MUSINGS OF THE MEMBERS

LEO HERZ-CHICAGO. ILL. First some notes on my antenna system. Am fixing up my listening post. Put up a Utility Antenna System, an odd-looking piece of equipment, 2 sections of tubing mounted on a piece of wood with little insulators connected to the antenna switching system with 20 feet of wire. Put it up so that I can use it if anything happens to my other 2 antennas - the 12' vertical & the 100'NE-SW single-throw double-pull knife switches to use either one of the antennas, or I can use the 100' & one of the 20' together, or the 12' vertical with the 20' or only the one. I have noted at times it is better to use both. My location is not the best and am still looking for something better as I have lots of local ORM, as I am close to the automatic stokers. If and when I move Derick Wharton will help me put up a first-class antenna system. Bought one of the new Direct Reading Clocks - it's a great help in making out reports. Since my last report to the bulletin I sent reports out to WKLX-WEXL(Oh no! -Ed), WCSC, & WJLB. Veries in from WDOD-WFOX-WHFC-WJOL. Not too many new reports as conditions were not too good and besides, blew 2 tubes last Sunday morning.

BILL WELLS HAMILTON. ONT. Many of the boys have reported code signals on the BCB and I have been of late checking up on some of them. On 1230 Kc/s. is a code station which repeats the letter "R" 3 times. Its location is unknown here, but it is definitely an Air Navigation station. Also on 930 Kc/s. is a station using the code call "NRRA" which is listed as a USCG Patrol Boat in N.Y. Harbor (#190). On 880 & 920 are heard 2 CW stations WCI & WSS and are listed as follows with their correct frequencies - WSS-Rocky Point, N.Y. 18.8 Kc/s, using 250 Kw. WCI-Tuckerton, N.J., 18.4 Kc/s., using 250 Kw. (Wouldn't that be 'Megacycles,' Bill? -Ed) I believe Lefty mentioned hearing NSC, well, this one is listed right in his own back-yeard at Floyd Bennett Field, Brooklyn, hi. Had a good time at the NRC Convention and hope to be there next year. Heard a ham in Casablanca, near Morocco say that he worked at an AFRS station there on 1036 Kc/s, but don't find such a station listed.

GRANT BATSON-WESTFIELD. N.Y. Veries are scarcer than the ice-bergs in Lake Erie - WMVG for 3/23 report. WPOR & WKXL in 4 days. Ten reports - WCCP on 1450 testing 4:00-4:15 on 9/9 also WKXL at 4:15-4:29 and WPOR S/on 4:28-4:45 reg. sked, and again on 9/23 at 4:30, asked for DX reports from NRC and other clubs. (no verie here yet.) 9/13 WBEJ special broadcast 4:21-4:36. 9/15 WKLX on 1300 testing 5:01-5:23 and KMMJ on 750 at S/on 7:15-7:30 for daytime report. How I needed this one - tried for 10 years. 9/16 KBIO on 1400 testing 4:17-4:30. 9/18 - WDAR on 1400 at 4:31-4:38. 9/20 - WMFT on 1240 testing 4:31-4:46 and bad QRM from WATT. To Stone - is CHOK in your verie collection - not mine!

BOB GORSUCH-2509 "D"AVE. N.E.-CEDAR RAPIDS, IA. Well boys note my change of QRA. Not much DX but heard WESR on equipment test 9/22 along with WKAY. KHOZ heard 9/23 on equipment test and KFUN on F/C the 24th. Have 14 reports out. Watch for these testing - transmitters will be shipped to WJOR-1230 Kc/s. on 9/13; WQUA on 9/27; to Muscatine, Iowa 9/27, WBET on 9/12 and KAKC on 9/20. These stations should be testing soon. Veries now 1199 and number 1200 just won't come along.

RAY MOORE-MANCHESTER, MASS. Reports out at present to TIPG, HJAN and ZNS(1540). Received a verie this week from LR-1, sked from 0800 to 2400, Argentine time, QRA: Calle Mainu 555, Buenos Aires.
