Two directional beam antennas designed to improve the short wave reception of special National Droadcasting Company programs in South America and in Europe, are nearing completion in Bound Brook, N. J., home of WJZ and of its associate relaying transmitter, W3XAL. One of the antennas will go into operation this Friday, Jan. 15, 1937, and the other on or about February 20th. The new antennas will function on either 17.78 meg. with 10 kilowatts power or on 6.1 megacycles with 25 kilowatts power in the antenna. By adopting the directional beam type radiator, the effective power increase to which the programs are aimed, will be six times the actual operating power of the transmitter. - Capt. H. H. Hall.
