front of the Peoples of Iran", which ceased operation on October 7, 1973. The new station, which gives no ID or indication of its target audience, is noted as follows:

1400-1450 Farsi 7200 kHz 1450-1510 Arabic 7200 kHz 1510-1530 Kurdish 7200 kHz

The former clandestine was strongly believed to be transmitting via the facilities of Radio Baghdad, Iraq.

KOREA

Thanks to sleuthing by Lars Rydén and T. Akabayashi of Japan, it now appears that the Voice of Hope, formerly known as the Voice of Unification, and before that as the Voice of the East, is actually a South-Korean-based black clandestine operation operated by the ROK CIA to counter the North Korean broadcasts over clandestine radio station Voice of the Revolutionary Party for Reunification. Further corroborating the Tokyo-based theories is that, despite the many changes in name and schedule, no information on Voice of Hope et al. has been issued by Western monitoring agencies. These agencies regularly avoid publicizing data on black clandestine radio operations.

The schedule for the black "Voice of Hope", beamed primarily to Japan and North Korea, and reportedly affiliated with the KBS, Seoul, is 0200-0300 on 6335v kHz and 1230-1330 on 3960 kHz. It IDs as "Himang eui Meari Pang Song" and does not verify reception reports.

The North-Korean-based Voice of the Revolutionary Party for Reunification is scheduled as follows:

1000-1400* Korean to ROK 4560v, 1135v kHz

1030-1100 Sun. in Korean over Pyongyang HS frequencies

1300-1400 Korean to DPRK Thursdays 4560v, 1135v kHz

1400-1430 English to ROK 4560v, 1135v kHz

2100-2300 Korean to ROK 4560v, 1135v kHz

2300-2330**English to ROK 4560v, 1135v kHz

*not 1300-1400 Thursdays

**not traced in Tokyo

The station was first heard on August 26, 1970, and is believed to have replaced "South Korea Liberation Radio" which operated until March 14, 1970. The interval signal is now reported to consist of notes from a music box, although in the recent past the signal consisted of 9 echoing major chime notes. Sign off is with an anthem. The station is not known to verify and likely will continue to not verify. According to station announcements the schedule may be expanded and transmitter powers increased in order for them to reach a larger audience.




