Report of bona fide reception of Paris, London, Rome, Dublin, Athens Carthage, and Palestine, all on B.C.B. during the past week comes from one of our "Middle West Members" "Two months ago I would'nt have beleived such a feat possible", he writes, "especially out here where the TA's must travel another 3,000 miles overland after they reach the east coast. By patient and careful tuning I landed each and every one for a period long enough to get positive identification and copy plenty of material for veries. I used to read reports of reception by listeners with considerable doubt but from now on I'll beleive anything on this "globe" can be heard at some time or other". A list of the calls, frequencies, and locations of the station heard is given:

Paris, Texas--KPLT--1500kc/s......London, Ontario--GFPL--730kc/s Rome, George--WRGA--1500kc/s......Dublin, Texas KFPL--1310kc/s Athens, Georgia--WGAU--1310kc/s Carthage, Ill WCAZ--1070kc/s Palestine, Texas KNET--1420KC/s

The CPC has arranged for a series of "Mexican Nights" on which the following stations have promised to appear: XERA (840); XENT (910); and XEAW (960),. Let's give these stations a good response as they will look good in any DXer's log book. VOGY has promised to stand by in order to give XERA a clear channel and TIRS will extend the same courtesy to XENT. More details will appear in a later bulletin.

One of our Cuban reporters, Senor Pistachio, reports that all the Cuban stations are now on their assigned frequencies as published in the latest station lists. The Senor says that by mutual agreement practically all Cubans now announce call letters in English on the quarter hour for the benefit of U.S. listeners and are anxious to get reports. They will verify pronptly and some of the smaller stations even send a dime out with each veri as a token of appreciation to the listener for his report.

STATION NOTES: WGY has asked the FCC for permission to reduce power to 100 watts and change frequency to 1370 so that they can get away from interference with KGO on 790- -WPG is fighting WBIL's permit to leave the 1100 channel on which the two stations now share time. We cant possibly hope to give WBIL's service area as good coverage as it gets under the present arrangement say WPG- Will listeners in the vicinity of Pittsburgh and Detroit please check to see if KDKA and WWJ have commenced broadcasting operations as yet? Statements in various publications regarding these two stations would indicate that they may now be on regular schedule.—Listeners in Cincinnati report an unidentified station on 700 kc. using the slogan "The Nation's Station" which puts out a pretty fair signal at times and has been heard as far south as Covington, Kentucky. Can someone help.

The Italian Embassy in Washington, has been informed that the short Wave station Radio Roma, San Paolo has inaugurated a daily News bulletin service over station IBC, which operates on 17.620kc/s at 5 A.M. and over station IDB, 5.455kc/s at 4 P.M. (Herz)

The Czecho-Slovak legation reports that the broadcasting of News in English, heard for sometime past from Prague at 6:55 P.M. has been discontinue, there is still a broadcast at that hour but now in the Czech language. (Herz)

The Netherlands, legation was unable to supply a recent program of the Einhoven stations. The last available program confirmed the news broadcast from there at 8:25 P.M. Sundays, and 8:45 P.M. on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, in the 31 meter band. In signing off from there last Tuesday night, the announcer concluded by saying "Good Night" we will see you again on Friday night, which would indicate that they are not on Wednesday night. The Netherlands legation knew nothing about this however. The Eindhoven station announced that the Netherlands put no propaganda on the Radio and term their broadcasts as Peace Programs. (Herz)
