Here's my first report for this season. I started my DXing off this season (Occober 1 to April 1, \*50) on October 4 by bringing in KPBX with their hurricane reports. Next on Oct. 11, at 2:31 a.m., I picked up WHIN. On Oct. 12, at 4:36 a.m., I got WRCO. Oct. 14 at 3:00 a.m. I got WVNJ, and to date on Oct. 18 I picked up WHIF at 2:48 a.m. and WSPC at 3:07 a.m. All of these are new ones and all time is Eastern Standard. My first new verie for the season was from WHIN, which is also my first new contest entry. I also received a verie from WIRJ which will be entered as my 2nd entry in the contest, but is not a new verie, for me, that is. It is not counted in my new verie lists, but goes into my extra verie log. On the verie they stated that they have a frequency measurement, the second Tuesday of each month from 2:30 to 2:45 a.m., and welcome reports. I received a verie from CKCW for a report sent De.c 10, 1948. The contest looks good, and I jound both contests. I'll try and defend my championship, but afraid I won't get up too far in the foreign contest. The way the Spanish-speaking stations are rolling in, I sure wish I knew Spanish/.I could increase my log a lot.

10/12 - WOBS at 5:30 a.m., regular schedule, and WGFG at 5:45 a.m. Reception poor, temperature 620 for low, over 80 for high. Verie from CKCW DX of last year. 10/13 - WCNU regular f/c at 2:30. KTMC regular f/c at 2:45. WARD with Community Chest Program heard at 3:45 a.m. 10/14 - Verie from WMID cleans up New Jersey for the first time. WVVW and WARD with Community Chest programs. 10/15 - WSTV with football game till 2:40 along with other Schio Football Network stations, WHBC, WDAY - WGAR, etc. Verie from WSIX. 10/17 - WVOP on tone test. Sid Rosenbaum - 806 Market Street - Wheeling, West Virginia Unfavorable atmospheric conditions and a high static level sent me back to be on most mornings. Report sent to KFMO for their f/c of Oct. 18 and had a prompt verie. This one was a folder of photos of Flat River and the "Lead Belt" of St. Francis County. Have several veries from this one, but wanted new one for contest. Sent another report to WCMA for f/c 3:10-3:20 (Oct. 18), my last attempt for a verie from this one. Also heard on Oct. 18 were <u>WENK KLUF WOPI</u>, all on f/c, WLOU on ET and WALB, regular, 5:45 p.m. Oct. 19, KGLU s/off at 2:00. <u>WJBF</u> on f/c, 2:45-3:00. WJPF on their musical check for another try for veria. WCDT f/c, KRUS & WFUN on f/c. On Oct. 20, KSL, news and s/off at 3:00 and WSTV on ET 3:45-4:00. On the same date had early twilight reception of WAPX and KWBU, both S-8. Have noticed a great many stations have cut their f/c's with tone to 10 minutes. Since the advent of the new DX season, have changed my method in sending reports. I try to include some applause for some part of program, whether it be tone, voice, or musical. Of course the tone and voice programs are rather difficult to applaud, but I usually find some way to applaud the way call is given, or mention interest in station slogan. It has sure paid off in many interesting veries from the "Front Office" or some member of the production staff. Have noticed lately that the use of prepared cards is on the increase. In my opinion, a verification to a DXer is small compensation for the service rendered. Stations that have adopted a "non-veri" policy should go without reports. The reports of the DXer is the only way they can chart their coverage. A wide-spread use of the prepared card could be as ruinous as the EKKO stamp in its day. Veries in are swell letter from CJBQ. Says they also received a report from a member of "National DX Club" of Grimsley, Tenn. Letter verie from KKIN says they had a report from an NRC er in Dubuque, Iowa (Len Kruse, no doubt.) Letter veries also in from WGYV WIGM WOPI & KAWT. Card from WLAR.

Len Kruse - 817 Wilson Avenue - Dubuque, Iowa DX conditions thus far in October have been 'poor' compared to reception at this time in years past. The only catches this past week included the logging of CKBI (900), Prince Albert, Sask. on regular schedule 2:00-2:05 a.m., followed by s/off, in the clear on 10/18. The same AM logged KNOR (1400) Norman, Okla., on ET from 2:30-3:00 a.m., with bad QRM from WMIN. The TT f/c of KCIL (1490) Houma, La., added to the log on 10/18 2:45-3:00 a.m., with WWSW giving him a bad time. A new "local" is had at this location, namely WRCO (1450) Richland Center, Wis., giving KWCR, Cedar Rapids, a lot of interference. Believe WRCO's regular schedule began on Oct. 18th. During the past week, veries were received from KNBY WBSM WEEB & WNNT, all in the form of letters. Reception conditions continued poor in this area, so no good catches were heard. Latin Americans were all over the dial, but I didn't have the time to go after them. The following reports were sent out: 10/19 - WJBF (ex-WTNT) on f/c from 2:45 50 3:00 a.m.; too much QRM from WITH & WNOR to hear the DX program which was to follow from 3:00 to 3:15 a.m., according to the Oct, 1 "DX News." That evening CMHD was logged on 890 kc/s. from 7:00 to 7:30 p.m. over-riding WLS. 10/20 - WFKE on its regular monthly f/c from 2:00 to 2:15 a.m., 10/22 - WERE on regular schedule from 7:10 to 7:46 p.m. 10/23 - WCBA from its regular Sunday A.M. sign/on at 7:30 a.m. until 8:00 a.m., with QRM from WORK. Week-daysign/on time is at present 6:30 a.m., but will probably be 7:00 a.m. in November. That afternoon, logged WRCW on 590 kc/s. from 1:45 to 3:00 p.m. for another try at a verie. 10/24 - WKRG was heard through WOR on a brief test from 3:42 to 3:44 a.m., and WJCD, Seymour, Ind., 1390 kc/s/, was heard on equipment test from 3:58 to 4:23 a.m., No sign yet of Aussies or Zedders, and this is usually their peak season.

Hank Holbrock - 6504 Chestnut Street - Chevy Chase 15, Md. I haven't done a great deal of DXing since my last report of 2 weeks ago. I've been hearing a great many South and Central Americans but haven't bothered to log and report most of them. I have also noticed that there is still a great deal of static and hope that it will begin to cease when the weather begins to get colder. The following stations have been logged and writtent to since my last report: 10/12 - WSCR (1000) on regular schedule; 10/13 - WDOV (1410) on regular schedule, WBGR (1370) f/c 1:45 to 2:00 a.m., WMMB (1050) f/c 2:00 to 2:15 a.m., WLIN (730) f/c 2:15 to 2:30 a.m., KTMC (1400) f/c 2:45 to 3:00 a.m., WPDX (750) regular schedule 5:30 to 5:45 p.m. s/off. 10/15 -WDAR (1400) f/c 1:30 to 1:45 a.m., 10/16 - WISH (1310) regular schedule 1:42 to 2:00 AM sign/off. 10/17 - YVMD "Radio Maracaibo" (1164) heard several nights with fairly good signals; 10/19 - TIBAS (650) heard through WSM 10:42 to 11:30 p.m. 10/20 - CMOW (1290) 1:36 to 1:55 a.m. s/off; 10/21 - XEX (730) 12:35 to 1:00 s/off, and 10/22 - XEHL (1010) 1:20 to 1:58 a.m. s/off. Verifications have been received from the following stations (letters) - WIL KLUF WEST WBGR WLIN WSIP WQXI & KCLA. Cards - WDAR WALB WISH & VP4RD. I guess that will do it for now. 73's and DX.

Plenty of work here so not too much time for DX, however I have got 11 reports out this season, mostly for at least a half-hour's reception. Letters have come back from WLS KUSD WWSW & CBO. With cards from WRMN KSVP & CBW. Reception hasn't been very good but the Northern Lights were beautiful to see here if not to hear especially on the evening of Oct. 15. I straightened out my outside antenna to 70 feet N-S. The SX-28-A lacks pep since I get it back. The S-20-R is 10 times more effective. I will have it fixed soon. Lots of stations for me to get so here's hoping I get more spare time. I experimented a little too with local stations close in frequency. I found too that if I add the difference in frequency to the highest station in frequency and on the resulting frequency get both stations. This would only work on the SX-28-B and could be minimized by tuning the amenna trimmer. I tried WBEN 930, WEBR, 970, on 1010 and also WBNY 1400 and WKBW 1520; on 1640. Both worked and could be eliminated. That's all for this time. (Grad to have your report, Bob. I get WINS-WMGM (1010-1050) on 1090, distorted. -Ed.)

Pat Reilley - 11 Irvine Place - Jamestown, New York
