

Is the process of impressing the vibrations of sound on a Radio MODULATION Wave. If a sound having 1000 vibrations a second were impressed upon a 300,000 vibration radio wave you would have a 1000-meter radio wave. For illustration if you impressed every 300 hundredth wave with a stronger vibration than the other waves, there would result then 1000 of these stronger waves every second. This will therefore set up a 1000 meter modulated signal. The various intensities of the audio sounds impressed on a Radio frequency wave are automatically toned and regulated by the braodcast Xmitter.

RADIO FREQUENCY AMPLIFICATION is the process of increasing the intensity or strength of the incomming radio wave before it is passed on to the detector. The signal received prior to the detector tube is Radio Frequency and Audio Frequency combined. The function of the detector is to seperate the two and to pass the AUDIO frequency impulses on to the next stage or stages of audio amplification.

AUDIO FREQUENCY AMPLIFICATION is the increasing of the addio frequency part of part of the received signal after itnleaves the detector tube & amplifies the Audio frequency and modulated portion of the signal.

RADIO KINKS

A simple way to clean off the prongs on the radio tubes is to use a plain ink This will leave the prongs nice and shiny and will remove all the eraser. dust and dirt collected thereon.

If you use a pipe cleaner once in a while to clean out your tuning condensers You will probably be supprised at the improvement in your receiver.

When static is rather bad why not try putting your antenna wire to your GND post connection of your receiver and your ground wire to the Antenna post Many new stations may be logged and verified in this manner. connection.

I have found thru experiments that the inverted "L" type antenna is the best for broadcast reception. It is highly directional. The RCA spider web is also highly directional and will reduce man made static 100%. This Antenna is very good for use on the short waves but give me the old "L" type for BCB.
