Many of these stations have promised special DX broadcasts. Nearly all of these stations answer in Spanish - some don't have verif-cards or stamps. NOTE: Short wave station COC 6010 & 9590 kcs and 49.9 & 31.28 Mts. was burned and over \$5,000 damage was done. They are no longer transmitting of course.
