CFAR - FLIN FLON, MANITOBA      Here is a station everybody wants! They are located in S. B. QUINNEY, MGR, a region heavily loaded with copper mines, and this affects their radiation, and it should be interesting to try for them on their new frequency of 590 Kc/s. They will be increasing power this summer, and here is a chance to land them with just 250 watts of power. We have no information on whether WVLA will be on, but we sincerely hope not. Arranged by the NNRC.

WCNT - CENTRALIA, ILLINOIS      This is another of the "sunshine" stations of radio, and HOBART G. STEPHENSON, C.E. this hour, is, as you undoubtedly know, their frequency check time. They hope to be able to stay on later, and continue, but that is still not certain. WCNT is a very friendly station, and we are sure you will all want to listen for this program, which should see a clear channel all the way. With their kilowatt of power, they ought to be easy. WCNR - BLOOMSBURG, PENNSYLVANIA      WCNR was so pleased with the response to their first S. E. DAVIS, C. On A.M. of 2/14 really had a good surprise in catching 1-YA of Auckland, New Zealand, on 650. At the same time there was a weak station on 730 which could have been 4-YA.
