"Replying to your letter of October 28, no definite arrangements have yet been made for special test programs from foreign broadcasting stations during the coming winter. We have just sent a letter requesting special transmissions from Station LR-1, 1070 kcs., Buenos Aires. We do not plan to ask for any special transmissions from European stations because we can record some of the French stations on their regular morning transmissions. We shall inform you of the special transmissions from IR-1 when defnite arrangements have been made."

Mr. H. H. Hohenstein, Director of station KFUO, 550 kcs. St. Louis, No., advises us that that station will broadcast a special DX program on Saturday morning, December 4 from 2:00 to 4:00 A.M., E.S.T. All are urged to listen in and send them a report on this broadcast.

More than 44,000 thunderstorms occur throughout the world each day. (That not even one day off? Ed.)

The coldest temperature ever recorded was 90 degrees below Zero at Verchojansk, Yakutsk, U.S.S.R. (Siberia) February 5th to 7th 1892. - H. Burstrom

It has been stated that the temperature in our own United States reached the all time low of 66 degrees below Zero at Fiverside, Yellowstone National Park, Tyoming on February 9th 1933.
