DXING ACCORDING TO NASWA-IV: Some months ago, we mentioned that NASWA member Edward C. Shaw was busy at work updating his popular DXing handbook, "DXing According to NASWA". Since it was first published in November, 1975, hundreds of copies have been ordered by NASWA members as well as many non-members. We have been told by many that it has been a tremendous help in getting a better understanding of the hobby as well as answering many of questions which would have gone unanswered otherwise.

We are pleased to announce that the project has been completed, and that we now have the fourth revision and printing of this book available for immediate distribution. We do call to the attention of those who may have one of the earlier editions that this latest edition will contain much of the original text, however it has been updated wherever necessary. Some additional material has been added such as reviews of some of the more recent marketed receivers and other equipment now available. We do not want to give the impression that this new edition completely outdates the earlier editions.

Printing costs, like everything else, have risen since the last printing. Also, twelve additional pages have been added, so we have had to increase the selling price slightly for this edition, but we still feel that it is still an exceptional value. Please note the centerfold of this issue which outlines in detail what subjects are covered and ordering instructions.

Finally, we would like to acknowledge and thank Ed Shaw for his efforts and time in not only compiling the original version, but also having the interest in keeping this fine book current.

LONG LIVE SHORTWAVE" is the title of a new recording devoted to DXing now available through NASWA HQ. This 52 minute cassette was produced and is narrated by Mitch Murray of Trans-Island Productions, Ltd., Isle of Man, British Isles. Mitch Murray is one of Great Britain's leading songwriters and record producers, as well as a life long shortwave enthusiast. This cassette covers features on receivers, antennas, propagation, QSL's, etc. How to identify satellites, RTTY, time, weather and other radio sounds are included along with a collection of over 30 station ID's and interval signals.

This cassette would be very helpful to those just getting started in the hobby or to use to introduce our hobby to those not already familiar with it.

We are arranging to import a limited number of cassettes which we can offer to the membership for \$6.95 including postage and handling to North American members. Order now, do not delay since the supply will be limited.

## TGNA

RADIO CULTURAL, RADIO STATION TGNA  
IN GUATEMALA

Radio station TGNA is one of two of Guatemala's more popular stations on the shortwave bands which broadcast from Guatemala City, the nation's capital. The other, if you have not guessed already, is "La Voz del Pueblo", the national radio station operated by the Guatemalan government. In this article, I will attempt to tell you, the readers of Shortwave Center, a good bit of information about the former of the two stations, Radio TGNA.

Radio TGNA is one of the three religiously-oriented, or if you prefer, "missionary" radio stations broadcasting in Central America on shortwave at the present time. It is also known as a cultural radio station due to its cultural and educational programming, which includes bulletins of news, programs of secular and folk music, as well as scientific programs, some of which are carried in cooperation with the country's government.

This station operates as a great many other missionary radio stations (such as HCJB in Quito, Ecuador) do, this is on a strictly non-commercial basis, depending of gifts from interested listeners outside as well as inside of Guatemala. Radio TGNA was founded in August of 1950 by Mr. Harold Van Broekhaven of the Central American Mission (now known as CAM International) located in Dallas, Texas. The station was founded for the purpose of reaching the people of Central America and the Caribbean with the Gospel through radio, and now, 29 years later, the station still fulfills this purpose.

In more recent years, the station's ministry and operation has increased, for now, Radio TGNA is on the air for 21½ hours a day. Most of the broadcast day is concentrated on the Station's local Spanish-speaking audience (for 19½ hours a day). The remainder of the broadcast day is divided between the English-speaking audiences (1½ hours a day), and also to listeners of the three principal Indian dialects of Guatemala: These are Cackchiquel, Mam, and Kekchi (30 minutes a day).

Radio TGNA can be heard in Guatemala City and the local surrounding areas on AM and FM, while their shortwave frequencies cover all of Guatemala, southern Mexico, all of the rest of Central America and the Caribbean area, as well as parts of the southern United States. More distant reception is possible depending on propagation conditions. The station broadcasts with 10 kW of power on AM and SW, while their FM outlet is on air with 0.25 kW. On the mediumwave (AM) band they broadcast as TGN on 730 kHz; as TGN-FM on 100.8 MHz stereo, and on shortwave, the station broadcasts as TGNC on 3300 kHz, 90 metres, and as TGNA on 5955 kHz in the 49 metre band. At one time the station had yet a third shortwave frequency of 9505 kHz, 31 metres, but since then its 0.5 kW transmitter, due to technical and interference problems, is now out of service and has been so for quite some time.

The station is known by the above-mentioned call letters, but it is more commonly known by the slogan, "Radio Cultural", or else by their general name, Radio TGNA. It has been on the air currently from Monday to Saturday between 1100 and 0830 GMT, and also on the air Sunday from 1200 to 0830 GMT. The serious DXer can hear any one of Radio TGNA's shortwave frequencies, even with the simplest of radio receivers and antennas, usually when it signs on at 1100 GMT. If that is too early for you, then TGNA comes in with an excellent to good signal in the early and late evenings between 0000 and the 0830 GMT signoff. Radio TGNA is on the air in English from 0300 to 0430 GMT with its two daily religious programs, "Back to the Bible" and "Through the Bible" (each on for 30 minutes) between 0300 and 0400 GMT. This is really the best time for peak North American reception of the 90 metre band outlet. On 5955 kHz, later in the evening hours, after TGNA's English program portion has concluded, there is a late-night program featuring secular music between 0430 and 0830 GMT.

The studios of Radio TGNA are located on the first floor of a two story building that was built in 1974, on the 4th Avenue, 30-09, Zone 3, which is approximately in the middle of

Guatemala City. The main floor contains two studios, an on-the-air control room, an automatic programmer room, a transmitter room, and repair shop, as well as reception and unsending areas, offices for the radio-pastor and assistant manager, and tape and record library. It has been said that this library is the most complete classical music library in Guatemala. Eighty percent of Radio TGNA's programs are recorded to assure their high quality.

The first studio is conveniently equipped to produce high quality stereo recordings with participation of large groups of people. It is built adequately for recording of video-tapes, although the station does not have the equipment for this purpose, some video-taping has been done, however, with rented equipment. The studio's array of musical instruments include a Yamaha Grand Piano, an organ, a vibra-harp, and a marimba (this being the national instrument of Guatemala). The studio also has a professional stereo Ampex recorder and two turntables; the console was designed and built at the station.

The second studio, however, is much smaller--it is monaural, used for recording small groups, containing two pianos (one small, the other large), some Ampex equipment and some home-built equipment. The on-the-air control room has a Collins console and 4 Viking stereo playbacks, along with two turntables, two cartridge, and one cassette playbacks, console, etc. The console and some of this equipment is home-built, and the control room can be moved to any of the other recording rooms for special occasions, live recordings, and remote control.

The automatic programmer room is just an extension of the above-mentioned on-the-air control room. The automatic programmer itself is also homebuilt. It has 5 stereo reel tape playbacks, including 4 Telex 230s and 1 cartridge playback. It is used 8 hours a day in different blocks, and is also capable of 4 consecutive hours of unattended operation. The transmitter room contains the home-built 250 watt FM transmitter which also serves as the link with the main transmitter site. It also has a communications system for remote control and a link system to join with the central government station (Radio Nacional de Guatemala, which was briefly mentioned at the beginning of this article) for special broadcast and also as stand-by equipment. All of these are home-built. There is also a shop, equipped for designing, building, testing, and repairing of equipment. Also there is an air-conditioning room, restrooms, and a small storage room for various uses.

The building's second floor houses TGNA's offices. There is a reception area, offices for the station manager and secretary, a counseling room, and an enormous conference room which has a capacity for 80 people. They also have an accounting office, a filing office, a literacy and program traffic office, a surveys and publications office, and a small counseling office as well as the Bible correspondence courses office. They have a mailing room, a store-room, a restroom, a small room for the night caretaker, and an equipment room. Last, but not certainly least, they have a room for the departmental director, a room currently vacant because they have no one to fill this position at the moment.

On top of the building the station has their 120 foot transmitter tower which has four circular antennas, with 8,000 watts ERP covering a radius of 30 kilometres, including Guatemala City itself and the surrounding areas. Also on the roof, there are three teletype reception antennas, some ham band antennas, and some special communications antennas.

As to its transmitter site, Radio TGNA has it located in the nearby town of San Miguel Petapa, about 20 km south of Guatemala City. This transmitter site has an area of approximately eight acres. The small one-story building at this site contains the 10 kW AM transmitter, a second 10 kW transmitter for the stations 90 metre band outlet, and a 0.5 kW transmitter for 49 metres. The building also includes some equipment for the link reception, control, and monitoring, as well as a storage room and a room for the caretaker. They have a 320 foot tall transmitter tower for AM ( $\frac{1}{4}$ -wave), and two 100 foot high towers which are used to support the 49 and 90 metre band antennas.

The station is currently in the process of getting authorization from the government to move its transmitter site from their current location at Petapa to a mountain which faces Guatemala City. But at the same time, TGNA is in an exhaustive search for land, and there are two other possibilities at this time, but these are beyond their control at the moment.

Before I finish up my article, here is some advice which all DXers should be familiar with when it comes to radio stations such as TGNA, Radio Cultural. That is, send them a reception report. They gratefully wish for reports on their signal and especially how well it is heard here in the United States. If these reports are correct in their details as to programming and the quality of reception, the station will verify with a QSL card. Send your reports in English to either one of the following station personell: Mr. Oscar Lopez,

the station manager (I would recommend him very highly), and Mr. Wayne Berger, the chief Engineer (who incidentally built the transmitters and most of the equipment used at the station). Return postage in the form of Guatemalan mint stamps or one or two IRCs would be extremely helpful, for the mail situation in Guatemala does not fare too well these days.

The Radio TGNA QSL card is a white postcard which depicts the Quetzal bird, the national bird of Guatemala, perched upon a microphone with the large letters TGNA at right along with general information on the front and back of the card. The Quetzal bird, by the way, does not survive when it is in captivity, hence it is the nation's symbol of liberty.

Before I conclude, I'd like to express my appreciation to two people without whose help this article would not be possible. Mr. Oscar Lopez helped me a great deal in regard to general information about the station and how it is run. And also Mr. Donald Rutledge (former TGNA station manager) of CAM International in Dallas, who helped me to become interested in Radio TGNA.

As for those in NASWA, if you haven't written Radio TGNA yet, then you should. It will be well worth the effort for either a report or just a simple letter. Their address is: Radio Cultrual TGNA, P. O. Box 601, Guatemala City, Guatemala, Central America. You will be glad that you wrote to them.

## Haiti

### THE CURRENT HAITIAN BROADCAST SCENE

Several years ago, most stations in Port-au-Prince dropped shortwave in favor of higher power (by Haitian standards) on mediumwave, in most cases up to 10 kW. Now the trend is towards FM. WRTH 79 does not reflect the actual FM picture in Haiti. The major Port-au-Prince stations have an FM outlet - even stereo in a couple of cases.

Although not a reference in itself, it is interesting to note that the following Port-au-Prince stations are the only ones listed today in the local Telephone Book:

R. Caraïbes	R. Nationale
R. Carillon	R. Nouveau-Monde
R. Haïti-Inter	R. Port-au-Prince
R. Lumière	R. 4VBM (R. MBC, formerly listed as 4VGM)

The following stations listed in WRTH 79 are believed to be silent:

R. Pétiion-Ville is apparently a favorite of the people at WRTH, as it surfaces from time to time in their listings; it was already silent when I first arrived in Haiti in 1961 and most likely even during my former short visits in the late 50s!

I have not yet heard about R. Soleil, a new listing.

R. Citadelle is obviously located at Cap-Haïtien and not at Port-au-Prince as in WRTH. The only other Haitian station recently heard on shortwave, i.e. R. 4VEH, also broadcasts from Cap-Haïtien in northern Haiti, not far from the Dominican border.

During a recent visit to Haiti, I went to see the people at 4VRD, R. Nationale, in their new building in downtown Port-au-Prince. As I had believed since RN was first reported on 6156 kHz, they told me that they do not operate on shortwave. Radio Citadelle does relay Radio Nationale at 1100 and apparently at 0400 GMT as well. (RN relaying has also been reported earlier than 1100.) RN is still using 1080 kHz mediumwave plus two FM outlets, one of them stereo. Shortwave is still being planned for the future. Other plans include a TV station, "Television Nationale" - which operated once last year relaying the World Soccer Championships via satellite. Regular broadcasts are yet to come. The TV studios will be housed in a nice building, already built and located at Delmas, on the Port-au-Prince to Pétiion-Ville road.

R. Nationale currently broadcasts at 1000-0500 GMT on the following frequencies:  
MW 1080 kHz with 10 kW, and FM 102 Stereo, FM 105.1 Mono (new).

No exciting developments in the shortwave area are likely in the near future. It took RN several years to replace La Voix de la Revolution Duvalieriste on mediumwave after a very long silence. Shortwave operation on 5975 and 9545 has been planned for several years as well, but even test SW broadcasts are yet to come.

## TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE REPORT

### February 26, 1979


On Monday, 26 February 1979, the last total solar eclipse of this century for North America passed over the west coast, through central Canada and up into north-central Greenland. Fortunately, Winnipeg was within the 250 km wide band of totality and Manitoba was said to have the best viewing position of the eclipse. The University of Manitoba DX-SWL Club was lucky enough to observe this spectacle.


This time based article is about the events the author and other UMDX members experienced before and during the eclipse. It deals with both shortwave and mediumwave observations, and the happenings at two locations during the eclipse.

0230 24 February 1979: "You know you guys, I'll bet we will be the only ones in this province who will get something out of the eclipse, even if it is cloudy. ." - Barry Wasylik to several UMDX members at a public display at the University of Manitoba.

0230 26 February 1979: It is eight-thirty and I'm anxious and inside where it is warm. Outside it is -20° C with gusty winds and blowing snow. Other members of UMDX are inside the "Star Truck Enterprise" near East Selkirk, Manitoba, some 25 km northeast of my location of Fort Richmond in southern Winnipeg.

I imagine they are probably very warm with tuning oil. The "Star Truk Enterprise" is a mobile DX shack which four UMDX members (Jim Roberts, Garry Sapoznikow, Dave McBride, and Barry Wasylik) put together in their spare time from an old school bus. It was specially designed for our vicious prairie winters and has seen many beverage antennas and many memorable DXpeditions. The Minnisotans will remember a cold February in '78. The weekend at Bird's Hill Provincial Park . . . -42° C and Radio Huayacocotla.

Even though tomorrow's forecast calls for a cloudy sky, everyone in this province is praying for clearness. Earlier AFRTS had a National Public Radio programme interview with some Americans here in town for the eclipse. They too are praying for a clear sky.

0500 26 February 1979: Since the eclipse starts at about 9 am off the west coast, I best not watch the "Twilight Zone" and retire for an early rise so I can get set up well in time for the eclipse.

1345 26 February 1979: I was awoken by my young sister shouting repeatedly, "The weatherman sez it's gonna be clear. . . git up!" Naturally, I awoke. The eclipse begins in two hours, totality in three. I checked out the old sun myself. No sundogs (glowing spots seen on each side of the sun caused by ice crystal refraction high in the atmosphere) so I guess it is going to be clear.

1430 26 February 1979: 8:30 weather for Winnipeg City and the Red River Valley: "Mostly clear today, Temperatures near minus twelve." Lady Luck prevails. One weather system moved off, the other died and veered off. The clouds were gone. All there is now are very thin high Cirrus clouds. Maybe the thousands who came to Manitoba from all over the world won't be disappointed.

1500 26 February 1979: After a reasonably tasty breakfast, I proceeded to set up .. my Sony ICF-5900W, clock, taperecorder, camera and 270 mm lens for pictures, 2½ inch refractor telescope, and lots of paper. Oops, almost forgot the thermometer. There, all set, now to wait.

1518 26 February 1979: I tuned to WWV on 15000 with a big signal to set my clock and

d watch. "Solar flux 170, A-index 18, Boulder K-index 4. Solar activity will be moderate unsettled . . ." Hmmm. The Corona should be nice.

20 26 February 1979: I decided to tune SW. The following were heard between 1520 and  
30: 9560 JORDAN fair 11800 SRI LANKA good 15290 SPAIN poor

36:20 26 February 1979: With half the neighborhood in my back yard, the eclipse began. Only the moon began to nibble out the sun at the one o'clock (upper right hand side) position. Weird sight. I was able to take glances at the partial phases with a pair of my 75¢ "Eclipse Visors" purchases from good old Kentucky Fried Chicken.

00 26 February 1979: I'm getting cold. Called in for some hot tea which really hit the spot. Even though totality was a good 45 minutes away, the sky was already beginning to show signs of darkening, and shadows were slowly getting longer. At this time, I tuned to WJED on 15240, Canada on 15325, and the VoA on 15195 to find these signals to have several long-delayed echoes. Tunisia on 15225 was also heard with poor modulation. Other than KGA Spokane, Washington on 1510, the Star Truck Enterprise noted nothing different. However, A is rarely heard (if ever) here at this time.

05 26 February 1979: East Selkirk (Star Truck Enterprise's location) noted weak and unidentified signals on 710, 730, 750, and 780.

07 26 February 1979: East Selkirk has 710 improving and 1540 appearing with fair signals.

10 26 February 1979: Totality has begun off the west coast. I tuned to WWV on 15000 to find WWVH in Kekaha, Hawaii mixing with WWV. Using my KFC Eclipse Visor I noticed a sun half cone. East Selkirk has weak signals on 710 and 1190.

20 26 February 1979: I tuned up to the VoA on 26040 to find it fading out for two seconds at four second intervals. They were noted earlier with normal reception. East Selkirk hears a time check and ID for WDSM in Superior, Wisconsin on 710.

28 26 February 1979: East Selkirk has KZIA in Albuquerque, New Mexico with fair signals on 1580.

30 26 February 1979: It is getting dark here. The temperature has dropped a degree or 15 minutes (see graph). Everybody here is buzzing. Soon totality will be here. I remembered Barry's comment of Saturday. By the looks of things, he's wrong. East Selkirk has KXEL in Waterloo, Iowa, on 1540.

31 26 February 1979: East Selkirk has a presumed monitoring of KWSL, Sioux City, Iowa, on 1470.

33 26 February 1979: East Selkirk notes KRNY on 1460 from Kearney, Neb., with fair signal.

35 26 February 1979: WWV has faded out leaving WWVH and JJY in Japan to pound in 5, 10, and 15 MHz. East Selkirk has a strong UNID on 1320 which mentions that the eclipse will pass 150 miles north and would "clear up" around eleven o'clock. KOZY in Grand Rapids, Minnesota is suspected to be the culprit.

40 26 February 1979: East Selkirk notes that 710 has dropped down to a fair signal, on 1470. KDKO in Littleton, Colorado, is tentative on 1510 with a very good signal. Comments from my back yard include "unreal, excellent, and Hey Mom, look, that guy got all sorts of stuff in his yard AND a telescope!"

43 26 February 1979: It is getting quite dark. The few birds which were around have suddenly become silent. A local dog is not enjoying himself. The VoA on 26040 is now coming very weakly.

46 26 February 1979: Mysterious "shadow bands" appear and dance across the pure white snow at 3000 kilometres per hour (2000 mph) and are as wide as pencils. Scientists are not sure of their cause . . . "Geez this is unbelievable. . ."

47 26 February 1979: The "diamond ring" and then the long awaited totality. "Oh this is unreal." The VoA on 26040 has faded out totally, and the clouds seem non-existent. People around here are cheering. "It's just beautiful. . . stunning." Quickly I recorded the temperature and lined up my telescope. In the seven o'clock (bottom left) position a massive solar prominence flares out its tongue-like filaments. I then proceeded to click off pictures.

"So quiet yet so booming . . . sort of a roaring silence." The Corona is sending out shimmering veins of silver light. The city's lights pop on. Venus and stars appear. A mysterious sunset appears all around the horizon, with vicious red, pink, and orange colours, like the shadow bands, unexplained. Words cannot illustrate the current happenings.

1649:16 26 February 1979: Two and a quarter minutes later, Bailey's Beads appear (sunlight flashing through irregularities on the moon's surface) then the colossal diamond ring flashes out. It's over. The shadow bands reappear and then quickly vanish as they speed northward. "Oh that was so magnificent . . ." The VoA on 26040 slowly begins to fade in. That was totality.

1654 26 February 1979: East Selkirk notes Joplin Missouri's KQYX with fair signals on 1510

1655 26 February 1979: East Selkirk notes another UNID station. This one on 1600 was heard with Mutual News, possibly Carrington, N. Dakota, KDAK. Whoever it was faded out by 1700

1658 26 February 1979: The Colorado station on 1510 has faded considerably. Was very strong at 1656, but is now very weak.

1700 26 February 1979: Things are lightening up and shadows are shrinking. Looking around the sky, I notice at least five vapour trails of research and private aircraft criss-crossing the sky. The birds have started to sing again and the city lights have been turned off:

1705 26 February 1979: Everybody has gone indoors and is watching replays on TV. I've been sitting outside for two hours and should be cold . . . but I'm not. I don't know how anybody could be cold after seeing such a sight.


1715 26 February 1979: The VoA on 26040 has pretty well returned to normal as has WWV on 5, 10, and 15 MHz. Nothing exciting is happening on SW. . . just normal reception. East Selkirk reports normal Winnipeg daytime reception on AM.

1730 26 February 1979: The sky and shadows have returned to normal.

1800 26 February 1979: Time has flown by and it's almost all over. Everyone is recollecting the day's previous events.


1803 26 February 1979: Putting on my KFC Visors for one last time, I watched the moon leave the sun. It's all over. What an experience.

And that was how the last total solar eclipse of this century for North America went. The following graph illustrates temperature changes during the eclipse.



We here at UMDX underestimated the eclipse and thought we could tune through totality, but it was impossible. An eclipse to a DXer (or anyone for that matter) can be quite an experience even if you don't tune.

## FRG-7

### NOTES ON THE FRG-7

by Syd Osterman, Toronto, Ont.

I have seen many improvements for the Frog, most involving work inside the box. The following basic ideas require none! The strength of the 25 metre band signals were much improved by using the Preselector on band C (4-11 MHz) rather than on Band D. The 11-12 MHz range can be covered at the end of the Preselector tuning for Band C. It would seem that there is a considerable peak in the alignment at the end of this band. Other units may differ in this respect, but try it anyway, since the increase in gain can be considerable.

Audio strength can be increased by plugging your headphones into the EXT. SPKR. socket at the back. The sound quality will also be sharper, due to the elimination of a resistor used with the front panel phone socket. I use the Radio Shack Duophones (stethoscope style) in this application. The plug should be changed to fit (miniature), and wired for mono use. As well as having sharp voice reproduction, these phones do not reproduce low-level hum present in the FRG-7.

Shortwave signals that overload the Frog-7 can be reduced by using the BCB antenna input for your SW antenna. A switch can be added to change the antenna input when required. Also, remember to try the DX-NORM-LOCAL switch when listening to DX close to an International powerhouse station. Often DX or LOCAL will give better results than the NORM position in this situation.

Lastly, ease of operation and reduction of operator fatigue can be achieved by placing a wedge shaped, rubber or plastic door stop under each front foot. This tilts the front panel to a convenient angle for use and, as a bonus, provides a storage space under the Frog for a log book, etc. Of course, you can use anything suitable to raise the front feet. I simply had a surplus of wedge shaped door stops.

Last month I left off with the signal in the ionosphere :

When a radio wave travels into the ionosphere the direction of the wave changes. The extent of this change is proportional to the density of the free electrons in the layer. (D, F1, F2, E are ionospheric layers). When the layer has enough of an electron density, the wave bends and eventually returns to the Earth. If not it will either be absorbed or travel out into space.



CHAD RNT still missing from 4904.5, reason uncertain; they usually put in a good signal here (Steve Webster, CMS Telegram 19/3) Per TV news, the broadcasting house in N'djamena was burned down in recent riots; so possibly no radio in Chad at the moment (Arctic Radio Club 23/2 via IRCA DX Monitor 7/4) RNT still missing from 4905.5, due to the situation in the country (Steve Webster, CMS Telegram 16/4)

CAPE VERDE All stns are nationalized, so there is no more Radio Clube here (Denis Beauregard, Texel, via IRCA DX Monitor 7/4) The only stn listed in WRTVH 79 was private, Voz de São Vicente, 3930 and 7155 (gh)

CANADA CKZN-6160 and CHNX-6130 hrd around 0930-0945 27/3, as the Colombian and HCJB were missing, respectively (Jack Jones, MS) The missing from WRTVH 79, Vancouver 6080 is certainly on the air, as heard at poor level here 13/4 at 0800-0836 (Jim Conrad, IA) (Gf Apr LN-11 CFRB engineer Paul Bigley says CFRX will remain on the air until the xtr breaks down or the building goes, whichever is first. He estimates this to be about two years. All reports are read, stamped and filed but they are short-staffed and have problems getting a good signal out to their own listeners with cheap transistor radios, to worry about reports from overseas which obviously are of no use. He complained of tapes of their signals which were difficult to pick anything identifiable out of. The reception my friend got would seem to conflict with Foxworth's report (Mike Barraclough, UK, April SWNS)

Australia DX 25/3) RNA obs on 4886.5 24/3, 25/3 1830-191. 6/4 at 1810, location?? ("RP" & "GBE", PLAY-DX, Italy) Another RNA, unID location, on 5061 31/3 2115-2135 ("GBE", Play-DX)

ALGERIA Algiers Radio reported 18/3 that local time would continue as GMT plus one until 2. 10 when GMT would be resumed (BEC MS 22/3)

## FUTURE PLANS

YUGOSLAVIA The Dir. of RY told a meeting that a decision would be made 'in the next few days' by a commission consisting of reps from all republics and provinces and federal bodies, as to 'who will be entrusted with the construction of new and more powerful xtrs for RY'. This was reported by TanJug 23/3 (BECM)

WARC 79 A regional preparatory seminar for WARC was held 12/3 in Panamá, thru 23/3. AGAN reported that small countries were demanding a fair allocation of the spectrum so as to prevent 'the big powers and the more developed nations from hoarding freqs'. Equatorial countries were demanding that their rights to satellite space in the geo-stationary orbit be respected (BEC MS 22/3)

VENEZUELA Venpres news agency reported 27/3 that the Dir. of R. Nac. had anc'd that a sing organization made up of R. Nacional, R. Continente, the cultural radio stns, and La Voz de Venezuela would be created to present the country's image, with emphasis on educational (si and information. Equipment for La Voz de Venezuela was already in Paraguaná, Falcón state. Its 1000 kW xtr will cover rural areas, SA and Caribbean. It will also reach Europe with its directional antennas. The xtr building itself and offices for the new stn have, however not yet been built (BEC MS 5/4) The 1000 kW xtr is on 880 kHz (Richard Clark, NRC DX News 2/4) Tentatively hrd 19/3, 20/3 way under the Cuban, lousy signal for that power (Chuck Huton, Decatur GA, NRC DX News 2/4)

USSR R. Moscow asks listeners to suggest later time for GB&I xmsn 1900-2000 (BEC MS 5/4)

U S A / GERMANY WEST / LIBERIA Continental Electronics says it has received an over-\$6.2 million contract from the GSA to design and manufacture eleven 250 kW xtrs for RFE/RL (Electronics News 5/3 via Bob LaRose, CA, SWNS)

SRI LANKA The fact that Deutsche Welle had received permission to build a relay stn here was first broadcast by DW in its own newscast in early 12/77, and I can recall having heard this very clearly. At that time and on many other occasions the Ceylon Observer too had a front page spread about it. The denial in 1978 by G. G. Thiele of DW about such a project is regretted. Perhaps he is not aware of the facts, or is it that DW has had second thoughts about the project? (Oliver T. Goonawardena, Sri Lanka, UADX 20/3)

MALAYSIA (EAST?) As part of a \$50 million expenditure, mainly to bring TV to East Malaysia, radio stns and studios would be built in Bandar Seri Aman, Bintulu, Kapit and Sarikei. The xtr and studio at Bandar Seri Aman would be completed next year, and Bintulu would begin later this year. A new radio xtr serving Baling and six districts in Kedah state would improve reception when completed in 1980 (BBC MS 22/3)

LIBERIA (Cf Jan LN-14) AMR Africa is to contain 6 xtrs (Adrian Peterson, CMS Telegram)

INDIA Per AIR, MinfoBC anc'd 12/3 that as part of the 12 new radio stns in the current plan, one in Rajasthan was expected to be commissioned during the next two years (BBC MS 22/3) Per AIR, MinfoBC stated 23/3 that a bill to set up autonomous organizations for AIR & TV would be introduced in the current parliamentary session (BBC MS 29/3)

GUATEMALA AMR is to begin broadcasting on SW 15/8/79, no freqs announced yet. Originally supposed to be on the air last year. The AM & FM outlets, already on the air, are known as "Union Radio" (Edwin Stickle, NY, SPEEDXGRAM Apr) 20 kW on SW (Adrian Peterson, CMS Telegram)

GABON has one of the most advanced SW complexes in the world, but no one qualified to run it. They cannot decide on what form a foreign service should take, but they do plan to be on the air shortly with at the very least domestic services (Le Monde, via Wayne Oliver, SPEEDX Apr) It's silent due to the lack of electrical power and technical staff (Andreas ---'s pen friend SCDX 17/4)

ECUADOR It is expected that during late J79 and S79 testing will take place with a 500 kW unit (Roger Stubbe, HCJB 6/4) The antenna will be over 400 feet tall, and contain 18 miles of wire. It is hoped the new ant will improve reception especially in Ecu. Total cost of this project for a steerable antenna at Pifo, is expected to be around \$50,000 US. (Church Around the World, Mar., via Norman Grosvenor, SPEEDX)

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC In an exclusive taped interview with SWNS Correspondent Robert Rowe, Rudy Espinal claims there is a good possibility that R. Clarin will be back on SW soon. The new pga will be partly financed by the govt and partly by 'another organization' which he doesn't name. This is certainly surprising as the new Dominican govt will soon have an int'l service on its own RTVD. Espinal identifies a key figure in the new R. Clarin operation as Franklin Belanco. Some of what Espinal says, probably relates to the fact that Balaguer's Reformist Party, the forced to surrender the presidency, retained control of the D.R.'s powerful Senate (April SWNS)

BRAZIL Radiobrás plans a multi-lingual service, including Japanese & French (SCDX 27/3) more, LN-13

BANGLADESH R. Bangladesh reported 14/4 that MinfoBC stated that seven 'fully-fledged' regional radio stns will be set up at Barasil, Bogra, Comilla, Munsingh, Ranganati, Tangail and Thakurgaon (BBC MS 22/3) RB reported that as a result of a memorandum signed in Dacca 6/4, Bangladesh is to receive a Australian\$210,000 grant for equipping and running a RB studio complex in Sylhet (BBC MS 12/4)

CLANDESTINE CRANNY Radio Liberation As their QSL Agent, it is my sad duty to announce that on 0500 8/4, R. Liberation was the last one heard, and the last chance to report on this 'hobby pirate' stn (Stu Klein, FL, who is convinced they were in putrid Louisiana, tho I am not -gh)

"WJAT" New York was busted 15/4 by FCC agent Jack Shadinsky. The operators were the same as those of "WCPR", Perry Calavari ("Harris") and Hal Hayes. "WISI" on FM, operated by Al Brady, was also caught (Harry Helms, Dallas TX)

"KDOR", 830, Hollywood CA was shut down by the FCC 18/2 after Dick Dorwart staged a marathon broadcast in hopes of raising support. Dorwart had kept KDOR on the air since 18/4/78, running the show from his own garage, most nights between 6 p.m. and midnight. Three times the FCC visited and asked him to stop; three times he stopped, only to go back on the air again. Per Jeff Young, FCC Washington, the kid-gloves treatment had very much to do with the fact that the 31-year old Dorwart is severely handicapped by osteogenesis imperfecta, "brittle bones", impairing normal growth and keeping him in a wheelchair most of his life. "We handled him very gently, hoping he would lose interest. In nine out of 10 cases, illegal stns are run by teen-agers who do lose interest after a while. But Dick is serious. He's applied for a license." If he still goes back on the air, "we'll be forced to issue a cease-and-desist order. If he violates that, he risks a \$10,000 fine and a year in jail." Dorwart says he will comply. "I've never meant to bug the FCC. They've treated me fairly. I stayed on because I felt I had something to say. This signal wasn't interfering with anybody and I al-

ways played things in good taste. I wasn't acting out any fantasies. I wanted to make K-DOR real." With a homemade xmr pumping out 50 watts, he claimed listeners as far away as Sunland, Tujunga, Whittier and Pomona. Loud and clear in Hollywood, KDOR had developed a small but avid cult following, some for the novelty, some for the refreshing amateurism. Engineer Don Saunders, who went on the air as "Connie Francis", dispensed some of the worst one-liners this side of vaudeville. Dorwart joked that any FCC penalties could hardly be worse than 'breaking 195 bones in my body', the current count. He has stainless steel pins inserted for support and sets some of the breaks himself in plastic casts. Dorwart estimates the value of his radio equipment around \$10,000. He says he has been in radio for about 15 years, mostly cutting PSAs for the American Cancer Society, March of Dimes, and others. The KDOR bulletin board has plaques, certificates and pictures of Johnny Carson, Jack Lemmon, Kay Lenz and others with whom he has worked. "I was cutting a public service spot with Ralph Bellamy during one of the FCC inspections," Dorwart said, smiling. "I didn't think they were quite ready for that." The format was no format at all. Now thru proper channels "I have my application on file and I don't think it's a million-to-one shot," he said. "I'll be back...." (James Brown, L.A. Times 11/3, via Mittman & Pejza, IRCA DX Monitor 7/4)

"WCBX" 1614v kHz first noted all the way down here 6/4 0335-0402\*, 7/4 0500, 8/4 -0536\* with professional format of top-40 singles, DJ giving NY area wx, TGS, plenty of IDs, and address something like "P.O. "WVOT" Voice of Togetherness, 28640, hrd 30/3 at 0145, half religion, half contemporary mx. "from somewhere in the Midwest"; offered a "Big QSL card" (Dick Swanson, IA, 9/4) WVOT sent me an offset full-data QSL. Unfortunately, I not only failed to hear the verified BC, but have never heard of the operation. Programming is 'for world peace with God's help' (Terry L. Krueger, FL, 11/4)

Voice of Venus called me and said they would be on 7480 USB at 0145 GMT Tue. Hrd on LSB but facsimile on also. I don't spend any time on this kid stuff. I don't know where they got my name from. Said they were not in Minneapolis MN. So much for that (Bob Zilmer, Milwaukee WI) 170-watt SSB experiment by 2 Indiana high-school students, \*0230v-0640v\* weekends on 7412v-7460-7490 (John Campbell, DSWCI SW News) (cf Apr LN-15) Darren Leno is no longer affiliated with VOV and is not happy about all the mail he's getting. VOV can be reached instead thru Free Radio Campaign USA, R.D. #2, Box 542, Wescosville Pa. 18106 (gh) more LN-13

"Fun Radio", 6420 in Santa Monica. This bootlegger is back in force now, quite blatant. All mx format. Southern CA DXers are very close-mouthed about him but there are a few finks in any group. An individual known to me has driven by the place while the stn is on the air. There is more than one person involved. Pirate mania aplenty nowadays! (Chuck Boehnke, Los Gatos CA, Apr NNRG) The "KDHFR" or "KVHF" of previous issue, presumably (gh)

R. Viking was raided and new xtrs were built to replace old ones. Power upped to 3 kW in the beginning of 1979. Sked every 2nd Sun on 6240/6250 per letter from John Svenson of RV (Dave Twiggs, Bristol CT, 10/3) Now on the air most Sundays 0800-1100, changed because of chaotic summer-time situation across Europe (Poul Foged, Apr DSWCI SW News)

R. Zodiac International/Radio 49 These two stns have merged with the new name R. Zodiac 49, sked 2nd & 4th Sundays 1000-1400 (John Dawson, RZ, via Dave Twiggs, CT, 10/3)

Radio Enoch, right-wing extremist pirate is the first to broadcast out-and-out political propaganda in the UK, Suns from 1000 around 7.35 MHz. Two men with faint West Midlands accents present R. Enoch's pgs--news, commentary, features, reading letters and some music. Started just before Xmas, now once a month for one hour, to limit time for detexion of site. Some 6 to 8 individuals probably involved, but with 150 or so 'in the know'. Run by People Against Marxism, populist right-wing group, firmly denying links with the National Front or the South Africans. PAM policy is against immigration, for South Africa & Rhodesia; for free enterprise, against govt interference; opposed to the EEC on grounds of loss of sovereignty; Defence should be built up to meet Communist threat. Trade unions are OK, but now have been infiltrated by revolutionaries. The two presenters take turns making comments, with background music support from "Land of Hope & Glory" Nothing much has been done about R. Enoch, and other pirates are extremely unhappy about its existence (Lennie Michaels, Time Out 23-29/3, via Andy Robins, MI) The thrill of my trip to England was hearing R. Enoch on 7345V LSB, poor sig, from 1010 with talk about National Front, Botswana, immigration; drifted from 7350 at time in to 2340 at 1030\*. It's only a matter of time before they are taken off the air thanks to their very political attitude (Bill Whitacre, UK, 25/3)

Other European Hobby Pirates, active midday Sundays on SW: 6230, R. Solent City, also testing on 6235. 6240 R. Condor (Ireland) relaying "Big D". 6250 R. Viking super sigs w/DX pgm 0945. 6250 R. Democratic National Front Radio of Yemen (Cf Apr LN-14) BEC MS says this has operated since early March, yet I had noted it back in 11/78 and IDed it as Aden. Probably uses Aden's xmtr 6005, and ID is very similar (Peter Bunn, ADXN April)

Anti-South African program in EG is now aired daily from Madagascar at 1800-1900 on 6135 (Richard Ginbey, RSA, SGDX 17/4) "Mobilization Against Apartheid" will be carried in R. Budapest EG pgms 30/5 2100, 31/5 0200, 0300, 1030, 1200, 1430 (Budapest International)

Zimbabwe Will Be Free pgm via R. Moscow in the 1600-1630 Shona xmsn is moved from Mon to Sun, but still repeated on Thurs, per R. Moscow anmts 19/3 and 20/3 (BEC MS 29/3)

Kampuchea from people living in the Mekong Delta of Vietnam, have their own radio stn, per R. Democratic Kampuchea 19/12. They have risen against the tyrants of the Le Duan/Phan Van Dong clique and organized racial defence movement to fight the clique (Jiji Bangkok 19/2 via Dec SEMs Monthly via NFDX 2/4)

Voice of Democratic Kampuchea an'd that from 26/3 a new sked would be in effect: 2330-0030 11685 9470. 0400-0500 17705 11725. 0900-1000 15600 11980. 1200-1300 11990 11600. Obs 26/3 confirms this sked (BEC MS 29/3) On 1/4 this sked an'd: 2330-0030 9470 11655. 0400-0500 11725 11705 (sic, should be 17705). 0900-1000 11990 15600. 1200-1300 11600 11990. 11655 is actually on 11660 and 17705 actually on 17703. Former 1500 xmsn untraced on 31/3. Not enough time to check all fqs (Isao Ugusa, 1/4, NFDX 2/4)

Night-One (Cf Apr LN-14) in its 9/3 xmsn denounced China sending troops to Laos for commencing 2nd battle against Vietnam. IN MY OPINION

(Diane S. Lévesque, Carbondale IL) I really got a good chuckle out of Feb. "In My Opinion". I thought the issue of 'elitists vs. commoners' was closed a long time ago--yet you not only head the IMO with a comment on that subject but you follow it with two opinions which also happen to be prime specimens of typical DX bickery. Beautiful. The skeleton sneaks once again out of the closet, shaking a defiant fist at its tombstone.

I had an unusual opportunity to study first-hand an elitist group last summer, and I realized right there and then that it required anthropological analysis to see that your run-of-the-mill elitist actually is a real person, for one must analyze him in the midst of his environment to really understand him. For one thing, the elitist will argue with his fellow elitist because he is a perfectionist among perfectionists, and he is showing that he likes his fellow perfectionists when he does so--not, as we would suppose, to be unpleasant or to be one-up-on-you. If you find yourself being doubted argued (sic) with by an elitist, don't feel affronted by his nerve; feel flattered that he actually takes you seriously enough to show you that he likes you in his native manner. It is only when you feel insulted enough to tell him to take a flying leap that you will disappoint his innocent soul because all along he would have been under the impression that this was a new-found friendship because he thought that you had similar integrity and expertise to argue back, even on simple subjects as what the letters of a receiver's model number could possibly stand for--or flying transmitters.

An elitist is actually no different than you or I--he just belongs to a different DX culture, that's all. You will indeed find him contributing to more public clubs than the one he regards as his number one concern, and what bothers you and me most about him is that we don't know, without personality analysis, just who is the elitist among us, and we shall never know what it is between his ears that he's not telling us. These characteristics lead us otherwise peaceable hobbyists to go on witch hunts--which adds to the reasons an elitist will never admit to his nationality outside his tribe.

So you see, James Morck, NASWA has always stuck with the motto "Unity & Friendship"---see what a 'melting pot' it has become?





Thank you for your Reception Report dated June 5th on 15 megacycle transmission, the details of which I confirm.

I am sorry that I am unable to help you in tracing your report to Radio Seac as that organisation ceased to operate on April 1st and the transmitters over which the Radio Seac programme was broadcast are now being used to carry transmissions by the BBC. I enclose a copy of our basic schedule which may be of assistance to you. As you will see, we broadcast on two frequencies, one in the 15 megacycle band directed to North China and Japan and the other in the 21 megacycle band directed to Malay and the N.E.I. The former transmission is on a power of 100 kilowatts and the latter on a power of 7 1/2 kilowatts.



Thank you for your recent letter reporting reception of the Australian overseas shortwave service. The details of your reports conform with our logs, and verifications are enclosed.

Listener's reports and observations are welcomed by the programme and technical staff of "Radio Australia". Such reports assist in maintaining a high standard of overseas programme-reception. We hope you will continue to tune to our broadcasts and favour us with details of your observations from time to time.

The National Broadcasting Service at Wellington, New Zealand, plans to commence a shortwave service for the Pacific area some time this year. Frequencies have been allocated in the 49, 31, 25, 19, 16, and 11 metre bands, and two new ten kilowatt transmitters installed in the Wellington transmitting site. Experimental broadcasts have been carried out on frequencies in the 25 and 31 metre bands, on beams directed to Australia. The actual date when regular broadcasts will be made is as yet unknown.

The enclosed schedule covering our overseas shortwave service will serve as a guide to you when tuning to programmes from "Radio Australia".
