"DXING ACCORDING TO NASWA" FOURTH EDITION: Edward C. Shaw, author of NASWA's popular DXing handbook is busy work on the fourth revision and printing of his book which was first published in November, 1975.

Although much of the original text will remain unchanged, this revision will concentrate on information of the new receivers now on the market as well as updating other areas that would have changed since the last revision. No date is set for publication, so watch FRENDX for future announcements.



RELEASE OF RCI GALLUP POLL DATA ON AMERICAN
SHORTWAVE LISTENERS

Background: As a part of the effort of Larry Magne, longtime NASWA Associate, an attempt was made to counter impressions about shortwave listening in the United States that were made in a report prepared in June 1978 by the Stanford Research Organization for the American Radio Relay League. The effect of the report was to minimize SWL activity in the U.S. in order to justify not increasing frequency allocations to international broadcast at WARC-79. To counter the ARRL report Magne sought and received release of data contained in a Gallup Poll study of American shortwave listening conducted in 1975 at the request of Radio Canada International. This interesting information is presented here in a memorandum dated 8 August 1978 (released as of 30 October) from Larry to Mr. Stanley Leinwoll, Chairman of the FCC International Broadcasting Service Group (IBSG).

"The American Radio Relay League, Inc. (ARRL), an Amateur radio organization, recently filed a comment with the FCC in reaction to the Commission's Eight Notice of Inquiry (NOI). This comment consists of a report prepared June, 1978, for the ARRL by SRI International, the Stanford Research organization. The report, "The Audience for High Frequency Broadcasting," forms the basis for the ARRL's view that International Broadcasting (IB) is not in need of additional HF spectrum space.

At the outset, the SRI-ARRL report notes that International Broadcasting's need for additional HF spectrum space is based on the severe overcrowding within the HF Broadcast bands which has developed in recent years. It goes on to cite EBU data showing that the situation of late has become so severe that more IB expansion is taking place out-of-band than in-band. This summarizes much of the IB dilemma, which for American International Broadcasters is especially acute, as the option of going out-of-band has not been made available to them.

Having made this observation, the report devotes itself to the implied proposition that the amount of HF spectrum that should be allocated to IB is a function of the size and characteristics of the listening audience.

In reply, it should be emphasized that the IBSG rejects the ARRL's proposition. First, the problem, as has been carefully documented, is that the IB bands suffer from severe congestion. The SRI-ARRL report has not addressed itself to this problem. Second, gathering audience data from such places as Bangladesh, China, or Bulgaria is, at best, educated guesswork. No responsible broadcaster would equate these data with "state of the art" ratings such as those obtained by American domestic broadcasters. Third, audience size per se is more often than not secondary to the broadcaster's mission. In many countries, those most likely to have access to shortwave radios are people in positions of atypical influence.

Jamming also tends to reduce audience size (cf. Board for International Broadcasting's 4th Annual Report, 1978, pp. 22-24). Jamming simultaneously aggravates overcrowding

1) because it disrupts not only the jammed channel, but also the two adjacent channels; and
 2) because in order to counter jamming, broadcasters are forced to use multiple channels.
 However, according to the SRI-ARRL report's reasoning, the reduced audience resulting from jamming reduces broadcasting's need for HF spectrum space!

As for the SRI-ARRL report's details, what suits ARRL's arguments is elaborated, whereas that which doesn't tends to be omitted, distorted, or worse. Some examples:

P. 3. The SRI-ARRL report impugns Deutsche Welle's Mr. Rössler for a lack of "supporting evidence" to validate his published claims concerning an increase in the number of receivers equipped to receive HF broadcasts. In this regard, the SRI-ARRL report quotes various statements made in print by Mr. Rössler, plus a citation of him of material from the BEC Handbook.

A first requisite in thorough investigation is to obtain data as near as possible to the source, which SRI and/or ARRL did by visiting Mr. Rössler on 18 November 1977 (cf. p. 28). What rings hollow is the report's attacking the lack of supporting detail in Mr. Rössler's writings, while making no allusion to the supporting evidence (or lack of it) he presumably would have been given the opportunity to present during the SRI-ARRL visit at Cologne. Whether the issue wasn't raised, or whether Mr. Rössler's further documentation on the subject was deliberately omitted from the final report, the SRI-ARRL allegations appear to be more concerned with scoring debating points than providing the Commission with a valid summary of Mr. Rössler's reasoning and data base.

P. 5. The report asks a pertinent question: "What need for expansion exists, in terms of listener requirements?" As the IBSG has detailed, the existing level of IB congestion is so serious as to markedly degrade signal quality in the target zone. International Broadcast has been increasingly difficult to receive satisfactorily since WARC-59; without relief from overcongestion it can but deteriorate further. Yet, there is not one sentence in the 40 page SRI-ARRL report that addresses itself to the relationship between quality of received signal and audience characteristics. That the multitude of heterodyne whistles and modulation interferences routinely encountered within the HF broadcast bands may be costing American International Broadcasters audiences they would otherwise have, and is making IB listening increasingly frustrating for American listeners, escapes even passing mention.

P. 5. The report limits its study of IB audiences to "audience research conducted by or in behalf of HF broadcasters themselves." Intentionally or not, this eliminates the most exacting study done on the subject -- the mid-1977 survey done by Yankelovich, Skelly, and White -- which was commissioned by an American electronics manufacturer. Because the study is concerned with proprietary information, it has been kept from the public. However, any serious research into the subject of International Broadcasting audiences should at least attempt to obtain the non-proprietary findings of this study (it should be pointed out that the existence of the Yankelovich study is fairly common knowledge in the North American IB community because of the several people interviewed during the analysis and data-gathering).

P. 16. The SRI-ARRL report cites Gallup statistics gathered in 1973 and 1975 for Radio Canada International. The SRI tables (nos. 4 and 5) summarize the audience size by giving the most regular audience only, i.e. that which listens once or more a week. Omitted without mention of their existence are the numerous figures in the Gallup surveys giving listenership on a less frequent basis. In International Broadcasting intermittent listening plays a special role, as during crises or other major events audiences tend to enlarge considerably. For example, during the 1968 Czechoslovakian events, RFE's audience is estimated to have risen substantially. Similarly, RFE's Romanian audience is reported to have grown dramatically immediately following the March 1977 earthquake there. That so many people tune IB during critical moments is itself a measure of the service it performs.

Also questionable, in view of the SRI-ARRL report's claims to statistical expertise, is SRI's use of one set of Gallup statistics to provide data for a question which is answered by another set of Gallup statistics. The 1975 Gallup Survey, on page 3 and the top of page 4 (of the Gallup report), gives listenership for each station as a percentage of the total 1975 U.S. Adult population (142 M). The headings of Tables 4 and 5 of the SRI-ARRL report, plus the text on page 17, leave little doubt that the tables give us just such data. However, there is a foot note at the bottom of p. 16, "Based on tables at bottom of page 4" (of the 1975 Gallup report to RCI). The percentages at the bottom of page 4 are not those for the total U.S. Adult population; these are found on page 3 and the top of page 4. Rather, they are percentages of the U.S. adult population that own radios capable of receiving shortwave broadcasts!

As a result, what the SRI-ARRL report suggests is the U.S. IB audience for each of six selected broadcasters differs markedly from the data actually found in the Gallup Survey SRI cites for its statistics, viz.:

P. 29. The SRI-ARRL report questions whether radios with shortwave reception capability are, in fact, being sold in wider numbers. It also questions whether there exists a correlation between sales of such radios and "numbers of regular listeners to HF broadcasts."

Because of the competitive nature of the radio industry, such proprietary data typically are not made available to the public. Nevertheless, for the first time since the introduction of the transistor, consumer-oriented shortwave portable radios have undergone fundamental circuit changes, with the result that shortwave listening now is much easier and more pleasurable (cf. World Radio TV Handbook 1978, rear section, pages 3-10). This sort of radio is not an AM/FM set with SW bands incidentally tacked on and possibly not used. Rather, these sets are designed with the primary intent of receiving shortwave broadcasts. These shortwave units are no longer advertised solely in the WRTH and similar specialized publications. Since 1977, they have been increasingly promoted in such mass publications as *Newsweek*, *Time*, *Playboy*, *Smithsonian*, the *New York Times*, the *Wall Street Journal*, and even over television. Sales of this new generation of shortwave radio are reported to be vigorous.

There are other indicators that suggest IB is a growing medium. One of the Don Smith studies ("America's Short-wave Audience", *Public Opinion Quarterly*, winter 1969) indicates that a tiny proportion of those listening to IB are radio hobbyists. As radio hobby activity is better documented than shortwave listening in general, relative changes in hobby activity may provide an indication as to the growth of the larger shortwave listening audience.

Two measures of IB hobby activity are sales of the annual *World Radio TV Handbook* and membership in IB hobby clubs. The 1976 WRTH sold 40,000 copies; the 1977 edition 43,000 copies; and the 1978 edition (est.) 55,000 copies. In the U.S., the largest club devoted to IB hobby activities, the North American Shortwave Association, had a 1976 membership of 1,200 a 1977 membership of 1,500; and a 1978 (actual, mid-year) membership of 1,700.

Of course, in poorer countries the situation is doubtless quite different. Even a \$150 Sony ICF-5900W is beyond the means of most Africans, for example. However, that the public's large responds enthusiastically to IB when one of the long-standing technical hurdles is

vercome suggests that the proposed reductions in interference brought about by a more equitable allocation of HF spectrum space to Broadcasting should have positive effects on IB listenership not only in advanced countries, but also in countries where primitive radios are the norm.

P. 29-30. The SRI-ARRL report states that non-shortwave alternatives, such as broadcast tape exchanges and satellite relays, may replace HF broadcasting as a primary means of international information exchange.

The report misses the point of shortwave broadcasting. Were the flow of information free and unimpeded, the most technically suitable vehicle within the economic means of a broadcaster would be chosen. This would almost certainly exclude HF for the majority of applications. But every nation has either formal restrictions on the flow of information and/or cultural biases that inhibit the domestic media from seeing events from the viewpoint of other cultures. At one extreme there are countries which are so hostile to outside information that they jam IB signals and otherwise censor virtually all communication. But even under the best conditions, such as exist in many Western democracies, there are circumstances when a nation feels its situation is not properly perceived and reported on because of the norms and perspective of the domestic media. None of this can be resolved by resorting to distribution channels controlled by those who already control the domestic media. Consequently, any information exchange under these conditions is sharply limited. Wireless World, commenting on the results of the long-established "Eurovision" network, which is the most successful attempt to implement what the SRI-ARRL report proposes, states "the initial ambitious prospectus for Eurovision has deteriorated to a confinement to football matches, 'It's a Knockout', and, worst of all, the Eurovision Song Contest." As for more of the same sort of thing, Wireless World concludes, "the most desirable international linking system might well be an open circuit, at that rate." (7/78, p. 50).

Given ITU restrictions on satellite broadcasting, plus the limitations of MF, it is nearly always HF which is the sole available medium for International Broadcasting. Fixed may go to satellite and hams to VHF, but for IB there is no place to turn but HF, where existing in-band congestion is very nearly intolerable.

In closing, it may be worth noting the irony of the ARRL's argument. If the radio community were to accept the concept of frequency allocation's being primarily a function of the number of people making direct use of a given class of stations, IB would occupy the lion's share of the HF spectrum, whereas Amateur space would be relatively tiny. Similarly, by this line of reasoning, Citizens Band would be entitled to far greater bandspace than amateur, especially in view of the recent growth in CB usage. The IBSG does not subscribe to this view.

DX 160

-MINOR IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE REALISTIC DX-160

The Realistic DX-160 is a very fine set for the money, and can bring many hours of DXing pleasure for the owner. There are however, some circuit modifications that can be made to improve your DX-160. First of all, let's look at the S meter. When I first got my set, I noticed that the S meter would pin itself with a loud click when tuned to the weakest of signals. To solve this problem I took a 5 kohm potentiometer and placed it in parallel across the red and white leads running from the S meter. I drilled a small hole in the back of the set and mounted the potentiometer for easy access for adjustment. I soldered the wires from the potentiometer where the red and white leads run into the circuit board. Now that the S meter can be adjusted, you can calibrate the meter. You will need a signal generator. You can usually find old ones at your corner ham store for about \$45 on up (or borrow one). Once you get the generator, you will have to tune it to a 60 microvolt signal. Then attach it to your antenna terminal and turn the adjustment on the potentiometer until the S meter reads at S 9. Now your set has a truly accurate S meter.

Now we come to the Automatic Noise Limiter (ANL). This little device serves about no useful purpose and just takes up room in the DX 160. To add your own ANL you must go to the audio portion of your set. All you need for this adjustment is a 470 mf electrolytic capacitor and a switch. First of all, look at the wires that lead to the headphone jack. One wire will be white with a purple stripe on it. This is the wire that you will need. From this lead, solder the positive lead of the capacitor; then solder the negative lead to one of the lugs on the switch. Now, from the remaining lug on the switch, solder a lead to the chassis (or the black wire that runs to the headphone jack). This side of the switch is now grounded and when the switch is turned on the capacitor is put in parallel across the audio leads and will help to null some of the noise. There will be a slight drop in volume, but you can just turn up the volume slightly to compensate for this. The ANL will work whether you are using headphones or the external speaker. To mount the switch, I drilled a small hole between the headphone jack and the bandspread dial. Remember to use a very small switch, so you can mount it properly in the small space.

Ever wanted to tape a program off the air and find that there is no way to make a direct electrical connection? Well, with a phono plug and a piece of wire, you will be able to make those direct connections to your taperecorder. To do this, go to the white wire with the purple stripe that runs to the headphone jack (mentioned earlier) and simply solder a wire to it and run it to the phono plug mounted on the back of your set. To mount the phono plug, I drilled a $\frac{1}{8}$ inch hole in the back of my set and simply ran the wire from the headphone jack to the phono plug. The plug grounds itself out on one side so you only need the one wire. You can tape a show whether you use headphones or the external speaker.

If you want to attach a Q multiplier or use a digital readout, you will need some way of making a connection to the IF section of your set. To do this you must first of all find the white wire with the light blue stripe that runs from the RF gain control to R16. Now, where the two meet, simply solder a piece of coax cable to it. Remember to ground the braid to the chassis, and run this to a coax connector mounted on the back. Now you have an easy way to connect anything you want to the IF section of your set. Remember to use coax cable when making this connection and provide the proper shielding necessary when using the IF section.

If you want to use an antenna that is fed with coax cable and do not want to be constantly bothered with the messy fussiness of cutting back the plastic sheath and the braid, and would rather use the proper coax connectors, simply mount a chassis coax connector to the back of your set and then with a small piece of coax cable, run it to the A1 terminal of the strip terminal already on the set. Once again you will need the shielding here since you are going to have to run the wire right by the main power cord and you might pick up some unwanted noise.

For operating convenience on those long nights of DXing, I found a few things to make it a bit easier on yourself. First of all I put raised feet on the front of my set. I got this

idea from a book and from seeing the advantages for myself on my friend's FT-101. The raised feet give a better view of the front of the set so you are not always bending your neck when you want to see where you are on the dial. Also, I attached small bolts to the two tuning knobs so I could sweep over any portion of the band I wanted much more easily. These little cranks also help reduce hand cramps. For tuning in those weak stations packed close together, I recommend that you hold the whole knob for better accuracy in tuning.

Well, I hope these ideas will help all you DX-160 owners as much as it has helped me. A word of caution. If you don't feel too confident about doing something to your set, do not do it. Find someone who can do what you want done, you may save yourself from a lot of grief. Please write me if you have any suggestions, or with your opinions of what I have suggested. SUNSPOTS

SUNSPOTS CAN BE A DRAG

Those of you versed in propagation will, I'm sure, agree with the above statement, at times. The first week in October was a prime example. As many of you tropical band DXers know, many good openings come on the upswing of the 27 day cycle, just before we get some unsettled or active geomagnetic activity. Unsettled and active conditions usually produce an A index of around 10 to 20. Well, the A index for October 1st was clear up to 65 and we were in the midst of a major geomagnetic storm! So what does all this mean? Well, it means that if you were trying to listen to almost any SW frequency on this date, you were plumb out of luck! And if you tried to do any tropical band DXing for the next week, you were again out of luck - it took that long for the ionosphere to recompose itself after the shell-shock of the initial bombardment of solar particles. The rising sunspot count only means that we will see more of this in the future and that if you don't get that DX on the upswing of a geomagnetic storm, you may well not get it on the downswing!

Sunspots can be a drag in another and more important way too. Recently astronomers around the world and particularly at NASA have been keeping a close eye on the sinking Skylab space station now precariously orbiting the earth. Last night on the CBS news there seemed to be some disagreement as to just when Skylab might be coming down (re-entering the earth's atmosphere - similar to the Russian satellite that came down last year). There were only two general things that the astronomers could agree on: 1) the U.S. doesn't have too much time to get the Space shuttle "on line" and go up there to push Skylab back out into a safe orbit, and 2) it was the increased sunspot activity that caused the Skylab to come in so far so fast! It seems that while the amateur radio operators were heralding in the new Cycle 21 sunspot eruption as a fantastic new adventure in radio, it is at the same time causing the Skylab to come dangerously close to falling out of orbit. The cause of the rapid orbital decay of Skylab is that the increased solar radiation has heated the upper atmosphere and caused it to rise, increasing atmospheric drag on Skylab and hastening its eventual fall. This increased solar radiation has come very rapidly in the new cycle. While the minimum of Cycle 20 was sometime during 1974 or 75, and Cycle 21 didn't even officially start until July 1976, it is already 2/3 to 3/4 of the way to its maximum level in just two years! It seems to be in a bit of a hurry considering it has some 11 years to make the round trip. That either means we are in for a long time with high solar flux readings and general noisy low band conditions or for a time of very slow decline to the Cycle 21 minimum or who knows. . .

All in all, the next few years should be very interesting propagationally speaking, and remember; if the Skylab does land in your backyard, do not touch it or approach it, just get on the phone and call Jack Webb and "Project U.F.O." or Dr. Hynek at Northwestern University, hi!! (NASA recently announced that Skylab WILL fall.)

Radio Saigon

THE SAIGON STORY

The following history of Radio Saigon, French Indo-China, was related by Jean Pison, head of the English Department of Radio Saigon, on March 16, 1947.

"On a day in the summer of 1928, the Director of the French Radio-Electric Society, in his office in the Boulevard Haussman, Paris, sent for his commercial agent. A customer had just arrived from Saigon, who wanted to buy a 12 KW shortwave broadcasting station. At that time, only the most important countries had such luxuries. The man must be mad -- or, at best, a very poor joker! When inquiries were made, however, it was found that the man, Monsieur Joseph de la Pommeraye, was a 'serious' prospective customer, who, with a group of friends, wished to 'endow' French-Indo-China with a powerful radio station. The commercial agent hastened to invite the gentleman to luncheon, and on this occasion learned of the forthcoming creation of the Franco-Indochinese Radio Company.

"Twelve months later, this company purchased a plot of ground at Chi-Hoa, on the outskirts of Saigon, and had buildings constructed there. Two engineers came from France, and also a fine orchestra -- certainly the best that Indo-China had ever known, for of the seven musicians engaged, five were firstprize winners from the Paris Conservatory.

"On July 18, 1930, the first Radio Saigon broadcast took place, in the presence of the Governor-general, Monsieur Pasquier. From the very beginning, results were excellent (except within a radius of about 150 miles and in Cambodia). Considerable improvement was achieved by the addition of new aeriels.

"Letters came in from the four corners of the globe, so to speak. Listeners everywhere showed their enthusiastic admiration for France's fine effort. In Indo-China, however, the population was not well-equipped to hear the new station's broadcasts. In 1930, there were only 108 radio sets in the entire country, and these were of the loudspeaker type.

"It was suggested that the Administration should have at least one radio receiver installed in the public hall of every village. But, alas, nothing came of this idea, and what was worse, owing to the heavy expenses incurred, Radio Saigon was obliged to cease its transmissions on April 30, 1932. Letters of disappointment and protest poured in from all over the world. Yet, in spite of various press campaigns, 'The Voice of France in the Far East,' the name under which Radio Saigon was known to many hundreds of listeners, remained silent.

"In 1938, the matter was taken up in Paris and Indochina, and these negotiations resulted in the formation of the Indochinese Broadcasting Company. In January 1939, the transmitting apparatus was taken from Chi-Hoa and was installed in Phu-Tho. The studios were set up temporarily at the Radio-Electric Centre in Saigon itself. In March 1939, French radio specialists arrived on the Air-France plane. Thanks to their valuable help, the first broadcast from the new studio was given at 0700 hours on April 1.

"We carried on under considerable difficulties. There were frequent breakdowns in the technical equipment, which we were still waiting patiently to have renewed, and we were particularly short of gramophone records. Gradually then, both equipment and recordings began to arrive. Broadcasters became more varied and daily transmissions were given in French, Tonkinese, English, Dutch, Cambodian, Chinese, and Siamese. A tremendous mail arrived with every boat; in fact, about 60% of the letters received bore foreign stamps.

Then in September of 1939, war broke out in Europe. Radio Saigon found itself unable to continue as a private enterprise. Government aid was given and the 'Voice of France in the Far East' continued to be heard. Then came June, 1940---and the Armistice! All telephonic and telegraphic communications with France were broken, and so Indo-China was unable to receive any first-hand news from France. However, listeners continued to hear three daily news bulletins. But they hardly realized the tremendous amount of work involved for the staff of the station and for the Radio Control Service. For a month, the head of this Service could not have had more than two or three hours sleep each night. Surrounded by contradictory reports and telegrams, he was continually listening-in---hoping to find out what was really happening in France. Meanwhile, more technical equipment had arrived and Radio Saigon could now be heard throughout the French Empire.

"When the Japanese first arrived in Indo-China, they were, of course, much concerned with the radio and tried their best to turn the station into a pro-Japanese affair. They somehow managed to 'drag' from a timorous Government, rights of control over the station's broadcasts.

"But they met with stubborn Underground opposition --- at least from some members of the staff. I could make a long story of my Homeric struggle with their censors and the system of code signals established with other Allied stations --- but time does not permit. Everything went along more or less smoothly until March 9, 1945. That was the date of the Japanese 'cou de force' which resulted in their overthrowing the French Colonial government and taking full power.

There were but four of us present on the premises at 2130 hours when the place was stormed by a detachment armed from head to foot. They took us -- two men and two women -- as prisoners, without telling us what our fate might be. In the morning, they asked us to keep on working "with" them. We refused indignantly and were rather surprised that they permitted us to return to our homes. To be quite true, I must tell you that they fetched me shortly afterwards, took me to the Kempetai, and took vengeance for all our past contests. I was very nearly beaten to death before they had finished with me.

"Meanwhile, their dream of transforming Radio Saigon into a branch of the Japanese propaganda service had come true. From March 10 to the beginning of September 1945, the station was operated by the Japs -- entirely and exclusively. When the British troops came in September 1945, the Japs had turned over the station to the Viet Minh, who abandoned it immediately.

"We began broadcasting again on September 26, and that was indeed a great day for those

among us who had devoted a large part of our activities to Radio Saigon for several years before the Japanese 'period'. Matters were not quite so easy as we might have wished, however, for part of our equipment had been sabotaged by either the Japs or the Viet Minh.

"But we made the best of it, and that lasted until April 8, 1946, another fateful day in the history of Radio Saigon. It was on that day that the arsenal which was just opposite our premises was blown up, the explosions lasting for some 56 hours. Radio Saigon was practically burned down, with all the technical equipment being utterly destroyed. The first explosion occurred at 1020, and we are proud to say that we resumed broadcasting at 1800. We borrowed whatever material we could find (from the Post Office Dept., and from the Army), installed it in a private house, and simply went on!

"To the present day (1947) we are still in that house -- working under difficult conditions, but making our 'Voice' heard the world over in eight languages, 15 hours a day. Our former building is being rebuilt.

"With the gradual improvement in our equipment, the number of overseas listeners to our English broadcasts is increasing. We will be delighted to verify all correct reports and hope that many of you will continue to keep us posted on the reception of Radio Saigon in your various countries."

Mailbag

Your editor's mailbag has received several letters regarding my article on selectivity in modern receivers. Thanks for all the kind comments. Apparently it was needed and I am glad it was of value to many of you.

Among the comments on the selectivity article was one by Perry Ferrell of Gilfer which is worth reprinting here. Perry says, "There are a lot of factors in "why" Japanese receivers are so broad (in selectivity) ... one reason is the power density of stations heard in Japan is substantially less than here in the States and particularly in Europe. . . secondly, cost is a BIG factor, those 6 kHz filters are only 50 cents in Japan, but the ones we're using for the 4 kHz selectivity is about \$11.00 wholesale . . . third, ease of alignment; an inexperienced technician can rapidly align a broad IF receiver, while tweaking a narrow IF receiver takes a moment more -- and I mean about 2 to 3 minutes, all of which adds up at the end of the week and is subtracted from the bottom (profit) line." (Thanks for shedding more light on the subject, Perry.)


Greg Danylchenko, Port Credit, Ont., sends an item from the Toronto Star that mentions secret Soviet studies of shortwave listening in the USSR that the author became aware of while in the USSR that suggests that in the early 1970's 1 in 6 adult Soviet Citizens hear some foreign radio broadcast. The article mentions that more than half of Soviet households radios that can pick up international broadcasts. Apparently Soviet Citizens can freely listen to international broadcasts or at least the author found it widely done. People in the USSR to whom the author talked realize their own news system is weak and turn to the VOA, BBC, and others to learn what is going on. The numbers of Soviets that listen to foreign broadcasts causes political problems for the Soviet news managers as they can no longer ignore problems and must hurry to counter western broadcasts. Studies conducted in this country, at MIT, indicate that in a crisis, perhaps half of adult Soviets would listen to a foreign voice for information.

(Editors comment with trepidation: If the above is true, and there is no guarantee one way or the other, then what alternatives do American Citizens have in a crisis, how many of them are equipped to listen to international broadcasts, half? The RCI studies cited earlier would indicate more like %.)

MISCELÁNEA RADIAL ZIMBABWE (Cf Nov LN-6 KENYA) 11950 suspected Kenya is 2nd harmonic of RBC African sce 5975 (Kofinek, DSWCI)

YEMEN WEST (actually this is just plain YEMEN, as opposed to YEMEN SOUTH; previously referred to as YEMEN NORTH, but a look at the map shows it as much WEST as NORTH of SOUTH YEMEN) R. Sanaa noted on two xmters simultaneously 4853 and 4975 // with AR, good 1500-1530 (Peter Bunn, R. Australia Japanese DX 10/12)

YEMEN SOUTH Aden radio obs on new 6005, opening at 1500 with full ID in AR; may be replacement for 7190, not audible at this time, GS in AR (Peter Bunn, R. Australia DX 10/12)

VIETNAM Ho Chi Minh City noted on 9623 in Viet at 1330 (Noel Green, BBC WRC 1/12)

VENEZUELA As of 11/12, R. Nacional's IS not hrd on 15400 since Sept (SWNS) Seems to be a regular pattern of prime activity circa August, tho not so unannounced (gh)

U S S R Per a recent study published by BBC and FBIS, R. Moscow broadcasts weekly for the exterior in 84 languages for 1999 hours, followed by USA, 1805 h in 58 langs, China 1437 in 44, Egypt 1091 in 31, West Germany 795 in 37, and UK 727 in 37 (OCS-N via Nov L'Onde) Moscow figures probably outdated by RMWS changes (gh) New RMWS made possible in part by introduction of 24 new 500 kW xmters, which sources in US say are more powerful than any this country

uses...new service is being seen in some circles as Soviet attempt to establish signal dominance /in out of band frequencies/ before WARC (Broadcasting 30/10 via SWNS) Their US sources are obviously uninformed about VOA's 500 kW xmtrs at Greenville; they should have asked any DX listener (gh) In a 2/12 mailbag pgm, RMWS mentioned that as of Dec, it would cut down on the number of frequencies used in any one hour--enabling the service to stay on the air for several hours on the same frequencies (BBC MS 7/12) Sometime ago I reported that R. Tashkent has ten QSL cards. Recently, they corrected themselves in a letter--five (Bill Matthews, OH) Magadan hrd on 19000 kHz at 0230, 2 x 9500; Vladivostok on 25075 at 0132 5 x 5015; and on 28865 at 0050, 3 x 9620 //25075, all in Russian (R. Colin Newell, BC, 16/10 & 18/10, SPEEDX) That last would be 28860 (gh)

U S A A WTFDA correspondent, Randall B. Clark, WV, reminds us about DXing the 'remote pick-up' stations in the 26 MHz band--a number of which I used to hear between 25870 and 26400 kHz, usually NBFM. Low-power xmtrs operated by local AM/FM stations for feeds to studio from church services, shopping center shows, etc. I haven't heard any of these in several years, but a few may still be active irregularly, and worldwide propagation is now possible (gh)

WVW back on 20000 kHz as of 1/12 (David Crawford, FL) 20 MHz would continue as long as propagation conditions warrant, it was announced (Wilder Pickard, IL) The 20 MHz frequency has not been inserted in the ID anmts (Andrew Blumberg, NY, 5/12; gh 7/12) WVW & WVW were to add another 'leap second' between UTC 1978 and 1979 (Pickard)

WANB, Waynesburg PA, 500 watts hrd on 4740, 3 x 1580, 18/11 at 1212, not to be confused with Maldives! (Steve Webster, Ont) WANB hrd on 4740 at 2100 12/12, NBC nx (Gerry Bishop PA)

WCBC (Cf Dec LN-8)--massive series of spurs have finally disappeared (SWNS 1/12) LN-15 Computer studies made at MIT suggest that on a 'typical' day in the early 1970s, some 10 million Soviet citizens may have listened to the VOA alone, and another 5 million to the far more abrasive R. Liberty. These numbers--confirmed in secret Soviet studies I've been told about in Moscow--could only have gone up in recent years, as more and more people acquired SW sets (Mark Gayn, "The Voices Moscow Hates", Toronto Star, via San Francisco Sunday Examiner & Chronicle 12/11, via Steven P. d'Adolf)

This year, VOA has increased its trend to make a considerable number of late changes to its proposed schedules, a few days before the start of each season. Those who have obtained a copy of the 10-page VOA Frequency Schedule effective 5th November must be extremely puzzled, as many frequencies are in use which do not appear in the schedule. Since publication there have been over 200 changes to freqs, times, sites, powers and target areas shown. One example is the 1000-1100 xmsn from Greenville in PT to Brazil, listed on 9580--feeder to Ascension, 11730 and 11840, whereas freqs are 11715 and 15375 only. If this trend continues, DXers apart from VOA monitors, will have no reliable information on VOA transmissions (Robert Jones, Dec ADXN) NY)

AFRTS feeder on USB football past 2100 GMT 3/12 between 10535 and 10540 kHz (Mark Giorgi,

URUGUAY SODRE IS formerly on 9515 and 11885 has not been heard here this year, EPT's activation of 9515 makes it seem likely SODRE IS has been deleted. Any confirmation? (Richard E. Wood, NH, 8/12) Not heard on 9515, but certainly on 11885, 24/11 and 25/11 around 2315 and 0030 with English, also announcing 31m (gh, OK) more, LN-15

UGANDA (Cf Dec LN-8) Don't ask me how that 17725 ended with Uganda--oddly enough, I have that evening's logging verified by Kampala, but for 15325 (John L. Rouse, MD) UBC has test to Eur in new lang, German, on new 9685, hrd 2039-2103* (Joe Tangredi, SCDX 21/11) Poor audio quality is probably due to using a standard dial-up phone line link from studio to transmitter rather than a 5-kHz line; also I suspect they do not use a peak limiter on their xmtr to hold all modulation levels to maximum 100% (Jim Conrad, IA, Dec. R.I.E.)

TURKEY State Meteorological Service, 6900, hrd poorly 0500-0515 23/11 with Turkish anmt, mid-east sitar mx (Charley Hoffman, PA) Also 7/12 0413-0458, mostly chants and pipe & string mx; short talk at 0435--maybe a wx report! (Syd Osterman, Ont.)

SYRIA A letter from Awatef Haffar of Syrian Radio confirms they are off SW 'for the time being' (Bob Donly, Nov SPEEDX, via DX Ontario)

SOUTH AFRICA Altho R. RSA announced and Dec LN-2 printed that move of NAM svc 0156-0250 from 15155 to 15220 was to avoid Morocco, it was, for the record, Algeria (Richard E. Wood)

SEYCHELLES (Cf Aug LN-7) That FEBA annual 60,000 pound tax--is it true? Yes, FEBA paid nothing before independence to the British govt, but when Seychelles became independent a new agreement was signed. Why such a big licence fee? Because the US Govt pays \$1 million for their satellite tracking station--wish I could 'let' my back garden to NASA! According to FEBA Pgm Dir who was on a tour of SAs and asked the question at my QTH (Goonetilleke, UADX)

PORTUGAL RFE/RL, hrd at 1400 with rock mx, ID, 10/12 on 30340, 2 x 15170 (Wm. Yohana, NJ)

OMAN (Cf Dec LN-7) Not only can BBC Masirah 9590 0255 s/on be IDed per Nov LN sked, but voice ID is given as "BBC Eastern Relay Station" Often level with Bonaire here (Richard E. Wood, NH) Or even over RN Bonaire, including me....we can no longer rely on the auroral zone being such a good buffer for channel sharing, during this solar cycle peak (gh)

NICARAGUA Rdif. Nacional, 5950, absent from 2200 to 0900 22/11 (Stu Klein, FL) Not observed since 1200 21/11; appears to coincide with govt decision to rescind the reg requiring formation of a national net (BBCMS 30/11) Back on 5950 since 30/11 (BBCMS 7/12) Hrd 1/12 at 0200 check (gh) Not hrd since 5/12--only R. Zelaya in Bluefields on 5950 now (BBC MS 14/12) But again hrd since--best described as 'irregular' without jumping to conclusions (gh) more LN-15

NEW ZEALAND 18/11 at 1441 on 5225 kHz I hrd 'This is a test transmission for New Zealand Broadcasting... chimes and repeat, off at 1447. Anything to do with planned new RNZ SW service? (George J. Poppin, CA) It was a NZ Post Office xmsn. It is our policy not to verify such reports (K. D. McFarlane, PO Telecomms Div, 6/12) Utility (gh)

NETHERLANDS A sad note. Van Dulken, head of the English section, recently retired after 30 years with R. Nederland. His place has been taken over by Will van der Fluit--not a name known in front of the microphone. He used to be a producer/translator (Simon Hicks, WDXC Contact, via Dec. REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING)

NEPAL I had the good luck to hear R. Nepal 13/12 1222-1315 fadeout on 3425. Mx sounds very much like Indian sub-continental pop mx; at 1245 drum beat and a 7-minute talk, in presumed Nepali; no trace of them since (Neville Denetto, Kakabeka Falls, Ont.)

MONGOLIA Mongolian news agency Montsame reported 23/11 that a new radio stn had been put into operation in Choybalsan city (eastern Mongolia) ahead of schedule--one of numerous projects with USSR funds. (BBC MS 30/11) Cf LN-6

MALI LN-15

MALTA (Cf LN-6) DW has had a relay here since 1974; however, the Government of Malta is the licensing authority. The agreement with Malta provides that xmsn time not used by DW should be made available to GOM, which would reimburse costs. DW, therefore, are not responsible for the content of any xmsns broadcast by the GOM or any third party. DW emphasizes that it has not granted transmission time to "R. Mediterranean" (DPA via BBC MS 7/12)

LEBANON (Cf Dec LN-7 & 14) Per R. Lebanon 20/11, the PM has issued a circular prohibiting official dealings with 'private radio stations'. Unless civil servants, contractors and hired workers refrain from all dealings with such stations, they will face legal action (BBCMS 30/11) Voice of Lebanon tentatively hrd on 6550 at 0550-0604 10/12 in AR with chants, 0558 possible chimes (Syd Osterman, Ont.)

LAOS Houa Phan on 6198 was unheard in Nov. Udom Sai on 6908, Luang Prabang on 7000 were untraced, Pakse not found. Xieng Khouang hrd on 4756 & 6676. Savannakhet on 7383 to 1400* Laos again back to rarities! (Isao Ugusa, New FEDXR 30/11) On 30/11 LNR broadcast a review "New Steps in Propaganda Work in 1978". It stated LNR was being expanded and improved in all respects. Six local stations had been 'consolidated and developed' also producing their own pgms 'in order to mobilize people of various nationalities in their areas' (BBC MS 7/12) Pathet Lao nx agency reports a ceremony was held 8/12 in Vientiane at which radio equipment installed by Vietnam was received as a gift for LNR--including MW & SW xmtrs of 1, 2, 4, 5, 15 and 50 kW, per an agreement signed in Vientiane 29/5/78 (BBCMS 14/12)

KOREA SOUTH The govt-controlled Korean Broadcast System has been shown by Congressional investigation to be a front for the Korean CIA (John Weisman, "Buying Goodwill--and More", 25/11 TV Guide, p. 30) KBS is the parent body of R. Korea (gh) R. Korea has at least three pennants of the same design but different colors--yellow with blue border, pink with green border, and light blue with dark blue border (Bill Matthews, OH)

KAZAKH SSR Alma-Ata in Kazakh with IS and local ID is at booming strength 1200 on 5960 21/11 (Richard E. Wood, Plymouth NH)

KASHMIR AZAD AKR Muzaffarabad, obs on new 6010 fair to poor 1130-1400 20/10 (Victor Goonetilleke, Sri Lanka, Dec ADXN) f/in about 1155, Koran 1200, ID in Kashmiri 1210, good level 26/11 (Peter Bunn, Victoria, ADXN) Also on 3860 at 1130-1400 (Goonetilleke, RA DX 10/12)

ITALY RAI 11800 was found to be the source of a racket on 25m, splatter all over the band, 2050-2130 circa 4/12. Gross modulation problems (Larry Magne, PA)

IRAN I just heard NBC Nightly News mention that Iran has begun jamming the BBC, 5/12. Wonder what else Iran is jamming? No other details given (Mike Agner, Burlington MA)

INDONESIA 'Tis the season for long-path reception in the afternoon (gh) The lazy way to DX Asia--once again RRI Ujung Pandang is heard at 2130, not the 50 kW 4719, but the listed 20 kW on 4753, good to 2200 fadeout, but squeezed by 4750 Bertoua, 4755 Colombia. Who says you have to get up early? (Gerry Bishop, PA, 12/12) Had RRI-Kendari on 4000, 5 kW 17/12 2248 t/in to 2310 f/out with continuous Koran poetry, Song of the Coconut Islands IS, clear RRI Indo ID by M after time pips, and into RRI nx relay, comtry, mx. Very strong, best LP here to date (Terry L. Krueger, Casselberry FL) RRI Nabire, Irian Jaya obs back on old 5975, after using 6126 for several months, noted at 1030 (Peter Bunn, Vic., R. A. Japanese DX 10/12) Cf Dec LN-6. 3374.5 hrd 16/10 at 1350 songs, 1400 news relay presumably RRI Jambi again. On 3375.5 sked 1200-1500 is a new one, RRI Medan, per tape from Jim Young with definite ID, later hrd at my QTH; replaces 3414 (Bill Sparks, Tropical DX Newsletter 15/11)

HAITI (Cf Dec LN-6) 6156 R. Citadelle, several clear IDs hrd 1127 25/11; further monitoring reveals R.Nationale pgm sometimes, but not always at 1000 or 1100, but it's mostly Citadelle now; lots of Xmas mx and ads (Jerry Berg, MA) Until I hear a Citadelle ID on 6155, I will continue to consider it R. Nationale! When a station IDs as "R. Nationale" & "4VRD" I'll believe 'em until I hear diff'rent (Stu Klein, FL, 22/11) To determine what R. Citadelle was doing I listened to their BCB freq of 1145, and they were broadcasting R. Nationale!!!--same as SW. At 0400 they changed back to R. Citadelle. I hope this clears up once and for all who is on 6156--it is R. Citadelle. Also, R. Familial is on 5640, 4 x 1410, or R. Familia, in Port-de-Paix (Richard Clark, Santo Cerro, La Vega, Dominican Rep., 23/11 & 21/11)

GERMANY EAST DIZ timesig hrd 12/10 on 4525, 2250-2300+, pips but no voice so not SWBC (Hoffman, PA)

FRANCE DXer Mike Bolitho of Toronto visited RFI 8/8 and then found himself on the air on "Paris Calling Africa" in an interview, and reading letters from Canada on their mailbag. His full story appears in December REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING (gh) RFI hrd 6/12 at 1420-1755 on 43.17 MHz, 2 x 21.585. What would be the ERP on a second harmonic--in the watts presumably (Randall B. Clark, Parkersburg WV) Actually 43160, 2 x 21580. Power very hard to compute, depending on amount of suppression, but should be very small (gh) more IN-15

FALKLAND ISLANDS 2370, unID but suspect this, 0030-0130* variable with peak at 0100, many times heard with only a weak carrier, 1/11 during audio peaks hrd a man in definite EG a-round 0053, then signal took a nose dive. Also some audio next day, with talk/instrumental mx. 6/11 carrier only, but s/off as a variant 0142*, a solid reception detail if they keep accurate logs (Bill Whitacre, MI, TDXN) Tent. 2370 0128 25/11, YL ancr in EG, reading messages, believe hrd 2370 and a MW freq ancd at 0130. Orchestral mx, 0131 s/off, 0132 carrier off. Prior to hearing this, WWV announced a geomagnetic storm in progress; soon hrd WWV, WWVH, JJJ and LOL all on 15 MHz! (Ed Kusalk, Ontario, DX Ontario)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC R. Norte, 4787, Santiago, very good with ID 0915, IA mx, 5/12; OCs on 4785 and 4790 at this hour (Jerry Berg, MA)

CZECHOSLOVAKIA Remember that anti-N-bomb card R. Prague went to its listeners? Per Stephen Shooob, staff assistant, 1171 of them were received at the White House, in FR, EG, SP (Kim Andrew Elliott, MN, Dec. REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING)

CUBA Re Young's report of a weak SP stn on 4800 before Ecuador s/on, I believe it's 8th harmonic of CMKV-600, hrd 2/12 with mx to 0930, nx, usual deep fading typical of harmonics. 0922 several talkovers and "Voz de Cuba" TC; that's a program at 0500-1000 on a net of stns, per WRTH (Jerry Berg, MA)

COSTA RICA TIFC hrd on 6035A at 1153 in SP with ID, het Siberian, //5055; new freq (Jack Jones, MS, 24/11) Years ago was on 6037; about time they left 6175 with BBC QRM, etc (gh)

COOK ISLANDS RCI all-night for UK rugby test relay from RNZ 1432 preceded by mx 7/11, 5045 (Robert Yeo, Vic., ADXN) Appears to be AN, local Fri nites (Sat morn GMT), C&W mx 11/11, man in EG, native drums & Maori singing; no ID hrd; 1335 during a noise quiet period, 3:05 TC was hrd, corresponding with GMT -10½; still going strong at 1430 with Maori talk. Bill Whitacre heard a similar pgm on another Sat; I haven't hrd it on any other mornings (Bill Sparks, TDXN Tent., rock mx and EG anmts from 1030, almost gone by 1130 25/11, corresponding with reports of being on late Sats (Jerry Berg, MA) 25/11 1118-1300 fade out. Definite ID at 1125; all kinds of mx; only ancr hrd was M with Aussie accent; NZ election results; mentioned R. Australia and R. Singapore regarding later pgms; probably off-air relay of RNZ comedy show judging from audio quality; troublesome het, probably Indonesia. Suspect now more than 500 w, perhaps a new 5 kW? Signal seemed on a par with Solomons. But as of 10/12 not heard again, maybe just due to good conditions for 500 W (Syd Osterman, Ont.)

COLOMBIA unID in Spanish between 13845 and 13850 kHz daily 1800 past 0400, in Spanish (Mark Giorgi, NY) That's Rdif. Nacional in a relay by a PTP xmtr, often on AM, some SSB (gh) IN-15

CHINA VOA Chinese lang from Philippines are no longer jammed, suddenly discontinued in October, having been in operation since 1949. This means that all VOA lang transmissions are now free from jamming interference, tho RL/RFE continue to suffer (Robert Jones, NSW, Dec ADXN) Cf IRAN (gh) NCNA says that as from 1/1/79 it will adopt the Chinese phonetic system for the romanization of names of Chinese persons and places. For example, Peking will be spelt Beijing, Mao Tse-tung will become Mao Zedong, and Hsinhua, Xinhua. Ministry of Foreign Affairs will also adopt the Chinese phonetic system on the same date (BBC MS 7/12) Shouldn't we? (gh)

CANADA RCI has a weekly audience of 9 to 10 million listeners in ESW Eu, Af, NAM, SAM, RCI Director Alan Brown told CRTS commissioners in a CBC license hearing in Ottawa. "That figure should mean something to a country which exports great quantities of nickel and pulp and wheat, but no newspapers, no magazines, very few books--very little to tell the world about its political life, aspirations, opinions or culture." (Closed Circuit, 20/11)

RCI does it again--Sunday 0200-0427 GMT 3/12, the Sunday EG pgm was broadcast, not the scheduled Sat pgm, including DX Digest, at least in the correct editions. After hearing it I would prefer the DX Digest & Mailbag on local Saturdays. Then on GMT 4/12 the Saturday pgm instead of Sun at 0100, but usual Sunday pgms at 0200-0427 (Larry M. Nebron, CA) I was listening at 0100 GMT Mon and called them up about it--otherwise likely no one at RCI or Sackville would have noticed that the Sat & Sun tapes were apparently interchanged! (gh)

QSL from CKFX 6080 Vancouver says they use a Vertical Array Antenna; for the past year or so, they had been actually running less than 10 watts, but they cleaned up the equipment so they are now actually 10 watts, accounting for recent DX receptions as far away as Chicago. They seem to really check out reports, rejecting some guesswork. They invite collect phone calls during the Dianne Giffin pgm weekdays at 0900-1300--if you can catch the number (Greg Ravenhorst, Hollandale MN, 4/12)

CAMEROON 3/11 I hrd a Cameroon stn on 4850 at 2059 past 2200, classical mx; new regional? (Steve Webster, Ont.) I don't think this is anything new (gh)

BRAZIL R. Cultura Araraquara, 10/12 1010 on 3365, poor, instrumental xylophone mx; plugs for R. Naç. Brasília, local ID for Araraquara (Charley Hoffman, PA)

BOTSWANA New freq 9590 hrd around 1400 in vernaculars (Miki Vcelar, RSA, via Andrew Blumberg, NY 25/11) Writing looked like maybe 9690=4845 x 2, but both assure me it's 9590 (gh)

KOPUTHATSWANA (Cf Dec LN-4) SABC reported 28/11 that R. Bop. would broadcast on VHF/FM 38.01 MHz as from 1500 5/12 in, AF, EG, Setswana (BBC MS 7/12)

ARGENTINA R. Splendid, B.A., obs since 24/11 on 6030 ex-5985 (BBC MS 30/11)

ANGOLA During the independence anniversary, weekend of 11/12-11, most stations were on all night--Benguela noted 0200 5041 6150; Huila 0250 3970; Luanda at 0230 on 3355 3375 4790; Bshawen, Huambo as late as 2235 on 3345 5060. Lobito moved from 4175 to 4827a, *0345 with strong signal (Vaclav Kofinek, RSA, DSWCI Dec SW News)

ALGERIA hrd on 13228 one day, presumed; and on 14335, almost certain RTVA, 0202 AR chants, talk, but sounds like wide-band FM! On 15160 I once hrd them w/AM carrier and SSB intelligence (Richard Stoller, NY) You can be sure anything other than AM is purely unintentional from Algeria, gaining a reputation as the pits, technically (gh)

ALBANIA R. Gjrokaster like a local 9/12, SIO 454 at 0535, 5057 with light opera, gypsy mx and gorgeous solo mandolin; many 'shqipter' mentions and TC at 0600 (Jay Novello, Endwell NY) more VOV LN-15

CLANDESTINE CRANNY Voice of the Voyageur appears to have resumed regular weekly broadcasts GMT Sun 0500 on 6220 (Walcott, TX)

Southern California pirate on 6420 has switched to 6115, noted 8/12 0010-0019; gone at 0054 to check; this time, classical, rock, blues; long silences and no amnt, but I believe this un-D pirate does have a microphone. When first noted 18/9, there were background noises such as a big bang when something fell to the floor and the sound of a changing turntable; lately the background noises have stopped; was SIO 545 (Ken Kashiwabara, Panorama City CA)

880a station comes back every once in a while, hd 5/11 2151 with pieces of Zeppelin mx, throwing hets at DSB hams, coming on with disguised voices. Almost cussing match with a ham, hard to tell if it's a ham--tho I'm sure they don't approve of having hets thrown at them, most DSB hams are sort of anti-establishment by nature and don't seem to care whether the guy is on or not (Richard Stoller, NY)

WRFB R. Free Bolinas, 837 kHz, pop and talk pgms several times per week about 0200-0600 MT; occasional phone-ins, requests; broadcast oriented, not DX oriented, didn't know what QSL card is when I called (Larry M. Nebron, Daly City CA, 3/12) First time heard in a long time 25/11 at 1930-1940, fair, AOR mx, no IDs, sloppy, on 838 (Bill Moriyama, San Francisco CA, IRCA DX Monitor)

WFSR Free Speech Radio in NY City, last hrd on 7/2/78; he only operates during snow storms, when the FCC is closed and can't catch him! on 1630 kHz (Don Wood, Westport CT)

WFAT Fat Radio, Free Speech Radio, NYC, phone-in format 3/12 with a few mx breaks; had one all from South Carolina; claims only late-night phone-in pgm in NYC; first hrd at 0900 GMT with very poor signal on 3260 kHz variable. Announced 1624.7 kHz, hrd varying 1620-1630 at 940. Voice of One Lebanon. Close relation of former Voice of Arab Syria. Presumably the argument this pgm presents is that the main current cause of disunity in Lebanon is the presence of the Syrian army in/and the Arab peacekeeping forces there. As this is rather hard to justify on logical grounds, the producers of the programme may be quite relieved at the chance to stop broadcasting if somebody tells them that Syria and Iraq are now supposed to be friends. W A R C 7 9 RSA is proposing total doubling of SWBC spectrum, such as 12.7-13 and 19.7-20 MHz (R. RSA DX 17/12 via Joel M. Rubin)

FCC position before WARC includes expanding the AM band to include 1615-1800 kHz (NY Times 7/12 via Rubin) 1615-1860, which could accommodate 800 or more new commercial AM stations. The FCC proposal includes recommendation that existing travelers advisory service, currently on 1605-1615 kHz, be continued. THAILAND R. Thailand reported 23/11 that P&T Dept would be establishing more radio-frequency checking stns thruout the country during fiscal 1979; only one at present is at Nonthaburi, not capable of covering the whole country; first two will be in NE in Ubon & Khon Kaen, to

enable govt to locate anti-govt clands in the NE. P&T Dept also plans to set up two similar stns in each of the other three regions of the country (BBC MS 30/11)

SRI LANKA Besides its project to construct a relay station at Kourou, near Cayenne, French Guiana, Télé Diffusion de France may be shaping up plans to build in conjunction with Deutsche Welle a relay in Sri Lanka covering Southeast Asia (Le Figaro 20/10, via Bernard de Tarlé via L'Onde) TDF being the parent body of RFI (gh) We know that newspapers and DX magazines have been publishing news about a new relay station being built at Trincommalee, Sri Lanka. We can only say that these are speculations. It is true we plan a relay station in Asia and that negotiations are being held. Maybe the wild speculations are due to the fact that DW is helping with 'know-how' to build up a home-service in Sri Lanka (G.G. Thiele, DW, via Dan Carrier, FL, via Dec SPEEDX)

NEW ZEALAND Re RNZ's new external service plans, "Initial investigations are under way costing and assessing requirements for new xmtrs and SW operations for the future, but no definite decisions have been made" (R. Geoffrey Haggett, RNZ mgr, via Andrew J. Blumberg, NY)

NEPAL Plans are underway for a possible "Adventist World Radio" broadcast over R. Nepal, according to Adrian Peterson (ADXN Dec) Have these countries no pride in their own religious traditions? (gh)

MEXICO R. México is planning to begin a regular Japanese service shortly, following special BC in Jap on the occasion of the visit of Pres. of Mexico to Japan 10/78 (Takahito Akabayashi & Tetsuo Suzuki, JADX, via Dec ADXN)

LIBERIA After seven years of SWBC from Portugal, Adventist World Radio is ready to take a giant step forward. In Sept a small fact-finding committee was sent to Liberia to study the possibility of building a SW radio station. This study indicates it is feasible to own and operate a Seventh-day Adventist SW stn. The Annual Council in Oct voted to build this stn in Liberia. A dream is coming true. The plan calls for four SW xmtrs with a combined power output of 500,000 watts. This is enough to reach into at least seven of the church's ten world divisions. We will be able to broadcast up to 96 program hours a day; right now in Portugal, we are only on the air 12½ hours a week. The operating costs will only be a small fraction of what we are now paying. But AWR faces a serious financial problem... (Harold L. Reiner, AWR, Washington DC, via John Tuchscherer, WI; dated 13/11) 1 of 250 kW, 2 of 100 kW and one of 50 kW; also MW outlet to serve local areas; work is expected to commence on AWR-Africa during 1979 (Adrian M. Peterson, Dir., AWR-Asia, via NASWA HQ)

KENYA VOK reported 19/11 that the President said VOK would be getting modern equipment to enable its reception to improve within the country and overseas (BBC MS 23/11) **INDIA** below

GUATEMALA AWR-Guatemala project was officially opened in Tegucigalpa during Aug by Pr. L. E. Tucker, one of the stns' pgm producers in the USA. The SW outlet is expected to be on the air by mid-1979. It is to be separate from local MW & FM services, an international outreach under auspices of the international AWR Board in Washington DC, which is expecting to appoint a manager soon for SW AWR-Guatemala (Adrian M. Peterson, Dir., AWR-Asia, via NASWA HQ)

GERMANY WEST Officials are afraid that because of the freq change of Bayerischer Rundfunk from 1602 to 801 kHz, it will not be heard so well abroad and so plans are in hand to considerably increase power of the SW xmtr on 6085 (Süddeutsche Zeitung, 15/11, via BBC MS 23/11)

GABON I'm sure you appreciate that a long-range undertaking like replacing nationalized RVOG takes time. There are so many factors that must be considered and implications which need to be carefully studied before decisions can be made. We hope within the next six months or so to be able to present plans to our decision makers and that we soon can give you info on the direction in which we are going to resume the RVOG radio ministry (Manfred Lundgren, LWF, Geneva, 14/11 form letter not mentioning Gabon to Gerry Bishop, PA inquiring about Gabon)

That's all we have for this month....One last tip--La Voz de Saquisili on 4900 in the morning hours around 1100 when Juventud is off the air. Things to beware of in recent reports: Any station other than Radio Loreto on 5050; carriers on 2370 that seem to go off at 0130-0142*; assuming you've heard Station B when what you've really heard is Station B or its QTH mentioned over Station A; reporting reception of a 250 watt Bolivian (or any other) station on the same frequency as a known 50 kW powerhouse--again, words are often misleading and may sound like station IDs! Finally, some tips on reporting taken from the Nov. '74 IR-A, Bob Hill Editor: REPORT SELECTIVELY-IR is supposed to be a DX roundup, not a complete band survey. Try to send only your best catches. If there are 20 items in your log and 15 of them are common, then send in only the 5 others. DON'T OVER-ABBREVIATE-If in doubt, spell it out. It's the editor's job to abbreviate. MAKE EACH ITEM COMPLETE-Last name after each item, include time, dates for unusual catches. Give details, especially for LA strns. "SP, LA mx" describes almost every stn south of the border! And two others from DR--typed reports are always appreciated, as are interesting logs with stimulating details.
