The 1941 N R C annual convention was a grand success which surpassed all others in attendance. 42 persons traveled from far and wide in order to be in Euffalo over the Labor Day week end. Members who were among the early arrivals, were Leo Herz-Eldon Addy and Fred Borcherdt, they arrived Tuesday evening and toured Buffalo and vicinity. Saturday morning most of the others started arriving and by early evening most had arrived. Sunday morning saw the remainder pull in and what a happy gang it turned out to be. The banquet dinner was served about 1:30 PM Sunday August 31st at Lorenzo's located on Pearl St Buffalo. All the officers for the 1941-1942 season were at the convention except Fred Van Voorhees, this enabled a lot of work to be done right here and one of the things the board authorized me (your editor) to do was to publish a membership list complete with names and addresses for which a fee of 10¢ will be charged and must be paid in advance so to those who wish this list please remit at once. After this list is published all new members complete addresses will appear in following issues so that your list may be kept up to date at all times.

Your Editor is going to ask you fellows to send your reports on seperate sheets of paper and have them contain the real DX news, that is news which is and would be of interest to your fellow members. Stations which can be heard regular and are of no value as far as DXing is concerned should be left out. Reports sent out and veries received by you should of course be listed in your report and any special tests that you know of which would enable others to verify any station should be sent. I believe that a report of 10 or 11 lines should be sufficient and that by using this system we could have a better DX bulletin and not so much space taken up by the regular run of station call letters telling that WBZ-WLW-WGN etc signed off or on at a certain time. On the other hand we dont want the bulletin to become stiff and boring but keep the friend by spirit which has prevailed in the past. The only reason for the above suggestions is to have a real DX bulletin that will be useful to all members. We have just passed a very successful season and the board upon seeing the books feel as if we can go places this coming DX season. (Ray)

In regard to half year memberships the BOARD ruled that this practice will be discontinued and the following system will take its place. Any one sending in \$1.00 will be sent 15 issues of the bulletin and upon reccipt of the other \$1.00 the additional 19 issues will be sent. It has been shown where a couple of times members have accepted a \$1.00 for a half years membership from a new member and had received 6 months membership and had also received a total of 26 issues of the bulletin. This came about by beginning the half year about October 1st and receiving the benifit of the bulletins weekly for 6 months which were 26 in number. When this 6 months were up they failed to send in the other \$1.00 and the club can not afford to issue 26 bulletins for only \$1.00. All 6 months membership now in effect will be as of the old rule and any new memberships will either receive 15 Assues if only \$1.00 is sent in. Therefore it would be greatly appreciated if when getting new members you would try to get a full years dues paid in the beginning.
