WJHP-WFOY-WPDQ-WJAX heard 10/8 all nite with reports of hurricane. Veries from WJBW-WLAG-KGBX-WBHB-WHHM-KRNT-WSON-KVOP-WHTB (caught them on 3690 one p.m.). WCCO is covered every nite by CMBZ and an as yet unidentified Spanish-speaker. Cubans and Mexicans coming in all over the dial, but nothing farther south. Would like to have BILL GABRIEL'S address in Columbia, as I'm just 28 miles from there. Spanish letter in Oct 5 bulletin is a great help - maybe it'll produce more veries!

RAY B. "RIP VAN" EDGE-BUFFALO, N.Y. Still no new reports sent out, but a couple nice letter veries in from CJBQ-WABI and a very lousy card from WGES for a report from over a year ago. This verie card was lousier than the one received several years ago. Now total 983. Regarding the log book, since last issue the following names were added - R. Hunt, Meyer, Spencer, Curgan, DeRosa, Barrett, Duggan, Seth & Kirk(2). They should be in your hands the latter part of this month. However it is asked that no others send in as the deadline has been reached here and it is not known how many extra will be printed.

HERB CAMPBELL-ATHENS, PENNA. A few veries in since last report - WEHB, WCHA, WKAY, WJTN, WHIO, WMGR, WSLs. Only a snatch of the first mentioned was heard so sent a SWL card with no request for verification or return postage. Verie by return mail! To Bill Wells, I don't think that I ever heard any CW on the BCB which wasn't a long wave harmonic, or something picked up by the I.F. channel. Though over 200 miles from the sea the ship sigs are sometimes ear-splitting, and we are only 15 miles from the beacon EA, and right on the beam, with a mess of other ones pointed in our general direction. Va., on 1340 Kc/s. with an Equipment test on 10/10 from 1:54 to 2:04 a.m. S/off. WCCO and WMOA have also been heard at 6:30 a.m. s/on and will try to dig them later. WMOU goes on regular sked 10/14. CHEF's DX on 10/12 from 2 to 3 a.m. came in R9 with Gen. Mgr. Jacques A. Thivierge at the mike. The pages of "Changes in Station Data" is swell and I hope that it will be a regular feature. KVOC heard testing tone on 1230 Kc/s. Oct. 8 from 3 a.m. on. Same morning WRHP Tallahassee Fla. tested on 1450. KSIL, 1340 Kc/s. heard testing Sept. 23 from 3:35 to 3:47 so they are on reg. sked now. KVET started Oct. 1 on reg. sked. Had pleasant visit from Len Kruse last Sat. and a good time was had., though short. Len had pleasure of hearing KGFY for first time. Hope you can come back again, Len. KHOZ sent swell letterhead signed by CE Loren Watkins, Jr.

DR. JOHN W. KIRK-POINT PLEASANT, W. VA. Was in Montgomery, W. Va. last night. Went out to the station WMON and parked my car about 25' from their antenna directly under their coaxial cable which they use to feed it, from their transmitter. At this location their signal was very weak, and there was considerable interference on it from some station that signed off at 11:21 p.m. with the National Anthem. Who is it that signed off on 10/11 at 11:21 p.m. on 1340 Kc/s. that was putting such a wallop signal into Montgomery? Driving a short distance (50' or so) WMON completely took over 1340 Kc/s. He seems to put in a very strong signal with no interference for about 3 miles from his transmitter at night, and some sort of signal for nearly 7 miles. Beyond this not a peep could be hrd from WMON. Considering his location I don't see how he gets out at all. He is completely surrounded by mountains on all sides, and his antenna is only a fraction of the height of them. Several buildings in Montgomery are as tall as his tower. Its height must be several hundred feet below the average terrain at Montgomery. I know at my home I can't get any trace of him except on his tests. Got some good DX driving home from there on car radio. KFI-KNX-KFVD-CFCN-KFBK-KPMC and others. Didn't report them though because I was busy driving and it was pouring rain.

SID STEELE-LOUISVILLE, KY It is about time to make a report, the first since last spg. No early morning DX at all during the summer months. WIOD-WCMW & WCNT all logged on reg. sked. They are about twice as loud as WCPO who is only 100 miles away and with both of them all-nighters it surely will block the 1230 band in this location. CHEF caught through static on 10/12 DX for the NRC & NNRC. Signal strength good this a.m. but the static really ruined good dx. Veries in from WCMW-WCNT-WKTM-WWRN-WBHB-WHFM, also fm WMVG from last season. Total now 1,126.

NORM MAGUIRE-GLASTONBURY, CONN. Reckon I'd better send in a report. Have been very slow with my correspondence this year. Very little DXing, no TAs or TPs reported, although a couple heard in early Sept. None heard since. Veries in include: KSTT-CHOK-CHEE(2)WIBA, WOLF, WLAT, WEDO, WLBL, WCMW, WIRA, WNBH, WMVG, WWRN, WNAR, WRNL, WCHA, WONS, WKNB, WCNT WAIT(2). Two hold-outs, CHEF & WAIT came back. Both verified early reports, with WAIT another recent program. The signer of WAIT is Earl Withrow, Mgr. For Bill Wells, the AFRS station has been operating in Casablanca for quite some time on 1086 Kc/s. It has a power of 450 watts and is one of the best stations heard in Barcelona, Spain. May have a directional antenna towards Europe which may be why it is seldom heard over here. Congrats, Lefty, on your first issue. It looks mighty fine. Keep it up! (Txn - I'll try!)

He came in at a peak of R5 here. Oct. 14 I was off for having worked the holiday and so I was up all morning, and I added 6 new ones for reports. WMCU was heard for about 2 minutes at 1:28, but he got a report anyhow on his sign-off message. KID was in the clear from 1:30 till 2:00 and I was thinking I had KSRO, drat the luck. WBSR with its very distinctive low-tone whistle was on again from 3:30 to 3:45, and then at 4:15 I bumped into WRHP testing for a new one. At 5:30, both WPOR and WSPB came on for regular broadcasts, and I tried again to pry a verie out of Sarasota. WGFG signs on at 5:59 for those who need him. (Me included. Signal not good enough, with too much day-light out to get a report, but as I'm up every morning (except Sunday) at that hour, I'll keep trying, as darkness lingers longer. WNEL is very strong on 1320 at 5 a.m. sign-on, with all-English program. - Somebody asked about WIAC's sign-on - yes, they do come on at 5 a.m.! KRG was selling Rat Poison at 5:19 - I know a few places I'd like to send some of that stuff! Well, that's all from me for this time - I still like my 23 tube Scott although I've never tried one of those HQ129X sets. I also go for tone quality, being, like Al Maley, a "long-hair." You can't beat the Scott for tone, I feel.
