

In case some members may have overlooked our announcement in the October FRENEX regarding an increase in membership rates for North American members, we will summarize our earlier comments on the subject.

Effective immediately, membership in NASWA for North American members is \$16.00 per year which includes FRENEX. The optional mid-month UPDATE is now \$4.00 per year. These rates supercede the \$14.00 and \$3.50 rates which had been in effect since January, 1980. We will honor the old rates for renewal of existing memberships under certain conditions. (1) Those who are due to renew between now and March, 1982 may do so at the old rates providing they send their payment before December 31, 1981. (2) We can accept advance renewals at the old rates for one year only. (3) To determine when one's membership expires, note the number immediately to the right of the name on the address label. If it is 10, 11, 12, 1, 2, or 3, that member is eligible to renew at the old rates.

No changes in membership rates for overseas members were announced, and they will not be changes until there is a change in international postage rates.

All membership renewals should be sent to NASWA, P.O. Box 13, Liberty, IN 47353 and must arrive before December 31, 1981. After that date all renewals must be at the new rates.

.....IMPROVING YOUR USE OF THE WRTV HANDBOOK.....

"We can learn by doing".....True, yes-and we can Learn by Not Doing.

For example...I have used the yearly WRTV Handbook, and after all these many years of using this valuable book, as it comes direct from the publisher, it finally dawned on me, how I could improve my use, and the knowledge to be obtained from each issue, by this easy procedure...

You know at times it is rather hard to hold the entire book, and turn all the pages to find out what stations worldwide are listed under each frequency, or under any one particular band....say if you wish to see what stations are grouped under 15230 Khz.

So now if you have this trouble, there is nothing better, than to turn to the back of your handbook, and carefully remove (do NOT tear out) all the approximately 16 pages listing the stations starting with the 120 Meter band, and continuing down thru the 11 Meter band.

Next, keeping these loose pages in order only requires a small amount of past or glue where needed.

Indexing these pages, for QUICK reference, is one thing you can do easily, by using "10 cent store" Index Tabs, on the right hand edge of some of the pages. I find that six double-sided tabs are required to index from 4825 khz to 17900 khz.

The top face of the six different tabs reads downward (from top of page to the bottom) 5955-5020....then the 2nd tab reads 7100...the next reads 7280-7550....4th tabs reads 9840...5th reads 11995, and the top of bottom tab reads 15245-15550.

All the tabs are spaced evenly.

Next turning all pages FORWARD to show the under side of each of the 6 tabs, the top tab reads 5950...2nd tab reads 7190-7275, 3rd tab reads 9500...4th tab reads 11700...5th tab reads 15000 and the back of the lowest tab reads 17450 all in khz.

But you go ahead and place the tabs where you wish, and letter each tab according. Okay?

It is also helpful if you use Marking Pen, and mark at the TOP of each column, on each page, the Kilohertz coverage starting at the top of each particular column (2 to a page).

Next it is good to use a ruler and pen, and mark a dividing line between each consecutive group of frequencies....such as a line between 7255 khz and 7260 khz., all for speed in logging.

If you prefer, it might be better to place the loose pages in a 3 ring binder..it all depends upon YOU.

Dan Ferguson had not sought the No. 1 job in NASWA. He'd signed on only as publisher of FRENEX. But upon Bill Eddings' death, the entire job, including that of chief editor and administrator, was his. FRENEX was a slicker looking publication, offset printed, sometimes with illustrations, with better and more varied features than in the past.

In 1973, some now familiar names began showing up in the pages of FRENEX. Mac Leonhardt and Jerry Lineback took on editing chores of Log Report sections. Glenn Hauser began a relatively shortlived column devoted to tuning harmonic signals.

Membership continued to grow. Indeed, the increased costs of a printed bulletin almost made growth a necessity. Members ranged in age from their teens--there was even a 10-year-old member--to their retirement years. Some were like Jack Jones, who returned to the hobby in the 70s, after an absence of nearly 40 years. He penned a FRENEX article called, "I Remember When."

Shaw and Charlie Wooten served as Shortwave Center editors in 1974. For over four years in the early 70s, Larry Magne wrote a unique column covering clandestine stations, probably the first of its kind.

It was an era of hobby boosterism. Many SWLs felt that what was needed was to promote the hobby, to tell non-DXers about the fun of the whole thing. Some set up displays in supermarkets and libraries, showing QSLs from exotic lands to whomever seemed interested. Others sought publicity via their local radio or TV station. One time ANARC executive secretary Al Reynolds wrote a feature for FRENEX called, "The SWL AS His Own Publicity Man."

It was generally accepted that promoting the hobby was the right thing to do. We wanted more people to know the joys of shortwave listening.

We didn't realize that there could be too much of a good thing. But that's what happened in Japan in the mid-70s. A brushfire-like SWL boom, a phenomenon similar to the U.S. CB craze, brought millions to the hobby of listening--and collecting QSLs. The QSL quest, though, so burdened many of the international broadcasting stations, that they were forced to severely cut back their verification efforts. We are still living with the problems born of the Japanese SWLing boom, which has largely died out now.

A plus, however, was that the huge, though shortlived, market prompted Japanese receiver manufacturers to design and construct a wide variety of new SW receivers, in all price ranges. Today we are benefiting from this development. Before the "boom," U.S. SWLs had few new receivers to choose from. Old line American manufacturers like Hammarlund, Hallicrafters, National had either gone out of business or stopped making equipment suitable for hobbists.

But as NASWA moved into 1975, a new era was beginning. The first step was taken in March, when Mac Leonhardt became "coordinator" of the editorial staff. This was followed in May by Ferguson's decision to turn the club over to new hands. Leonhardt's duties were expended. Mac began the club administrator, largely responsible for operations of a club that had grown to nearly 1,000 members. Alan Mayer of Illinois assumed the other half of the job, that of publisher.

There were some editorial changes in the next several months. Hauset replaced Dan Jamison as Listeners' Notebook editor, a post he retains today, of course. Lineback took over the position of Short Wave Center editor from Wooten. William Oliver began editing the QSL section. After nearly a decade of editing the Flash Sheet, Al Niblack stepped down. He was followed by Ralph Berry, John Moritz and in June 1977, by Tom Alleman.

A new guidebook, "DXing According to NASWA," compiled by Shaw, first came out in the fall of 1975. It has since gone through several printings and remains a good basic text for novice SWLs.

At the end of 1975, the membership fee for NASWA was \$13 and membership was approaching 1,200.

With so large a membership, and an accompanying large treasury, it seemed that the old NASWA constitution, long forgotten, had passed by a 10 to 1 membership vote margin.

It vested control of the club in a three member board, which was

later amended to five members.

Then, with the coming of 1977, some fairly serious problems developed within NASWA.

If I do not go into great detail, it is because 1977 is not so long ago, and there are still tender spots, not yet ready for very much probing.

Basically, though, there were three unrelated matters that all came to a head about the same time.

The first involved NASWA's satirical columnist, the anonymous Charlie Loudenboomer.

As recently as January 1976, a headquarters column noted: "One letter this month suggests Charlie Loudenboomer be retired and the space used for more productive information. Surely, sir, you jest. FRENEX would not be the same without CL!"

But just over a year later, Loudenboomer would be banished from FRENEX. The reason was a column CL had written, a broad and not too kind parody of a "pat-me-on-the-back" autobiographical article a member from Idaho had written for FRENEX a few months earlier. The parodied member was irate at being the target of CL's wicked pen, angrily wrote headquarters, then resigned from the club. An unbridled Loudenboomer, whose identity was not even known to headquarters, had to go.

Loudenboomer's fans rallied to his defense. There was an attempt to reach an accommodation, but CL had by then vanished, never to identify himself or return to FRENEX.

A second issue of early 1977, stemmed from a set of editorial guidelines offered by Shaw, a member of the executive council. They, in turn, had been prompted by the appearance of some "four letter words" and frank commentary by some members in a Listeners' Notebook featurette called "In My Opinion."

Several editors responded negatively to what was viewed by them as a dictatorial control of sub-editors. There was considerable sound and fury, a resignation by an editor, an alteration in the content of some columns. The ultimate result was that section editors today have a fair degree of autonomy in what they include in their columns, but FRENEX has been purged of language which some might find offensive.

The third issue was one that had been brewing for a long while. It was not easy to pinpoint, though. Basically it stemmed from a difference of opinion between a relatively few old line DXers and a large, and growing larger number of newer members who were more attuned to program listening, SWling, than to hardcore DXing after tough-to-hear stations, or obtaining QSLs from those DX stations.

The traditional view, promoted almost as a matter of faith in the club for years, was that shortwave listeners (SWLs) were just inexperienced DXers. That with time and training, any SWL could be converted into a DX fanatic.

What was becoming painfully evident in the 70s, however, was that there were many NASWA members who were perfectly happy with program listening, who had no interest in tuning in some weak, fluttery SW signal in some foreign language. There were those who didn't give a hoot for collecting QSLs. These were not just inexperienced or incomplete DXers...they just had different interests and motivations from DXers.

Obviously, there were many, perhaps the majority, who found both DXing and SWling phases of the hobby interesting. But among some, at least, there was a feeling of alienation from the club they'd known so long. There was a certain degree of "dropping out," in interest and support of NASWA, if not actually dropping memberships. This third problem was perhaps not out in the open to the extent of the Loudenboomer firing or the editorial guidelines controversies. But it did cast a chill over the operations of the club early in 1977.

But after a couple of years, the dust has begun to settle, it seems. Perhaps, in its 20th year, NASWA is embarking on yet a new phase, one that will see improved cooperation among members and a tolerant view toward those in the club whose interests and approaches to the listening hobby are different from our own. For there seems to be room to pursue individual approaches in some aspects, and work cooperatively in others where there are mutual interests and ideas.

Bill Eddings' motto, "Unity and Friendship," still applies for NASWA as the club moves into its third decade.

AUTHOR'S NOTE: In this three-part history, it is clear that many names have been omitted. There have been many editors who have contributed sections to FRENEX over the years. There are those who have served in other capacities, also unnamed here. I have not intentionally slighted anyone. Often considerable contributions were made by persons who, for reasons of space, could not all be named in his history. The historical interpretations are my own, although I have tried to be as non-partisan as I could be in controversial areas.

THE BEST LAID PLANS

A dose of rumor, a dash of hoax, a package of instant idea mix, a cup of press releases, a pound of unprepared pocketbooks. Mix that recipe together and you have some of the reasons behind the stations that never were.

A review of some 18 years of Sweden Calling DXers bulletins recently turned up a rather remarkable list of these phantoms, including a handful that would have brought new countries to the list. Virtually no part of the globe was spared the splashy "here comes a new and powerful international broadcaster" story.

In Europe, a missionary group announced plans for an evangelical shortwave station to operate from Switzerland around 1966.

The Dutch Catholic Radio Association planned to go on the air with the "Voice of Africa" from Liberia sometime after 1965. Later that was retargeted to 1968. And the BBC from Aldabra Island?

Asia was well represented. A Voice of America relay station in Thailand for late 1966. An international commercial station for Japan in 1967. Another commercial operation that never opened a mike was the "Voice of the Himalayas" which was supposed to go on the air from Nepal. The Maldives would not be the super catch it is had their announced plans for 200 kilowatts on shortwave come to fruition. And good old NYAB in Bhutan talked about playing the power game with 50 kw on shortwave which they hoped to begin on the first of January, 1975.

The Deutsche Welle was talking about a relay station in El Salvador in 1967--they are probably happy they decided not to. And La Voz de la Victor in Costa Rica had plans to subvert the 31 meter band with 1,000 kilowatts. Panama was to be represented on shortwave again via Radio Libertad--a station that actually was on shortwave quite a few years ago and has since vanished from both the shortwave and medium wave bands. A Latin American International Shortwave broadcasting station was announced for Paraguay in 1973.

Christmas Island was a popular spot for awhile with both FEBC and the BBC talking it up as a relay site in the mid seventies.

1967 saw the announcement of a commercial shortwave station planned for Navassa Island and a year later the CBC was talking about two, 100 kw relay transmitters in the Carribean.

Monterrey, California was to be the home of the North American Broadcasting Corporation, shortwave of course, after plans were announced in 1968.

Ah, what might have been! But wait! Perhaps not all of these can be counted out after all. For it was something like ten years ago that the first announcements were made about plans for an FEBC shortwave outlet on Saipan and Billy Graham's Hawaiian station. And both are very active projects with listeners and DXers expecting signals from them both in the next year or so. Who knows, we all may log Navassa Island yet!

IT SOUNDS TO ME!

"I believe that the Voice of America is a great station. I have enjoyed listening to many of their programs and I am sure many Americans would find it interesting. Every American should be proud of it."

The above quotation is from a letter to this editor from Norman C. Grosvenor of Hollywood, Calif. and it not only gave me the idea for, but the gist of, this column for November. Norman's words set me to thinking and I immediately came up with two conclusions: (1) Yes, the VOA is something we can be proud of and (2) We have been taking it for granted; at least I have.

Noone has ever accused me of being a super-patriot and in my career as a newsman I have launched more than a few shots at my government and the men who have been running it, regardless of party. I have seen a lot of ineptly-operated and over-costly governmental programs in my day and, like all of you, have watched a substantial amount of my tax dollars go down the drain.

I don't feel that way about the VOA. I think I have gotten my tax money's worth out of it. I've been fairly happy with the way it operates, what it says, the image it projects and its influence abroad.

Before you accuse me of getting soft, let me say that I don't feel that comfortable about Radio Free Europe and Radio Liberty. It is possible I am being unfair since I don't understand any of the languages used but I have seen enough critical news stories to wonder whether these stations are well operated.

To return to Norman's letter which also praises the AFRTS--American Forces Radio and Television Service.

"I have a feeling," my correspondent writes, "that there are many Americans who believe these stations are only for foreigners and their transmissions are of little or no interest to Americans. They are in for a mighty great surprise. Do they know that these stations are being maintained by the taxpayers? Do they know that these stations can be heard in the U.S.?"

Norman points out that many Americans have a SW band on their sets but never use it. He feels that if VOA and AFRTS officials could be encouraged to publish their English programs in U.S. papers for a three-month trial period, "I am positive they would find the results amazing." (I believe that commercial broadcasters would oppose this kind of competition, especially with AFRTS which enjoys "feeds" from private outlets. Am I correct in this?)

Concludes Norman: "The question is how we can persuade VOA and AFRTS to go along with this idea. The American public would be amazed at the amount of material being aired ---there would be more Americans listening to these stations and listening to many subjects, some of them of real interest to them."

An interesting view but it's obvious that the VOA's real mission is to present an honest, favorable if possible, image of the U.S. abroad. I think it succeeds. Its news reports may not be quite as unbiased as the BBC's but compared to its chief rival, Radio Moscow, they are models of objectivity. They dispense reliable information about our country and, to the best of my knowledge, they don't lie. Certainly not as an every-day procedure. And the VOA can be downright entertaining.

Through programs like Willis Conover's Jazz Hour, the Breakfast Show, African Safari and the like, the VOA has made itself an admired medium of entertainment and information.

I often listen to the VOA and not just to be informed. I find myself remembering VOA programs that have impressed me--like the tribute shortly after Louis Armstrong's death that faded out with Louie singing, "What a Wonderful World!" I'm glad we have the VOA for an advocate around the globe and I suggest that those who don't agree try a steady nightly diet for one week of nothing but Radio Moscow.

A PERSONAL NOTE: Writing this column was one of the last things I did before heading for the hospital for a major operation. This will be the first time in 40 years I have been spent a night in a hospital, the last occasion being when the U.S. Army put me there on maneuvers because an ingrown toenail had immobilized me. So I have been lucky and if my luck continues I'll be back with you for the December column.

This Is The Way It Sounds To Them!

(Feedback from past columns. Don't forget to send in your reaction.)

From JERRY BERG, Lexington, MA:

"Your September column on taped DX is the first I have seen that treats the subject seriously. Thought I'd send along a few thoughts.

"While it is true that one could hold out someone else's recording as his own, such a combination of dishonesty and resourcefulness is unlikely to ever be encountered. And, in any event, one need not resort to such sophisticated deception to reap hobby rewards. The entire NASWA awards program is based simply on the submission of a list containing the proper information regarding the relevant loggings or verifications. What could be more easily falsified than that? Yet I have heard of no such problems in the awards program. The point is I believe that DXers should be presumed honest unless and until one is discovered to be otherwise, and that the acceptance of tapes for a particular purpose should not depend on abuses that are rarely if ever going to occur.

"As one with a collection of hundreds of Latin American IDs on tape, I agree wholeheartedly that, when the DX doldrums set in, past DX experiences as relived are a real boost. Still, if I could have one or the other, I think I would still rather have the QSL, representing as it does a measure of effort on the listener's part that warranted a reply from some faraway place. I guess the best of all worlds is having both the QSL and the tape. Certainly if one is going to all the trouble to write for a QSL, little extra effort is involved in preserving a short taped segment of the logging.

"Tapes are not QSLs, of course, as they are totally lacking in any personal communication between station and listener. However, as proof of reception they are virtually conclusive. I say 'virtually' because I have heard recordings that are represented as being this or that station but that I cannot identify as such from the recording. Thus, any recording should be of a quality sufficient to establish the identity of the ID.

"One step that might be taken would be for a series of NASWA awards to be offered for those who tape. Unlike QSLs, which DXers are understandably reluctant to mail in for checking because of the danger of loss, tapes can be duplicated and mailed rather easily. An applicant for an award could submit a copy of his tape which could then be sent to someone who might volunteer to listen to the tape and verify its contents."

From CHARLES GEORGE, Dallas, TX:

"Since I got my RF-2600 to go with my SSR-1 I have found QSLing less important. Now if I hear a rare catch I would rather have a tape recording. Most stations seem to answer reports as a friendly gesture instead of it proving that they were heard.

"To me if a person claims they've heard a certain station I will believe them since due to the vagaries of propagation they could have. If they are lying they are only hurting themselves and no one else.

"I still collect QSLs but mainly as souvenirs from the station. I would usually rather have their station schedules so I can tune in for my favorite shows from that station."

FROM YE EDITOR:

An offshoot of the above discussion is what makes the best or the most nearly perfect QSL? Here are a couple of ideas, somewhat impractical I'm afraid.

(1) You have the station on your set. Call up the station and ask them to listen for a minute. Then record their on-the-spot reply that this is indeed what they are broadcasting at the moment.

(2) Send a tape to the station. Ask and hope that they will directly comment to the effect, "This tape is of our station." On your duplicate of the tape record an intro with words from the QSL and file with the tape. That's about the best you can achieve unless you have some other better ideas.

On a somewhat related idea it has frequently occurred to me that with tapes of station IDs, excerpts of music, etc., plus film slides made from your QSLs and a text, an enterprising DXer with a little effort could compose an interesting talk and make public appearances at schools, etc. and even possibly earn a little money so doing. In this case they would not necessarily have to be your tapes and QSLs as long as you did not claim credit for them. Has anyone tried this?

"Those #!?!# Little Buggers"

On page #7 of FRENEX August 1981, Mr. David Newkirk made a few cogent remarks about Mr. Albert Miller's thoughts about utility stations on the 90 & 60 meter bands. (Mostly RTTY & Facsimile). In the last few weeks, I came to own a Kantronics Field Day #2, which opened a while new field of SWling & DXing. But I am also a DXer on the shortwave bands, and do mostly my DXing on the 60 & 90 Meter band, so, I would like to throw my \$0.02 in about Mr. David Newkirks remarks. This is what happened the other nite to me.

It was 0335 Gurt., I was listening to TWR Swaziland on 3240 Khz with a fair to good signal. I thought to myself this will be a good nite on the 90 Meter Band for the Africans. Wrong! 0345 TWR s/off. I then went to Mozambique on 3208V. But was confronted with wall to wall utility stations from 3200 to 3215 kHz (3 altogether) I went up to 3232 in which I heard a station but the utility around 3230 was blocking it. Even the 2.9 Collinsfilter didn't help. Up to Radio #5 on 3250 kHz. They were in but with the utility QRM I couldn't make much out.

I counted 22 utilities on the 90 Meter Band but the ironic part was I checked between 3100 to 3200 kHz and found only 3 utilities and between 3400 to 3500 KHz I found none! I wonder why?

So off to the 60 Meter band 0400 on 4910 I caught a few Bars of a National Anthem, and ZAP! a utility done did 4910 in. Off to Botswana on 4845. They were in poor to fair after 15 minutes, I decided to start from 4750 and count the utilities up to 5060 kHz. About 5 minutes I was back up to Botswana, but no Botswana just a utility station. Well I counted 25 utility stations on the 60 Meter band between the 60 & 90 a total of 47 utility stations.

I checked the other bands, 49 Meters: a utility on 6048 KHz. 31 Meter band: a utility on 9735 KHz. 19 Meter band a utility station on 15407 KHz. Well the bright side was the other bands weren't infested with the Little Buggers as much as the 60 & 90 Meter bands. But they were growing roots. 5 years ago 60 & 90 Meter bands were relatively free of utilities. Now the #?!# Little Buggers are running all over the 60 & 90 Meter bands. I hope 5 years from now the Little Buggers don't infest the International Bands (49, 41, 31 etc) as they do now on the 60 & 90 Meter Bands. If so Mr. David Newkirk will have a field day in DXing them.

From 1600 kHz to 3000 kHz there are 28400 HRZ's which are divided into bands for Amateur Radio Bands, International Broadcasting Bands, Tropical Broadcasting Bands, and the utility bands.

The shortwave bands from 120 through 11 Meter bands have 3160 HRZ's.

The amateur Radio Bands 160 thru 10 Meter band (10 meter also shared with the CBer's) have 3200 HRZ's.

Now between the shortwave and amateur bands (75 meter and 41 meter are shared by both) have a total of 6360 HRZ's to work with.

Now we will add 1000 HRZ's to that. For the EBC, Cario etc out-of-band power houses and I don't think Angola's 1kw to 5kw, and Indonesia 0.25kw & 1kw because of their low power would be much of a problem. That gives us a total of 7360 HRZ's

That leaves the utility stations 21040 HRZ's to work with in a 24 hour period.

Darkness does change the band conditions. Take for example: It is 0400 GMT between 2300kHz thru 15450kHz (120 thru 19 Meter bands.) there are 2160 HRZ's. And in the Amateur Radio Bands there are 1050 HRZ's (75 & 41 Meter bands shared with shortwave broadcasting). And we will give Mr. David Newkirk the benefit of the doubt and add another 500HRZ's for the out of band power houses. So that totals to 3710HRZ's.

And that leaves the utility stations with only 9440HRZ's!!!! Poor Little Buggers, not much room for them to work with.

90 Meter is only 200HRZ and 60 Meter is only 310HRZ, a total of 510HRZ. And between the 90 & 60 Meter band we have 45+ of those #?!# Little Buggers running all over our DXing Bands, and they have 9440 HRZ to do their thing!

Well Mr. David Newkirk, I am not blowing off steam, I am just stating the Facts!

ADAPTORS FOR TESTING OLDER TUBES

Most of the tube testers available today are set up to test "modern" tubes. In order to be able to test many of the earlier tubes, one is faced with a minor problem. The majority of current testers will only go back to the octal (eight pin) bases. In the development of the thermionic tube, the octal base rates a modern score in that it dominated tube basing for an entire decade; from the late thirties to the late forties.

Fear not, dear friend, for there is a solution to testing those old four, five, six, and seven pin lamps. Rather than searching through the flea markets, swapper sheets and club journals; you can easily rig up a set of adaptors that will fit your modern machine. The cost is negligible, but the satisfaction is great.

Your parts list should include about eight to ten octal bases. ETCO Electronics offers a good supply of these little babies (009MS) at 26¢ per. You will also need several chassis-mount sockets for WD-11, four pin, five pin, six pin, and seven pin tubes. A UV (short pin socket) base would also be recommended. These tube bases may be scavenged from old chasses, or they may be purchased from oldie tyme collectors. Be sure to purchase chassis-mount sockets, not breadboard, in order that they will be able to be nestled inside the octal bases. This will make your adaptors more compact and appealing to the eye.

The first step in the process is to scarify the inside of the octal shell about $\frac{3}{8}$ inch down from the rim. This will give you a good surface for gluing the pieces together. Your next step is to remove the spring ring and metal mount from your "special" base. The outer rim of the bottom of this base should then be scarified where it will contact the inside of the octal shell. (See Figures 1 & 2.)

Most of the octal tubes ran their heaters (filaments) between the #2 and #7 pins on the octal base. Locate the schematic that came with your tester and find which socket has this pin arrangement. Most testers will have at least two octal bases. One of these will be the 2/7. The other will most probably be 7/8 or 1/8. Whichever tester base you choose, standardize it and stick to it. Make a mark near it so that you always use that socket for your adaptors.

With confidence in mind and soldering iron in hand, you are now ready to do a little magic. Gather up your solder (resin core only), wire stripper and some 18 AWG wire. Take the four pin standard base (Figure 2) and attach four leads to the four tabs under the socket. The wire leads should be about two to three inches long. You should leave about $\frac{3}{8}$ inches of insulation on the wire. The leads should show about $\frac{3}{8}$ inches of wire on one end (for the socket tab), and the remainder of the bare leads is for stringing through the octal base pins.

After soldering the four wires to the tabs, straighten them out evenly (in much the same manner as the leads come off of a transistor). Feed the two leads which are connected to the large pin holes (filament leads) into the #2 and #7 pin holes. The grid and plate leads should be funneled through two of the remaining pins (pins 4 & 5 for example). (See Figure 3.) Work the leads through the pins until the socket is just ready to enter the octal shell. Stop. Obtain your epoxy glue and mix a small amount. Place the glue on the four pin base. Leave a thick layer to assure a good bond. Now finish pulling the leads through the pins. You may have to squeeze the socket into the shell a bit if you left the insulation a bit too long. Twist the socket from side to side in order to more evenly distribute the glue along the roughened surfaces, as well as to work the air bubbles out of the mix. Let the glue set. I heartily recommend 3M Epoxy; as it will harden faster than any other epoxy I've tried (about 15 minutes).

The final task is to pull out any slack in the pin leads, and solder them in the pins. Heat the pins with a high wattage iron and touch the solder to the open ends of the pins. The properly heated pins will wick up a good deal of solder; attach the wire leads; and, strengthen the pins themselves. Snip off the excess lead wire and sand or file off any blobs or drips. (See Figure 4.) Your adaptor is complete.

When you rig up your five (or more) pin adaptors, you should bring your cathode lead down through pin #8; as this was the most often used cathode pin on the original octal tubes. A good number of tubes had a #1 cathode pin and, of course, many of the multi-function tubes had two cathodes; but the 8 pin was the early standard.

The placement of the other grid leads is not a matter of great importance. Most portable testers will have a selector switch for keying in a certain combination of tube elements for measuring the filament emission and grid leakage. Be sure to note which socket pins have been connected to which base pins. In this manner, you may then properly select the correct setting for your tester/adaptor/tube set-up.

The following basing diagrams will hold true for a vast majority of the tubes that you will be able to test. Nonetheless, it is a good idea to acquire an old tube manual from the forties for use as a cross-reference. These books will list tubes going back to the early twenties (although the term, "Discontinued, for reference only." will continually pop up). If you should wish to test a V99 tube, for example, your four pin socket would not work. The V99 has a filament hook-up on pins 2 & 4, instead of pins 1 & 4, and all of the pins are small. Merely crimp the large hole contacts slightly on another four pin socket. Install this socket in a shell with the filament leads connected to pins 2 & 4, and you're in business.

The basing diagrams below in Figure 5 are recommended for their overall utility.




TUBE OF THE MONTH

WD-11 DETECTOR AMPLIFIER TRIODE

The WD-11 tube was developed by Westinghouse in 1922 for the specific job of operating their Aeriola Sr. receiving set. The Aeriola was designed to use a 1.1 volt dry cell battery for a filament supply. The WD-11 was the first tube to use an oxide-coated filament (in order to boost emissions under low voltage stimulation). From 1923 until 1926, the WD-12 was also offered. This tube was electrically identical to the "11", but it had a UV (short pin) base rather than the long pin/large anode pin configuration of the WD-11. The WD-12 was then replaced by the UX based WX-12 which could fit the standard four prong UX socket.

VISITING RADIO CITADELLE AND LA VOZ DE LA LIBERTAD

Rarely reported and more rarely QSLed, Radio Citadelle in Cap Haitien, Haiti and La Voz de la Libertad in Puerto Plata Dominican Republic, were stations I had heard weakly and only in winter--when I heard them at all. A Caribbean vacation, with stops at Cap Haitien and Puerto Plata, offered a marvelous opportunity to visit these two small stations. Fellow NASWA member Larry Gutter kindly lent me his Barlow-Wadley for our trip, and the nights were filled with local-quality latin american DX. It was December, 1978; Chicago was snowed in and frozen, and there we were in cutoffs, tee shirts and sneakers in 85-degree sunshine.

On a tour of the countryside around Cap Haitien, the cab passed 4VEH, its whitewashed low building and towers visible for miles above the fields. Passing fruit vendors and jitneys on the road in the outskirts near Cap Haitien, I peered through the cab window looking for a tower, the logical thing to do if you're hunting for a SWBC station. After all, there was 4VEH behind us, and it had towers. No such luck. As we entered the town, I became disappointed. Our driver's English precluded any serious conversation; I couldn't explain what I wanted to do and hadn't left Chicago with the station's address. When my wife Ellen asked me what the station was called, I answered "Radio Citadelle". Our driver nodded and knew exactly where to take us.

Radio Citadelle occupies the second floor of a two-story building; a small sign above a window indicates its presence. Nobody in the first-floor bar seemed to be aware of the radio station above their heads. As I tried to find the entrance to the station, I saw why my search for a tower would have been useless: there is no tower. Radio Citadelle's transmitter feeds a single wire dipole, 30 feet above the ground, with one end attached to the building across the street. They used 6155kHz.

Most Haitians speak no English, some French, and lots of Creole. The Radio Citadelle staff and our cab driver were no exception. It wasn't much of a visit from the standpoint of conversation, but an eye-opener as far as comparisons to US stations are concerned. The studio was in the front of the building, and with the windows open the sounds of the street are easily picked up when the mike is open. Their record library consists of about 50-75 LPs and as many 45s. With cigarette ashes on them they likely don't last long. Anyone nearby changes the record when a number is over, and the nearest LP is the next one to hit the platter. The turntable was ancient, but the operator was a youthful 12-13 years old. It may not have been the most sophisticated operation, but they all appeared to be having a good time. The station manager appeared, asked who I was, and was answered in Creole by our cab driver. When he heard I was from Chicago and that I had indeed received their transmissions, he was incredulous. Just too far away, he said, for their 250 watts to be picked up. Most of their listeners reports come from Haiti and nearby islands and, rarely, from Florida. He was very curious about my receiver and antenna. I asked about those reports from the United States, and he blithely pointed to the beer-can-filled wastebasket and shrugged his shoulders. Answering those letters is an annoyance, the staff neither writes nor reads English, and, besides, who has the time? Radio Citadelle exists for the audience in and around Cap Haitien, and not much else matters.

But we had a better response when we got to Puerto Plata, on the Dominican Republic side of the island. Our afternoon outing would take us near La Voz de la Libertad. Ellen spoke Spanish to our cab driver and he drove us straight to the station. And it had a tower.

In Puerto Plata, La Voz de la Libertad is a big deal. The owner, Senor Pellegrin, has several businesses including a tavern and nightclub and the station, which broadcasts on the AM band as well as on shortwave. When I heard them in 1978 they used 621B kHz, but the current WRTH does not show that frequency for them. We arrived in midday, siesta time, when only a few office staff and Senor Pellegrin were present. Ellen addressed him in Spanish, explaining that we were there on vacation from wintry Chicago (he grinned and nodded), where I had been successful in occasionally receiving their broadcasts (he wasn't surprised). What sort of radio, he asked, and describe the antenna, too, will you? That done, we walked around their offices. They were quite orderly and businesslike. The studio was a serious place also, air conditioned with the windows shut, and lined with acoustical tile, old, but expensive, Ampex tape decks and RCA turntables. Their audience was the Caribbean, Puerto Plata was a

developing resort town, and this station was right there in the middle of that. Did they QSL and answer reception reports, I asked, somewhat embarrassed? No!

It is easy, now, for me to see why reception reports to the Radio Citadelles and La Voz de la Libertads of the world often go unanswered. Having been at those two small stations was lesson enough. Our letters ask for a response, but that response will never produce any income for them. A government station may answer my letter for public relations reasons, but a small regional station has scant funds to pay someone to write back to me. Once they get over their surprise upon learning you've received them at great distance, a more pragmatic "so what" takes hold. And there you have it. Moral of the story: consider yourself lucky if that little station in Lower Nowhere answers your QSO.

Ever since DXing started as a hobby there has been a fascination with reception of low power transmitters. In this time of ever-increasing transmitter powers used by many international broadcasters, it seems appropriate to muse a bit over a few GRP catches. Back when I first joined the DXing hobby, the stereotypical DXer was one who pulled his share of all-nighters. Listening in that special quiet that exists between dusk and dawn one could hardly help but feel that something special might fall on the next twist of the dial.

Nowhere was this feeling more acute than with the special breed of mediumwave DXer who, resisting all forms of fatigue and frustration, pursued the band on Monday mornings. Back then, Monday mornings were something special on MW as it was an unwritten rule that many stations would be off the air for maintainance and/or testing. You were never really sure what you would hear - the last frontier of DXing, you might say. Mediumwavers took advantage of this time to arrange with stations to do testing in the hopes that whatever station normally dominated the channel would be off. If you were lucky, you might hear a station that you normally couldn't.


These special tests were most appropriately called "courtesy programs" and for a few DX seasons I pursued the CPC trail. (CPC = National Radio Club's Courtesy Program Committee) It was on one of these long, cold winter mornings (isn't it always) that I determinedly tuned into 1510 KHz waiting to hear WPUT, Brewster, New York sign/on for their test. Sure enough, they came on with 1000 watts non-directional on a crystal clear frequency. I was excited about this test since it was announced that in addition to the regular 1 KW, WPUT would be testing with their PSA (presunrise authorization) powers of 56 and 4.2 watts. What an opportunity! I steadfastly kept the recorder running as they dropped power to 56 watts - still no strain copy, weaker but with them playing a Sousa march I was all set. Then came the moment of truth - they were going to 4.2 watts and putting on another Sousa march - thank the Lord for loud music and heavy modulation. The signal took a nose dive and stabilized at a very weak but quite readable level thanks to no interference and almost no noise on the frequency.

A short week later back came a verification from the chief engineer saying that I was the farthest listener to correctly report their 4.2 watt PSA. Quite a thrill for a half-awake and sprouting young DXer.

BRAZIL From the beginning of April to 14/10 I have been intensely DXing tropical band Brazilian DX, amounting to a survey. This is primarily gray phase DXing (± 30-45 minutes either side of sunset or sunrise here or there) my antenna is not bad, but not the equal of a 180' longwire--usually, except during rain its ground-plane aspect (it's much more than a simple ground-plane vertical!) make it quite substantial. All excited talk one day, and all mellow to upbeat Bras another day; many ID 3245 this fq jumping lately with both R Educação Palmares & R Clube Varginha making relatively fine showings in Sept & Oct.
