Oct.12 hrd WKAT R7 using 260 watts. WJRD for a new one R6-8 bad fading. WSOC (RMed by CHCH who was testing. WPRA very poor at 3:28. XEL (?) doing nicely on 1150kc. WKAQ with a beautiful signal approaching R9 at times. WFOY at 4 R8. Also heard, but without enough data to report were WBIG WDAN WFOR WMPS. Reported WKEU who was R6 at 4:28. On 13th WOMI was R7 at 4:57. Heard that Spick on 1400 with hetrodyne behind him, probably from KHBC. Also heard faintly were KGFL and KWYO but no chance to report them Veries this week were WSOC WFLA and KALE. WFLA sent an Ekko stamp on their card. I enjoyed that column"Crazy Ideas for Crazy People"Wish CKMC up there in Cobalt would get the crazy idea of putting on a DX program for the NRC. On the 19th DX was good. A flock of Argentine stations on this AM. Heard LS2 on 1190 R4-7. LR6 on 370 R4-8 after WENR signed off. LR3 on 950 R4-8. LT1 on 780 (5kw) R3-5 in Rosario, and LT3 on 1160 R3-4 in Rosario. One result of the war is that many of the European short wave announcer s are totally ignoring kilocyles and in announcing future programs, are making the definite statement with no qualifications that we are on the 25, 31 or 19 meter wave hand.

This should meet with the approval of the listening public of this country, many of whom are more of lest bewildered by both the meter and kilocycles designation. There are only the 13, 16, 19, 25, 31 and 49 meter band, that would seem to be enough to ask the people to remember. If a listener knows that a station is on a certain band it is usally easy enough for him to fish around and find it. It is much simpler for the people to remember these major wave bands than it is to fog the issue with alot of kilocycle figures. (Herz) (RME)
