Latest varies are letters from KHAS and WDAK, and cards from KVWC and WTRY. Missed out on quite a few during my week away from the dials. Watch for WBLJ in Dalton, Ga. Allocation of stations now set for March 29 1941. (Hope your Well)

DAVID THOMAS-PROCTORVILLE OHIO. (Thanks for renewal) I have the best aerial system I've had in years (18) using uni-directional Beverage Waves. TAs come in regular, also TPs. On 11/3--Berlin--Marseilles--Moscow, along with KGU--KHBC--KGMB, 1-2-4-YA, 2NR-2BL and 4QN-3GL-3LO and others including 4 of which I am not yet positive, but will get them this week end if possible. VOWR 1 on 750 and another on 1000 and a Siam Chinese station. I held Berlin until 3:40 AM and VKs until 7:20 AM EST. In the afternoon I received and identified (noon time) 111 stations in 27 states and 3 countries all on the BCB. Day was warm and bright and temp was 76. Every freq was received except 1180 due to WSAZ. Stations like WKPA and WGBI were Q4-5 R8-9; My log stands at over 2400 verified broadcast stations (as I do not verify SW or Hams except under rare occasions. Received verie from JORK 720 kc for Aug 29th program, not bad for summer is it. Local stations in Huntington W. Va., and Tri State area are, WSAZ (1190 soon move to 900 kc) Call "Worst Station from A to Z"; WCMI--Huntington, Ironton Ashland--Where Coal Meets Iron; WQOW (Huntington--u.h.f. police and 3 mobile units--We Quit Work; WZBH--U.S. Engineers (2350 & 5437.5 kc); WWJF--Huntington airport Burlington O. 236 kc, call sign (voice WWJF) (Code--H.I.) Regarding WUMS. We operate phone only as service demands and on several frequencies between 100 and 60,000 kcs (4,000 to 5 m) Special events or occasions are transmitted on 1560 kc. FIB--OXJ and OXF will be heard during the December holidays, but as it will be a point to point special private broadcast its schedule will not be given to the public. (Thats just a tip so be on watch for them is all) WUMS will verify all correct reports and will acknowledge all letters or reports FREE (No postage required). I do not exchange SWL cards or answer letters, so you may not hear from me again until next year when I send in my dues. Not because I dont want to but my time prohibits it. Heard 2 new ones to-day 11/7-French Equatorial Africa on 11.79 megs and Dakar on 9.40 meg, both between 4-4:30 PM. On the BCB have heard about 700 stations but verified very few. Due to my working hours little time can be given to DXing on this band and it sure hurts to be awake when you know the DX is rolling in. Cards from LRL-1YA and 2NR are prize possessions. Sure drop in any time Carroll, no I have a Scott 23, had the Phantom but changed it for the 23 and am better satisfied as to selectivity. That is the only difference. Ray.
