JACK McKETMEY, Cleveland, Ohio - Sends us his first NPO report since joining the club and says that he hopes he has some news which will be of interest to the members.

He says that to date his list of ver-

ies is 92 and growing almost every day,

Reception conditions here have been erratic but on the whole quite fair. A lot of noise maybe, but my vertical still brings them in. He says he uses a 1937 Eilvertone 5 tube set. His aprial is a 6 foot copper tube erected on top of the house. The top is approximately 40 feet high. He says he has a shielded lead-in fastened to it. He says that this aerial brings in a lot more distance than his inverted "L" type aerial.

He states that he has just received a

fine verif from CMBY Havana. in which they tell him that they are now using 500 watts. This card is very modernistic with blue letters on white. On the back is information in both Spanish and English languages.


