KHOZ - HARRISON, ARK. Chief Engineer Loren C. Watkins, Jr. writes on a nifty letter-head that KHOZ will join in our series of DX shows, on November 13, from 3:30 to 4:30 a.m., E.S.T. We thank Mr. Watkins for the opportunity of logging his brand new station and trust that many of you members will be on hand. Now this show is going to consist at least in part of live talent, and should be well worth listening to, so nobody miss this big DX. Ralph Johans notified your CPC Chairman that KHOZ would DX and so credit for its arrangement goes to our Ralphie.

WNLC - NEW LONDON, CONN. Many of our newer members will welcome the opportunity to try for this older station, always a friendly one toward DXers. Chief Engineer Walter Tucker, Jr., wrote Ralph Johans that he was interested in a DX program, and Ralph arranged to have him broadcast on the second Wednesday, during the silent period of WWSW and WJBK, the program to be dedicated jointly to the NRC & NNRC. We'll have WMRN, WGKV, and WWSW to buck during portions of this program, but WNLC has a strong signal and should prove easy for all of us. Let's do Mr. Tucker a favor and report in large numbers. Ralphie says WNLC MAY come on at 3.30 instead of 3:45. Calls to be given after every second selection. This program overlaps in part the KHOZ DX, but being on different channels, we ought to be able to hear much of both.

WEDO - MCKEESPORT, PENNA. Here is a hard-to-get Daytime station honoring us with a special program. Mr. E. J. Patrick of WEDO says that the program will consist of recorded selections, dedications, publicity of coming tips, and that they will broadcast a brief history of McKeesport. Mr. Patrick also says that WEDO was gratified by the numerous letters they received from members of this club during their week or so of equipment test programs. David also says about some of the others in this list: 1150 XEJS Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. 500 w. "We do not have that station there." 1270 - XEOH Camargo, Chih., 150 w. Ditto. XEJK 1340, Delicias, Chih., 100 w. Has been off the air for several years now. 1490 - XEJR Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. 250 w. "Off for years too. 1490 - XERA Chihuahua, Chih. 250 w. "Never heard of it." 1490 (new) Juarez, Chih. "Have not heard of it." (Thank a million David for this information!! -Ed.)
