Dear Mr. Kruse-

Thank you for your kind letter inquiring about a Test from WKXY.I put the question up to the Staff and they agreed to run the Test on Monday Dec. 19th. We may put in some news beside the music and identifications. Due to our limited staff, we'll have to limit our verifications to a short note on postcards if we get too many. In respect to verifications, I always like to say something about our Equipment because I think that interests the DXers. So for this test I'll ask you to publish details of our Equipment and then the veries can be limited to a very short CK on postcards. Our freq. is 1540Kc. and we radiate from a 184 foot stainless, Inc. uniform triangular cross section guyed towr. Our Transmitter is the Gates BC-IF, the latest model made by Gates Company. The rest of the Equipment is also Gates with the exception of the Western Electric 633A Microphones.
