

HQ-180

THE HAMMARLUND HQ-180 RECEIVER, WITH DIGITAL READOUT

Recently, in anticipation of purchasing a Hammarlund HQ-180 receiver, I was surprised to find that FRENCH issues back to 1970 yielded practically nothing at all on this classic receiver. Well known to DXers in the 50's and 60's, it is probably relatively unknown to newer hobbyists. This article reviews the receiver's operation and comments on the addition of digital readout to it. The HQ-180 is no longer manufactured and Hammarlund is out of business, but the receiver is available on the used receiver market, usually in the \$300-400 range, depending on condition.

The HQ-180

The 180 series is a product of the pre-transistor era. It has 18 tubes (17 in the 180 and weighs 45 pounds. The 6" x 9" 8-watt speaker is housed in a separate cabinet. The receiver is of heavy duty steel construction throughout. If you are looking for portable operation, the 180 is definitely not for you.

There are two main models of the 180 series: The HQ-180, which was the first design of the series, and the HQ-180A, a later model. The 180A differs from the 180 in that initial warm-up drift is reduced, two rear panel accessory sockets are provided, the BFO switch has three positions rather than 2, a 500-ohm output is provided in addition to a 3.2 ohm output and operation is somewhat cooler. Most versions of the 180 or 180A are equipped with a Telechron clock timer (in which case a "C" is added to the model designation, i.e. HQ-180AC which can be set to switch the receiver on automatically at a chosen time. Some of the 180A's feature an 11-position fixed frequency crystal oscillator assembly which is factory installed in lieu of and in the panel space provided for the clock timer. This is the HQ-180AX. The crystal oscillator permits the operator to plug in 11 crystals of his choice and dial them with a rotary switch. The receiver can be zeroed into the channel frequency by manipulating the 8:1 Vernier Tuning control on the front panel, thus correcting for slight frequency discrepancies caused by crystal tolerances. Generally speaking, the HQ-180AX is somewhat less readily available than the other models.

Coverage and tuning. The receiver covers .54 to 30.0 MHz in 6 bands: .54-1.05, 1.05-2.05, 2.05-4.0, 4.0-7.85, 7.85-15.35, and 15.35-30.0 MHz; and is double conversion to 7.85 and triple conversion above. Tuning is of the traditional design, utilizing a main tuning dial for general tuning and a "bandspread" dial to spread out the band for finer tuning. The bandspread dial is calibrated in 5 kHz segments for the 80, 40, 20, 15, and 10 meter amateur bands, and also contains a 0-100 logging scale. In addition, a separate Vernier Tuning control permits extra fine tuning + 3 kHz of the center of the pass band. Tuning has a very solid feel to it on a 180. I have found drift on my HQ-180AC to be virtually undetectable. This is because the separate filament transformer in the 180A series provides 24 hour operation of the heaters of the high frequency oscillator and first converter as long as the receiver is plugged in (even if it is turned off).

Operation. The receiver is switched on by the RF Gain control. Volume is controlled by the AF Gain control. According to the manual, the HQ-180A features an Auto-Response system which automatically adjusts the audio passband to best meet receiving conditions and is intended to produce crisper, easier to understand sound on weaker signals and broader, better fidelity on stronger signals. Audio quality is quite good, and the receiver can produce extremely high gain. The continuously variable Antenna Trimmer control compensates for the loading effect of various types of antennas at different frequencies.

A 3-position switch permits selection of "receive," "calibrate" (a 100 kHz crystal calibrator is included) or "send" (for use with a ham transmitter; useful as a "standby"

position). The 180A has a 3-position mode switch: "AM," "SSB," and "CW." In "SSB" the BFO is on and fixed. In "CW" the BFO is switched on, but is then adjustable + 2 kHz by a separate BFO pitch control. (On the 180 the "SSB" fixed BFO position is eliminated.)

Sensitivity and selectivity. According to specifications, the 180A provides a 10 dB signal to noise ratio or better at 1.5 uV on AM (0.5 uV on CW), depending on bandwidth. It is clear that a properly aligned 180 has sufficient sensitivity for the most demanding DXing.

The receiver has very good selectivity. First, the sideband switch permits selection of LSB, USB, or DSB. Since this switch is separate from the BFO control, the LSB or USB positions, as well as the DSB position, can be used in the AM mode. This is often helpful in reducing QRM on either side of the signal. Second, the Selectivity switch offers .5, 1, 2, or 3 kHz selectivity in the USB or LSB positions, and 1, 2, 4, or 6 kHz selectivity in the DSB position. Skirts are relatively steep, providing for good station separation capability. Third, a Slot Frequency, 8:1 vernier tuning control provides a sharp, adjustable pilot, or "hole" in the selectivity curve. It is normally left outside the passband in the .5 kHz position, and is brought in for the purpose of reducing hets, etc.

Other features. There is a 4 position AVC switch: "off," "slow," "medium," and "fast." There is also a very useful noise limiter which is adjustable when switched on. Unlike some noise limiters, this one really works. The S-meter is large, easily read, and calibrated to 10 dB over S-9. (A 50 uV signal reads S-9.) A dial scale reset control permits minor adjustment of the hairline on the bandspread dial face.

The Radio West DD-2S Digital Frequency Display

Radio West (3417 Purer Rd., Escondido, CA 92025) markets a variety of different models of the "KRS" Digital Frequency Display to match virtually any shortwave receiver. The DD-2S is designed for the HQ-180, and sells for \$180 (summer sale price was \$160). It arrived safely via UPS about a month after I placed my order.

The display is housed in a gray metal cabinet, 6" w x 6½" d x 2" h. Connection to the receiver requires a minor receiver modification. The receiver must be removed from its cabinet (accomplished by removing 4 screws), a ¼" hole drilled in the read panel and a phono jack (supplied with the DD-2S) installed. Then a shielded cable and one capacitor (both also supplied) must be wired between the jack and the high frequency oscillator tube socket. This requires only four solder connections and can be done in a few minutes without difficulty. The display is powered by a plug-in AC power supply (supplied) that converts 117 VAC to 12 VDC, and is connected to the new receiver jack by a cable (also supplied). Actually, installation is straightforward and adequately explained, with diagrams, in the DD-2S instructions. Once connected, one or more receiver coils might require very minor adjustment, but this is not complicated and is also covered in the instructions. No instruments are necessary.

The display has two switches. One is on-off. The other is a two-position switch, one position being for the .54-7.85 MHz bands, the other being for the 7.85-30.0 MHz bands. The frequency is shown to the nearest kHz, i.e. "XX.XXX," in red LED's similar to those in an RF-2800.

The display has two minor faults. One is that the last digit bobbles a bit at times. Slight tuning will usually hold it steady, however. The other is that the display generates a slight amount of radio frequency interference on the .54-7.85 MHz bands. This RFI is lightly audible when these bands are "out," i.e. during daylight when there is little other than local activity. This means that reception is very slightly noisier than usual if the display is left on while using the receiver under those conditions. This problem can be avoided by turning off the display once the frequency in question has been located or identified. Once the bands start "coming in," however, the RFI becomes completely inaudible and the display can be left on as a matter of course.

As a practical matter, with the display added, one tends to ignore the markings on the main tuning and bandspread dials except to set the main tuning dial to the general area of the desired frequency. Tuning is then done with the bandspread dial, watching the display read out the frequencies. Anyone who is used to the HQ-180 will find the simplicity of digital tuning on a 180 to be quite a novelty.

Conclusion

In my opinion the HQ-180 is still one of the best DXing machines available, mainly due to the flexibility inherent in its many controls. When you are sitting in front of one of these "boat anchors," as they are now known, you know you are using a piece of professional

radio equipment that was designed with the practical needs of the operator in mind. In place of some of the questionable gimmicks of the new generation of mass market shortwave sets, one gets sharp selectivity, very fine tuning, a solid feel to the tuning generally, and an overall high quality approach to shortwave reception. (Even the manual, with its detailed instructions, charts, circuit descriptions, etc., is written for someone who really wants to know everything about his receiver--a far cry from the sketchy instructions that accompany some of the newer receivers.) Adding digital readout--though relatively expensive using the DD-25 unit--makes this an equipment combination worthy of the listener who takes his DX seriously.

Mizuho sx-59

USER REVIEW OF MIZUHO SX-59 PREAMPLIFIER/PRESELECTOR

Several months ago there was an article in Shortwave Center dealing with the Mizuho SX-59 antenna preselector/preamplifier. It was, however, more of a description than a user review. I would like to direct my comments to the impressions I have gained over approximately six weeks of usage with my Allied SX-190 receiver. For a more thorough description of the SX-59, I refer the user to the previous article.

The SX-59 is available from Gilfer Shortwave, Box 239, Park Ridge, NJ 07656, for \$87.00. While this sum probably won't bankrupt most potential buyers, it certainly is enough to warrant considering whether the unit is really worth that much. In my opinion, it is worth it for most potential users. Gilfer though cautions that the unit will affect different receivers in different ways and that it will be least attractive with the better quality double and tripple conversion receivers and on the main shortwave bands of 41, 49, 31, and 25 metres. They suggest that the unit will be most effective on less sophisticated receivers and above 15 MHz and below 5 MHz. My observations tend to support these premises. I have my unit hooked up to an Allied SX-190 receiver, which is generally considered to be an excellent and very sensitive receiver. I have found that the SX-59 made at least some difference all across the bands. It certainly made the biggest difference for me on 16 and 13 metres. On those bands, it made stations audible that were completely unreadable for me without the SX-59. I would certainly think that most users will hear stations with the SX-59 that they cannot hear without using it. This will probably strike you as being very dramatic as it indeed is. However, you should still understand that there will still be stations you won't be able to pick up even with the SX-59. Radio Andorra and Ulan Bator may still continue to elude your best DX efforts. Also, I would caution the reader that it is my firm belief that the biggest thing you can do to improve your reception is to use the best possible antenna that your individual circumstances will permit. The SX-59 is not a substitute for a poor antenna, although it will to some extent alleviate the deficiencies of such an antenna.

The most beneficial aspect of the unit I think is what it does to marginal reception. The station you can hear, but not well enough to write a reception report on or really enjoy listening to the program content. Quite often it will pull the station out of the static and atmospheric noise and make it much more readable. Here too I should caution the reader that what I have just described will not always happen under all circumstances. Sometimes it will amplify the noise just as much as the signal and merely give you a more distorted mess than you started with. Here the RF control on the unit will sometimes make a difference. Also, generally speaking, the unit makes no difference in selectivity. So if you have two adjacent stations interfering with each other or two stations on the same channel, the SX-59 will not solve your problem. It will merely amplify both signals equally.

Now we come to the bottom line as they say. From my standpoint, the improvement of marginal reception justifies the cost of the unit. However, some of you may crave more specifics. For instance, how many more countries will this unit let me hear, you may ask. Like Gilfer said, as I mentioned earlier, a lot depends. I am a little reluctant to be too specific, to promise too much, but since you have read this far, I will go out on the limb just a bit. For me, using a very good receiver and an equally good antenna to start with, I estimate that it has made a 5 to 10 percent difference. Thus, if you've logged 50 countries, it might mean an extra three to five countries beyond what you might get without using the unit. If you have logged 100 countries, the difference might be 5 to 10 countries, and so on. Again, I caution you concerning these figures. They will vary considerably from individual circumstance to circumstance. However, I do think they are reasonable and fairly conservative and I would expect most users to do as well, although some might not and a few will probably do even better. In my judgement the Mizuho SX-59 antenna preamplifier is a valuable tool for the serious DXer and worth its price.

METEOROLOGICAL DX: CLEAR QUESTIONS, CLOUDY ANSWERS

While articles carry on and ramble on about WHEN to tune your hot-shot DX, I find myself wondering why weather is rarely mentioned. Sure, I can expect the South Pacific at 1100-1200, Brazil at 0000 and 0900, Africa at 0300-0400, and dinner at 0130, but will this hold every day, rain or shine? Or are there chance combinations in the sky that make each day a baffling and aggravating search for the sudden "tunnel" to Andorra, Cook Islands, Antarctica? Or is it better to rely solely on superstition and whimsical notions? I asked myself this question, and found that being superstitious and whimsical was by far the most successful alternative.

For one thing, summer DXing has its moments, but the usual high level of horse hooves (hoofs, too) and buzz-saw static convinced me that most of my sought-after stations would be trampled, then drowned by machinery by the time I could pull them out. That rather put me off, so I waited for winter, when the noise level would be lower, and the idea of sitting indoors would be made more pleasant.

When winter rolled around, I began tuning the SWBC bands every day, rain or shine, cool and warm, to try and find some mystic formula to set my listening hours by. I consulted a ham buddy in El Paso, and he scoffed at my attempts to relate weather to DXing, saying that there was no direct and consistent correlation between the two, and that I'd be better off putting a longwire antenna on a kite, and flying it. I continued, in spite of this sage advice, and came up with the following observations that were both consistent and direct:

FIRST: That DX on a sunny, warm day is terrible, with the bands dominated by the "Super Stations" and a higher static level. Lower frequencies exist only locally.

SECOND: That DX on clear, warm nights is likewise terrible.

THIRD: That DX on clear, cool nights is better, with a lower static level, but still no hot tamale. Super Stations still rule.

FOURTH: That DX during cloudy weather caused by an advancing cold front is more tolerable in every way. Lower frequencies come alive, super stations are diminished in impact, and static level, in the absence of storms, is comfortably low. This applies to both day and night DXing.

FIFTH: That DX during cloudy weather caused by an advancing warm front is superb. The advantages are the same as observation number four, except that this time the comfortably low static level is heightened by odd, exotic stations fading, bobbing, fluttering, and just staying still for you to catch them. 100 of my 106 countries logged have been logged during this weather situation, so I'll stick with what works.

Thunderstorms are a tossup, because oftentimes viably exotic DX is overcome by the machine-gun fire of static blitzes; and besides, my ears and head often feel like they have been pelted with marbles after a session of this kind. If you like pain, this suggestion may work.

Or again, none of these will work. I can't ask you to trust the word of one who flips a quarter to decide which item on the menu he will order; who won't drive his car unless there is a bowling ball in the back seat; who only shops for groceries (when he has to) after 2 a.m. I can only suggest that these observations attempt to answer questions that are inevitably asked, whether or not they have any right to be asked.

Book Review

MARCONI AND WIRELESS by R. N. Vyvyan

In August 1978, while on a motorcycle tour of Nova Scotia, I made it a point to visit the site of Marconi's wireless station at Glace Bay. Other than some concrete foundations and a memorial plaque, nothing remains, but the lack of information stimulated my interest. As a result I've come across an excellent book written by a man who was chief engineer at Glace Bay for six years. Originally written in 1933, it was reprinted in 1974.

Within its 250 pages you are taken through the development of transatlantic wireless and are told of the state of the art of radio in such areas as military use, direction finding, rescue at sea, broadcasting, and there's even a chapter called "Wireless as a Career." It's all written in laymans language so the reading is not a technical chore but quite entertaining. Several photos of equipment and stations are included along with simple schematics of early receivers and transmitters (boy, are they simple!).

The book is filled with fascinating tidbits. It turns out they had no idea what frequency they were using in the first transatlantic attempts (with spark transmitters it's not too critical!) and antennas were cut and try. No one knew about beams or directivity. Transmitters were basically keyed 50 kW alternators. Later, tuning forks were used as a frequency reference multiplied up for RF. All this only eighty years ago or less.

In a chapter called "Broadcasting-Present Day Problems" (1933 remember), the author complains of the congestion on shortwave caused by the increasing number of high power 50 kW stations and suggests SSB as a possible solution. He mentions using a central receiving site and distributing radio programs by wire, just like cable TV today.

It's quite a book. You can get it for \$18 from Pergamon Press, Maxwell House, Fairview Park, Elmsford, NY 10523. You will have to wait a few weeks after ordering since it comes from England.

Just as a closing note, let me recommend visiting the Marconi Site at South Wellfleet on Cape Cod, if you get the chance. Some foundations are left and there is an excellent model of the station as it looked in its prime. Looking out over the Atlantic you can still feel a little of the excitement they must have felt when contact was made.

SW Situation

SHORTWAVE-BOOM OR THUD?

I've heard that shortwave in the U.S. is booming, but you could fool me. If there are a number of fancy new receivers out, the only place I have seen them so far is in slick ads. Even a tour of downtown Boston produced no new radio I haven't seen in the last five years.

And, quite frankly, if I wanted to become a SWL/DXer today, I could not as the guides that led me into it no longer exist.

To explain: Back some thirty odd years ago, when I was a kid, my father got (and still has) a powerful RCA "Radiola" table AM radio. It has an internal aerial consisting of a flat coil of green floss covered wire (remember those?) and an external jack. Just with this aerial, it was very good. But we hooked it to the outside aerial, relic of the old cathedral radio, a 200 or so foot wire from the roof peak to a distant tree. Reception was fantastic. Distant Chicago sounded like nearby Boston. At this same time, I discovered at the local news store a small paper back book called White's "Radio Log." It listed every known station in North America. A section at the back had the world's shortwave stations, but we didn't have that type radio so I ignored it. With this book, I spent many happy days logging stations all over the eastern U.S. and Canada. The only frustration was a massive solar storm one summer in the late 1940s which blacked out all radio reception.

My enthusiasm waned somewhat by the mid-1950s. Many of my favorite radio programs had moved over to the new medium, television. Also, I couldn't seem to find any up to date White's Radio Logs. In this time, I had an experience with shortwave that turned me off it for years. My brother bought a pocket AM/SW radio, quite expensive at it was an early transistor. Its SW covered from 3 to 12 MHz and it used a screw-in telescoping whip antenna. We spent a week trying to get something on SW but all there was was a "bagpipe" channel marker around the big "10" on its dial. Thereafter, my brother used it on its AM section until it died and he has never been interested in SW since.

By the 1960's, I was into FM as AM had gone to pot. But I was still DXing of sorts and trying to find any kind of radio station listing. Once, I got a very expensive one covering U.S. AM/FM/TV stations which is sold to their engineers. Mostly, I had to wait for the stations to identify themselves on the hour or half hour.

The years went by and it was now the spring of 1973. Radio Shack stores were appearing in the suburbs and I went to a local one and bought an "Astronaut 6" multi-band. Primarily it was for its excellent tonal quality, but also it was the VHF-Hi PSB I am also interested in. I barely noticed that it also has SW. A few trips later to this store and I noticed a stack of "Elementary Electronics" magazines on the counter. Out of curiosity, I bought one to thumb through that rainy evening. Among its articles was one by Don Jensen and another on the World's international shortwave broadcasters' DX programs. Both features told when and where to tune on the SW band. The next morning, just for the heck of it, I turned to the SW band and tuned halfway between the 9 and 10 on the dial as one article had suggested. Immediately, Radio Australia boomed out of the speaker. A few hours later and a slight twist on the knob, and some man was stating: "This is the Voice of the Andes." I was hooked on shortwave from that moment on.

It was months before I tuned any other section of the SW band - I was finding too many stations on what I later learned was 31 metres. One station intrigued me for several months. Late every afternoon, after work, I would tune to one which had an unusual slow Arabic music. Sometimes it sounded Latin Americanish. And the man spoke in some weird language and mentioned "Radyoso" and once in a while, "Ankara." But the station always faded out near supper time. I eagerly awaited each new "Elementary Electronics" as it appeared on the Radio Shack counter and soon had a listing of the SW broadcasters and the useage of the IRC. On a chance, I wrote to Turkey and asked them if this was their station. A few weeks later, the answer came in a colorful Voice of Turkey QSL card. Finally, I was able to get their English language broadcast.

By now I was furiously collecting all I could on SW. Some books were helpful, others were not, and some were too technical. Of all the books I bought or found at the local library, Radio Shack's "Introduction to Short Wave" proved to be the most helpful. It not only explained SW in a simple fashion, but told where to tune and at what times of day. I also got their disappointing "Short Wave Listener's Guide" of SW frequencies. It was already several years old and only a handful of stations were accurately listed.

The only problem I had with the "Astro 6" is that like most radios of today, the numbers are scattered over its plastic face and it has no logging scale. This may be OK for AM and FM but it is hell to find a certain SW station. From succeeding issues of "Elementary Electronics" and its ads, I got my first World Radio and TV Handbook in 1974, my Barlow Wadley XCR-30 with its excellent readout in the fall of 1975, and then finally joined NASWA and SPEEDX. Then I finally found White's "Radio Log," now published by "E/E" in their sister magazine, the then semi-annual "Communications World." I now had everything.

Unfortunately, this is not true today as I said at the start. Radio Shack made a terrible mistake when it gave up printing its "Introduction to Short Wave." They did bring out an updated "Shortwave Listeners Guide" and while it is the only SW listing available to

the general public today, I feel it may be more of a hindrance than a help to budding SWLs. Radio Shack also no longer carries "Elementary Electronics" so I must subscribe. And curiously (and I have mentioned it to them), the publishers of "E/E" no longer mention when their newest issue of the now annual "Communications World" is out. I have never seen either on the local news stands nor on any in downtown Boston although I have been told that a few appear in the city now and again. The local news store has only one radio magazine - devoted to CB. The local library subscribes to a few technical ones for hams. All have an occasional SW article but this is not worth their prices for that alone.

The new style radios look very impressive all chromy and with little red numbers. If this is what interests you, all well and good. But if manufacturers think people buy their multi-bands for the whole radio, they are fooling themselves. With few exceptions, they are bought for their portability and superior tonal qualities. They seem to be "locked" onto some local AM or FM station. When I pointed out to several persons that their radios could get SW, the owners were greatly surprised. A few remarked, "There ain't nothing there but noise, man."

Something has to be done to remedy this situation if SW is to "boom." I would like to see some periodical covering SW broadcasting stations and their reception made readily available to the public. If not on news stands, then in stores that sell radios. While I am not plugging "Elementary Electronics" by any means, I have never come across any other periodical which has interested and helped me become a SWL. Even a small brochure simply explaining SW packed in with every radio capable of receiving those frequencies is certainly better than the nearly total lack of any information today.

Antenna

RADIO WEST ACTIVE ANTENNA-A REVIEW

I recently received a prototype model of Radio West's new active antenna for testing. The antenna consists of a short whip extending from a short plastic tube. This business end of the antenna is only about 18 inches long and can be placed anywhere, inside or outside. It will work quite well inside frame or stone buildings. It may have to be placed outside of steel framed buildings such as house trailers or apartment buildings. The advantage is that the business end is so small and unobtrusive, that it can be easily hidden. It may even be possible to tape the unit to the inside of a large glass window in a high-rise apartment building that has no access to the outside.

The tube at the business end is attached to a small box containing the amplifier circuits by about 25 feet of coax cable. The unit is powered by a 12 volt adapter and is connected to your receiver by a coax cable with an RCA type jack to the amplifier box. The tube at the antenna end contains a pre-amp/impedance matching device that drives a CATV RF transistor in the box. Production models will have a gain control to control input to prevent overload on sensitive receivers. The prototype model, without gain control, drives my R-7 with no overload problems, but connecting the antenna to my RF-2800 produced some internal difficulties in the receiver. Radio West warns that receiver gain may have to be turned down to avoid cross modulation. Portable use may be possible with a 12 volt power supply from batteries.

The antenna is broad band, 50 kHz to 30 MHz. My experience shows that there may be some noise at times below about 700 kHz, but that the antenna performs very well across the SW bands when compared to outside antennas. I have mine in the second floor closet of a frame house. Above 1600 kHz, it performs better than any wire antenna I have and better than a dipole antenna, except for the band for which the dipole is cut.

The list below shows how the antenna compared to my 60 m dipole ($\frac{1}{4}$ wave length) and a 25 metre wire, both mounted outside at some elevation above ground.

1. Below 910 kHz, there was some noise and below 700 kHz considerable noise. This may have been a problem with my particular set-up, rather than a fault of the antenna itself.
2. 1000 kHz: The active antenna was slightly better than the 60 m dipole and about the same as the single wire.
3. 1520 kHz: Slightly better than 60 m, about same as the single wire.
4. 2500 kHz: Slightly better than 60 m (+ 10 dB on meter), slightly better than wire.
5. 3330 kHz: Noticeably better than 60 m (+15 dB), noticeably better than wire

6. 3994 kHz: Noticeably better than 60 m, noticeably better than wire..
7. 5000 kHz: Slightly worse than 60 m dipole, noticeably better than wire.
8. 6100 kHz: Very slightly better than 60 m, slightly better than wire.
9. 7325 kHz: Noticeably better than 60 m, slightly better than wire.
10. 9745 kHz: Very much better than 60 m (+ 20-25 dB), very much better than wire (+ 25 dB)
11. 11830 kHz: Slightly better than 60 m, slightly better than wire.
12. 15315 kHz: Slightly worse than 60 m, slightly better than wire.
13. 17825 kHz: Slightly worse than 60 m, slightly better than wire.
14. 21460 kHz: Slightly worse than 60 m, slightly worse than wire.
15. 27150 kHz: Slightly better than 60 m, slightly better than wire.

The main advantage of this antenna is that it provides good reception across the entire SW spectrum. It is unobtrusive, can be used indoors, and may represent a good alternative for apartment dwellers or those with antenna restrictions.

The disadvantages of this antenna include a slightly higher noise to signal level than the dipole, but at all times the same stations are listenable on both. Another possible disadvantage is the possible adverse effects of an amplified input to a unstable receiver such as the DX-300. The same problems exist with all amplified preselectors. The RF gain may have to be adjusted downward. With the R-7, and I would presume other broadband receivers, there is no problem using the full output plus the internal preamp too.

In the dark

DARKENED ROOM AIDS DX RECEPTION

If you are a DX fan and stay up nights nursing dials in an effort to fill your log book with the call letters of distant stations, take a tip from the transmitting amateurs and use a small, opaquely shaded bulb as the only source of illumination in the room. Turn out all the overhead clusters and wall brackets, then set the lamp on or near the radio table, so that it is below the level of your eyes and casts a glow only strong enough to make the dial readings on the receiver discernible. A more effective expedient in easing the reception of the elusive DX you have never found.

The weakness of the light has no electrical effect on the receiver, to increase the latter's sensitivity; but it has a marked effect on your physical and mental condition that directly facilitates reception. With a dull light in the room you unconsciously relax your muscles, put yourself at ease, and rest your eyes. You sit back comfortably, and the inactivity of your other senses tends to sharpen those of hearing and feeling. You are not distracted by a strong light, but feel only the soothing effect of a soft and indirect one. You are able to concentrate, fully and completely, with only your ears and fingers active.

When you turn the dials you are not scarcely aware of their presence, or of the presence of anything else in the room. You merely listen and decipher the sounds the earphones impress on your brain.

EQUIPMENT - WHAT DOES ONE NEED?

The SP-600 was the first, problem was that it did not have accurate readout - primary solution - a BC-221 frequency meter, not good enough, too much work - get a Torrestronics Digital Readout (see July 1979 FRENEX), still not good enough - the FRG-7 looks better - OK, send Perry a big bag of plastic money and get the Frog, 4 kHz filters, GAR-7 Digital Readout - still not enough - a good deal on a Collins R-390A comes up,, what's next, a \$6000 Raca!

I have 103 countries verified. I could have had them all with any one of the above receivers. Why the kilobuck additional investment? I don't know, thought each step was better than the previous one.

Moral of tale: KEEP WHAT YOU VE GOT, work it to death, and then, and only then, consider an ACCESSORY, not a whole new receiving station.

Bonaire

A VISIT TO TWR AND RN STUDIOS, BONAIRE

As the bride and I approached our 25th wedding anniversary, we started planning a trip which would combine a winter (actually late fall) vacation, a "special" anniversary celebration and complying with our desire to travel to some "exotic" place.

In keeping with the multi-purposeness of the trip, it was not surprising that Bonaire loomed large as first choice. After all, a visit to Bonaire would allow inspection of the Radio Nederland and Trans World Radio facilities on the island. Shirley and I started planning the trip eight months in advance, researching the various travel books available at the local library.

We decided to visit the ABC group, staying briefly on Aruba and Curacao, spending the major portion (eight days) of the trip on Bonaire.

We found that the peoples of the three islands are very friendly and most people speak four languages, Dutch, Spanish, English, and Papiamentu, which is the newest language (spoken and written) in the world. Some of the older islanders may have a little difficulty making themselves understood in English, but have no trouble understanding the language.

Unfortunately, we did not have sufficient time to accomplish all the things we wanted to, since Bonaire is a most fascinating place. At the time we were there, getting there was half the fun. Flamingo Airport (Bonaire) is in the process of lengthening its runways, and the condition of the field is changing rapidly. Perhaps now the work is finished and getting to Bonaire will be simpler and quicker. The field could not handle DC-9s, and the hop from Curacao to Bonaire was via a Shorts 330, twin-engined turboprop of 30 passenger capacity. This part of the trip was very interesting.

The package we bought allowed rental of a car for one day, and we planned to visit the RN and TWR studios and explore the northern portion of the island at this time. As it turned out, this did not allow any time for a visit to either antenna park, but provided a good reason to return to the island in the future.

It must be noted here that we arrived at the RN studios unannounced, and were given a 20 minute tour of the studio building. The relay equipment had been replaced recently, and the technicians were very busy at the time of our visit. Mentioned were future plans for "our own" satellite, and there was a large room in the building set aside for a radio museum. We were treated with the utmost kindness and courtesy. This facility is not a "studio" as I pictured it, but a new modern building housing the relay facilities. The transmissions are relayed by landline from Curacao.

Just a few yards up the street is the TWR studio and program facility. After parking the car, I went across the street to take a few snapshots of the buildings, and Shirley was greeted by Chuck Roswell, who was just about to leave the premises after a staff meeting. Mr. Roswell, who is employed at the antenna park, was most kind, and conducted us on a tour of the facilities. Through him, we met Mr. Schipper (pronounced Skipper) who is in charge of the English section, and keeps excellent records. (He checked me in his files, and told me the last day I had reported, and also had Kap Kapinos in the files.) This facility consists

of two buildings. The first was occupied by the various language sections and administrative offices. This building also contained the power generators and a print shop. The second building contained complete program production facilities, with several studios for taping and dubbing, and a very large library of programs. There was also an acoustically "tunable" room for taping live music. Mr. Roswell also offered to conduct us through a tour of the transmitter facilities and antenna park, but unfortunately we didn't have the time to take advantage of this kindly offer.

In summing up, I wish to say that we were treated most kindly at the Radio Nederland and Trans World Radio Studios, but it was unfortunate that time did not allow us to visit the transmitter and antenna parks, which gives us a good reason to return in the future.

Both studios are located within "walking distance" of the hotels on the island. Ours was the most distant hotel, the Flamingo Beach, about three miles away. Taxis were getting about three dollars per trip at the time. The closest hotel is just across the street from the studios, this is the Hotel Bonaire. TWR's antenna park and transmitters are in the southern portion of the island, and RN's transmitters and antennas in the northern section.

I brought along an Allied 2660 portable, and SWling with this receiver wasn't worth much due to the many images caused by the proximity of the high powered emissions. Possibly, better results could be obtained with a better quality receiver.

Visiting Bonaire is strongly recommended, and we found the islanders to be very friendly, honest, and sincere. Our hotel staff (Flamingo Beach) were excellent. We enjoyed our stay immensely, and will return in the future. However, it must be noted that Bonaire is the "quietest" of the three islands, with little night life. A complete refund was given on the spot, so I took my Sony to the RCA dealer. Not one bit of radiation from any RCA in the store. Color sets are not cheap and I am sure not all dealers are as nice as my Zenith dealer. I have a 1973 model console Zenith that I have had no problem with and it doesn't radiate. Perhaps the problem is in the 1980 all solid state Zeniths.

My children can now watch TV and I can do a little SWling. The new RCA 13" doesn't radiate."



The Chinese, Russian and Indian sections were expanded in 1979 and their pgms were doubled in duration and re-organised. Number of broadcasts in Esperanto and Japanese were also increased and some new African langs were introduced in the French broadcasts to Africa (ed. note: as yet unconfirmed). R. ANTARCTICA Fleet Post Office San Francisco says all mail to Antarctica won't go out until September; snowbound Feb-August; postage 15 cents to AFAN (George Poppin, CA, 26/2)

AUSTRALIA On 19/2 RA quoted the P&T Minister as informing Parliament that the govt attached great importance to the rebuilding as a matter of urgency of RA's xmtrs near Darwin. The Minister said that the earliest date for the restoration of facilities there would be late 1982. The govt recognized the need to rebuild the xmtrs and to repair RA facilities at Shepparton, Vic. by allocating 9.6 million dollars for the project (WBI 21/2) P&T Minister is Mr Staley. The Public Works Committee has still not given its decision on the reconstruction. RA and the P&T Dept have different proposals, and the PWC held a hearing in Darwin in Feb. P&T Dept proposes that the three 250 kW xmtrs be moved to a new site at Humpty Doo, 60 km SE of Darwin, along the Arnhem Highway where chances of future cyclone damage are much less. Operating costs would also be lower than on Cox Peninsula. RA opposes this because it would entail a further delay of 1½-2 years. PWC decision expected before Easter. Construction at Cox Peninsula (the old site) would commence at the start of the dry season in May, if approved. The RA 'Darwin' station at Cox Peninsula is conducting test xmsns with music using the salvaged 301° log periodic antenna and diesel generator power to keep the three 250 kW xmtrs in operating condition. A\$M0.75 /I assume this means 750,000 dollars/ a year is being spent on their maintenance. Present test fq is 21720, daytime Mon-Fri; obs 24/1 0230-0500 playing Neil Diamond album continuously. Darwin also used when Carnarvon is having technical problems, such as three weeks in 7/79, and 27/1/80. Angelo Pratt, Darwin, says the ABC there has announced the proposed SW domestic HF /sic/ service would not proceed, in view of the projected satellite system (Robert Jones, Sydney NSW, Mar ADXN)

CANADA CBC will be transferring Montréal's shortwave Northern Service over to the French language services in Quebec within the next few months, per Brian Fleming, nat'l program dir. of CBCNS in Ottawa. One of the conditions is that there would be no changes in Inuktitut programming, but it's likely there would be changes in other languages (M. McGoldrick, Atuaqnik, 12/79 via Paddy Gardiner, Ft. Chimo PQ, via April R.I.B.)

COSTA RICA Per a R. Relej report, the Council of Govt was informed 14/2 that per a study by the National Radio Control Dept, the 9615 kHz fq of R. Noticias del Continente should be cancelled. Legal reasons were cited tho the requirements for transfer of the fq permit to the present owner were fulfilled /sic/, it was not published in the Official Gazette. However, a final decision is pending. The decision did not mean that RNC would have to stop broadcasting but the Govt Ministry felt that the authorization for the operation of the stn 'totally invalid'. R. Relej also said the Argentine and Chilean govts had charged RNC had broadcast 'subversive and hostile' reports leading to the govt intervention (WBI 21/2)

INDONESIA RRI 5/2 reported the Info Minister told a Parliamentary Commission that the capacity of RRI's Intl Service would be increased in the near future. For this purpose, a 30 million franc loan from France would be used to buy two 250 kW xmtrs. The contract is expected to be finalized by the end of March (WBI 14/2)

LEBANON V. of Hope has anc'd via George Otis here in the USA that they will try SWBC (no power mentioned) in approximately 3 months using call letters "KING". Also they recently began a pgm for UN peacekeeping force there (Eric Cooper, Mission Viejo CA) MONACO/France LN-16

NAMIBIA Two 100 kW /SW/ xmtrs may be testing by mid year, perhaps on similar freqs to SABC. The SWABC Afrikaans & English services will replace SABC relays; will be on FM and partly SW, no MW (Richard Ginbey, RSA, R. Nederland DX Juke Box 13/3)

NEW HEBRIDES These islands will be renamed Vanuatu when they become independent in May. Chief Minister Walter Lini said the new name means "A country that has stood alone and will continue to stand alone." PORTUGAL AWR to add Polish late April produced by studios in Poland (SCDX 4/3)

SEYCHELLES FEBA have ordered a 100 kW SW xmtr in Sept 1979 to cost \$600,000 to install in Sept 1981 (FEBC Skywaves via Colin Campbell, Feb NZ DX Times)

SURINAM 50 watt xmtr on 4794 will be increased to 500 watts. So if you want a flea-power QSL, act quickly (Robert Veltmeijer, WRTH/WMR via Mar DSWCI SWN) R. Apintie (gh)

Confusion to test from 2200-? 15/3 at 21500 + 10 kHz (FRC-USA) Those who tuned in heard Dubai instead, tsk (gh)

Voice of American Solidarity should be on in the near future via WDAB facilities; no other info available now (John Santusuosso, Feb NNRC Alternative Radio)

Voice of the American Revolution hrd on 6990 2/3 2347-2349*, IDed many times with 200W RF out 2/3 power; said was testing, off with "73 and good DX", SIO 333. Pse QSL (Mike McCollum, 8908 Pickwick Dr, Indianapolis IN 46260)

R. Telstar International very weak on 6248 2/3, apparently being relayed by Syncom 40; much QRM and didn't hear full ID, so tentative; SIO 212-222 (Mike McCollum, IN)

"WBLO" Atlanta pirate hrd 17/2 0730-0745* on 3890; ancr apologized for gap between xmsns; said would be on again soon; last xmsn was several months ago. Pgm included the adventure? series "Chickenman" and pop mx (Anthony G. Pavick, Latrobe PA) 17/2 0707-0735* and *0736-0747* host "Delby" (?) referred frequently to 'the new WBLO' and played long songs by Jethro Tull. Indonesia "Amatir" or backyard pirate broadcasting here is not confined to large centres like Jakarta. One or two apparently unofficial ops have been hrd in Malang, e.g. on 2608 and 2781, with religious pgms. Ujung Pandang is quite a centre, perhaps not surprisingly if you remember the number of private low-fq SW stns there listed by WRTH a few years ago before the govt 'clean up SW' campaign. Most popular time is early local evenings, 1200-1300 GMT. But listeners can hear something unofficial on some fq at almost any hour; fqs vary as xmtrs are not very stable; some noted on 1909, 2226, 2321, 2516, 2547, 2768, 2818, 3088. On 2503 there is R. Fqs are 15790 11830 9620; 'morn' pgms also on 7300(WBI) VOMR audible on 15790 at 2300 13/3; 15787 ute silent then (Jim Conrad, IA)

First August Radio (Std. Chinese: Ba yi dien-tai de guang-bo) hostile to Chinese Vice-Premier Deng Xiaoping is on 12120; number and duration of broadcasts vary from day to day but are of about 8 minutes starting on any hour or half hour between 1200 and 1538 (WBI 2/80)

Iran Dissidents claim to operate 3 clandestine stns in Iran and plan a fourth and more powerful one in Teheran itself in the next week or two; they follow Shahpur Bakhtiar, the Shah's last P.M., who now lives in exile in Paris. B's supporters also claim to soon operate an Egyptian based stn capable of broadcasting thruout Iran. But Egyptian authorities say they think the Bakhtiar loyalists are just talking about plans for R. Cairo to resume Persian language BCs to Iran that were discontinued after the fall of the Shah (Newsweek, 28/1 via SCDX)

Nat'l R. of the Saharan Arab Dem. Rep. (Arabic: Itha'at al-Jumhuriyah al-Arabiyyah as-Sahariyyah ad-Dimqratiyyah) obs on 1355 kHz 1900-2355 apx on 23-25/2; poor reception, but in AR and verns to 2300, incl nx 2100 (23 & 24/2 only). Rest in SP including nx in support of Polisario Front; first mention of existence of this was noted 21/8/79 when French svc of Algerian radio quoted a report purportedly BC by the stn re an attack on a garrison in Touizgui in southern Morocco. Appears to have been first obs by EBU monitoring stn in Jurbsise Belgium on 4/12/79 (WBI 28/2) Voice of the Western Somali & Somali Abo Liberation Fronts LN-16 SOMALI

Green Tunisia (Arabic: Tunis al-Khadra). 7/2 Libyan nx agency JANA quoted a Spanish nx agency that a spokesman for Tunisian revolutionaries in Paris had announced setup of a clandestine radio centre of this name. Somewhere in Gafsa (Tunisia), 'to contribute to the escalation of the struggle against the present regime and for the liberation of the country from French domination' (no such stn yet traced) (WBI 14/2) V. of Arab Homeland ES from Tripoli referred 13/2 to Gafsa Radio which broadcast material attributed to the "Rev. Movement for the Lib. of Tun" No details of times/fqs. Maybe the "Green Tunisia" stn. 14/2 ed. of 'Eight Days', a magazine on ME affairs, referred to Gafsa Radio 'on almost the same wavelength as Tripoli' and calling on Tunisians to take up arms against the present govt (WBI 21/2) This stn has now been traced on 730 kHz, ID as "Here is Gafsa, the Voice of the Revolutionary Movement for the Liberation of Tunisia" (Arabic: Huna Gafsa, Sawt al-Harakah ath-Thawriyyah li Tahrir Tunis). Eve xmsns are apx 1700-1930 & 2030-2300; each contains one hour continuous mx, one hour of spoken material interspersed with patriotic songs, plus 30min continuous mx. Amnts hrd only between 1800 and 1900 and 2130-2230. Hostile spoken material to Tunisian govt is in AR, except one item in FR 23/2. Also obs on 730 0500, socked after 0530, and at times between 1300 and 1530 with the xmr staying on the air between BCs. The patriotic songs interspersing the spoken material are of Egyptian origin and used to be played during Pres. Nasir's era by Cairo Radio and Voice of the Arabs; since then they have been played mainly by Libyan radio (WBI 28/2)

R. Riposte, per France-Inter report, the Socialist Party's stn broadcast in Metz for about 10 mins 6/2; completely jammed by TDF on orders from the prefecture. The pgm was in connexion with the current trial in Metz of the S.P.'s federal secretary for Moselle who was facing charges of contravening the law on election propaganda; thought to be on FM (WBI 14/2)

Zimbabwe People's Revolutionary Voice Amnt on this pgm via R. Zambia said from 14/2 it would be retimed to its 'old time', i.e. 1715-1800 Mon-Sat on 9580, 0700-0745 Sun on 11880; the former was confirmed 14/2 (WBI 21/2) Seems discontinued since 29/2 RZ pgms 1715-1800(WBI 13/3)

V. of Free Africa, hostile to Mozambique, from Rhodesia, not hrd since 13/2 tho claimed it would not close down (WBI 21/2) Per sources in Zim/Rho it has permanently closed. Used to transmit from Gwelo with 100 kW on 1020 in PT & verns toward Mozambique 1630-1730 (QTHAfrica)

R. Abdala 25/2 0023* on 7092, man talking, vocal version of Cuban anthem, ID w/piano IS, "Cuba será libre!" (Jay Novello, Endwell NY)

Voice of Alpha 66, militant anti-Castro group hrd with very pro sound in either their first or one of their first BCs 30/1 0115-0127* on 7053. Good signals but not as strong as Abdala or Libertad Cubana ("Havana Moon", Mar NNRC) Also hrd 4/2 0138-0149* (John Santosuosso, NNRC)

R. Girón (cf Mar LN-8) was the station busted by the FCC in Miami, not R. Libertad Cubana, per a Miami Herald article of the same date, but apparently rewritten for a later edition making that correction. This version appears in full in the March R.I.B. (gh)

Spy Numbers German ones are proliferating! Hrd very distinctive IS for 5 mins preceding the numbers: bell-gong 8 times per, repeated until 'Mata Hari' went into her bit at 0630-0640* with one bell-gong, on 3265a; due to strength I am confident it was either very near my QTH or in Eu. Does no one know what this is? (Max Greenwood, Devon PA) There is a daily English spy numbers broadcast at *2230-2240* on 14985 apx, taped woman, 2-5 digit groups; preceded by second beeps from 2225 (Ted Van Beurden, Biloxi MS) Well, not when checked 23/3 (gh)

DX PROGRAMS ANDORRA World Music Radio via R. Andorra, 6215, now includes a DX segment by Andy Sennitt of WRTH, Suns 2125-2130 weekly (Barracrough)

AUSTRALIA The final edition of RA's "Club Forum" was 1/3. Despite many discussions with senior RA personnel, the decision to terminate this long-running pgm will not be viewed favorably by DXers around the world. ARDXC sought to have the pgm retained with expanded DX tips, but this was not considered desirable. A monthly show is planned (Bob Padula, ADXN) Had been on since 1972; may be a new monthly pgm replacing it in a few months time; this will be announced on Mailbag (Keith Glover, R. Australia Club Forum 1/3)

BELGIUM BRT keeps mentioning that its twice monthly DX Corner is being weeklyized but instead it keeps appearing irregularly; perhaps in April? (gh)

ECUADOR As of M80, HCJB has added another airing of the DX Party Line Monday edition (only), GMT Mons at 0330 on 15250 11915 9745 to Nam (gh)

GERMANY WEST DLF DX pgm in EG is now Tues 1840 on 1269 kHz (Mar WWDXC)

HUNGARY With switch to DST 6/4, R. Budapest DX also moves an hour earlier: Tue & Fri to Eu 1415-1430 on 15160 11910 9835 9585 7200 6110; Wed & Sat Nam 0300-0315 17710 etc (gh)

PORTUGAL The AWR DX pgm is still on at 0935 on 9670 (Suns) using some material from Adrian Peterson's RMI and some local material (Mike Barracrough, UK, 17/2) I have urged AWR Guatemala to sked RMI; their own 'DX' pgm nightly(?) 0230-0300 needs such material (gh)

U S A VOA Spanish DX segment noted 10/3 at 0140-0145 on 6190 etc (gh). more LN-16

CAMEROON EG nx 1830-1845 on 4000 and 4850 from Yaoundé, relayed by Garoua 5010, Bertoua 4750 (Paul Karagianis, QTH Africa 10/3)

CANADA CFWP 6030 has been off the air for several weeks; confirmed by a call to them when passing thru Calgary 3/3. Had been off air 3-4 weeks then and was likely to be off another 3-4 weeks; parts hard to get for that old xmtr (John Meyer, Manitowoc WI, 17/3) cf LN-7

EQUATORIAL GUINEA LV de Río Muni on 4925 ex-5005 with overseas mailbag pgm in SP Suns 2130; asks for more reports and says this pgm will be on every Sunday (Paul Karagianis, QTH Africa)

GABON Libreville on 9554 2 x 4777, FR 15/3 around 2315 (Bob Padula, Surrey Hills, Victoria)

GUATEMALA Later observations to those on LN-8 re Unión Radio, AWR: 18266 continued providing excellent reception in the apx 0100-0500 period 23/4 and 24/4; also audible at times on 12187 and with heavy QRM around 6088.5. 0100-0300 half is in EG w/pgms like Voice of Prophecy, Your Story Hour, The Quiet Hour--and a nightly 'DX' program at 0230-0300! which is mostly hymns and 'Health File' on backache, artificial respiration, etc. Sometimes a different box

KENYA Nairobi has again returned to 4804 with Gen Svc; EG nx 1900; good reception suggests possible increase of xmt power (Miki Vcelař, Pretoria, RSA, QTH-Africa 10/3)




