## INTERVIEW

THE SHORTWAVE CENTER INTERVIEW: **JOHN CAMPBELL**

SWC: I guess the logical place to start, John, is to ask how you found your way into the hobby?

Partly through discovering that an old receiver at home actually had a shortwave band, and partly through an interest in electronics. The receiver wasn't very effective, but I found a military surplus receiver (Marconi RL155, for the specialists) for \$20 soon afterwards, and used the interest in electronics to put it into working condition. This was at a time when there were no Australian DX clubs, but there were two active New Zealand clubs whose publications were sold in some Australian bookstores, and that was where my DX education started.

SWC: You've done a considerable amount of traveling in your work and have, I would guess, been able to DX from a number of places. What was your favorite?

New Zealand, I think, because of the general enthusiasm of the DXers I met there, as well as the standard of the DX itself. Finland (especially north of the Arctic Circle) comes a good second for the same reasons. It's probably no coincidence that these are about the only two countries in the world where you can say at an average dinner party that you're a DXer and find at least one other person who knows what that is (and doesn't confuse DX reception with ham radio) because he or she has a friend or relation involved in the hobby or has read about it in newspapers. It's the human environment as well as the rare signals that creates the DX quality - at least for me.

SWC: Where would you like to DX from that you haven't already?

My tastes in DX targets run particularly to countries with a wide selection of separate and independent SW operations, preferably with a home-brew flavor. There are not many countries which fit that description: now that Angolan radio is centrally-controlled, the list probably boils down to Indonesia, the Andean countries and Brazil. My ideal location would be one that could give an equally good chance of DX reception from each of them. In theory that could mean a south-west Pacific island location, though the actual Pacific sites that I know give either good Indonesian or good Latin reception, but not both. Maybe I should settle for Wisconsin. From the DX evidence, that seems to be a hard location to beat.

SWC: Especially the Lake Geneva/Kenosha area, eh? You've developed quite a reputation as an expert on clandestine broadcasting. What brought about this interest?

Probably an interest in languages and current history. It's quite a challenge to figure out what a new clandestine is about, who runs it, why it's there and so on, from the broadcast material itself. Good language practice, too. The European pirates are a slightly different story. I'm reminded of the British Everest expedition leader in the 1920s who was asked why he wanted to climb the mountain and replied "Because it's there". I happened to move to Europe in 1972 when the SW hobby pirates were just getting started, and I stayed with them. As almost none of them operates outside 0900-1300 on Sundays, it's easy to keep up with what's going on.

SWC: The European pirate scene seems very quiet these days from our perspective here in the States. Exactly what's going on over there?

Quiet on some Sundays, maybe, but the stations are still out there somewhere. The all-time high of activity on any one Sunday that I can remember was actually quite recent, at the end of October 1984, when I heard 25 stations. There are threats of more efficient raids and tougher legislation in several European countries just now but these seem only to make the stations operate less frequently, not to frighten them off the air completely.

SWC: Country chasers will want to know if they can look forward to any activity this season from Scotland, Wales, Isle of Man, Channel Islands or Northern Ireland. Any predictions?

The 1984-85 transatlantic season hasn't produced anything very exciting, probably because the most interested operators had bad luck with conditions in 1983-84. But it's already possible to say that some special broadcasts from Scotland and Wales for winter 1985-86 are likely. Unfortunately there's nothing happening in the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man now, but Northern Ireland (one station) is a possibility.

SWC: The status of Irish pirates seems rather vague. For instance, is Radio Dublin officially a pirate?

R. Dublin is indeed a pirate, as is any Irish broadcaster except RTE and R. na Gaeltachta. But "pirate" isn't a bad word in Ireland. For example, the national airline Aer Lingus bought advertising time on a Dublin pirate a few years ago, and the Minister responsible justified this in the Irish parliament by saying that the pirate had better audience ratings than RTE. If you believe the newspaper rumors, legislation to put the pirates out of business is just round the corner, but it has been just round the same corner for 8 years now. I think we'll be hearing R. Dublin on 6910 for a long time yet.

SWC: You've had numerous contacts with the Euro pirates and, in some cases, have actually met the operators. What's your impression?

There's a big mixture of backgrounds, and no one common denominator. Certainly there are people with convincing motives, especially given that most European official broadcasting is a national monopoly or run under much tighter state control than in the USA. (But I wouldn't say that the USA is a radio paradise: try reading "Technologies of Freedom" by Ithiel de Sola Pool, for example). To these people in Europe "free radio" or "community radio" means something positive, including high technical and programming standards. There are some very forgettable operations too, but these usually don't last long and don't make up more than 25-30% of the overall SW numbers.

SWC: What do you think their reaction is to the hobby and DXers?

Very friendly in general, especially to transatlantic DXers. Some of the better stations are actually run by DXers or have programs of free radio and DX news contributed by DXers. They generally understand the hobby quite well; that's also where the SW pirates get the majority of their audience. On the other hand, the stations put a fair amount of effort into their programming too, and the operators are not necessarily happy if listeners merely write in with reception-report information and don't make comments about the programs.

SWC: A few years ago we saw a great deal of discussion on the issue of pirates, particularly those here in the U.S. Aside from some dialogue not much else has happened in either direction. Where do we go from here?

It seems to me that both the amount of US pirate activity and the great US pirate debate have died down in the last three years. To judge by information that I read, most of the stations which are continuing have a lot in common with Europirates and are worth hearing. (Here's a chance for me to say that my favorite US pirate, R. Confusion, was certainly worth hearing and compared very favorably with the best Europirates). If the programming is generally well done and there are not too many examples of cowboy operations or "kids playing radio", the people who appreciate this style of broadcasting will follow it, those who don't will not, and the two sides shouldn't see any need to argue with each other. This seems to be the story of US pirate radio and coverage of pirate radio in the last year or two, anyway.

SWC: A popular opinion is that lack of exposure, by eliminating references and loggings of pirates in FRENDX, for instance, would eventually force the pirates off. What's your opinion?

Even if there is no regular coverage, there will still be a few enthusiasts who will continue. R. Clandestine, for example, was in business before there was any regular coverage at all. Another factor keeping the pot boiling will be the existence of radio clubs or bulletins specialising in "unofficial radio". I don't think that these will die out.

SWC: There seems to be a great deal of reluctance by DXers to contact clandestine stations, since most are politically motivated. Is it worth the risk?

That depends on what you have to do to contact them. Mail is safe enough, as far as I know, but the difficulties start when stations announce no addresses and you have to go out hunting them if you want to communicate. I did a spell of that in Northern Ireland in 1972. The experience of having guns pointed (three times) or fired (once) in your general direction certainly keeps all your mental faculties wide awake and working overtime. I'd only recommend it to the most dedicated QSL-hunters, though. I have other stories of the same kind, but unfortunately not for publication, apart from the occasion when I was asked to stand in for a revolutionary announcer who was immobilised by a giant hangover. The story that I'd most like to tell has something to do with Sonora, and involves asking why the complement of trucks of the Arizona State Highway Patrol finished up one short in 1967. Take my word for it, contact by mail is the safest way to go.

SWC: Your other area of expertise is computers, specifically their application to DXing. What future do you see for the computing DXer?

Not much if the standard programming language for hobby computers continues to be BASIC. With BASIC or with software packages resting on a language like BASIC, you're confined to simple arithmetic, simple record-keeping, and word processing. That's all helpful, but I can do it myself quite easily with pencil and paper, card files and maybe a calculator. Where computing should really pay off eventually for the DXer is in forming and testing hypotheses, say on what to look for if K indices take particular values at particular times of the year. This really needs an article to itself, but I've already written one which makes some of the right non-BASIC noises in FRENEX for November 1983. Fortunately ideas about the most useful languages for this type of computing, like LISP and Prolog, turn up quite often now in "Byte". In brief, to sum up, don't settle for BASIC, and try to get a computer with at least 256K bytes (512K is even better) of RAM.

SWC: Using your knowledge of computer technology, what improvements and changes would you make in receiver design?

That's another question which deserves an article to itself. The best way to approach it is probably to ask you to think of what you would like your ideal DX receiver to do. Obviously there's no simple answer, but you can list performance characteristics in different categories, like selectivity. For each category, the chances are that you would prefer specifications which aren't fixed but which change according to the conditions, like a band-pass characteristic which can attenuate one sideband with respect to another while filtering out interference like heterodynes, or behaving differently for male voices, female voices and music. In other words, the answer to what you need is "It depends...". But that's just where computers come in. The great strength of a computer program is that it can use tests like the IF statement in BASIC to do "It depends" things for you automatically, depending on the data (the incoming signal, in this case). So, computer technology already has the power to support your ideal receiver design. The catch, as Jerry Berg said in SWC last December, is that the DXer is a relatively rare bird, and that the numbers of potential buyers for the most interesting designs may not be large enough to tempt manufacturers to act. But do-it-yourself technology is a possible alternative, as Jack Ferolo has shown in SWC in November. In fact I've done some of it myself already with microprocessors, though professionally and not yet at a hobby level.

SWC: Your work keeps you so busy these days, just how active are you DX-wise?

Not as active as I would like, but this isn't so much of a problem in Europe if you're chasing Andean stations or Indonesians. The good seasons for each of these regions are fairly short, and I can usually adjust my work schedule to fit. Then there are the clandestines and pirates, but these are quite considerate of my

schedule too. I manage to keep up with things because none of these areas needs large amounts of band-scanning time in Europe; I can usually zero in on the periods and frequency ranges of interest quickly. But I'd be grateful to have the time for band-scanning too. Maybe in another 25 years or so...

SWC: What's your opinion of international broadcasting as an entertainment and information medium?

Entertainment, no - at least as far as the large stations are concerned. At the other end of the scale, one more reason for liking Indonesian and Andean DX is the local music. On entertainment, I agree 100% with Jerry Perg and Don Jensen. Information? Well, unlike Jerry, I sometimes enjoy hearing about cement-production statistics from India - you never know when odd pieces of news stored away in the mental filing system will turn out to be helpful, either when you're visiting some obscure corner of the world next time or when you're trying to make sense of the programming on a new clandestine. For international news I listen to the EBC first, though with some reservations. In a more unlikely direction, I've found that Spanish Foreign R. news is quite good value lately.

SWC: I know that you've had the opportunity to meet a number of U.S. DXers, especially some of the better known. What impression did they make?

My impressions are based almost entirely on well-known DXers who have been in the hobby for some time; I haven't met many others in the USA. My impressions are very positive, for two reasons. Firstly, they are very agreeable as people, besides having a respect for information, which is always something that I appreciate. Secondly, and I hope I don't embarrass any of my friends by saying this, I know of no better example of a group of people representing at the moment one particular mixture of social and technical capability which seems to have been specifically American for at least the last 125 years. This mixture is one of the things that makes the USA such a rewarding country to visit and to work in. There are pointers to it in places like p. 383-4 of "The Making of the President 1960" by T.H. White and in the historical chapters of "From Know-How to Nowhere" and other books by Elting Morison, a historian of technology. And even in the ham radio monthly QST during the 1920s. It's stretching the truth a little, but not by too much, to say that, if I hadn't bought a bundle of these at a ham club auction in South Australia, I wouldn't have decided to go to MIT as a graduate student. That may seem like a long way from DX, but for me it isn't - and it helps to explain why I try to make it to US DX get-togethers whenever I can.

SWC: What's John Campbell going to be doing 5 years from now?

The same things as now, I hope, but in some different places. I like having more than one base, so I'd be happy to get back to the USA for a regular part of each year, combining this with work in Europe, particularly Sweden. More chance to attend DX conventions and hear all those exotic Peruvian SW locals!

SWC: Thank you, John, for taking time off from your busy schedule to answer my questions and for being so patient while I put them together. Hopefully we'll meet during one of your future trips to the States!

## The Asian DX Championship Contest 1984 -A Participant's Report

For whatever reason, DX contests and championships are not a popular tradition in North America. They are, in Asia and especially in Europe. North American DXers may have become aware of this European DX phenomenon for the first time recently, when Radio Syd, Banjul, The Gambia, reactivated its shortwave transmitter only on the occasion of the Nordic DX Championship, bringing back to life, for one day, an otherwise "dead" SWBC country.

The reasons for the lack of DX contests (as opposed to awards and certificates) in North America might include cultural factors, a comparative lack of locally-based DX clubs in U.S. and Canadian cities and states (though there are more of these now than in the past), the extreme variation in conditions from day to day and from region to region of North America, or perhaps a lack of volunteer interest in organizing them. Would-be organizers might feel that it would take a lot of work, e.g. correspondence with stations.

This might be true if the Radio Syd example were standard for a contest, i.e. persuading an inactive station to open up on a specified date and frequency and broadcast special material, then perhaps find itself inundated by reports. Or even if the organizer had to ask participating stations to send greetings to contest participants, to broadcast in English when it would not normally do so, etc.

However, the 1984 Asian DX Championship Contest showed none of these complications and was probably quite easy to arrange. The Union of Asian DXers (Sri Lanka) simply selected a number of South Asian stations, on their normal schedules, in their normal languages and, of course, on their normal frequencies, to be monitored by contest participants. At least at the times I was able to receive the designated stations, there were no changes of schedule, no greetings to Contest participants, and--very likely--no awareness on the part of the station that a contest was in progress. Is this how a North American-based contest would operate? Probably not, but at least such a contest, with no correspondence with stations, would be easy and cheap to launch.

Participants had to log the following stations, each only one time out of the two designated time slots:

### Results

If you consider my location in Hawaii and subtract 10 hours from UTC to obtain Hawaiian Standard Time, you will see that I only had one potential chance at the lower-frequency stations. 0100 UTC is 3 p.m. here, 0200 is 4 p.m. With dusk here about 6:15 p.m. local now in midwinter, and not varying much year-round due to my closeness to the equator, there is no South Asian reception on 60, 49 or even 41 meters at such mid-afternoon times.

the other hand, the time segment beginning at 1437 and ending at 1800 UTC is, as it happened, excellently chosen for my Hawaiian location. 1437 is 4:37 m. here and 1800 is 8:00 a.m. I had been a little concerned about that rather late time, when it has already (in midwinter) been daylight here for over an hour and a half, but 60 m. and even medium wave have been staying open in Asia that late, recently, and Azad Kashmir proved to be one of the loudest, easiest logged signals in the whole contest.

At this latitude, conditions do not vary as much from day to day as at higher latitudes, e.g. in North America. There is some variation, but nothing corresponding to the sudden ionospheric disturbances and auroral storms which, in North America, blank out everything from Europe or Asia and leave only a scattering of Latin American stations plus, perhaps, Tahiti and Australia. So, I would call conditions on the contest day (December 29 only, for me) about average.

Let's look at the specifics:

730-0740 Bangladesh. Neither 21460 nor 17800 audible. M.u.f.'s do vary here, though not as much as at higher latitudes. 13 m. was almost dead with just weak signals from Australia and the Asian USSR. 16 m. showed powerful Australia, Japan, USSR, Havana, etc., but no India, Pakistan or Bangladesh. I think this entry was a good choice by UADX, however, as I have heard Bangladesh here around this time. Contest entrants in Australia, Europe, etc., may have received it.

437-1437 Rangoon. 5985 was quite good, an average SINPO 33333, and the time slot had been rather well chosen to include the first two minutes of the English news at 1445. ID: "This is the Burma Broadcasting Service in Rangoon. Here is the news." Prior to that there was instrumental music with a country and Western tinge, rather difficult to report.

450-1500 Nepal. The easiest of all the contest stations, Radio Nepal had 100% copy and potent signals on both 7165 (which for some reason I had never logged before) and 5005. Since discovering it, I have been checking 7165 regularly and can report fade-in times of a little before 0800 at present, which makes it a candidate for U.S. East Coast reception. At 1450 there was instrumental music and at 1451, "This is R. Nepal, the news..." As always when I hear Radio Nepal, there was strong emphasis on "His Majesty the King", and never more so than this day, which proved to be his Official Birthday. (His biological birthday might be quite different.) An extremely easy-to-copy list of Birthday messages and telegrams from heads of state around the world, all very similar in wording, was read out. Heads of State included: "Head of the Council of State of the People's Republic of Poland, Henryk Jablonski," "President of the Islamic Republic of Iran, Ali Khamene'i," "His Majesty King Hassan of Morocco," "The President of the Socialist Republic of Romania, Nicolae Ceausescu," and many other very familiar names. I took page after page of copy, although only three definite program items were needed for the contest.

1530-1540 Colombo. My first blank among the tropical-band entries. At 1532 I noted a trace of instrumental music which might have been Sri Lanka, peeping through a loud, dominant Yakutsk, USSR, 4940. At 1533 a second station showed up through Yakutsk, but it was Qinghai, China.

1600-1610 Hyderabad. Since there was no designated station between 1540 and 1600, I naturally tuned to 4800, specified for 1600, ahead of time, and was disconcerted to find another Soviet there, just when my assignment of Colombo 4940 had been wiped out by Yakutsk. To my good fortune, the Soviet on 4800 ended transmission at 1600, though its carrier remained on and at 1606-1607 there was a 1000 Hz tone test which may have come from it. Hyderabad was audible, and about 30% readable, with ID 1600; "This is Delhi" and into the news read by a female. It was not solid copy, but I could discern phrases about India's President, ministers, Pakistan, New Delhi, etc.; a little more than the three program items required by UADX. There was a trace of what sounded like another South Asian on 4800; this might have been the beginnings of the fade-in of Lesotho, which had risen to huge strength by 1700 that morning.

1700-1710 Pakistan. Not a trace of this station, and yet only weeks earlier I had enjoyed its English program of Western pop music requests in the clear on 4815. One problem was the variation in frequency. I stayed mostly on 4830, as specified in the contest, and on 4815, where I had heard it before. I did hear a powerful, unlisted Radio Pakistan outlet on 4777.5, in a language sounding very different from Urdu, but this was clearly not the Karachi English service required for the contest. It will be interesting, when the results are published, to find out what happened to this station.

1730-1740 Afghanistan. All three frequencies were booming in, including 3965 with the audio hum which marks it as a relay from Soviet territory. I took my report on 4740; at 1730 there were three short, low time pips followed by one long, higher one. ID "Oa Radio Afghanistan Kabul" and into the news in Pushtu. This Turkic-origin language is not as easy to copy as Dari (Afghan Persian), a strikingly clear language with lots of long vowels and many words of Arabic and Indo-European origin. But reception was so good that it was fairly easy to copy at least the placenames, country names, and familiar phrases like "Afghanistan khalk" (people), "Shuravi" (Soviet), "wahidi Afghanistan" (the unity of Afgh.), "Afghanistan Demokratik Jumhuri," etc. At 1738 there was military march music and the voice of Babrak Karmal shouting about "Afghanistan Demokratik"; at 1739 rousing classical music and shouts by a crowd, altogether an unpleasant, militaristic program, the voice of an unpopular regime.

1750-1800 Azad Kashmir. I reported this new frequency of 4790 on October 11, for the first time (in the Frendx December Log Report) and identified it as Radio Pakistan. Precisely that ID was given again this time, at 1755 after the Urdu news. This is Azad Kashmir Radio, but it sounds and functions like a regional station of Radio Pakistan, and the news heard was probably a relay from the central studio. It was easy copy, with mentions of Pres. Zia ul-Haq, "Hakuma Pakistan" (the Govt. of P.), Islamabad, Burma, "wazir" (minister), etc.

#### Entering the Contest

I submitted my log of the above to Gerhard Werdin of Germany, one of the three-Contest Committee, and the one designated to receive reports from outside South Asia. Entry fee was \$1 or 4 IRC's. The other judges are Sarath Weerakoon and the well-known UADX editor, Victor Goonetilleke. They will "take in all aspects of the hobby in determining the winner". I don't imagine I will win, but it was fun entering and I learned quite a lot. I may be the only U.S. entrant, as the Contest received very little publicity in North American DX circles. Those seeking further info on UADX should send along a few IRCs to: Union of Asian DXers, 32/4A Malwatte Road, Dehiwala, Sri Lanka.

## Your First Receiver: A Portable?

One of the most frequently asked questions by newcomers is, "Can you suggest a receiver for someone just getting started in the hobby?" Invariably, the answer is a portable. Although many table-top communications receivers are capable of operating from a 12 volt power source, we'll confine our use of the term "portable" to those receivers that are designed to be powered from conventional batteries, such as "D" or "C" cells, and have a built-in whip antenna. These receivers, which may be considered self-contained, vary widely in their features, such as: frequency coverage, digital frequency readout, memory recall, BFO/product detector for SSB/CW, S-meter or LED signal strength indicator (often doubling as a battery strength indicator), external antenna connections, tape recorder jack, and a sharper selectivity position.

Some features are desirable in terms of utilizing the receiver for a specific purpose: the ardent program listener may find the memory recall to be the most advantageous, while the receiver's physical size and battery consumption may appeal to the traveler. The benefits of these features may not be fully realized by a newcomer to the hobby, who has yet to learn the nature of radio propagation, and how the various radio services are assigned within the frequency spectrum. In this respect, the omission of some particular features may actually limit the potential growth of the budding hobbyist.

Frequency coverage varies widely among available portables, with some providing portions of the international SWBC bands, while including longwave and FM coverage. This, unfortunately, prevents exposure to the unique and fascinating outlets to be found on the tropical bands, which offer, perhaps, a more realistic representation of a particular country's culture and folklore. It's no coincidence that for many, that's where the real "DX" is to be found.

One common problem among the earlier portables, and exists in many newer models, is drift, requiring frequent retuning by the user. This problem has been rectified in some models by the use of frequency synthesis provided by microprocessor technology. This also allows accurate (to 1 kHz) frequency determination, while at the same time, provides SSB and CW reception limited only by the available I.F. bandwidth.

Most portables are designed to provide adequate sensitivity when using the built-in whip antenna. When an outdoor random wire (untuned) is used, overloading frequently occurs. The use of a matching device, such as the MFJ random wire tuner, or the Grove Mini Matcher can, in most cases, eliminate overloading. Resonant antennas cut for specific frequency band, such as dipoles, can also cause overloading, and may require reducing the R.F. gain control or use of the step attenuator, if provided. A small value potentiometer placed in the "hot" lead or center conductor of the feedline can function as a variable attenuator. Some users, however, have found satisfactory reception with the built-in whip when the receiver was connected to an adequate ground system. On some receivers where no external antenna connections exists, coupling can often be accomplished via an alligator clip connected to the whip antenna. The point here is to experiment, and see what works best.

Some portables offer a sharper selectivity position which, in practice, may offer results comparable to some stock, unmodified table top communications receivers. An external audio filter can be used to increase the portable's ability to dig out weaker stations, however, don't overlook the use of the tone controls, particularly if separate treble and bass controls are provided. Communications headphones, while confining to some users, do allow some narrowing of the audio response, and provide the user with a higher degree of concentration on a particular signal, known among old-timers as the "cerebral" filter.

Some may question the use of outboard accessories as detracting from the portability of receivers intended to be self-contained, however, they do offer the opportunity for improved performance for the user, who may be reluctant to invest in a more sophisticated receiver. Portables can be used to hear some very interesting DX,

a glance through the Contributors' page in FRENCH will invariably show listings of members using these as their main, or only, receiver.

Additionally, some have discovered that portables can be used effectively in field day situations or DX-peditions where long antenna lengths and low power line noise are preferable to the confines of the home listening post.

More amazing, perhaps, is the availability of quality portables at incredible price reductions. During the past year, notable examples have been the Sony 6500W and the Uniden GR 2021. Consequently, this cannot be considered a rich man's hobby, and one has to question the wisdom in paying for technology that may not be readily utilized.

Chuck Bolland, Lake Worth, FL writes that International Radio, Inc., Fort St. Lucie, FL has a crystal filter available for the ICOM R71A and R70 available for \$99.00 plus postage. This 8-pole filter replaces the 455 kHz ceramic filter or the FL 44 A filter. This filter has a bandwidth of 2.1 kHz at -6dB and 3.2 kHz at -60dB, compared to the FL 44 A 2.1 kHz filter, which has a bandwidth of 4.2 kHz at -60 dB. Chuck mentions that the filter comes with easy instructions and all that is required is a soldering iron, solder, and a de-soldering tool or braid. The filter is larger than the FL 44 A and consequently cannot be installed on the circuit board where the FL 44 A would be normally located. Chuck says he placed the new filter just above the main board in the same area as the original filter. Results, says Chuck, are impressive.

-- while on the subject of R70 and R71A modifications, several people have written regarding the effectiveness of Gerry Thomas's jumper wire across R 134 to improve the ECSSB capability of the receiver. Some have noted improvement in AM as well, while others found AM performance degraded. Interesting to note that several people claimed to be relative newcomers to the hobby, with little or no technical experience. Glad to see some of you tinkering with your receivers.....

Tubes: References are often made in regards to older, tube equipment that tubes are now difficult to find, with few choices among available brands. Recent advertisements in the amateur radio magazines lists: Transleteronic, Inc., 1365 39th St., Brooklyn, NY 11218; Unity Electronics, P.O. Box 213, 107 Trumbell St., Elizabethtown, N.J., 07206; Rutan Electronic Sales, 164 Mercer St., New York, NY 10012; ETCO Electronics, North Country Shopping Centre, Plattsburgh, NY 12901; Elmira Electronics, P.O. Box 4230 Elmira, NY 14904; and Alpha Electronics, 1365-39 th St., Brooklyn, NY, 11218.

Delta Loop: This antenna, popular among 80 meter amateur radio DXers, was originally described by L.V. Mayhead, G3AQC, in CQ magazine, August, 1975. Essentially it is an equilateral triangle, cut for a specific frequency. It provides an acceptable match to low impedance coaxial cable when corner fed. Unfortunately, it requires a high support.

It is described in some detail in 80 Meter DXing, by John Devoldere, ON4UN, (published by Communications Technology, Inc., Greenville, NH.)


It is also described in the October 1984 QST magazine, "The Full-Wave Delta Loop at Low Height," by Doug DeMaw, W1FB, and Lee Aurick, W1SE. Construction at lower mast height is made possible by slanting the side elements away from the support.

It is also described in the January 1985 Ham Radio magazine, "The Reduced-Size, Full-Performance, Corner-Fed Delta Loop," by V.C. Lear, G3TKN. Reduction in size is made possible by the addition of loading stubs located on the base element, and a vertical stub suspended from the top, where the side elements converge.

--- Some NASWA members have erected versions of the Delta Loop for the 60 meter tropical band, consisting of 70 foot sides and suspended from a very tall tree. (Also 70 feet). The main advantages are broad band performance, and excellent response to low angle signals. Our good friend, Neal Perdue, mentions that it is quite likely the ultimate 60 meter DX antenna.

That does it for this month. Sincere thanks to Chuck Bolland and Neal Perdue, and all the folks who took the time to write.

**New International Language: "American Rock"**

TOYKO—Even though Japanese youths cannot understand the disc jockeys' patter on the Far East Radio Network (FEN), they eagerly tune in to hear real American sounds.

Exploiting the current fad, electronics giant Sony marketed a radio this May that receives only FEN broadcasts. Sales of the 3,500-yen (\$14) radio have been so brisk that many retail stores report they cannot keep them in stock.

Japanese are not listening to FEN because they want to improve their English, but because the station, which broadcasts mostly pop music, conveys a feeling of America.

There are many cheaper radios available that receive other stations as well as FEN. But with the one-station radio, "FEN freaks" can openly display their loyalty.

A spaghetti restaurant in Tokyo, where most diners are young women, keeps its radio tuned to the U.S. Department of Defense station.

The 35-year-old manager said that radio programming on local stations did not provide the mood he wanted for his estery.

FEN began broadcasting popular music and international news for U.S. military personnel in East Asia in 1945. Japanese listeners are estimated to number about 3 million.

**AFGHANISTAN** In its own report on opening of regional radio stn in Jalalabad, Czech rx agcy CTK stated 18/12 that its task'd be to acquaint listeners w/essense & aims of rev'ly govt and to counter slanderous counter-rev'ly propaganda beamed from neighbouring Pakistan. More than 20 hostile radio stns, CTK reported, were being 250h a week of 'seditious propaganda' in langs of Afghan nation from Peshawar and Quetta in Pak, Iranian borderland, and especially the USA and Western Europe. Dangerous step of escalating psychological pressure on democratic Afgh was Washington's intention to start regular VOA bcs from Peshawar, a mere 60 km from Afgh border. It was therefore highly important for Afgh to counter slanders of seditious radio stns. Afgh expanded extent & impact of its bcs yearly. In addn to Radio Seda Vatan (V of the Fatherland) being for Afghans in neighbouring countries, R Kabul had bcs in 5 langs for forni listeners. An enjoyable catch. (Perry)

3901v, new freq, RPD Kab. Karo, Kabinjaha, the peripatent Pemerintah' of N. Sumatera makes another nov. Here since 30 Dec with vastly improved signal which will likely make it overseas. Vy nice clarity, steady signal, though drifts in range 3901-3897. Before this latest HF, had settled for a few weeks on 4350-55v range with reasonable power but horrendous mod. Still among "72 meter band", and probably always will as that's been the "official" freq since that 1974 listing DF uncovered! Sig too good on 3900v as not to be intentional. Often hrd w/lagupope like local version of "Flahdance", Jak nx rlyrs faithfully picked up. ID 0101 on 5 Jan as "Inilah Radio Pemerintah Daerah Kab. Karo di udara gelombang 72 meter band." Enjoyable ads include those for kecap (soya sauce) "Miki Mouse", and the ubiquitous Pepsodent jingles. (Perry)

3017v, RPD2 Kampar, Bangkinang, Propinsi Riau, So. Sumatera. Ditto the remarks on Tembilahan item above -- here's the whereabouts of another one we all thought probably existed. Noted 1 Jan 85 with fair but fadey sig at 0100 (9 a.m. locally), improving somewhat with time. Pgm of lagu melayu, some greetings to listeners. Held to 0210 t/o. A local stn w/a sense of humour; ancr joking and laughing his way through listeners' ltrs, amused in particular by one who tho stn was more excited than it actually is -- "no, no, bukan radio ini Radio Republik Indonesia. Beluas! Ini Radio Pem-da, baik-lah!" (No, no, this station isn't RRI -- not yet! This is regional govt radio, right!) Lots of "apa Kabar?" (what's new?) to listeners in Bangkinang. Caught ID as soon as I found this one's audio: at 0102 OM "...selamat pagi pada pendengar-teman dari Radio Pemerintah Daerah Tkt II Kampar..." (Perry)

2h3j, RRI Banda Aceh, big sig the bad QRM at 12h0 w/nondescript Indo pops. At 1258, YL gave local ID, "Inilah Radio Rep. Indonesia Banda Aceh di gelombang 125 meter..." Don't know how typical the Sumaterans are compared to all the rest of Indonesians, and the Sumateran RPD stns in particular compared to the rest, but I've been struck that the ID-on-the-air is a definite nonstarter of a concept! Best IDs have remained elusive, the partial comprehension would indicate this is a vy interesting stn, not an RPD stn and not a Kotamadya stn, the evidently a municipal stn of sorts. General note: Diers have been missing out on one tool for siting unid stns. While nothing works quite like an ID (hi), every added clue helps. I've been finding that the Assan Maghrib, the evening call to prayer, is a dandy way to determine approximate longitude of stn within the Indo archipelago since the darkness terminator gives you a great general idea. The DX Edge sliderule device is perfect for this. Now, this idea should of course be used with caution, but at least here in Kuala Lumpur, the time for evening call to prayer is scientifically calculated right down to the second, with a big clock appearing on TV screens at dusk, counting off the seconds! Reasonable to expect at least some degree of precision, for Allah's sake, in Indonesia! (Perry) \* URAID BANYU, WITH CHANGING SCHEDULE/SCHEDULE TIME.

ISRAEL A controversy has been brewing in Israel during the last few weeks over the disclosure that talks are underway between US and Israeli negotiators over a SW relay base for VOA which US'd like to set up in Israel. Proposal calls for high powered xmtrs and large ants which'd be used to relay VOA xmns to SU. US first proposed the relay stn to several other Mediterranean countries but they turned the project down. Israeli politicians basically have expressed two contrary views; some say the SW relay base'd aggravate already soured relations between Israel and the SU and'd harm Israel's efforts to encourage the SU to allow emigration of Jews from Russia to Israel. Opposing view is that since Isr is so heavily dependent on the US economically, it's only natural we should agree to allow the Americans to build a SW installation on our territory (Kol Israel DX Corner, 6/1 2254 via Frank F Orcutt, Buffalo NY) Add'l points from a long BBCMS piece: Secret debates on issue held for some time; delegation of senior VOA ofcls had visited Israel. Knesset member Yosi Sarid demanded PM turn down request; told VOI that Spain, Greece and Turkey had rejected similar requests. IDF radio suggested establishment of a committee to study the issue, which in all probability'd mean postponement of entire project for an unlimited period. Original proposal was for stn to serve not only VOA but also V of Zion to the Diaspora. Moscow's RSP&P commented that VOA is in fact a tool in the hands of the CIA. Turkey's Anatolia nx agcy confirmed the US application to set up relay in E Anatolia or Black Sea region, but permission withheld due to relations w/ SU in political and trade fields (WBI 3/1)

1/1 edn of nxpaper Yedi'tot Aharonot reported that rabbis, comms personnel and scientists'd recently been working on establishing a religious radio stn in Israel. Spl assn for the purpose called Shila (Hebrew: Shidurey Yisra'el Lefi Hahalakha - Israel bcs according to the religious law code). Shila'd be a positive and educ stn devoid of libel and w/no "clowning or cheap humour" and'd carry a lot of Jewish songs about moral values, apertisan, totally independent. It'd teach Jewish law & tradition and bc discussions about science in accordance w/Torah, features about family life, nx. Anything conflicting w/Jewish law wouldn't be bc. Already had studio in Jerusalem; not yet decided if commercial, but leading rabbis'd decide this plus possibility of TV. Shila as yet unlicensed, but assn's chairman maintains that Comms Minister already takes favourable view towards it (WBI 10/1)

I suspect NSB was testing phonerline; later that day they had their annual joint pgm with local KZOO 1210 kHz; per phone call it's every Nov 23 Japan time, lasting until 0900 23/11. They had teletalk w/listeners in Japan, DJ chitchat, pop mx and ads--some recorded in HI for HI products but played at NSB studios! I got hold of an NSB rep at KZOO who said thru an interpreter they discontinued the DX show "BCL World Tam Tam"--the only show worth listening to, in my opinion. 

LIBERIA LBS Monrovia, 3255, \*0500 in EG; lists day's prgms, one promising opus is "From the Government Death Announcement Files," others include BBC relays such as "World News" and "Focus on Africa." Also has programs in Kru language. (12-28)

MADAGASCAR In a more predictable move for the southern hemisphere summer than R. RSA's move to 90m, R. Madagasikara seems to have replaced 90m (3286) with 60m, 5010. Noted in Malagasy 0315-30 including US soul mx and on Christmas Eve, the FR hymn "Minuit Chretiens" (known in US as "O Holy Night"). This should be a challenging catch for mainland DXers. 


#### DX-PEDITION RESULTS




