Another week has rolled around with DX happenings aplenty. We'll try to bring you a few of them in spite of the fact that we didnt live up to our name during the past week. A great many new stations are taking the air and they seem to be getting the greatest amount of attention from our members.

WHMA. 1420 kcs., Anniston Alabama tested for the first time on the 26th with Feichtner, Becker and Brackbill sending in cards to the effect that they heard WHMA. Undoubtedly many others NRCers heard them also.

WKST, 1250 kcs., New Castle Pa.started regular schedule on the 23rd and are heard quite well in their immediate coverage area. We have no knowledge of and early morning tests by WKST and beleive that they did not sonduct tests in the wee hours.

WPIC, 780 kcs., Sharon Pa. started a regular schedule on the 25th They are covering very well and are heard over a wide area.

Among the stations that will probadly be testing within the week are WJHL KRBM CKCA CMCP KOME WIBC. If you hear any of these stations on with test programs, drop us a card so that we can pass the information on to our members.

There is atill considerable speculation concerning the spick on 1150. Practically everyone who sends in a report mentions it but few will stick their necks out and identify it. Joe Becker tells us that XEC have sent him a verie. (Note:-Max Demuling also received a verie from XEC saying that the operate on 1150 kc.) Joe adds that he thinks there is two stations on that frequency and that one or the other signs off at 3 AM. Since XEL has been positively heard on 1095 kc., we'd like to make a little wager with any of youse betting guys that the mysterious station is XECL, Mexicala B.Gfa. XECL used 1100 kcs. during its brief stay on the air and had a power of 1000 watts. They were deleted by the Mexican Radio Commission for some reason or other, but we'll bet a wooden nickle that the mysterious is none other than the said XECL.

A Spick on 1400 or thereabouts has the boys guessing, too. We suggest that anyone hearing this station keep in mind the Guatemala City station TGX that is assigned that frequency. It seems possible that this could be TGX.

The state of West Virginia gets another station but we are not advised what city it will be located in. It will be a smally on 1210 kc., with 100 watts and 250 watts days, and the owner will be Joe.L.Smith Jr. Perhaps some of our mountaineer members from the state of West Virginia can tell us what city this station will be located in.

One of the FCC examiners have recommended that WHEF, 1500 kc., Kosciusko Miss., be denied a renewal of their license. The final statis of this question is in the hands of the FCC at the present time and it is quite probable that WHEF will be deleted. Do you have 'em verified.

WSMK, 1380 kcs., Dayton Ohio has started work on a new transmitter When completed the station will go on unlimted time with a day power of 500 watts and night power of 250 watts. Night operation will be with directional antenna so as to prevent interference with KQV. It is expected that WSMK will join the blue network of NBC after the changes are Completed.

Kc., So I know that it was XEC that I heeard on that morning. (Check Max report OM.) Nothing new here lately except WPIC and WDAN, WPIC has verified. Still no WGAN or KSAM verification. Also heard that one on 870 or 860 which some members say may be LR6, I thought perhaps it was XEMO but I may be wrong. (XEMO is on 860 kw. OM but the one that the boys have been hearing is on 870 kc., Note Bra uners, Feichtners, Reilley reports on this one.). Yes Sir them Cubans and Mexicans sure keep me busy tring to keep up with them. Oct.24-56 degrees and raining, bad noise, WIL signed at 3:00am and the Hawaiians good but too noisy to listen for TP's. Oct.25-40 degrees and bad buzzing.LR6 on 870 at 3:25 till after 4:00.Spick covered up KSL untill nearly 3:00am, WFMD tested at 2:00. Eeries in from WJEJ WCOU KITE and WHLS all letters and cards from WPIC and WDAN. On the SW I logged HP5G WWV OLR4A DJO and 2RO4 all veried. WNBZ at Saranac Lake N.Y. sent me a very nice personal letter verie in it they stated that they would appreciate reports and that all correct ones sent to Ray Ebglish would be positively verified. In regards to stations not verifing or sending lousy ones as have been reported I find that if you send a station a report in letter form stating the QSA and R with which they were heard along with two or three selections and a time announcement or local announcement they will send a fair verie and quite prompt. Of course if the average DXer does what a certain DXer told me a few days ago it is no wonder the stations are neglecting their DX reports, this fellow said if I hear a station and it rates only r?3 or 4 I tell the station it was 8 or 9 and maybe they will give my report more attention and by the way this same fellow who reports a few lines on a postal card is one of those who are raising the roof off because of cheap veries. I will admit that some stations do make a pratice of not verifing at all or sending cheap ones. Last year KASA on 1210 kc., was put on the black list by a great many DXers I sent this same station a report this year, a period of 15 days elapsed then I sent them a stamped self-addressed envelope and filled in card, all that the station had to do was to sign it and that they did and it was back in my files within 6 days from the time I sent it to them and by the way it was signed by the owner E.M. Woody. So in conclusion let me again state that if the average DXer takes a little more time and is more sincere in reporting to stations he will find that the stations will do like wise. I heard WPIC on October 20 sent out my report the same day my report reached WPIC on the 21 they sent my verie out on the afternoon of the 21 and it was in my files on the 24th signed by J.C.Mac Donald.
