Talk about your freakish reception during the past week, here at headquarters we've even found it a task to hear the 50,000 watters on the West Coast since Sunday morning. This condition is indeed very unusual and we are at a loss to be able to explain it.

Last week we promised you that we would tell you of the contents of the letter which we received from the National Bureau of Standardss with reference to those test programs which are being transmitted several times each week. Therefore we shall quote a portion of that letter.

"On account of increases of power and other improvements at the participating transmitting stations in Europe, it appears that the European transmissions can be heard and measured much more consistently than during previous winters. The Bureau has been able to record these transmissions regularly up to date.

The Bureau will be interested in reciving reports of your observations on these or other broadcast transmissions over great distances, especially if you can give a reasonable estimate of the field intensity or relative field intensities of the stations observed. It is of special interest to have observations over paths of different maximum latitudes. Transpacific observations to compare with the transatlantic measurements would be very interesting".

Hence we find that we are to be afforded the opportunity to be of service to the National Bureau of Standards. Send in your reports on your observations, we are certain that they will be very much appreciated. According to a note in this week's NNRC Bulletin, we note that someone says that the Argentine stations are to test for the United States Government the third Friday morning of each month from 2:00-3:30 A.M., E.S.T. However the letter received from the Bureau does not mention anything in connection with any such tests, but it might be worth your while to watch for anything resembling tests of this kind from the Argentinian stations.

Last week at least two more new stations took the air in a series of test programs, during which time they anticipate experimenting with their new transmitters. KOBH, 1370 kcs., Rapid City, S. D. were heard testing on Friday morning, Nov. 27 and KTEM, 1370 kcs., Temple, Texas were heard on Sunday morning, Nov. 29. We would suggest that you all keep close tabs on this particular frequency for some future tests from these two stations.

Miles I. Hart, one of our CPCers who recently moved to Cary, North Carolina reports that KAST, Astoria, Ore. will dedicate their December chack to our members. They will be on Dec. 8 from 5:10 to 5:30 A.M., EST. He says that KRKO, 1370 kcs., Everett, Wash, has also promised to dedicat one of their future checks to the members of our club, although no specific date has been set, although from the tone of their letter, we would not be surprised to see it be the December test.

Joe Decker, our Hamilton, Ohio CPCer, and Vice President advises us that he has secured promise of the KXO frequency check for the month of December. KXO are located in El Centro, Calif. It is needless for us to again say that we hope that you will all make an effort to be on hand to hear these dedications and then send in your reports, out of appreciation for what the station has done for our alub

To many Short Tave listeners, the collection of Verification cards from the various stations throughout the world, is but one of the many interesting features of this interesting pastime. Many stations put out beautifully printed verification cards of all sizes shapes and colors, and are very prized by those who own them. To assure the reception of Verification cards from Short Wave stations in Foreign lands, it is absolutely essential that you include with your report of reception of said station, an International Reply Coupon that is obtainable from your own local post office for 9%. These coupons are acceptable in practically every country of the world, and provides a convenient means of including return postage.

The Real short wave listening season is upon us right at present, and many persons will be contemplating the purchase of a new receiver. For those interested in Short Wave reception, the selection of the right instrument is highly important. A new development has recently appeared on the market that all present and prospective Short Wave enthusiasts should inventigate. It is a specially designed circuit that prevents the "Drifting", so bothersome with many receivers on Foreign reception. This is the tendency of the radio to drift a little off the station being received, thus necessitating returning. This new development called "Magic Tuning", keeps the radio perfectly tuned-in to the station being received at all times.

Reception conditions were erratic this past week. Reception of signals from the Vest namely Oceania Asia etc extremely consistent whereas the signals from the giant European stations primarily intended for listeners in North America were very weak. Oddly enough, signals which these European stations were primarily sending to the Oceania and the Orient, were heard here better than those that were directed towards. This evening (Sunday) conditions were beginning to reverse itself, and return to normal: The South American stations overrode the European stations to such an extent that the Europeans at times were inaudible.

JVH (14.60 meg.) seems to have abandoned their Midnight to 1 AM daily schedule, as it isnt being heard at that time. Like all stations operating on the higher frequencies, it may have fallen a victim of Atmospherics that have hit all of the higher frequency stations now that winter is here. However, at 5:30 A.M. JVM on 10.74 meg. is radiating a fine signal, but dies out after a little more than a half hour of operation.

A newcomer on the air is CLX, whose announced frequency is 6995 kcs. has been heard with fine signal strongth and good clarity. This station is under the supervision of the National Observatory of Havana, Cuba, as announced. This station has been on code for quite a while, but is now on voice transmissions. Tune for CLX, between 9 and 10 PM EST or if you are an early morning listener, it is on the air at 7 AM., contacting American imateur stations. So far, as known, this station as yet hasn't been heard using musical selections, altho they may of course, altho we haven't heard them using such as yet.

I presume that you all know that GSL is on the air again with its winter schedule from Daventry.

HCIPM at Quito on 5735 kcs. is heard every once and a while. They don't seem to have any definite schedule. It is a weak station, but occasionally puts in a very good signal. They are supposed to be on Tuesday nights late, but have been heard on other nights too.
