Mr. Huber also sends us the following information regarding the first meeting of the newly organized Federal Communications Commission.

The Federal Communication Commission, created by an Act of Congress approved June 19, 1934, was organized on July 11, with all seven members present. Judge Eugene O. Sykes, appointed chairman by President Roosevelt. presided.

The Act creating the Commission, as an independent government agen-cy, provides for the regulation of interstate and foreign communications by wire or radio and abolishes the Federal Radio Commission which was organized March 15, 1927.

The Commission named Paul D. P. Spearman, of Tremont, Miss., general counsel and Herbert L. Pettey, of Kansas City, Mo., secretary. Mr. Pettey was secretary of the Federal Radio Commission from March 31,1933, until it was abolished.

The first meeting of the Commission they authorized that all licenregulation permits, etc., made or granted by the Federal Radio Commission were continued in effect until modified, terminated, superseded or repealed by the Commission or by operation of law.

The members of the Federal Communication Commission are Judge Eugene O. Sykes, Thad H. Brown, Paul Walker, Dr. Irvin Stewart, Norman Stanley Case. George Henry Payne and Hampson Gray.

They also seek to increase the power of the Osaka station from 10 KW to 100 KW within the next two years. Stations at Niigata and Nagasaki will be enlarged during 1935-36 according to the present plans. Japan has more than 1,711,631 listeners who pay a license fee. Perhaps we here in the East will get a chance to hear the Japs now just like we have heard the Europeans during the past year.
