Want to let you all know how much I enjoy my membership in the NRC. These weekly bulletins are really the thing. This month January has been my best all-around month for new stations & veries since I took DX up in earnest about 3 years ago. Engineer at KOCB has just advised me that on their DX the quantity was not so good but the distance was. Reports were as follows: 1-Ontario, 4-New York, 2 New Jersey, 1 Ohio, 1 Virginia, 1 Penn., 1 Washington, and 1 New Mexico. The KWKW DX polled 10 reports as follows - 1-Ontario, 3-Illinois, 1-Minichigan, 1-Missouri, 1 North Carolina, 1 New Jersey, 1-Indiana, and 1 Kansas. I think the trouble here was KWKW has put on several DXes for the boys before & they were pretty well logged. The KTUR engineer advises me that so far he has reports from N.Y., N.J., Conn., Iowa, Colo., Wash., Ore. and of course, Cal. Will have a complete breakdown on results of this DX later on. The latest verifications here are cards from WPEN KWKW WFNC & WARE, and letters from CMJB WLOG WMUS, London Regional, WAPF Toulouse-Muret 913, CKWX XEQR WALD & KNEY. The BEC sent a letter that comes as close to verifying reception of the 977 transmitter as any I've yet seen from them. The Toulouse verification was in English and written by one of the engineers. The XEQR verie will be of interest to the gang. The letter was on Cadena Radio Continental stationery. The address on the letterhead is "Paseo de la Reforma Num. 51, Mexico, D.F. The verie was signed by Francisco Aguirre J. who is the Director General of CRG. The other BEC stations listed on the letterhead were XERG 790, XEQB 1310 kc/s. (May be a new call for XEFO but I doubt it) & XEML 1550. Also listed are CW XERQ & XEQH. It may be that reports addressed to the above for all of the stations will be verified (we hope.) I sent my report to Av. Ejido Num. 8-10 though so can't figure it out. I've given up trying to figure out how to get verifications from Mexicans. I send the best report I can to the latest known address & am satisfied with 1 return for 5 reports. It looks as if I'm 2 weeks behind in reporting my activities. Latest reports went out to: 1/16, KSL on NNRC special, WLOG at 3:12 on f/c, WYXO on NNRC special, KCSU on NNRC special, & KWCR on the NRC special, 1/18 - KIBE on the NRC special, very good. 1/21 - KBRS at 2:05 a.m. on f/c, KITO s/off at 3:00 a.m., WARE on NRC special, WLNA on NRC special, and WGRA on ET. 1/22 - XERQ on all-night dancing show at 3:45, verified in 8 days! CMCQ at 4:05 on all-night show, WPEN at 5:00 on all-night show, WAPF on NRC special. 1/23 - WPBC on NRC special & WALD at 4:40 on f/c. 1/28 - WEBC at 2:05 s/off, KWHN KNEY KVRC & KFFA on NNRC specials. 1/29 - WPAT on all-night show, KDET on f/c at 3:00, WMRC on a March of Dimes show at 3:15. 1/30 - KNOR on NRC special and KCBC on all-night show. 2/1 - KBZY on f/c at 4:10, WEAR on an ET on 1230 kc/s., at 4:37, KIYI on f/c at 4:55, & WIBS on early-morning show at 5:05. There's a story behind my logging of WIBS here. Monday AM Jan. 30 Dad told me he heard a Spanish speaking station on WGN's frequency and I was quite excited. On Tuesday he amended his statement to read one channel above WGN & I was less excited. On Thursday AM I was up early and logged WIBS. ##### 2/4 - KTSN at 2:22 with a fair signal, WMLS on a f/c at 3:01, WATZ on an ET at 3:23, WLAV on f/c at 4:00, and WBGE on all night show at 4:55. (The underlined stations verified before I got them in a report to NRC). I bought a 10" globe here & am trying to cook up (literally) a plastic scale of miles for it. If I am successful I'll bring it to the convention for all to see. Preliminary measurement of my more distant catches on the globe showed that my measurements on my Q1 maps were in error by about 1000 miles on all my TPs. My average distance is back up to over 1000 miles now (1050 to be exact) as a result of the corrections. Preliminary markings on the new scale of miles are in error by .02" in the entire length, less than 16 miles in 19000. If the sub-division marking is as accurate, the whole scale will be more accurate than my ability to read it. Right now I have divisions every 500 miles. Divisions 100 miles apart will be in the neighborhood of 1/8" apart (.1256" to be exact). The error in using 1/8" per hundred miles would be about 50 miles on the more distant TPs. Well that's all the news from here. 73's and DX.

"Ran into" 2 indefinitely-identified stations since my last report that I'd like info on - they describe this way - an ETer on 1290 kc/s. that seemed to give the calls WNOS, 2/4 at 3:00 a.m., and a new station in Bedford, Va. that ETed 2/5 at 3:20 a.m. on 1490 kc/s. and seemed to give the calls WILT. In addition to those I added KDRS DX and KJFJ 1570 kc/s. and KNOR. I heard WWDC say on 2/5 at 3:30 that they'd begin regular 24-hour operation on 1260 kc/s. 2/20, and that WOL whom they'll supplant there would then take the 1450 kc/s. band. My latest veries are from WARE KDRS & KNEY for their recent DXes, as well as for regular scheduled transmissions of 50 watt VOHF, Harmon Field, Newfoundland, WGBG & KFI. Verifications have come in slowly this week: KVOO KCBQ & WHAS. Listening hours were short and conditions were erratic. 1/28, KPOJ on s/off at 3:00 a.m. KNBY & KFFA both had fair signals here on their special tests for NTRC. While listening to KFFA, a station QRM'd in code on 1360 kc/s. I wrote the FCC monitor station here in San Francisco. They answered 3 days later and thanked me for my co-operation. They said that they were investigating for an unauthorized station, but that it was most probably an image from the Navy station on 2,270 Mgs. 2/3 - My buddy, who will join the ranks of NRC as soon as he receives his application blank from Harold Wagner, came over to my house to sleep - I use that term loosely, for we stayed up all night! We were to go fishing the next morning, so we thought we might just as well get some DX-ing done. Here are our results: WVTR, Tokyo, on 770 kc/s, with fair signal. XERF drowned out everyone near 1570 kc/s. CKNW on 1320 kc/s. at 4:30 a.m. KSON, 24-hour station in San Diego certainly should reach you fellows on the East Coast with their signal. KWEG with weak signal at 5:00 a.m. At 5:30, heard 400 again smothered (as usual) beneath XELM's side-band interference. 6:30 a.m. heard WBS in Puerto Rico but they faded out too soon for a report. LISTENERS FACE THREE-STATION MIX-UP IN RADIO SWITCH FEB. 20.

"Beginning February 20, radio listeners may have to think twice - or maybe three times - before tuning in a favorite program.

"On and after that date, if they turn the dial to 1260 kilocycles, hoping to get station WOL, they'll get WWDC. If they tune to 1450, thinking to get WWDC, they'll be listening to WOL. But to top it off, the WOL they get won't be the same one they used to listen to. If, for instance, they want a Mutual Broadcasting System program, they'll have to turn to 1390, Station WEAM.

"Here's how things will line up after the February 20 three-way switch:

"Station WWDC, which recently bought WOL's studios and power facilities, will start broadcasting over the WOL band - 1260 - from the WOL quarters at 1627 K. Street, N.W. The Peoples's Broadcasting Co. which has bought the WOL call letters, will take over the present WWDC offices at 1000 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., and the 1450 spot. Station WEAM, with studios at 2030 North Sixteenth Street, Arlington, will assume the Mutual Broadcasting network programs.

"But until WEAM enlarges its studios, WWDC will use the Mutual news shows."
