Tone tests at 2:15 a.m. from WKIC on Nov. 1 netted their verie. WLBJ at 3:00 a.m. was also tone testing. Missouri night produced KNCM KIMO KCRV KMMO & KCHI. Veries are in from KNCM & KMMO. Also logged same morning were KTRM KSVP WCRK KICO WHCC WASK & WTOP. KALI DX very poor with uncertain identification. CFRB signed on at 5:00 a.m. on 1010 kc/s. and WOOD at 5:30 a.m. Finally a post card verie from WTAQ after two tries and a nice letter from WMAV constitute the latest Illinois veries.
