

1980 NASWA MEMBERSHIP DIRECTORY: Quite a few have responded to our announcement in last months FRENEX regarding the fact that a new membership directory which lists the names and addresses of most NASWA members as of June 1, 1980 will soon be available. The list is now at the printers and the finished product is expected soon. Those having ordered will receive their copy soon thereafter.

As our first announcement stated, this is a limited printing with about the same number of directories to be printed as were ordered last year, so this might be the final announcement as to its availability in the future. Those interested in this sort of information are urged to order now rather than to wait for further announcements....when the original printing is sold out, that will be all for this edition.

To help cover printing and mailing costs, there is a charge of \$1.00 post-paid for North American members, and 8 IRC's overseas. Canadian members can send Canadian currency. Distribution is to NASWA members only, and only one copy per member.

OTHER MATTERS OF INTEREST: Those who have been around NASWA or in our hobby for a while know that there are several limited circulation publications that are useful. So, for those who may be fairly new to the hobby, we would like to call their attention to some of the other materials they might find useful in addition to NASWA's FRENEX and Update.

ANARC NEWSLETTER: This is the official publication of the Association of North American Radio Clubs. ANARC is not a club in itself, but is the means whereby other radio clubs can promote the exchange of ideas and information within all major radio clubs in North America. The monthly ANARC Newsletter is non-technical and is an excellent source of information on many matters. Their "DX Calendar" list most of the upcoming DX meetings, conventions and the like. Also, their recently added "Market Place Report" feature comments on new equipment and where one might obtain other items of interest to the radio hobbyist. The newsletter is available for \$3.50 per year in North America, or \$8.00 overseas from ANARC, 557 North Madison Ave., Pasadena, CA 91101. Also, a directory of all ANARC clubs is available for a self addressed and stamped envelope in the U.S., or one IRC in Canada or Mexico, or 3 IRC's overseas.

USSR HIGH FREQUENCY BROADCAST NEWSLETTER: Edited and published by Roger Legge, UHN is published approximately monthly and specializes in late news on Soviet broadcasting with updates on schedules, transmitter sites, QSL information and the like, all relating to the Soviet areas. A most useful reference for those interested in this area. A subscription is \$3.00 for ten issues sent to Roger Legge, P.O. Box 232, McLean, VA 22110. Roger is also responsible for the English Language broadcast lists which have been appearing quarterly in FRENEX.

REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING (RIB): Although edited and published by Glenn Hauser, FRENEX's Listeners' Notebook editor, RIB is not a NASWA sponsored publication, but is an excellent supplement to FRENEX. Non-technical for the most part, RIB concentrates mostly on SW program content and listener reaction and comment. There are no log reports or other duplicated features usually found in club bulletins. For those who are interested in program content, this is especially recommended. Subscriptions are available from Glenn Hauser, University Radio WUOT, Knoxville, TN 37916 for \$12.00 U.S. for 12 issues by first class mail in North America. Elsewhere \$13.00, or \$16.50 overseas airmail. Samples in North America are \$1.00.

FRG-7

IMPROVEMENTS TO FRG-7 AUDIO

When I first received my own FRG-7, two audible faults made themselves immediately obvious: First, the overall sound quality was extremely muffled, thus making even the clearest programs very hard to understand. Second, in spite of the muffled quality, constant 5000 Hz heterodynes were nearly always present within the shortwave bands, which made for very irritating listening. Perhaps the muffled sound was Yeasu's vain attempt to suppress the heterodyne problem.

A quick look at the receiver schematic indicated that an audio notch filter ought to be quite easy to add. So, I constructed the circuit shown in sketch 1 using parts from my junk box, and mounted the small assembly inside the chassis. The results were completely satisfactory, I haven't heard a 5000 Hz whistle since. Some notes about this circuit are probably in order.

It consists of a simple bridged-tee L-C filter chosen for its ease of tuning. The filter is isolated, input and output, by emitter followers. This allows insertion into the receiver circuit after the filter has been accurately tuned on the test bench. The only unusual parts used are the coil, which is variable from about 16 to 42 mH, and the 5 kohm trimpot which should be a multi-turn unit for ease of tuning. Any common NPN silicon audio transistor such as the BC-109 can be used for the emitter followers. Series 4.7 kohm base resistors are used to suppress any tendency of self-oscillation which can sometimes occur when an emitter follower is called upon to drive an inductive load. The electrolytic capacitors I used were small tantalum units to save space. Tuning is simple: With power to the electronics, apply a precise 5000 Hz sinewave signal of about 1 volt P-P amplitude to the input. Monitor the output and adjust both the coil and trimpot for minimum signal. My filter had a notch depth of over 65 dB. Power requirements are about 12 VDC at 3 or 4 milliamps. This is easily tapped from the receiver at TP407 and is low enough not to make any impact on battery life. Volume control VR1, makes a convenient connection point to insert the filter into the audio path. Remove the coax center conductor from the top (clockwise or "hot") end of VR1, and connect this wire to the filter input. Then connect the filter's output back to the top pin of VR1. Power and ground connections complete the installation.

Now attention may be turned to solving the "muffle" problem mentioned above. A close inspection of the passive R-C network used for the tone control switch will reveal that, even in the Normal position, the audio response begins to diminish above 1000 Hz. This is even worse than the response of an ordinary telephone! With the 5000 Hz whistles now suppressed by the notch filter, I could now make the audio response much flatter without incurring undesirable side effects. To do this, simply replace C-447 on the IF-AF board (originally a 0.033 uF Mylar capacitor) with a 0.0047 uF capacitor. This flattens the response up to about 10,000 Hz, with the exception of the 5000 Hz notch introduced by the filter. You will now notice a dramatic improvement of intelligibility on all stations received. Excess noise can still be reduced, if desired, by using the other positions of the tone switch. No features or functions have been disabled by these modifications.

The only significant limitation on audio quality which still remains is the inexpensive speaker, which is a 3" x 5" oval unit. This seems to be a rather uncommon size, and I have not found any improved models that can fit right in. For those living in the U.S., McGee Radio (1901 McGee St., Kansas City, MO) sells an excellent quality 3" round speaker which can be mounted by making a new masonite spacer board. They call this their "mini-stereo"

resistors. Now tune in an "average" strength signal, and set VR410 (on the IF-AF board) for about an S-9 reading on the meter.

I've tabulated the performance of this circuit in my own receiver. As you can see, the accuracy is not perfect, but it is still far better than the original, and was done for only a couple of dollars cost.




ANTENNA MOUNTING

As a new member of NASWA, I'd like to share with the other members one of my nifty "home-grown" ideas for better, easier, and cheaper SWLing. Here in the hills of West Virginia, the wind has a tendency to kick up from time to time and stretch your long-wire antenna like a piece of over-cooked spaghetti. One day in a junk yard, while scrounging in the dirt for my third long wire in as many months, an old-timer related this bit of simplicity to me. Instead of fixing both ends of the long-wire to an anchor, he showed me how a junk-yard pulley could solve a number of my antenna problems. At one end of the wire use an egg insulator to separate the wire from a piece of good nylon rope about four feet long. Assuming that the antenna is strung horizontally, feed the nylon rope through a pulley attached to a wall (I use my garage) and tie the rope to the handle of an old plastic leach jug that has about 2" of dirt or sand in the bottom. The result is that the weighted jug keeps the line taut and the antenna high and clear. When the wind blows, the line gives enough to keep everything intact. Also, any stretching of the line due to its own weight is remedied. Here is a sketch of a typical set-up.

DX-302

CHANGES INCORPORATED IN THE DX-302

The following changes have been incorporated into the new Radio Shack DX-302 receiver when compared to the DX-300.

1. The stock ceramic filter in the third IF stage is improved and another is added well for improved SSB reception. The DX-300 was 5.5 kHz at -6 dB; the 302 is 3.5/6 kHz at -6/-60 dB and 2.5/4 kHz at -6/-60 dB.
2. The audio BW selection on the input to the AF amp has been removed.
3. An AGC amp (Q202) is added in the front end. High level inputs cause Q202 to reduce the FET's gain (Q201). Q202 works in conjunction with the RF-gain control, i.e. if the RF gain is reduced, a higher signal level will be needed before Q202 will react.
4. Q208 Gain Control controls the gain of the 1st IF amp when on longwave (bands 1 and 2). The DX-300 and DX-302 both use a Gain control stage on the first mixer for LW and MW in addition to Q208.
5. Extra attenuation is added onto the High impedance input. Thus the Attenuation switch selects equal attenuation of 0, 20, or 40 dB for both the Hi and Lo Z antenna inputs.
6. A BFO Pitch control replaces the Fine Tune. Thus the BFO frequency is varied instead of the 3rd L.O. frequency.
7. When in the "Standby" condition, the AF amp circuit is killed by grounding the input. In the DX-300 it was left floating.
8. Phone Jack output is reduced from 100 mV to 70 mV in the specs; no change to the Tape Output. Circuitry has been rearranged, with the DX-302 using Q313 as a Preamp for all audio outputs. In the DX-300, Q313 and 314 were Buffer amps for the Tape out and only IC301 is for the speaker and phones outputs.
9. Connections supplying the S-meter have been changed, but I don't know how response is affected.

CKZU

CBU/CKZU CBC RADIO BRITISH COLUMBIA

One of two Canadian Broadcasting Corporation shortwave stations is CKZU, which transmits from Vancouver. CKZU carries the same programming at its mediumwave sister station, CBU. CBU (then known as CNRV) began broadcasting on the first of October, 1925, on 690 kHz. Since then power has been increased three times, to 5 kW in 1937, to 10 kW in 1952 (when call letters were changed from CNRV to CBU), and to the present 50 kW in 1969.

The shortwave outlet CKZU began transmissions on October 27, 1941, with 500 watts output. The shortwave service is intended for the isolated communities and shipping along the coast of British Columbia. The signal has been heard far beyond its intended area; the station has verified reports from Norway, Sweden, Australia, New Zealand, and many parts of the United States.

CBU/CKZU is a part of the national network and most programming is received from the headquarters of the English Services Division in Toronto. CBU/CKZU devotes roughly 35 hours per week on local programming as well as recording material for broadcast over the national network.

The CBC Regional Broadcast Centre is located at 700 Hamilton Street in Vancouver. The Centre houses studios for CBC Radio, TV, and film services. Those who have verified this station probably have a QSL card showing an architect's sketch of the Centre.

Another CBC station located in British Columbia is CFPR, which went on the air from Prince Rupert, B.C. on January 1, 1942. Originally 250 watts, CFPR was upgraded to 10 kW in 1965. 120 other low power repeaters relay programming from CBU/CKZU or CFPR to listeners in remote areas of the province.

If you have not heard CBU/CKZU, then 6160 kHz is the frequency to check. Try around 0830-0910* GMT, or earlier if you are on the West Coast. The station's address is:

RADIO BHUTAN

Radio N.Y.A.B. was started in November 1973 by a small group of young people who were members of the National Youth Administration of Bhutan who wished to contribute toward the development of the country. The first studio was a small room in the Civil Wireless Building. The equipment was shielded from the transformer by putting it in a steel trunk. At first broadcasts were only one hour on Sunday and only in English.

Gradually programs in Dzonghka, the native language, were added and broadcast time was increased. More equipment was obtained and the staff became more experienced. Now Radio N.Y.A.B. broadcasts for a total of nine hours per week with programs in Dzonghka, Nepali/Schacop and English. They have a modern studio to broadcast from.

Their present schedule is: Sunday: 41 metres 7040 MHz 12:00 to 15:00 BST.

Wednesday and Friday: 61 Metre band 4690 MHz 17:00 to 20:00 BST. The English session is the last 30 minutes of each broadcast.

The programs consist of news bulletins, both international and local, educational features on agriculture, animal husbandry, basic health and hygiene, religious programming and listeners choice of music.

MORE ON WEATHER AND DXING

I just want to offer some support for David Gallagher's observations on weather and DXing in April FRENDX. It just so happens I have been plagued for some time with the question of how weather and DXing might be related. In fact, the importance of weather has seemed more important to me recently when I began to notice definite trends in the local weather and my ability to pull in distant stations.

While I was not able to refine the weather in the way Mr. Gallagher did, such as: "Cloudy weather caused by an advancing cold front. . ." and I did not separate day and night, I did observe the exact same things in general. For example, I found DX to be best on cloudy or foggy days. DXing on clear days, except for a few exceptions, was not always best. DXing was worst during rain. When it is not raining, but a thunderstorm is approaching, DXing is bad simply because of high static levels.

I made these observations through the summer and fall, and because of them I wrote to the BBC World Radio Club, noted my findings, and asked the question: "What affect does weather have on DXing?" In reply, on a World Radio Club program, BBC staff said my question was a difficult one to answer since there were theories, but no hard facts about the exact relationship.

Since then, my observations are still holding for the most part. I do feel, then, that weather does have an affect on DXing, although I admit it is certainly not a prime determinant. When thinking of how weather was affecting my ability to catch distant stations, I also wondered about my actual location. I live near water. There have been many foggy days. Also, when storms are in the area, they seem more intense around where I live. Perhaps this accounts for something.

In any case, I wonder if the area of weather is being investigated in any detailed way. It would certainly be interesting to get more hard facts on its effects.

(Editor's Note: Some studies are underway to study the relationship between weather and the influx of charged particles from the solar wind. These charged particles affect the

earth's electrical field that in turn may affect the location and severity of thunderstorms. Changes in the electrical field may also affect ionospheric refraction. There is a lot left to understand about these relationships. We would welcome any additional systematic observations made by DXers.)

THIS & THAT

Paul Kowolski, 1557 N. Farwell Ave., Apt. 105, Milwaukee, WI 53202, writes to us regarding tuning the SX-190 receiver. As most SX-190 owners probably know, the pre-selector can be mistuned to receive certain out of band frequencies. Ed Shaw, I believe, had an article on this some years ago. As he said "these

trick frequencies tune backwards. ."

I've found a way to receive further coverage involving pre-selector tuning and this is very useful. Coverage on the 11.5 MHz range can be either fundamental 11.5, 17 MHz will be the next "backwards reading" one, and then 26 MHz! And the 26 MHz range reads normally left to right. The 100 kHz crystal marker points will however be approximately 20 kHz behind the calibrated main spread dial.

To receive the 26 MHz band, first set the band selector to 11.5, then tune the pre-selector to between 27 and 25 and peak the background noise. Next put on the crystal calibrator and tune approximately in the vicinity of 180-200 on the main dial and listen for the crystal signal. When located, peak the preselector and adjust the dial skirt to 0. You will now be tuned to 26000 kHz. Daytimes tune up 20 kHz and you will find HCJB's 100 watt. As I said before, the main tune dial will be a bit behind actual markings, but the whole band is quite accurately tuned if you calibrate via crystal and use the dial skirt scale. Remember that, unlike the second "trick" setting that reads backwards, this third one reads normally left to right. So if you want 11 metre coverage, don't waste money on a crystal. The SX-190 will get most of it down to nearly 25800. Tests with the crystal marker shows it to read fairly linear much the same as normal band reception.

Rufus Jordan of Pittsburgh, PA sends a newspaper article stating that the U. S. FCC has approved AM stereo. There were several similar systems competing for approval and the FCC selected the system proposed by Magnavox corp. It is not known how long it will be before the system is on the air. The greatest market is expected to be in automobile audio systems. The natural audio frequency limitations of AM radio will still apply and the quality of sound reproduction will be less than on FM, but it will be an improvement over mono-AM. The range of stereo reception is expected to be 50-60 miles. AM-stereo presumably makes use of the fact that the AM signal contain two symmetrical audio side bands, these presumably will be modulated separately (not described in the article). The new system is compatible with present mono receivers.

In another unrelated FCC action, it has been proposed to open up additional night-time channels in the AM broadcast band by eliminating the protection of Clear-channel stations. The clear channel stations would be protected in a radius of about 750 miles, beyond that other stations would be allowed to operate on the frequency. Goodbye WOAI, WSM, WLS, etc.

Your editor wrote for the MFJ Enterprises, Inc., catalog (P. O. Box 494, Mississippi State, MS 39762). They have antenna tuners, preselectors, audio processors, an active antenna, and a digital clock that may be of interest to SWLs and DXers. They also have several tuners with a large RF capacity for transceivers and transmitters of interest to hams.

John D. Williams of Bloomington, MN, writes to mention that Fair Radio Sales, P.O. Box 1105, 1016 E. Eureka St., Lima, OH, 45802, has military surplus gear that may be of interest to DXers. While you should write for current prices and availability, they have had G133 (51S1 Collins) military conversion by LTV Tempco for use with 14-600 kHz LF tuner for \$975 and the manual for \$15, and power connector for \$5.00. They also have R-388, 390, 390A, and 391 receivers. They have the 3HTF4 ballast tube which replaces the hard to find 3TF7 used in some of these military receivers.

One should note that not all R-390A receivers were made by Collins. They are of Collins design, but not necessarily made by Collins. Some were made by Motorola, Stewart Warner, Bendix, and the like. Some do not have Collins filters, such as the ones made by Motorola. Another caution, beware of any of these that have the name plate, located above the digital, removed, as you don't know what you are getting. Also turn the receiver upside down and check for Collins filters. Also check the 3, 7, and 9 MHz bands on Stewart Warner receivers. They also have manuals, write for prices, most are reproductions with schematics.

For \$1.00, Associated Radio, 8012 Conser, Box 4327, Overland Park, KS 66204 will send a catalog with Ham and SW equipment.

Amateur Electronic Supply, 4828 W. Fond du Lac Ave., Milwaukee, WI 53286 is closing out the Standard C-6500 general coverage receiver, a solid state .5-30 MHz in 30 bands, AM, CW, LSB USB, 5.5 kHz AM and 3 kHz CW and SSB selectivity, built in speaker, 5 kHz analog dial, sale price \$249. They are also located in Wickliff, OH, Orlando, FL, Las Vegas, NV, and an associate store in Chicago, IL (phone is 1-800-242-5195).

George Poppin, 2654 17th Ave., San Francisco, CA, 94116, notes that his FRG-7 with digital readout brings in better reception of audio when I flip the switch to DX position and tone to Narrow position. It cuts out a lot of the splatter and QRN when in the DX position although the S-meter indicates a loss of signal strength. By maneuvering the KS preselector and Antenna Tuner, I can usually cut out more splatter and noise from the selected frequency. At the same time, I may tune from one to two kHz above or below the station frequency for better results. The narrow tone position really assists when hearing some of the low voiced Indonesians and, of course, I am always ready to activate the cassette tape recorder. This has enabled many IDs that would have vanished into the ionosphere.

Ron Dishman, Augusta, ME, writes that ZEUS has come out with a home service entrance lightning arrester for appliances and electronic equipment. If people do not have a service entrance lightning arrester, they might check this one out. It is supposed to be a lot better than GE's. The unit sells for \$25.00 and the electrician fee was \$10. It can be installed on the box without having the power company come to cut the power off if your box is grounded to the water main.

Ron also cautions that lightning may jump power cords or antenna leads to equipment, even if the equipment is not plugged in or the antenna attached. So keep delicate equipment away from cords and leads that may carry lightning charges if your QTH is struck.



UGANDA R. Uganda anc'd 20/5 that it was testing from Kampala: 0600-1530 (Sat 1345, Sun 1415) on 7195. 0300-0545 & 1600 (Sat 1400, Sun 1430)-2100 on 5026, asking for reception quality reports (WBI 22/5)

UNITED ARAB EMIRATES Tests continue on new 21700, Arabic relay 0600-1100 (Arthur Cushen, NZ) ex-21485, to apx 1015 (exc Fridays) with DS relay (WBI 29/5) For several days, reverted to 21485; but returned to 21700 9/6; 0700-1015 apx (exc Fri), occasional EG amnts; on 11/6 UAE Radio testing a second channel, 17775 //21700 to 0900; 21 MHz continued to 1032 (WBI 12/6)

URUGUAY R. La Voz de Artigas, says in a questionnaire returned to WRTH that they have a SW xmtr of 5 kW on 4945 with the call CVA-2117, 1000-0300; also plan another SW xmtr on the 49mb (WMR DX World 8/6) Southern Cone DXers have previously vehemently denied that 60mb operations from Uruguay are broadcasts, but instead PTP links; who cares? (gh)

U S A AFRTS hrd with US nx at 1030 on 6540 USB (Jochen May, W. Germany, SCDX 20/5) AFRTS-W says they know nothing of any SSB xmsns; I suspect that various US military 2-way communications centres put AFRTS audio on, which they may have handy going thru their terminals, as a convenient modulation marker. By the way, AFRTS (inband) SW xmtr costs run to \$500,000 a year (gh) WTVL, Waterville ME /I'll bet lots of TV stns have been wanting to buy that call! /rarely heard here on fundamental 1490, but often on 2980, 2nd harmonic (Doug Jaffe, Mtptr VT) Not exactly SW, but if you can tune to 3756000 or 3755600 kHz, you may hear RKO network news on hour and half hour in a test from Westar satellite (gh)

U S S R R. Yerevan pgm on new 11805 *2131 1/6, Armenian, retimed or new service, but Brazil co-channel QRM (Bob Padula, Victoria) R. Moscow's only Zulu service is at 1730-1800 on 17785 17765 15520 15230 12055 (WBI 12/6) Rather Peking-sounding fqs, some of those... (gh)

VANUATU is the spelling on their QSL card; R. Vanuatu slogan used, hrd on 7260 and 3945 in FR & EG; address: P.O. Box 49, Port Vila (John C. Onken, Roanoke IL) Because of the secession of Espiritu Santo and various other problems, the independence of the New Hebrides has been postponed until July 30, just about as late as it could be in the May-July timeframe previously agreed to (Pacific Islands Monthly, May, via Bob Bodell, OR) The rebel station is again being heard, on 3990, but only in the mornings, 1930-2030 GMT (Arthur Cushen, RNZ, 16/6)

VENEZUELA (Cf June LN-8) The govt-owned R. Nacional stopped operations 1/1 due to lack of money. Raul Torrealba Alvarez, director, made the amnt. He described this as an unprecedented measure, and that there were plans to expand RN to other regions of the country. Torrealba Alvarez also said RN's closing is a blow to Venezuela's culture, and it escapes all logic (via Allen Lesser, DC, May GO-DX) What became of R. Universo 4880? (Doug Jaffe, VT, 4/6)

FUTURE PLANS

FINLAND Yleisradio, FBC, reported 30/5 that it had been proposed that the audibility of Finnish SW xmsns abroad should be improved. The Diet's Social Affairs Committee and the Seamen's Service Office had proposed in a letter to the Minister of Comms that the SW stn at Pori be rebuilt in order to improve audibility. They proposed that the Ministry set aside 3 million Finnish marks in next year's budget for the preliminary planning of a new SW stn, which would cost altogether nearly 50 million marks. FBC had asked MinCom for funds to plan the stn some five years ago; not granted (WBI 5/6)

INDIA AIR reported 28/5 that among plans to improve audibility of its net in the northeast, Shillong will have a new 50 kW SW xmt (WBI 5/6)

LEBANON The Voice of Hope, Station 'WORD', High Adventure Ministries will soon supplement its 25 kW MW xmt with SW, capable of reaching the world (LA Times via Tribune-Review 25/5 via Chuck Kristan, Delmont PA, via July REVIEW OF INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTING)

LESOTHO R. Lesotho has 3 powerful SW xmters under construction; to be in operation in a couple of months (Richard Ginbey, RSA, RN DX Juke Box 12/6)

SOUTH AFRICA R. RSA will introduce a South American service in Spanish and Portuguese in Sept 1980, per a parliamentary amnt (Richard Ginbey, RSA, RN DXJB 12/6) I'll bet in the 2200-0200 period on familiar fqs; doesn't appear in advance skeds (gh) Capital Radio, Transkei will soon have SW to Johannesburg and Pretoria (Ginbey, ibid.) Present SW going the other way, for Cape Town (gh) The sudden resignation of three Capital Radio executives has led to speculation that the stn may be wholly taken over by the Transkei Government soon. A member of the staff said there would 'definitely be a mass walkout if the govt made any attempt to take over the stn' (Val Carter-Johnson, Sunday Times, via QTH Africa 20/5)

SURINAM (Cf June LN-7) R. Apintie, a commercial stn, wants to begin xmsns to the Netherlands --the director, Eddy Vervuurt, says reception of recent tests was good. The National Military Council of Surinam is planning to make daily broadcasts to the Netherlands over SW via the SRS with the first pgms planned for August, as part of a campaign to encourage immigrants from Surinam living in the Netherlands to return. R. Apintie on 4794; SRS on 4850 (NRC Handelsblad, via Max Arnhem, Netherlands, via SCDX 20/5)

U S A (Cf Feb LN-9, Apr LN-11) The permission process for WRNO New Orleans to go on SW continues. The application was cleared by IRAC as of 22/4; approval was still needed from ECAC; then it would be presented to the FCC for final review (WRNO via Ken MacHarg, IN)

CANADA After 2/7 there will be no further DX Digests from RCI on Wednesdays, as the Sunday 1807 broadcast will carry the entire program (the science feature being dropped as it is also carried Weds 1900+), just like the NAM service. It is still in two parts on the European service Suns at 1900+, 2000+. A reminder to all NASWans that this is the quickest way to get your hot DX news out--except for vacation periods (and the ANARCON weekend), any news I have received by mail or phone by 10 am ET on Friday can be considered for inclusion on the following Sunday's broadcast (gh)

EUROPE European Music Radio's DX program is on Sundays at 0945-1015, 10 watts on 6235/7325 kHz; one hour later during winter (Barry Stephens, EMR, via July RIB)

GUAM KTRR's 'DX Listener's Log' debut heard 30/5 0915-0930 good on 11840; was impossible at 0100 on 17855. News of DX conventions, how to keep a log, somehow working into a reading from Revelation, which is one of the required program content items for QSL (gh)

KOREA SOUTH R. Corea is starting a DX program in Spanish, 'Acción DX', from 27/6 on the 2nd & 4th Fridays at 0215, 0845, 0945, 1715, 2045. MADRIDX will be preparing part of it. See LN -5 for fqs (R. Nederland Espacio Dixista 21/6)

MONACO TWR Monaco's DX programs now sked Sats 0845-0900 on 9675; 1500-1515 on 7195; in German all weeks except the third of the month when in English (Wolfgang Böschel, W. Germany)

NETHERLANDS R. Nederland's Spanish DX program on Friday xmsns, Espacio Dixista is running a fun contest, 'Juegue con Nosotros'; for instance on 21/6 listeners were invited to identify an announcer by hearing him cough! (gh) My DX reports air on the 2nd Fridays +GMT Sats (gh)

POLAND R. Polonia hrd GMT Mon 9/6 at 0230 with 'DX Club' pgm in progress on 1815; as it ended 0237, they said it would be repeated all Sundays of June (presumably at same time) and that the next new edition would be July 1. It was not mentioned in a program preview for the 0300 xmsn; time may vary widely (gh)

SRI LANKA The SLBC DX program, 'Radio Monitors International' foresees these program highlights: July 6, Special RCI QSL. July 13, test recordings of AWR, Guatemala (from gh's World of Radio). July 20 Radio broadcasting in Guyana. July 27, Around the world with a radio. Aug 3, 3 SW stations in Dixon. Aug 10 Radio Broadcasting in New Caledonia. Aug 17, Radio broadcasting in Bermuda. Aug 24, Special - Calling Pitcairn Island. Aug 31, VOA Bethany. Full sked in May LN-11, but best chance to hear in NAM is Sun. 1100-1130 on 1835 or 15120(gh)

TURKEY VOT's DX program has improved a lot, hrd Tue 2230-2245 on 15360, which is doing well here (Joe Tangredi, Las Vegas NV, 27/5) Not here, awful het (gh)

U S A Several SWLs work at WPTF-680 Raleigh NC, so they've decided to dedicate part of their Sunday evening 'Of Special Interest' series to DX! At 9:05 pm ET weekly, and once a month, perhaps on the fourth Sunday for half an hour at 9:30. WPTF is 50 kW, widely heard in NC and to the south. Some excerpts of my 'World of Radio' program may be included. In the New York City area, WCWP-88.1 FM Brockport-Greenvale LI has added another airing of 'World of Radio'--Thursdays at 8:30 pm, for those who have found Fridays 1:30 pm ET inconvenient (gh) KGEI has a DX pgm called 'Dixismo Internacional al Día', produced by Tíndaro Muscará, M/W/F/S/S /probably local days/ in the pgm 'Departiendo con la Juventud', at 2305, 0105, 0805, 1435 on 9615 and 15280 (Tíndaro /sic/ Muscará .SCDX 27/5) Had been reported at 0115 (gh)

U S S R On World Radio Club 1/6, BBC said R. Moscow was about to eliminate its DX pgm, but I still heard it the same day on RM at 1720, 11840 (Ralf Munster, GA) I think they were just referring to Kuznetsov's complaints about it being reduced in the 23/4 program shakeup; however it has not been showing (e.g. 21/6) at the sked time in the NAM svc of 2335, or anytime during that hour; the same goes for many other R. Moscow pgms, which apparently are being purged to allow time for more hard-line propaganda (gh) Later: DX Program noted closing at 1230, one hour later than previously scheduled, on RWMS 22/6, 9600; and Sun 1820 11840; 0620, 00207(gh)

CANADA CBC is airing a new 26-week drama series 'exploring horror, terror and dread,' 'Nightfall' during the final half hour of 'As It Happens', Fridays starting July 4--2230 on 15325 17875, 2330 on 5960 9755. 'Royal Canadian Air Force', GMT Mns 0230 on 9625 6195, has gone off for the season until Oct.5, replaced by 'Farce d'Été', cuts from comedy albums beginning with Bob & Ray. And new original Canadian dramas are appearing on 'Soundstage', Suns 2005-2059 on 11720 9625 (CBC via July RIB)

U K O C B A N I Among BBWS listening for July: A special on the ceremonies surrounding the Queen Mother's Birthday, 15th 1830, 2330, 16th 1030. 'Reflections' on Mondays 0455 0809 2240 features His Holiness Karekin II, Armenian Orthodox leader. 'Brain of Britain' ends and from 12/7 'Take It Or Leave It' (a much less classy quiz) replaces it, Suns 1715, Thurs 0330, 1030. 'East Africa in Perspective', 21st & 28th 1000, 2130; 23rd, 30th 1615. 'The English Poets', Sats 1130, Suns 1830, Tues 0230 deals with Shelley, Tennyson, Browning, Eliot; Yeats & Auden. From Concerts are back in season, live at 1830 on July 22, 23, 29, 31 (gh)

ZIMBABWE In a commentary broadcast 30/5, ZBC said its Board of Management had decided to make programming a priority area, so that all pgms meet the needs of the people and reflect the true character of the Republic. As from 1/6, ZBC would launch 15 new pgms including: 'The Worldwide Struggle for Freedom', 'The History of Chimurenga's Sons' and 'With the People'. (The titles were given in the vernacular and are believed to apply to the former 'African Service') (WBI 5/6)

CLANDESTINE CRANNY

Radió-e Mujahidin Afghanistan, anti-Soviet station now on 15305 and 9710 at 1600-1700 (Shigenori Aoki, Nagoya DXers Circle via WMR DX World 1/6) Name from Arabic term for 'fighters for the faith'. 9710 blocked here by RAI; 15305 has QRM from R. Moscow Greek & Bulgarian services and jamming. Hrd 9/6 1600-1655: has Koran at opening and 1630, Pashtu talks. The same stn referred to as 'Isha Allah', June LN-11 (Jean-Jacques Bloch, Paris, France)

R. Vatan (R. Homeland) Persian-language 1700-1800 ceased using 15064 29/5, currently heard on 9790 only. First heard 9/5 (WBI 5/6) Back on 15064. Is right-wing, pro-Bakhtiar, per a friend who translated. Assume site in Egypt--there have been press reports of transmitters installed there to broadcast to Iran (Jean-Jacques Bloch, France, 12/6) Not heard here (gh)

Free Voice of Iran (Persian: Seday-e Azad-e Iran) obs 29/5 in progress at 1505 on 9590; subsequently observed daily 1500-1550, varying to 9589.3. Hostile to Khomeyni; a typical transmis-

sion consists of an opening anmt, anthem, commentary, news, press review and closing anmt with anthem. All interspersed with Iranian mx (WBI 5/6) 9590 blocked in Europe (Bloch) Matching above details was an ad in the 22/5 newspaper 'ARA' which describes itself as the 'organ of the Liberation Army of Iran'. It invited listeners to tune into the 'genuine' voice of Iran, daily at 1930 Tehran time on 31.3m, 9.59 MHz, 'the clarion call heralding the glad tidings of liberation' (WBI 12/6)

Voice of Iraqi Kurdistan (Kurdish: Aira Dangi Kordestana Iraqia) obs in progress at 1625 15/5 on 6253, subsequently observed at 1530-1600 in Surani Kurdish; 1600-1615 in Bahdinani Kurdish, 1615-1630 in Arabic, repeated at 0330 on same fq. Stn supports the Kurdistan Democratic Party and is hostile to the present Iraqi govt under Saddam Husayn. A similarly named stn operated 1965-1966, 1968-1970, 1974-1975 and in 1978. This was believed to be a genuine mobile clandestine operation and was controlled by Mustafa Barzani, the late leader of the Kurds (WBI 22/5) Stn carries i.a. reports on skirmishes with Iraqi govt forces in northern Iraq. The 1530 xmsn was extended 25/5 until about 1705, also to do the same 26/5 and 27/5 celebrating the anniversary of the 'national and progressive revolution' of 26/5/76 (WBI 29/5)

Voice of Palestine, Voice of the Palestine Revolution, Arabic-language stn believed in southern Lebanon, anc'd 24/5 that its morn and eve xmsns at 0400-0600 & 1500-1800 were now on 1270. 1143 appears to have ceased for the time being (WBI 5/6) The VOPVOPR service of R. Baghdad is heard on 9546 ex-9553 at 1800-1900 (WBI 29/5) VOPVOPR via Algiers hrd at 1700-1800 on 9640. Also hrd via Angola 'B' pgm Thu & Sat 2130-2200 on 7245 (Jean-Jacques Bloch, France) Hrd Sat 2130 on 4820 3355 (QTH Africa 30/5)

Democratic National Front Radio continues to broadcast in AR 1400-1600 on 6005 (WBI 5/6)

R. Freedom from South Yemen, hostile to the S. Yemeni govt, now on 9960 ex-9953 1130-1430 & 1630-2000 (WBI 29/5) Confirmed, heard at 2000* (Jean-Jacques Bloch, Paris)

V. of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Oman is no longer heard at the former time of 1830-1845 via SPLAJBC Libya (Jean-Jacques Bloch, France, 12/6)

V. of Free Sahara via Algiers now heard daily 2200-2300 on 9640 (Jean-Jacques Bloch, France)

A Voz da Verdade, hrd on 4950 to Angola 2000-2050* with many IDs by M&W around 2030; pgms in PT (Jean-Jacques Bloch, France)

Voice of Free Africa, previously reported as being off the air, perhaps for good, has reappeared 11/5 back on 4764 at usual times 0400-0500 & 1830-1930 with anmts in PT & verns to the effect that the 'struggle continues'. Opening anmt claims it is still operating from inside Mozambique, and in fact the same xmsn mode, USB with full carrier, is used (QTH Africa 20/5) Last hrd on 9/4, again observed in PT & verns 28/5, following former sked (WBI 5/6) Regarding the numerous S. African clandestines, I think their location is rather obvious: the SABC hrd at least 8 x 20 kW SW xmtrs at Paradys, which ceased operation in the early 1970s. They are now probably used for other purposes; most of the fqs are in-band and similar to former SABC channels (Ernie Behr, Kenora, Ont., 1/6)

Revolutionary Voice of Zimbabwe pgm via Rev. Voice of Ethiopia ES on behalf of Patriotic Front no longer hrd at 1900-1945 on 9560, probably discontinued. It had continued to be broadcast for sometime after the independence of Zimbabwe (WBI 5/6)

Voice of the Chilean Resistance via Algiers being heard at 0000 on 21635 (Padula, RA DX 1/6)

R. Sandino Michiel Schaay, Doorn, Netherlands, reports a scoop in the 1/80 Benelux DX Club magazine--a QSL from R. Sandino for a broadcast 9/7/79 while it was a clandestine stn on 7588 kHz. They filled in a prepared card showing that a 50 kW RCA xmtr was used, and added their rubber stamp with a portrait of Sandino. Altho R. Sandino can now be reached easily by mail at Paseo Tiscapa, Managua, when the report was sent it had to be routed thru a Dutch committee which was supporting the FSLN, and a radio correspondent travelling to Nicaragua. An accompanying letter with the QSL was signed by Martha Regina Arguello V. (gh)

Voice of the Special Anticomunist Guerrilla Forces, first reported by the ACAN news agency, was observed in progress 14/5 at 0214 on 6000 kHz, claiming to broadcast from Nicaragua and carrying anti-Communist material hostile to the Sandinist govt. 14/5 xmsn ended at 0244. A similar broadcast obs 15/5 0114 until swamped by other stns 0255. A R. America report from Tegucigalpa 16/5 said there were strong suspicions that the stn was operating from San Pedro Sula, Honduras. Investigations were underway to determine who was responsible, since the military govt could not lend itself 'to a conspiracy of this kind'. It was presumably located in the Río Piedras neighbourhood of SPS. If investigations carried out by police there lead to the location of the stn, the persons involved would be severely punished. (Ed. Note: the fq and QTH coincide with that of R. Swan). ACAN reported from Managua that the Nicaraguan newspaper 'Barricada' stated 18/5 that a cland had been broadcasting proclamations against the Nicaraguan govt and had been dismantled in Honduras, in Río Piedras on the outskirts of San Pedro Sula. It said a Cuban-North American named Prudencio Nodarse was listed as the person who operated the clandestine stn's xmsn plant which had broadcast the SW pgm. He had also operated the stn 'The Swan' (El Cisne) (WBI 22/5) Nevertheless, the stn I heard before on 6015, was again hrd 6/6 on 6000 at 1043, SIO 333; "La Voz Anticomunista...." (Jack Jones, MS) I hope you heard Chris Lobdell's tape of this I played on RCI and RN DX programs (gh)

K. Antorchas Mariñana & K. 1450 noted on 7081v 13/4 1700-1716 and other times (Crawford & Krueger, FL, NNRC) Both Brigade 1450 and Torch of Martí are old established organizations in the Cuban exile community (Havana Moon, June NNRC)

R. Habana Cuba, a cland on AM 7091v at 0042-0052. 12/4; on 7070x 0103* 11/4, M6W, guitar and marimba mx. This one does not appear to be a hoax--it is a genuine clandestine with a confusing ID (John Santososso, June NNRC)

R. Abdala is backed by a rather large and active organization of Cuban expatriates. Dedicated to overthrowing the present govt of Cuba, the Agrupación Abdala is running a truly clandestine stn from within the US with 5 hours of xmsns to Cuba weekly. This is all funded by Abdala out of its New York HQ. Their slogan "Volveremos" (we shall return) is a play on Castro's "Venceremos" (we shall overcome). Operating around 7080 kHz, R. Abdala has recently established three new xmtr sites after Castrista agents supposedly burned down the stn, forcing them off the air. Abdala claimed this was proof that their signals were reaching Cuba and are 'weakening Cuba's internal security and endangering the dictatorial system', or why else would Castro want them off the air? R.Abdala came back on the air in Sept. 1979, claiming to have four different xmtr sites, with an intensified campaign of anti-Castro propaganda towards Cuba. As of Oct. 1979, Abdala claimed to have carried out over 600 hours of broadcast time, and said they knew they were being received in Cuba because of reports received by people arriving from Cuba who say they are being received well in Matanzas and northern Las Villas. Abdala admits that they are transmitting from the US and it seems that the likely QTH is Miami (Abdala's Secretario Nacional was quoted as saying the Castrista burning of their equipment was 'perpetuado en Miami'). The reason for installing the other three aux xmtr sites is to avoid being off the air in the future should another attempt be made on the stn (or if the FCC should visit...) From a picture of the equipment which was supposedly burned at R. Abdala, it appears they are using an old Hammarlund receiver and a Collins AM/CW xmtr, looking much like your typical novice ham set-up. The antenna is probably nothing more than a dipole and power output around 100 watts. Even without an amplifier they should have no difficulty in covering the distance to Cuba. The fact that R. Abdala continues on the air, maintaining a schedule of every Mon, Wed, Thu, Fri at 8-9 pm and Suns 6 pm (ET) might be an indication of, with our current policy re Cuba, at least a tacit approval by Washington (or even CIA involvement). If you should hear R. Abdala and would like to try verifying it, try this address: R. Abdala, c/o Secretario Nacional de la Sección Cuba Enrique G. Encinosa, Agrupación Abdala, GPO Box 1883, New York NY 10001. Reports should be in Spanish, tho English would probably be OK. This article is based on info in the Jan & Oct 1979 issues of Abdala's Spanish lang newspaper, translated by the author (Kevin Szot, Vacaville CA). R. Abdala (the most irregular of the LVJPC-RLC-Abdala trio) hrd 26/5 0332-0341* on 7076. Audio was so poor that I thought they might be transmitting from a submarine or perhaps a garbage can! Both a man and woman were at mike (Reinstein, FL)

La Voz de la Junta Patriótica Cubana (cf June LN-10 under Abdala) is the correct name of the stn on 7400, hrd at *0200 21/5, 23/5, 24/5, 25/5; on 24/5 the host IDed himself as 'Comandante Víctor Morán', quite predictable format of march mx, anti-Castro monolog; s/off usually around 0225; audio quality the best I've heard yet from these clandestine Cubans (Steven Reinstein, Miramar FL) First hrd 21/5 on 7400v, and'd nightly 10-10:30 pm sked; jammed heavily after first night, but audible partly nevertheless; 200% clipped AM, ham/PTP gear. Theme song is martial/MOR group vocal, sounding like the 'no' song in the PQ referendum, hi. "Tomorrow we'll be happy...", it goes. Ancr rattles on predictably. Jamming is RITY and frivolous SSBers. On 24/5 one SSBer called 'Atención, Supermán, aquí R. Falcón' 3 times, very excited (Richard Stoller, LINY) Hd 27/5 on 7400 0443-0454*, very professional, with impassioned talks by a man about 'la hora de liberación', and 'la Cuba de mañana'. Frequent IDs, mentioning fq, and seemingly nonpolitical Latin pop mx (Joe Tangredi, Las Vegas NV, 27/5) Hd 8/6 0307-0327* on about 7408; short anti-Fidel speech, several uninterrupted songs, 0325, ID and anti-Castro anmt then presumed version of Cuban anthem; very pro sound and very good signal, SIO 444 (Mike MacCollum IN) Hd almost every night 0200 on 7380-7400v, also IDing as La Voz de la República Patriótica Cubana; often has imperfect modulation. 29/5 0208 this was on 7380 at the same time that R. Libertad Cubana 'Comandante David' was on 7090 working hams. 5/6 0225 usual s/off anmt but they stayed on with various LA mx and periodic IDs; 6/6 s/on half an hour late, and stayed on with mx, IDs after 0300 s/off (SWNS) Measured here around 7399.8, 20/6 0205 ID with theme mx by Dvořák, 0216 march, 0219 said would be back at 11 pm with 'Ventana al Mundo' pgm; audio cut leaving weaker audio gradually increasing (gh)

R. Libertad Cubana 7085-7089v, has transmitted virtually every night in May, *0100v. 25/5, Comandante David QSOd hams for reception reports; talked with ARDs in Costa Rica and Ontario, while announcing 7089 as fq. After extensive monitoring of this, LVJPC and Abdala, I have noticed that all three play the same version of a march with the words 'libertad y verdad' in every verse. They may all be related, or possibly, but not probably the same stn. All three suffer the same audio problems now and then; and I have never heard any two of them transmitting at the same time (Steven Reinstein, FL) Once in '79 I hrd Com. David calling 'CQ Concurso' and 'Libertad contra comunismo, QRZ?' and he was giving numbers to calling SSBers (Stoller, NY) Many of the RLC xmsns are taped and broadcast from several xmtr sites. The 'live' xmsns are from a fixed and secure location. Security is possibly due to Dirección General de Inteligencia (Cuban intelligence service) QRM, KGB trained; there is no apparent concern in regards to the FCC. Several weeks before the exodus of Cuban citizens to the Peruvian embassy, RLC was urging people of Cuba to seek refuge at this and other embassies (Havana Moon, June NNRC) Hundreds of thousands of Cubans gather around their radios to hear his vitriolic half hour broadcasts, at 9 pm Mon/Wed/Fri and 1 pm Sun. Exiles indicate he is heard all over the island, inspires sabotage, and reports in advance on what will happen. He has become the symbol of anti-Castro feelings and is the top radio personality in Cuba (Ivan A. Castro, Miami Herald 7/5)

Numbers 25/5 on 14965 hrd a set in progress 2106-2118* and 2136-2159*. The man gave 4-5 digit numbers, repeated twice, and concluded with 'End of Information', then a high screeching sound (Shawn McDaniel, IN) At 0035 13/6 on 5015a I hear "Natah" said by woman, then tape splice with man immediately saying "Nosista", for 2 mins, then German numbers by woman. I am pretty sure the code prefix words have no linguistic meaning, are just identifiers (Greenwood)

Voice of Democratic Kampuchea, in Cambodian hostile to the govt of Cambodia and to Vietnamese involvement there, is observed from xmtrs believed to be in China: 0400-0455 17705 11725. 0900-0955 15165 11980. 1200-1255 11990 11685 6995 5250. 2330-2425 12450 11685 9470 (WBI29/5)

Voice of the Malayan Revolution is a stn which would bore R. Tirana announcers to death! Good signals around 1500 in EG on 11830 until R.Korea carrier comes on at 1520. I doubt that China has a hand in this (Joe Tængredi, NV) Most reports are that it is in China (gh)

Radio Free Europe continues with an unjammed weekly English 'Commentary' Fris 2050-2100 on 15420, which is only on the air for this xmsn; it is also presumably carried on all the freqs of the Czech/Slovak service on the air at that hour, which are jammed: 7255 9725 11825 15255 17835 21665 21720 (gh)

France The three most political of France's pirate radio stns were laid waste by riot police on a single day last week. Thousands of pounds worth of equipment was taken away. Two of them were run by the Communist-dominated Confédération Générale du Travail (CGT). They were generally recognized to be doing an honourable local radio job as well as promoting their political and labour aims. The third, R. Paris 80, espoused all the current popular causes--the ecology/sic/, student protest, women, prisoners and homosexuals--in a lively programme. The purchase of a powerful transmitter had just enabled it to capture audiences throughout the French capital. It was invaded by 150 riot police soon after going off the air at 2 a.m. Four hours later it was the turn of the small town of Aubry, a suburb of Douai and HQ of the CGT's 'R. Quinquin'. At 6 a.m., 12 companies of riot police surrounded the town. Electricity and telephones were cut off. By the time the assault took place on the CGT 'Lorraine Heart of Steel' stn at Nancy, in the afternoon of the same day, the word had got round and the police were greeted by a hail of projectiles. Violence and tear gas were used to complete the operation. The overkill employed in the three operations was clearly intended to discourage other such initiatives during the runup to next year's presidential election. The State radio monopoly is a powerful weapon in the hands of the Govt (Anne Sington, Paris, (London) Sunday Telegraph, June 8 via Syd Osterman) France-Inter reported 4/6 that police had carried out an operation against at least four pirates /the above plus R. Libre Militante/ in accordance with the law of 7/8/74 on state monopoly of broadcasting. A report on 9/6 said the mayor of Aubry (Nord department) had been charged with aiding and abetting R. Quinquin which had broadcast from his locality (WBI 12/6)

"VOCA" I would like to inform NASWANS of the starting of a licensed/sic/ SW stn on 26080 called VOCA, broadcasting at 0300-0400 daily to Europe (0300-0315), Australia (0315-0330) and N & SAM (0330-0400). Power 100 watts; began 17/5 with 4 watt test at 1600, 1700, 1800, 2100 for 5 mins only. 30/5, a few test around 1500 and normal sked broadcast 31/5 at 0300. Regular sked broadcast began 8/6 GMT and will continue thru mid-August, then in late August the broadcast will continue. Our locations are Ocracoke NC in the summer and near Campobello SC from late August. All reception reports are to be mailed to VBI, International Service of VOCA Radio, 22 Windemere Dr., Greenville SC 29615. No reports in SW club bulletins will be accepted and no reports of less than 10 mins will be accepted (VBI, Greenville SC, 10/6)

"WARG" All these reports concern their 26/5 broadcast (gh) *0445-0513; before s/on they said "hang onto your hats, WARG will be on the air in a few minutes". Played songs 'Refugee', '3 Dog Night', 'Money'; please QSL (Shawn McDaniel, 4645 N. Oakdale Dr., Rolling Prairie IN 46371) Hrd 0600-0730+ on 5957 /sic--you mean 6957?/ Rock mx requests, usual phone. Said QSLs would be sent out at end of June; I won a silk screen WARG T-shirt. Said they were using 'very good equipment' and 'a lot' of power. Said they had callers from California with good reception; the last time they were on before 26/5 was 20/4; only tentative sked possible is on weekends at 0500-0800+, possibly signing on earlier. Reception is very good with improved audio; very little QRM, should be easy to find (John Pavelka, Pittsford NY) 6960, 0515-0830*, strong but modulation not all that great. T-shirt says 'I Love WARG'; in another contest, somebody from Montana won 3 record albums; heard other NASWA members' names mentioned. What is this "FRC" they refer to? (Gary Diekman, Parkersburg IA) Free Radio Campaign, R.D.#2, Box 542, Wescosville PA 18106--via which we urge all QSL traffic to be handled, not in the pages of FRENEX (gh) *0500-0830* on 6955, overmod at start but better later. Said that due to magazine articles (May 18 Newsday, Long Island), WONS will not be on the air again (John C.F. Kegel, Baltimore MD) Newsday said WARG was at Selden, 30 mi E of me, on 1615 kHz. A friend has somewhat incoherent info on a pirate his friend's cousin was supposedly running on a 6 MHz SW freq, with 2 kW. It does seem to fit. And remember how WARG and WONS appeared at the same time? They claim separate identities (Richard Stoller, Old Bethpage LINY)

"WLEU", 108.5 MHz, the FM reincarnation of dormant WLAU-1615 (in the Newsday article--did it ever exist?), hrd 13/6 0100-0435*, very loud, excellent audio, dbx expansion/compression system, even in well-separated stereo! Laurelton is 20 mi W of me (Richard Stoller, LINY)

R. Clandestine Re my 30/3 logging of this stn, the address of Box 100, New York NY is incorrect; in fact according to the PO which returned my letter, the address does not exist. Not only is some of their programming in poor taste, so are their practical jokes! (Don Moore, PA)

"WBLO" noted on 6022a 27/5 until 0230*; easy copy until AFRTS splatter began from 6030 at 0205. At 0207 had satire on SF novel; at s/off claimed a probably fictitious address in Atlanta. All pgms seemed British-produced (SWNS) Hrd 31/5 on 3875 0445-0548*, slick format including professional singing ID, "WBLO, Atlanta". Comedy album, rock. S-5, high quality audio, occasional ham tried to blast him out (Rowland F. Archer, Jr., Hillsborough NC) 31/5, strong, 0433-0550*; at times QRM from another stn playing folk song; 0542 John Wayne imitation (Mike MacCollum, IN)

R. Indiana hrd 7/6 0515-0523* on apx 6250; few songs and several IDs, giving FRC-USA address, SIO 343 (Mike Mac Collum, IN) R. Confusion, LN-13

"KVHF" Tentative, on 6420a 7/6 0747-0756; all I could hear was the mx, and the QRM was too strong to hear even that very well, so I tuned out before hearing one of the IDs which are usually given every half hour, tho not necessarily on the half hour; SIO 222 (Mike MacCollum, IN) Was fairly active Memorial Day weekend; hrd 25/5 on 6420 from 0911, s/off at 0919, but hrd again at 0944, ID 0947; back on again; at 1011 played 'It's Alright', 'Musical Clock', theme from R. Sweden (from 'Midsummer Vigil' by Hugo Alfvén, and 'A Summer Place'; also hrd 26/5 and 27/5 with good to excellent signal and excellent modulation. Please QSL (John C.F. Kegel, 6517 Brook Ave., Baltimore MD 21206)

Syncom.48/41, hrd 25/5 *0357-0418* on 7360, after using 6280 from around 0300 and signing off suddenly after FCC tracer was spotted on fq. 7360 off just as suddenly in mid-sentence (Kegel)

Voice of the Pyramids 1/6 0405-0412 on 6240, pop mx and ID thrice w/fq (John C.F. Kegel, MD)

Alderaan stations: 26/5 Moonshine Radio on 6315 around 0447, good audio, good signal. Heard 'Band on the Run'; asked for requests to addr. in PA. Announcers Billy Bones and Johnny Black heard despise disco and won't play it. Mentioned sister stations Pioneer Radio and Green River Radio; around 0509, a DX pgm with very routine logs of Eu stns. Around 0520, I found G.R.R. and P.R. on 7355 and 7370 resp. Very poor audio, mod on both. Sounded almost identical--same kind of mx and talk. Apologies for tech problems from GRR's Joseph Barnyard. Ancr on Pioneer said they were "broadcasting from somewhere out in the S. Pacific". I'd say they were somewhere out to lunch. Addr of FRC-USA given several times. I don't understand this duplication. If the ABC were smart, they'd pool their energies and resources and create one worthwhile station instead of three crummy ones. Jeez! If not offended by this, I'd appreciate QSLs; thanks in advance. May the Force be with you! (Joe Tangredi, 3180 Bel Air Dr., Las Vegas NV 89109)

IN MY OPINION

(Ernie Behr, Kenora, Ont.) Three to four pages a month in FRENDX

are being wasted on this pirate nonsense, which is of little value or interest to most members of a SWBC club like NASWA. Regardless of what they are pretending to be, pirates and illegal hams are not broadcasters, and should not be confused with genuine Clandestines, either. You have said, 'the role of LN is to document what is actually on the air, legal or not', but I'm afraid it's not really working out that way. Most of these kooks only want to see the name of their 'stn' in a DX publication, and in some cases they don't even need a transmitter to play their dumb, little game. They can get world-wide attention by simply calling gh and giving him a phony sked, as some are obviously doing. FRENDX editors and others who are wasting valuable space and time on this garbage are actually creating and increasing the flood of these illegal ops. The situation is getting completely out of hand, and it is high time to put a stop to it, by keeping all pirate news out of FRENDX (and RCI's DX-Digest). NASWA members are paying their fees for the best SWBC bulletin in America--they have a right to expect 56 pages of genuine SWBC news each month, and should not have to put up with this kindergarten stuff any longer.

(Richard Stoller, NY) We should set up some standards as to what constitutes a real effort, and what is simply sophomoric. How's this?: to be considered worthy of our publications, a stn must be full-carrier AM, play some music (i.e., no stn with a guy talking on and on would be considered) and not cause harmful QRM to another service. Arbitrary? Yes, but the more perceptive readers will note that any system of scrutiny is arbitrary. The system would keep things like 'Illegal hams-6980' out, where they belong. Drunken fishing boats would be ignored. What's left are not the cream of society, but what can you do? Some people may say any system is censorship; but we're not, telling people what not to listen to. We'd just be sticking to the concept, which I doubt anybody is against, that NASWA is an SWBC organization.

(Ed Stone, New York NY) I have mixed feelings about Clandestine Cranny. You seem to be putting a lot of effort into it--enormous. Is it worth it? (Re: Ralph Perry's article in May FRENDX). A political clandestine is worth listening to, but who wants a bunch of Space Cadets cluttering up the SWBC bands with a lot of scratchy rock records, giggling obscenities and idle chatter? Requesting QSLs just encourages them and gives them the only thing many hobby pirates want anyway--attention. I think you could use the space for other items.

gh: This is all good food for thought. Before making a decision, I would like to hear from more NASWAs on this--would anybody defend publishing pirate news this vehemently?

(Robert La Rose, SWNS) Shortwave Radar Notes. During my stay in Denmark (1973), I heard signals on several occasions that bear a very strong resemblance to the description recently published in FRENDX (May). I concluded from the frequencies used and the strength that the source was likely in the UK: I have read that OTHR experiments were being done from Orford-

ness. These signals were very strong in Copenhagen: the bandwidth was variable (even during reception) and was on the order of tens and up to a few hundred kHz. It distinctly sounded like the 60 Hz hum described. On at least one occasion I definitely remember them using SWBC bands: I recall one instance when the upper portion of the 25mb was obliterated.







The following article is published with the permission of Radio Japan. It appeared in a booklet sent out by NHK entitled "HOW TO LISTEN TO RADIO JAPAN" and is probably the best information available on the SINPO code.

HOW TO WRITE A RECEPTION REPORT

Various kinds of code are used for writing reception reports. The most widely used code today is the SINPO code, which stands for the initials of Signal Strength, Interference, Noise, Propagation Disturbance and Overall Rating. Each item is classified into five scales. Best is given as 5, and worst as 1. For example, 5 in Item "S" means the signals received are fairly powerful. 1 in Item "S" means signals are barely audible. Likewise, 5 in Item "I" means no interference, and 1 extreme interference. All these are shown in the table below.

In entering a reception report using the SINPO Code, you are asked to begin with Item "O", which indicates how clearly the broadcast you are listening to is audible. Each of the five scales in this item can be given as follows:

5. Excellent. Comparable to the reception of local broadcasts.
4. Good. Speech intelligible, perfectly and easily.
3. Fair. With some effort speech is intelligible.
2. Poor. With considerable effort speech is intelligible.
1. Unusable. Barely audible.
- X. Entirely inaudible.

Here are some examples of entry:

If you think reception conditions were perfect, then you write in 5 out-right in each of the S, I, N, and P columns as in the "O" column:

SINPO
55555

If you think they were good, you write 4 in the "O" column, and think over the reason why you could not give the best marks. Although you have no measure you may think the signal is strong enough and there is no static or fading, but you cannot give full marks as there is a slight interference from another station between speech. In that case the form should be filled in thusly:

SINPO
54554

If you think the reception was not good and considerable effort was required to understand speech, the overall rating will be 2. Then let us investigate the reason why you have given a 2. The signal does not seem to be so strong and the interference is heavy; in addition there is some fading which introduces some noise. If this is the case, you should complete it thus:

SINPO
32332

NASWA ABBREVIATIONS

The following abbreviations are the ones most often used, especially by the Log Report editors. Though it might be desirable to spell out words rather than to abbreviate, the use of abbreviations permits the inclusion of more items in the space available. When reporting, you can also use the same abbreviations, but feel free to write out anything that might be ambiguous. All the times used in FRENDX, except where otherwise indicated, are in the 24-hour GMT (Greenwich Mean Time) system.



Hi all! This time I have a real treat. For around 2 months or so, I have had the pleasure of writing back and forth with W. Conrad Richardson of Lynchburg Va. When it comes to describing a room full of accessories, I must admit Con has it hands down! What does he have? Well, let's take a look-see, shall we?....

ANTENNAS: 130 foot random wire with a pi network tuner
5 band doublet (dipole) fed w/RG58U coax. This is how he describes it:

"...I cut a 9 Mhz doublet from the #14 (insulated copper wire), then cut doublets for the 11, 15, 17 and 21 Mhz bands from 4 conductor TV rotator cable..." (paraphrased from letter on 8/23)
19 meter dipole oriented broadside to Japan, Korea, ect.
8 band (yes, you saw that right, 8 bands) vertical, fed w/RG58U coax. (This is a real masterpiece of work. I will quote from his 8/23 letter again, in order to show you just how he accomplished this feat.....)

"For the vertical, I used (an) idea presented by Neal Perdue in the Nov 1975 Friendx (cutting verticals to the formula $234/f$ (in Mhz) gives L (length) for $1/4$ wave)....

Thus the #14 wire is cut for the longest. Neal suggested 46 foot 8 inches which would tune 60 and 19 metres...Take the 4 conductor cable and strip insulation from one end and twist them together. Cut the (cable) over all length to 39 foot 10 inches, stripping 6 inches for an egg insulator. Come down 33 foot from the twisted end and cut 3 wires of the cable. This element will cover 40 metres and 13 metres. The next cut is at 24 feet 3 inches which gives 31 metres. The final cut is 19 foot 9 inches and that's for 25 metres...All of the ends of the wire are soldered together and attached to the inner conductor of the RG58U. The braid of the coax is grounded at the base of the antenna....by 4 copper ground rods. (Conrad goes on to say that this whole thing is hung on a tree limb about 50 (!) foot high!! All I can say is.. .WOW! mja) " What a farm, eh? Makes me jealous.....

Accessories: 10k linear taper pot w/built in on/off switch. This acts as an outboard RF gain control for the FRG7.

Ameco PT (?) preselector (is this the one built for use on transmitters, Con?)

GAR7 digital readout

BC221 Frequency meter

The next thing Con describes is a method for improving the selectivity of the FRG7. He has an old BCR274N receiver (which tunes longwaves) which he uses in the following manner...he taps the 455 kc from the end of the lattice filter in the FRG7 and feeds it to this receiver-which has 85 Kc intermediate frequencies! (Sounds nice- but how is the shape factor on the filters? That's the important thing...mja)....

Incidentally, don't try this unless you're very familiar with IF circuitry. Tap the wrong point, and you could be minus 1 receiver in a real hurry Out of room again?? I have more from Conrad, but not much more from you people out there! How abt it people?? 73s
